The only thing we can suggest to Gabriel is that he keep a stiff upper lip. In fact, it might not be a bad idea if he froze it into place by standing with his head in the refrigerator door for a half hour each morning. This situation clearly calls for drastic measures.

Malicious Mischief Heads List Of October Juvenile Crimes

SANTA ANA, (OCNS) — Orange County Sheriff's Department Juvenile Bureau reported its heaviest traffic in history occurred during October.

Juvenile Bureau head Sgt. Russell Campbell said 447 investigations were made by his three-man staff, including 13 adults arrested

and prosecuted for crimes involving children.

Malicious mischief and vandalism led the list of offenses with 75 cases. There were 34 petty thefts and 28 burglaries.

Campbell listed five felony morals and child molesting incidents. There were six narcotics cases involving juveniles.

Sixty-five boys were arrested and detained. Meanwhile, only seven members of the feminine sex were booked — two of them accused of immorality.

Campbell estimated 150 boys and 25 girls were questioned but not entered. Twenty-five traffic citations were issued to juveniles.

Mesa Chamber Opposes Ditch Freeway Plan

The Costa Mesa Chamber of Commerce board of directors voted Thursday to join the city council in opposing a ditch type freeway through the center of the city.

Chamber officials, led by Don Huddleston, said they believed the ditch freeway would divide the town and would create a serious flooding problem.

"Surface streets are under water during bad weather," said Huddleston. "What would the flooding be like in a street 20 feet below the surface?"

The state highway department's latest plan calls for sinking Newport Blvd. below the street level from the 20th St. intersection to north of Palisades Road.

County Highway Proposals Aired Before Senate Group

SANTA ANA, (OCNS) — Orange County's presentation before the Sen. Randolph Collier's Joint Interim Committee on Transportation Problems Nov. 9 in the Long Beach city hall was "well received," according to a county road department spokesman.

Board of Supervisors Chairman Willis Warner made a general talk on the board's policies concerning road development.

Road Commissioner Al Koch then gave a detailed analysis of this county's freeway, other roadway proposals and progress.

The Collier group reportedly was 100 per cent behind the Orange County suggestion that the roads abandoned by the state to counties and cities be brought up to proper standards.

The county recommended three freeway route changes in the state plans. All reportedly met with the committee's approval.

It was suggested the San Gabriel Freeway be extended from its south terminus on the Garden Grove Freeway to the Pacific Coast Highway; that the Garden Grove Freeway be extended from the Santa Ana Freeway to Tustin Ave. Freeway; and that MacArthur Blvd. be relocated around the expanding Orange County Airport and the route be deleted along Santa Ana's Main St.

Long Beach also offered its program on road development to the committee.

(DEAN WITTER & CO.) SANTA ANA, NOV. 16, (OCNS) — The market encountered early irregularity as profit taking was felt in several of the recent leaders. Montgomery Ward settled back, although support is coming in around yesterday's bear breakout point, which is constructive.

Meanwhile, interest has to rotate and is being maintained in selected motors, steels, metals, oils and specialties. Dividend news and anticipations are favoring influences. American Cyanamid responded favorably to its declaration and demonstrates good absorption power.

CHRYSLER UP
Chrysler bounced through into new high ground at the opening, then subsequently eased slightly. This breakout reflects confidence not only that the final quarter will produce excellent earnings, but also that the company's recovery will be well-maintained in its attempt to capture 20 per cent of the automobile market.

Steels were aided by the dividend increase of National Steel, as well as further comments regarding needed price increases. Bethlehem Steel appears attractive in the group, while we also feel Youngstown Steel is temporarily behind the group. Excellent earnings enhance the potential of Jones & Laughlin, which affords a very reasonable 5 per cent return.

Coppers maintain a firm tone in the wake of higher scrap prices, and Aluminum Ltd. advanced to a new recovery high.

Selected improvement is taking place in the aircrafts, with Douglas responding to further contract awards and Republic Aviation firm in anticipation of a year-end stock payment.

The market as measured by the Dow Jones is in a resistance area so that profit taking is natural. Some issues have experienced sharp gains so that corrections are to be expected. Among those we would favor particularly on weakness are Montgomery Ward, American Cyanamid, Chrysler, Royal Dutch and Bethlehem Steel.

Lutheran School Plans Revealed to Mesa Planners

Plans for a Lutheran school for the Harbor area were revealed by Rev. L. W. Tornow of Christ Lutheran Church of Costa Mesa Monday when he appeared before the Mesa planning commission to request a variance to relocate existing buildings on the site.

Mr. Tornow said plans for the school are only in the preliminary stage but at least the first two grades would be taught when the school is established. The property is on Victoria St. east of Placencia Ave.

He told the commission a public hearing had previously been held to gain approval of the use of 4 acres of the property for church purposes. Since then the Lutheran church has acquired an additional acre, he said, and now

desires to relocate existing buildings as well as "spread out" future buildings including the planned school.

Although there were no protests at the original public hearing, Board Chairman Walter Weimer said another public hearing was now necessary and set Nov. 28 as the date.

Ogle Voices County Views at State Assembly Meet

SANTA ANA, NOV. 16 (OCNS) — County Counsel Joel Ogle will voice Orange County's views at an Assembly Interim Committee meeting tomorrow and Friday in Long Beach.

The committee will conduct a two-phase hearing — on subcommittee and the Allen Bill provisions.

The supervisors instructed Ogle to oppose any state action aimed at reclaiming tidelands grants made to any city along California's coastline.

The committee discussions chiefly will be centered on Long Beach Harbor. The city received a state grant and then proposed to use money gained from tideland oil royalties in improvements outside the harbor area.

According to the state, the royalties were to be earmarked strictly for harbor developments. The Allen Bill would allow the state to take back the grant and use the money gained from Long Beach Harbor oil drilling along where in the state.

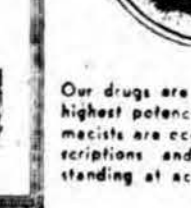

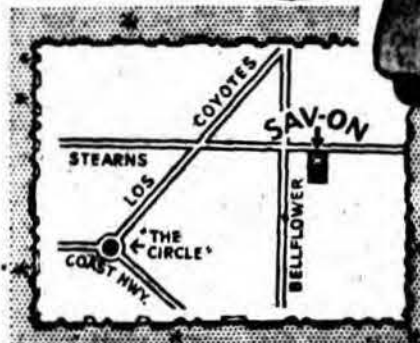

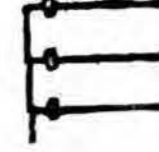

Senator Kuchel Protests Newsprint Cost Increase

United States Senator Thomas H. Kuchel today protested recent notices of price increases for newsprint with a warning that when an American newspaper is forced out of business by rising costs of paper "a basic American freedom — the freedom of information — is placed under attack." Kuchel is the son of the late Henry Kuchel who published Orange County's oldest newspaper, the Anaheim Gazette.

Kuchel, in a letter to the Senate Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee sent through his Washington office, said the latest price boost by Canadian newsprint manufacturers will add several million dollars a year to American newspaper production costs. Increases in the last decade already have added a total of \$450,000,000 to the publishing bill of the American industry, he noted.

"I am fearful that the cost of newsprint is approaching the point where it will be unbearable," Kuchel said.

He commended the Committee for "losing no time in ascertaining the facts."

"Free government has flourished in this land of ours because it is a nation of free citizens, with full access to the news. We must keep it that way," Kuchel wrote.

The California Senator revealed he also is asking several Federal agencies, including the Departments of Justice and State, for their suggestions in dealing with the situation.

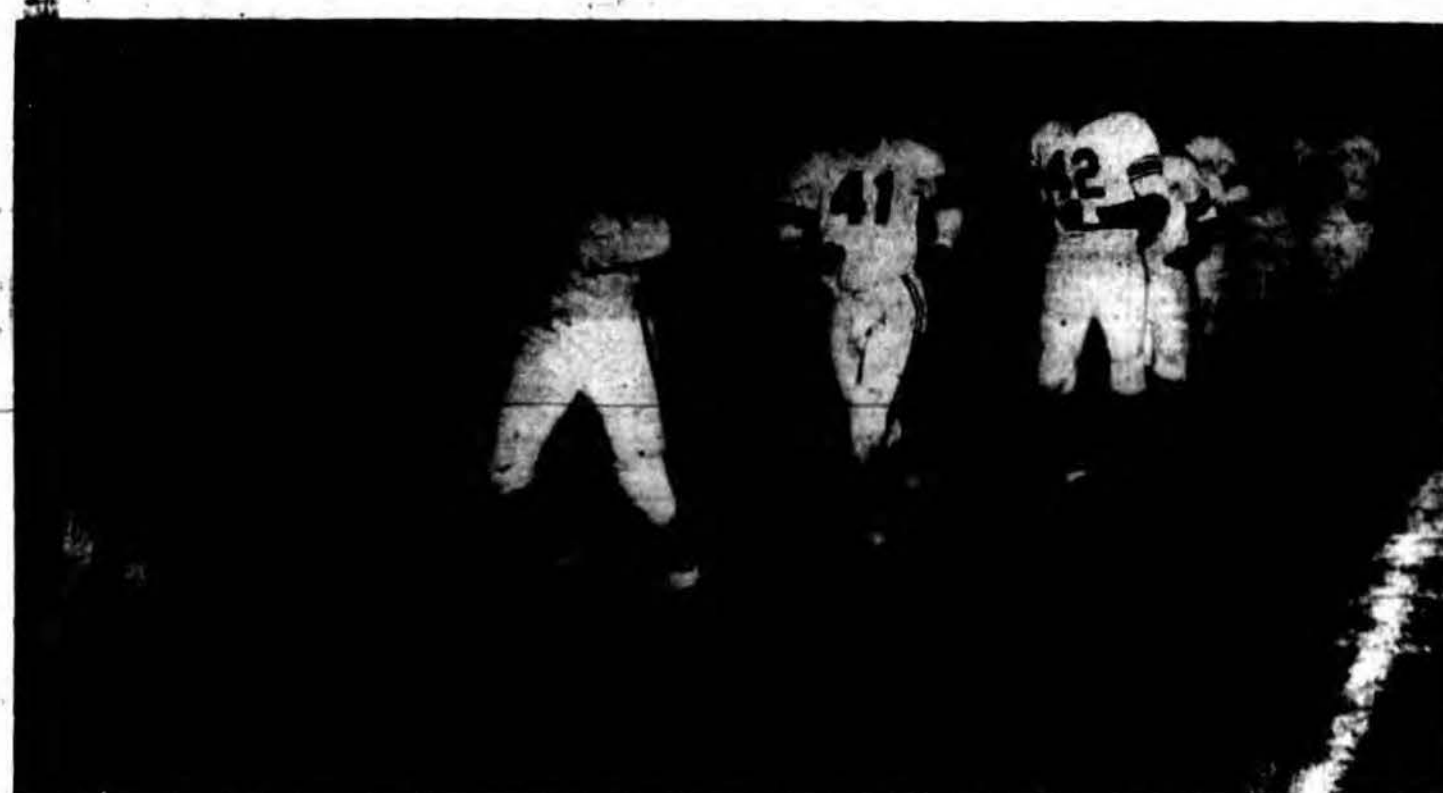

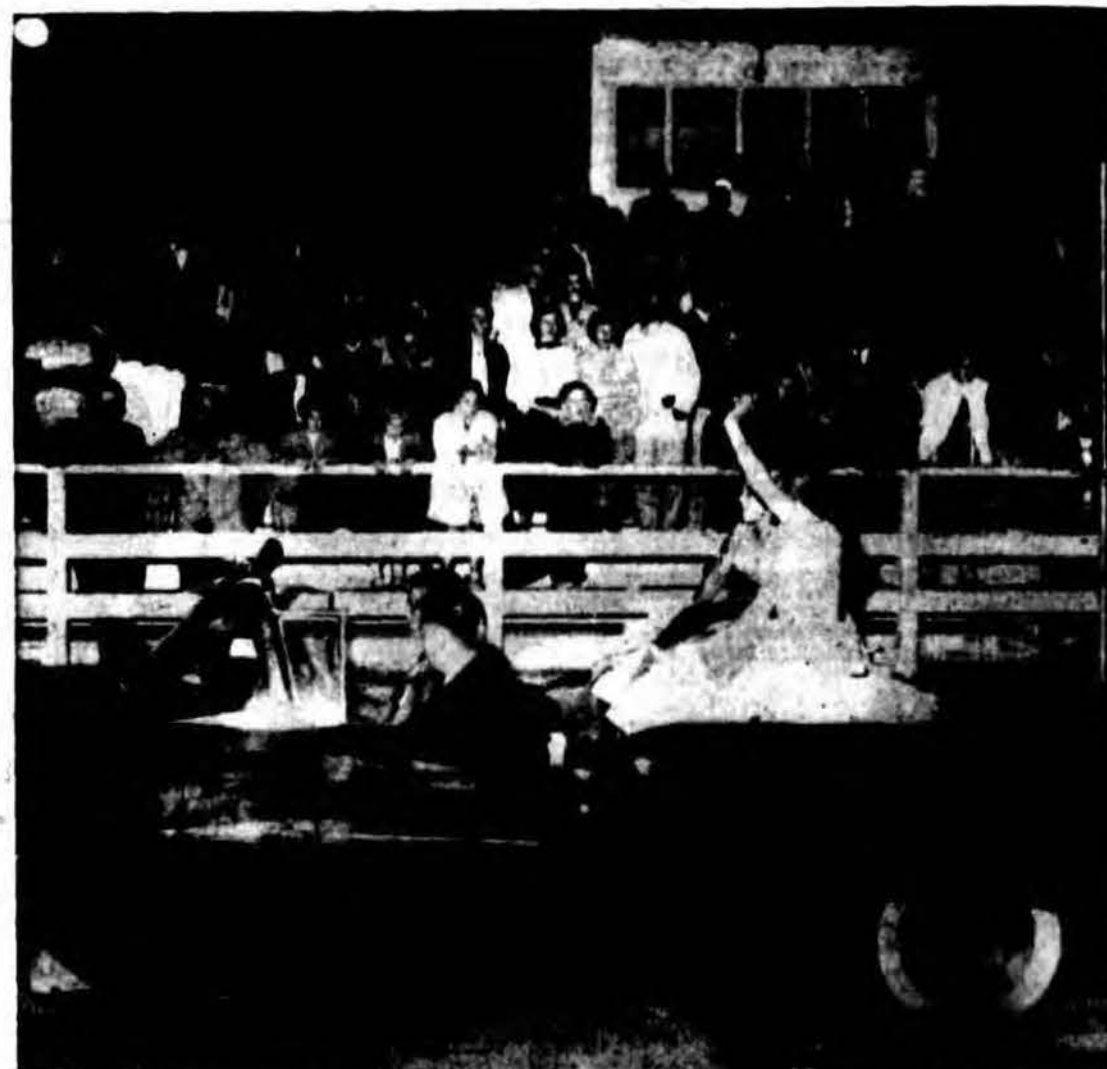

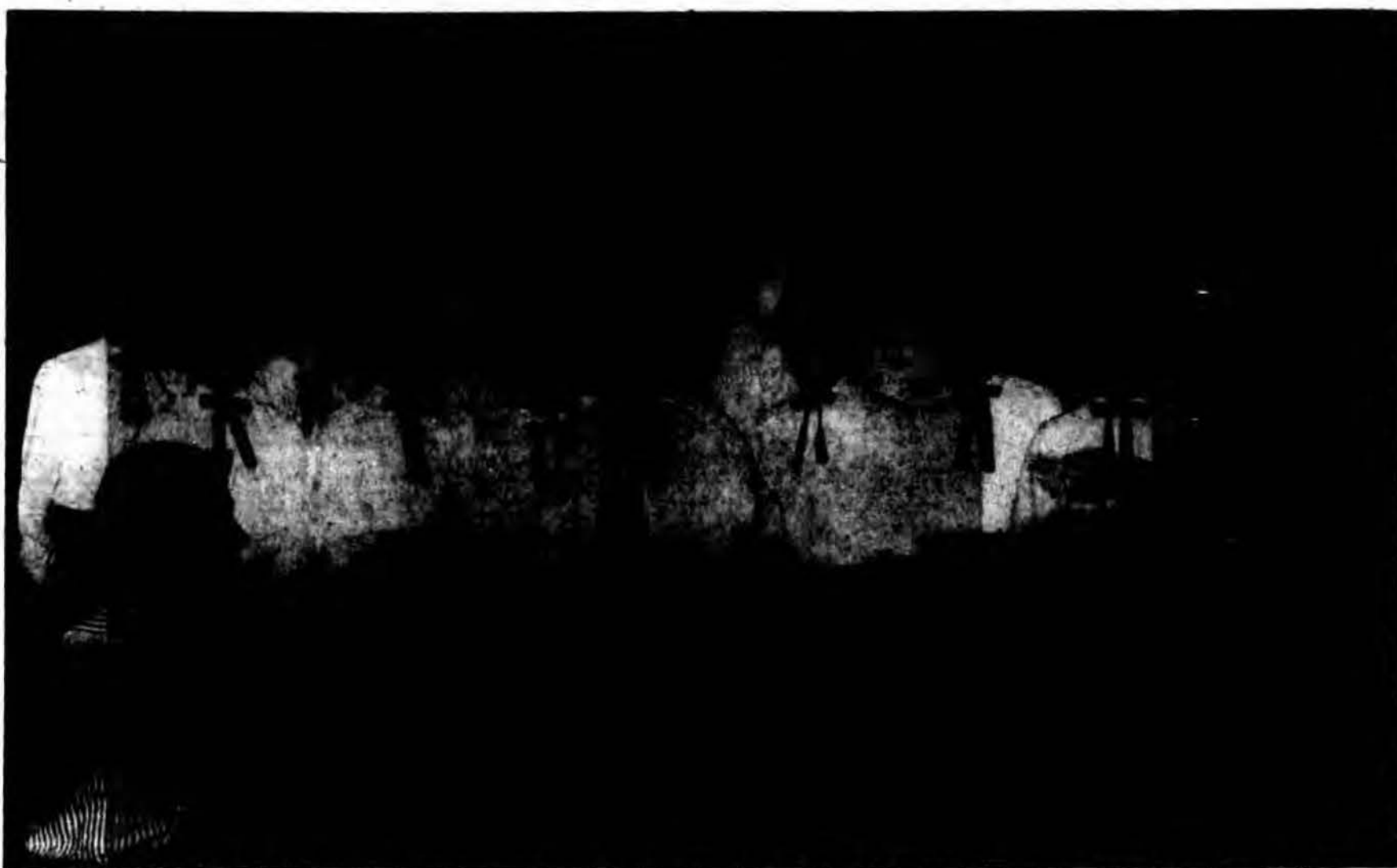

EDITORIALS

Outside Car Manufacturer Cuts Props from Dealers

City council Monday night saw a direct factory bid price on municipal automobiles cut the props out from under local dealer prices as General Motors showed the boys how to cut prices if you want city business.

Our Newport Beach car dealers submitted bids as they always have, knowing they had each other to back—but not dreaming a major motor car firm would enter the bidding competition. One council member estimated that as the city accepted the factory's direct bid the city would save \$2300 on the cars involved—compared to giving the business to the lowest bid of a local dealer.

One of the dealers who was present at the council session expressed his surprise a factory bid was made although such was not foreign to his knowledge in other areas.

In years past this newspaper has editorially commented on the custom of municipal employees buying their merchandise at discount houses catering to city workers and other public servants. We mentioned then they drew their salaries from the local taxpayers, a number of whom are in business here.

We cannot see how this factory discount car deal is any different. There is no doubt the city saved money, a habit we welcome in any level of government. But by the same token of seeking factory discounts, would it not be fairer to get ALL motor car makers to submit factory bids if the council chooses not to give the business to local dealers who pay the taxes that support the city?

Council Slaps Down County Flood Control Pork Barrel

Having suggested previously the Newport Beach City Council could well reconsider earlier approval of a resolution foisted on the body of the county board of supervisors to aid the \$42 million flood control project, we must publicly commend the council members for such action.

At Monday's meeting the council, by then having had time individually to study in more detail the ramifications of this political pork barrel to Newport Beach taxpayers, voted to rescind the resolution adopted half-heartedly some weeks ago.

Although the motion was Councilman J. B. Stoddard's, he is fair-minded, agreed with his fellows that any one of them would have brought up the rescinding action on which they all were unanimous.

We feel the people of Newport Beach will be glad to know that intelligence has prevailed in their local government, given time to study what was presented too quickly to the council. The flood control bond issue, more properly a drainage plan to aid west and north county subdivisions, has been thoroughly criticized by the county farm bureau and the county's own League of Cities chapter. Only city still for the bond issue is Anaheim.

We trust this city, given time to consider, will agree with other public bodies that there is a better method to give drainage to areas in need without soaking all the taxpayers in the county for what is needed only in certain areas.

High School, Y Leaders Working for Better Youth

You who read an editorial here recently regarding the "exclusiveness" of membership in the Newport Harbor Union High School YMCA clubs for boys and

girls doubtless will be as glad as we to hear this adolescent form of snobbery is being eliminated through constructive action of the school and the Y directors.

This past Monday morning, thanks to cooperation given by school authorities to the Y directors, two meetings were held, one for boys, one for girls, inviting children to hear the Hi-Y and the Tri-Hi-Y program expounded.

Whereas a total of 174 girls prior to Monday's meeting were in the four grades' various Tri-Hi-Y clubs, chartered and un-chartered, a total of 179 girls showed up at the Hi-Y Tri-Hi-Y meeting to learn from Mrs. Roy Fox, Tri-Hi-Y director, what the movement had to offer them and what they could give the movement. A total of 47 boys attended a Hi-Y session held in another room and heard the boys' Y program outlined.

We think the comparative totals — 174 girls "in" Y clubs and 179 girls who were interested in finding out about them — are most interesting. Those of you who read the recent editorial on cliquishness evident and proven in the Y clubs probably agree with us that there is no place for such in a movement dedicated to espousing Christian principles; nor can such cliquishness be excused when the club's support comes from the public purse — \$3000 this year for YMCA through Community Chest funds — of Newport Harbor.

However, comes now this greater sharing of the Y program, thanks to the Y leaders being given courteous hospitality by school officials in making halls available so the principles involved could be communicated. With the sharing of information and explanation of purposes there can be no reason henceforth to keep a high school youngster outside one of these organizations.

Although the previous editorial singled out one specific class' Tri-Hi-Y club as a case in point for its method of choosing members, it should be pointed out that in time past the Y here has allowed its club members to vote in by a majority count those children wishing to join. Defense of this is on grounds the clubs, to be effective, necessarily must contain compatible children. Likewise, it has been stated, size of available private homes' living rooms has limited the membership. Also, the Y executives think the clubs can be more usefully directed when they are no larger than about 25 members. Greater size makes the memberships less pliable for adult directors, it was claimed.

Now some of that last paragraph we agree with, some we don't.

However, now the school officials and Y directors are in better concert than ever before we have every hope the local YMCA high school program can grow in a proper direction with no vestige of snobishness and cliquishness attaching to any Y club. Any which are so plagued will be evident and will proclaim themselves a mockery of the Y purpose:

"To create, maintain and extend the high standards of Christian character."

To Keep Your Taxes Down You Must Do Your Part

"I wouldn't mess around with politics." So maybe you worry about the high cost of government, but think it's just too big and complicated to do anything about.

One of the "advantages" of living in these United States is that you can do practically nothing about government unless you feel like it.

So, okay, nobody will compel you. But your citizen's rights don't exclude one big must. An American must pay for government.

Property taxes are higher in Orange County and California this year. Other taxes keep climbing, too.

What can be done about it?

Three things: (1) Vote intelligently; (2) write to public officials, a writing voter is normally a thinking voter; and (3) participate in group action for more economical government.

Like all Americans, we here have the historic right to take our responsibilities of citizenship seriously. Since concern and action by many can reduce the high cost of government.

NO COMMENT

You hear fresh concern expressed on Capitol Hill these days over the effect of political activities of union bosses on the rank and file of union members.

For example, Senator Barry Goldwater, Arizona Republican, believes that the political freedom of the working man and woman of America is in great jeopardy because of expenditure of union funds for political purposes.

"In my opinion," he says, "the usurpation of political power by some top union leaders is denying to millions of rank and file workers the right to make their own political decisions."

BOSS COMPLAINT Part of his complaint against the union bosses is explained this way: "Objective studies by universities and other groups have shown that approximately 40 per cent of the union members in this coun-

try are Republican.

"When a union boss raises \$10,000 for political purposes out of compulsory union dues, \$4,000 of that money must come from Republican union members."

"This means that a Republican union member who goes down to the polls to vote Republican is, at the same time, required, in order to hold his job, to contribute, through his dues, check-off, to the campaign funds for the Democratic Party — the very party which he is voting against."

"Forty per cent of the union members in the United States are in this position today."

"If such a situation doesn't strike right at the roots of freedom in this country, then I have no idea what freedom means."

GOVERNMENT ECONOMY — You have heard of "Yes But" people — those who agree to something and then immediately start raising objections.



Sacramento Sidelight

SACRAMENTO, (CNS) — The ruling of Attorney General Edmund G. Brown to the effect that no officer, employee or member of a trade association may hold public office without jeopardizing contracts held by other members of the same association probably will have a widespread effect on business activities in California.

Already, the California State Builders Exchange has asked for immediate resignation from the association of certain members in 50 member associations throughout the state.

COUNCIL MEMBER

The ruling by the attorney general was given as the result of a situation in the City of Modesto, which held that the city could not enter into a contract with any member of the Valley Builders Exchange, Inc., because Harry Anderson, a member of the exchange at the time the contract was being negotiated, was a member of the Modesto City Council.

The councilman resigned his position with the exchange, but retained his seat on the council. Brown's ruling on the matter read:

"Even if all prospective contractors were members of the exchange, so there could be no question of favoring one member over a non-member, his (Anderson's) attitude on whether supplies should be purchased or construction undertaken at all, might be affected by the needs of the members of the exchange for business."

To get an idea of the extent of the ruling, it is noted that 50 construction associations, with 14,000 members, are affiliated with the California State Builders Exchange, and it is readily apparent that in this large group, there would be many members holding civic positions of public responsibility and on the public payroll.

Originally, the law adopted by the legislature prohibiting profit from government by persons serving government, was intended to halt the evil of having people run for office, and immediately upon being elected, start turning business into their own establishments.

This was both to keep the channels of competitive bidding open from all types of business which dealt with the government, and to cut down graft that had in some localities become prevalent.

WENT FURTHER However, the legislature went much farther than the members anticipated. Sometime ago in Marin county, there was a question of a supervisor who owned a portion of a rock company furnishing aggregates for county road work. To avoid violating the law, the supervisor did not run again.

There have been other instances in which capable individuals have been dissuaded from seeking public office, on account of the concerns they either owned or were connected with, did business with the local government.

Thus, the law as it is written results at times in keeping good men out of public office, where businessmen are needed to keep state and local government from falling into the hands of the professional civil service contingent.

But on the other hand, the law is probably successful in keeping a certain amount of graft and corruption out of government, or if not that, at least, it keeps the servitors of the public above suspicion.

Obviously, this is a law which probably will merit study by some legislative interim committee, to determine whether it cannot be revised to lessen its bad features and strengthen the good.

Editorial Circuit Rider

The Conference at Geneva:

Ontario-Upland Daily Report: "In one relatively brief speech for a Russian, Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov doused all hope of an East-West agreement on unification of Germany. Now everybody can stop kidding themselves and one another that Communism and Communism have changed spots. That is the healthiest development in world affairs during the past year. In that respect, it represents really good news at Geneva."

Fullerton Daily News Tribune: "Unless the Kremlin does a major flip-flop, there is no chance of any progress at Geneva toward settlement of the German, European and disarmament problems. Soviet conditions for agreement are impossible. That leaves only one other agenda item—development of contacts between east and west. If the Soviets block settlement of the other questions, this last agenda item could be a major trap for the west. Agreements to increase east-west contacts aren't worth the paper they're written on until the Soviets tear down the Iron Curtain."

ARROYO BOLSHIEVSK: "The San Francisco News: 'The arrogance with which the Bolsheviks at Geneva have torn up the Geneva spirit' is almost unbelievable. This poses a major problem for Western leaders. They let people's hopes rise too high last summer. Now they must lead the people down from those misplaced hopes at the summit—to descend without submitting unwarranted despair for unwarranted hopes. Scripps - Howard Foreign Editor Ludwell Denny reports from Geneva that Mr. Dulles wants to catch up something to the current fruitless talks going on into conferences next year. This is a dangerous course. To prolong the current efforts to negotiate with men who demand the impossible... can only invoke the Soviets to plunge further and further along the road of subversion and aggression."

Long Beach Press - Telegram: "This week, in a joint statement with U.S. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles, (Yugoslavia's Marshal) Tito was more encouraging than the Soviet Union."

DULLES PERFORMANCE Bakersfield Californian: Dulles... has ranged from Madrid to Belgrade to muster the full strength of the Western world and its neutral centers to oppose any scheme or coalition that the Soviet leaders may propose or assemble. He has spoken vigorously and surely in support of the contentions of the Western diplomats and time and again has placed Mr. Molotov on the defensive, which is a rare accomplishment. Whatever pessimism may have been in the minds of those who traveled to Geneva at the outset has been dispelled by the performance of Mr. Dulles and the manner in which he has triumphed over grave difficulties."

The Napa Register: "A national crisis involving the safety and security of the United States and its allies has developed suddenly. It was born in the apparent failure of Mr. Eisenhower's mid-summer foreign policy gamble at the Geneva summit. The Soviet Russian leaders who were so amiable there no longer smile. In the whole of Europe and in the Middle East, Soviet Russia now is accused of endangering even the doubtful peace which the post-war world had achieved. Urgent questions for foreign policy and defense have been created by the new Kremlin strategy."

AFFAIRS OF STATE

SACRAMENTO, (CNS)—While the spectacle of crime and pandemonium may be highly appealing to the California State Park Commission, it has no attraction for the residents of Columbia, this state's old gold mining town in Tuolumne County.

When the restoration of Columbia was first envisioned by the State Park Commission, headed by Joseph R. Knowland, Oakland publisher and political power, it was felt that California would have a Williamsburg, Virginia, which is a town restored to the old colonial days and a top-flight tourist attraction.

NATURAL STATE For several years, now, the state park commission has been acquiring property in Columbia, in the hopes that one day, it will own the entire community, and apparently, revert it to its "natural state."

The natural state is a fetish of the state park commission, which keeps some of its properties in a continual fire hazard by making it a crime to pick up a stick, and refusing to permit the public, which foots the bill for the commission, to use areas outside of camping grounds as designated by the parks for camping purposes.

What's left of the residents of Columbia, however, does not want to go along with the state park commission in that old gold mining town.

The citizens have formed an association, which will meet with the commission Nov. 18 at its meeting in San Francisco, and find out about rumors that have invaded the 1819 atmosphere of the community.

GOOD OLD DAYS? The rumors consisted of the theory that the state park commission planned to banish electric

lights from Columbia, tear up the paved street and substitute rotten granite, bar all automobiles from the community, and return to the days of the gas lamps.

Newton B. Drury, chief of the state division of beaches and parks, however, says this isn't true "at this time." Regarding the rumor that Columbians would have to get a horse and buggy for transportation, he said such a procedure had never been discussed.

Some of Drury's aides in the state division of beaches and parks, however, apparently discounted Drury's denials.

"The original idea of acquiring Columbia," said one, "was to restore it as nearly as possible to its status in the gold rush days. I assume that's where the gas lamps came into the picture, as well as the equine transportation."

NEED COMPROMISE

So actually, some probable compromise will be worked out with the residents of the community, which might result in their dressing up like Forty-Niners in return for electric lights and automobiles. But even so, the place would be a bad spot for electric shaver salesmen, as most Forty-Niners sported long black whiskers. During the summer, it's rather hot in Columbia for whiskers.

The restoration of Columbia is progressing slowly, so slowly in fact that the California Teachers Association felt it necessary to dun all the school children in California for a dime or so to restore the old Columbia school house. If all the children respond the take of course will be tremendous. However, there is the suspicion that quite a few of them won't.

SAMMY LEE CLAIMS WE MUST WIN GAMES

SANTA ANA, (OCNS) — Famed Olympic champion, Sammy Lee, in a recent address before the Santa Ana Kiwanis Club stated, "America has got to win next year's Olympic Games because the Russians are out to defeat us."

The two time world high diving champion reported on his recent world tour as a State Department emissary. He said most foreign, and particularly Asiatic countries, are receptive to Communist propaganda about American subjugation of colored races. In one country, Lee said, "I was asked if I could go anywhere I wanted to." The Korean descendant said he answered no — "I can't go into the San Francisco Olympic Club. But there are also some clubs in Chinatown that won't let an Irishman near their doors."

Describing himself repeatedly as "an Oriental from Connecticut," Lee called for financial support to next year's Olympic team. "It's important to our position in world affairs," he stated.

The Russians, he said, would love to be able to use the propaganda line, "again we defeated the decadent American capitalists."

"Our teams are always the most poorly dressed, ill-equipped and undermanned," he stated. "That's because we rely solely on contributions to get our teams to the games." The Russian government supports the USSR teams, he stated.

"Most of you people are probably wondering if I'll enter next year's Olympic events," Lee stated. "Well, I saw what happened to Archie Moore, and so I've decided to stay in retirement."

Lee said he would be available for talks to civic clubs throughout Orange County if he thought it would help raise money to send next year's Olympic teams to Australia. "I'll even perform exhibitions," he said.

Vaccination Required for Field Dogs in California

Hunters were warned again today by the State Health Department that their dogs should be vaccinated against rabies before being allowed to run at large, or before being transported in or out of a quarantine area. He warned that unvaccinated dogs running at large are subject to pick up, impoundment and vaccination at the owner's expense.

Malcolm H. Merrill, state health director, pointed out that quarantine measures have been invoked in many of the hunting areas in the state, prohibiting free movement of dogs which have not been vaccinated.

He explained that quarantine action was taken because a marked increase of rabies in wildlife is exposing dogs to unnecessary risk unless they are vaccinated. This is particularly true, he added, in the case of highly trained, valuable hunting dogs.

The director reported that

many local areas are requiring that a dog be vaccinated before being allowed to run at large, or before being transported in or out of a quarantine area. He warned that unvaccinated dogs running at large are subject to pick up, impoundment and vaccination at the owner's expense.

Merrill advised hunters to take the following precautions before starting out on a hunting trip:

1. Vaccinate your dogs with an approved anti-rabies vaccine.
2. Securely attach the rabies vaccination tag to the dog's collar and make certain the collar is worn at all times. It is also wise for the owner to carry the vaccination certificate while hunting.
3. Check the local health officer in the area in which you plan to hunt to learn the local rabies control ground rules. This is of particular importance because the permission for dogs to run at large after vaccination is discretionary with the quarantine officer.

The director reported that it has been recommended to local health officers that a general policy be followed allowing vaccinated dogs free movement in, within and out of rabies quarantine areas.

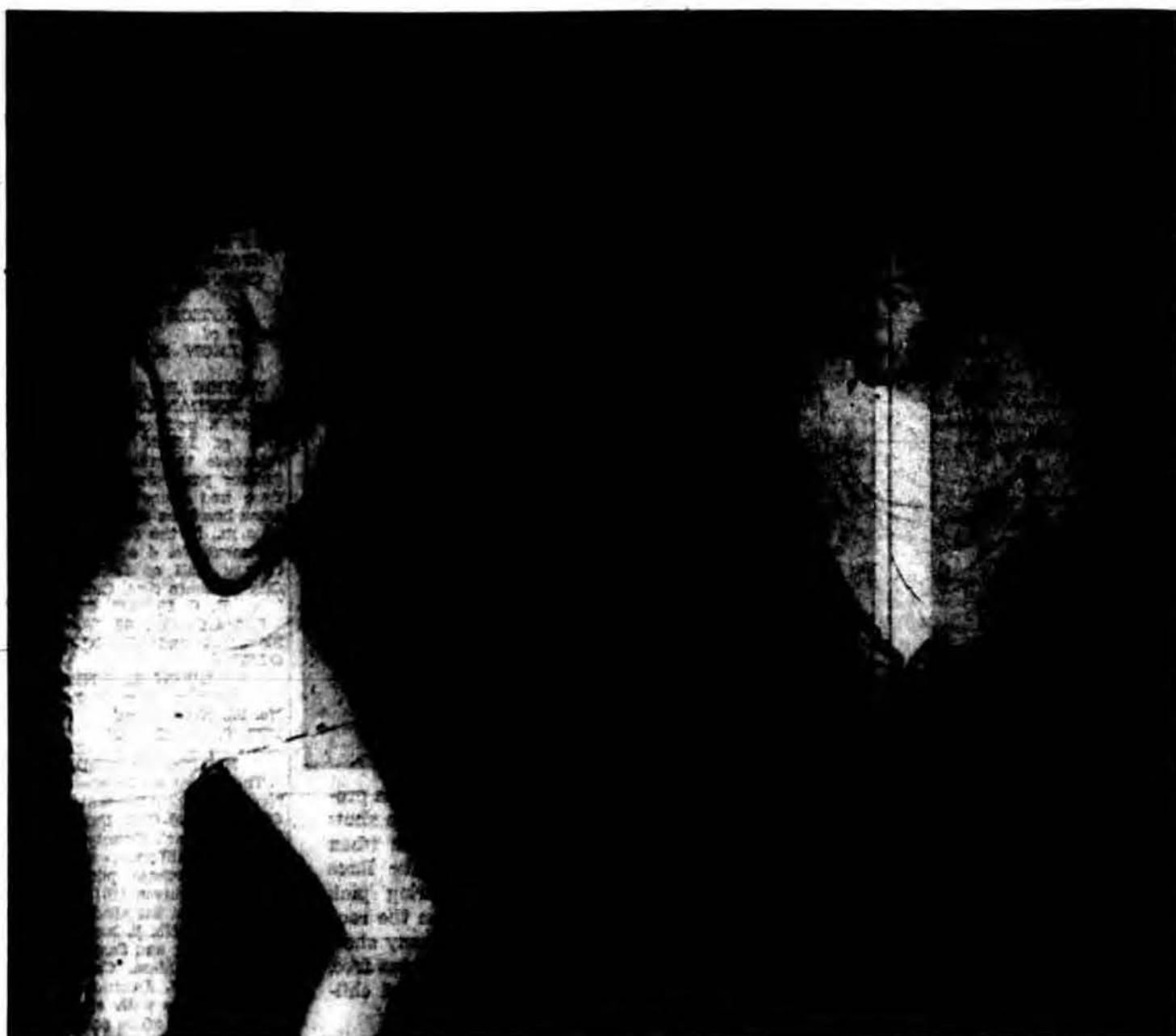

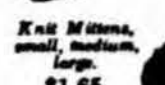

alleged failure of the administration's policies on agriculture. Before being chosen as national chairman, Butler worked at all levels in politics, starting with the Young Democrats in the 1932 campaign for Franklin D. Roosevelt. He is a graduate of Notre Dame Law School and has five children.

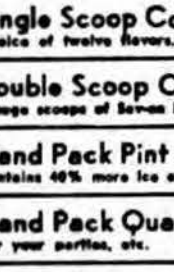

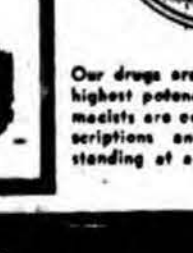

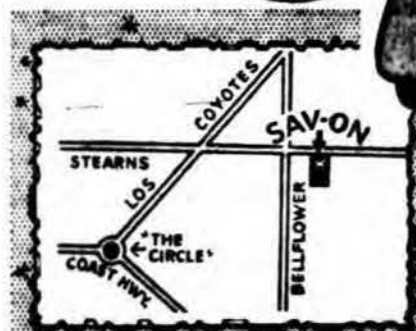

TEST PILOT WHO BAILED OUT AT 777 MPH OFF LAGUNA TELLS TALE NOW

George Smith, North American test pilot, who was feeling "tight in the chest" after he bailed out of an F-100A at supersonic speed off Laguna Beach, is back on his feet and almost ready to fly his plane again.

But months of treatment and convalescence at Hoag Hospital were necessary before the history-making pilot gained weight and some recollection of fast-moving events before he made an emergency escape from his cockpit jammed jet fighter as it dove vertically at 777 mph.

In surviving that escape—he got out of the hospital three months ago—Smith proved two things:

DURABLE PILOT

1. He is an extremely durable man.

2. It is possible to bail out of an airplane at supersonic speeds at low altitudes and survive.

As the first man to accomplish this second achievement, Smith has become one of aviation's most valuable human beings.

Ever since the nip and tuck fight for his life was resolved in his favor, Smith has been prodded and examined in a thousand different ways by aero-medical specialists who regard him with the ecstasy of collectors viewing an unique specimen.

(In England, Royal Air Force authorities yesterday were studying reports which indicated a crippled jet fighter was traveling 700 miles an hour, just beyond the speed of sound, when the pilot bailed out, and lived. The plane was at 25,000 feet altitude at the time of bail out, however.)

Smith's story, a hodge-podge of dramatic circumstances that re-enforces the adage of truth out-doing fiction, is told here for the first time. He will relate it in person to the Aviation Writers at the Press Club Tuesday night.

Most of the events of that day, Feb. 24, are lost to him as a result of the shock of the accident, but from bits and pieces supplied by neighbors and friends, Smith is able to assemble a sketchy picture of the flight.

TO TAKE LAUNDRY

He left his Manhattan Beach apartment that day to take his laundry out, but on the way he decided to stop at the North American main plant and complete a report on an airplane he had flown the previous Friday.

At the field, Dispatcher Robert Galahue suggested that since one of his airplanes, a P-100A, was ready for its first flight, it might be a good idea to take it up.

Since it would be just one flight, Smith didn't put on his reinforced nylon flight suit nor his sturdy flight boots, contenting himself with a parachute and a life vest put on over his sport shirt and slacks.

When he made his flight check at the end of the runway before take-off, Smith thought he noticed a stiffness in the action of the control stick, but since the instruments indicated the hydraulic pressure was normal, he decided to ignore it.

35,000-FT. ALTITUDE

Once in the air with the powerful super Sabre fighter, he climbed over the heavy overcast, reached 35,000 feet and was heading over the ocean south toward San Diego when it happened.

The airplane began to nose over. He tried to use the trim controls to straighten it out, but then he discovered that the control stick was jammed fast. The plane continued to steepen its dive, heading down at nearly a 20 degree angle.

Smith grabbed the control stick with both hands and pulled with all his strength. It didn't move. He radioed the company station and reported he was having hydraulic trouble.

Another North American test pilot, Joe Kinkella, on the same flight, shouted over his radio to Smith:

"George, bail out!"

WORKS FAST

Smith didn't need the advice.

into the tremendous windstream, increasing his weight to 3000 pounds in a split second.

This sudden tremendous increase in weight caused many hemorrhages in Smith's body as the suddenly heavy blood broke through the blood vessel walls. For days, George was unable to see because of hemorrhages in his eyes.

A Coast Guard boat picked up Smith from Simon's cruiser and rushed him, still unconscious, to Hoag Hospital.

Prompt and thorough attention by the physician on emergency duty who stayed with Smith constantly for the first 24 hours, and other doctors pulled him through the first few days.

Lt. Col. John F. Stapp, the Air Force officer who has traveled at supersonic speeds strapped in place on a rocket-powered sled, was among the aero medical specialists to inspect Smith as he started his convalescence.

COMMITTEE WORK

Twelve civilian and military specialists made up a committee that worked day and night to save the life of the man who was the first to bail out at supersonic speed and live to reach the ground.

Smith's weight dropped from 215 pounds to 150. His most extensive damage was on his liver, but damage to his lower intestine required surgery.

Today Smith's weight is back 175 pounds and he is waiting for the moment when the doctors tell him he can fly again.

And from the lessons learned from Smith, aviation designers are working out new methods of escape for man from supersonic jets — convinced from Smith's heroic tale that since it has been done once, it probably can be done better.

Mrs. Middleton Joins Mate in Suicide Pact

SANTA ANA, (OCNS)—What apparently was a well-planned double suicide by carbon monoxide poisoning resulted in death Friday night for Hal Middleton, 73, and the death Saturday afternoon of his wife, Edna, also 73, both of Laguna Beach. The bodies were taken to Brown's Mortuary, Laguna Beach.

Sheriff's deputies said they found the Middletons slumped over in the front seat of their expensive 1935 automobile parked in the 2400 block on Fortuna St., Dana Point area.

The car's engine was running and the motor was steaming with heat. The left front door was unlocked. Deputies ripped the door open and yanked loose a piece of garden hose which had been channeled from the exhaust pipe up through the rear seat.

BOTH ALIVE

Deputies said Mrs. Middleton was breathing "a little" and Middleton "had a slight pulse." An ambulance arrived at 8:30 p. m. resuscitation efforts failed to revive Middleton. Mrs. Middleton was rushed to Hoag Hospital.

Deputies said they found the Middletons' Boston bulldog, "Jigger," dead on the front seat floor boards. Also found were two red capsules in the lap of Mrs. Middleton, a two-quart sauce pan containing a partially filled bottle of sulfuric acid, one can of dust extermiator and a half full glass of whiskey in Middleton's right hand.

A note on top of the dash board read: "Be careful. There may be cyanide gas."

Another note was addressed simply to "the finder," Dep. Coroner Wally Fox took the notes.

A .38 cal. revolver was discovered in Middleton's coat pocket.

Deputies said a piece of cardboard had been wedged under the gas feed to keep the engine running.

LAST CONTACT

Mrs. Russell Hind, a neighbor of the Middletons, reportedly was the last to see the couple. She said they told her about 4:30 p. m. they were "going to eat."

Deputies were summoned to the Middleton home by housekeeper Mary M. Davidson. She said she found a suicide and instruction note. The note assertedly indicated the couple had gone to Dana Point to end their lives.

A nurse, Dorothy Bunge, had been told by her employers to take off early Friday.

The couple reportedly was dependent over ill-health.

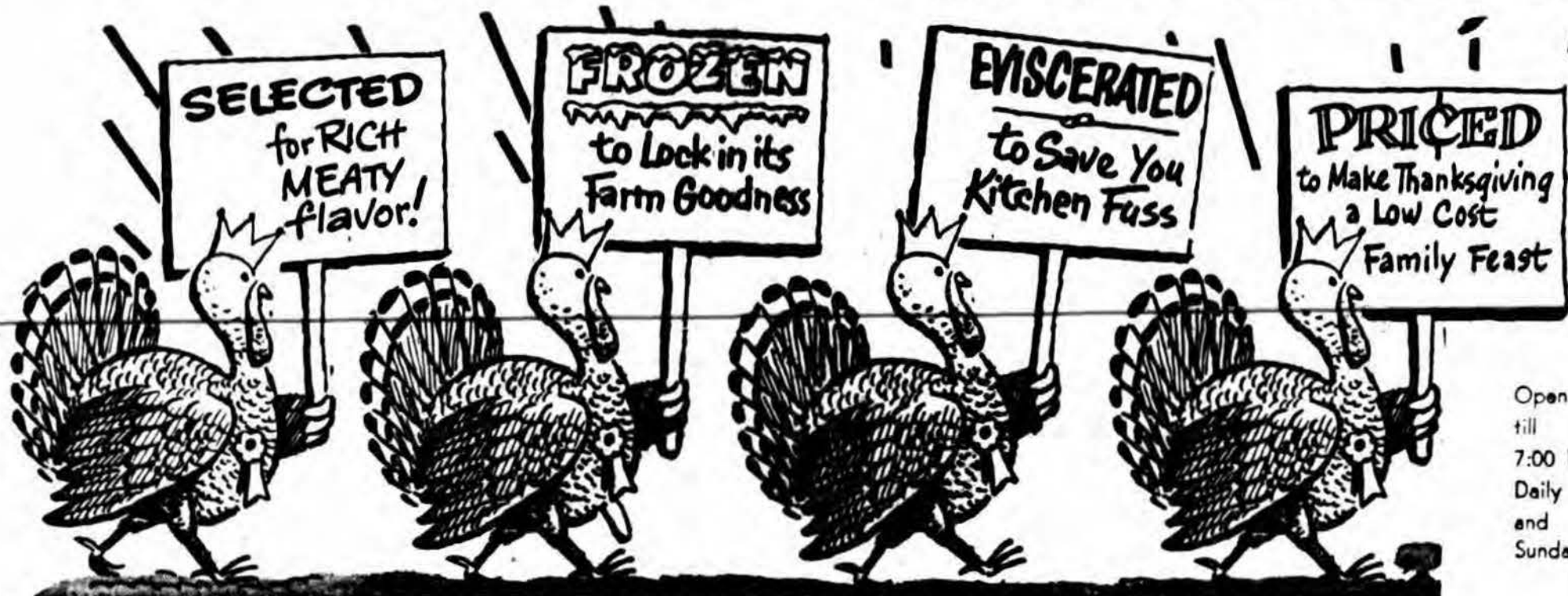
