And Donald Dungan, Costa Mesa's representative on the board of trustees for the Newport Harbor Union High School District, criticized Newport Beach elementary school officials for not "nipping the transfer proposal in the bud.

Newport Beach school officials said they had no voice in the matter because school boundary transfers lie within the responsibilities of the county board of supervisors.

Dr. Daniel Maurice Cohen, testifying in the trial of Jack Allan Gill, 25, and Raye Sarant, 30, both of Costa Mesa, said injuries received by Mrs. Sarant's daughter Norine could have been fatal if they had not been corrected.

Dr. Cohen said the injury was highly unusual and that he had never seen or read of such an injury occurring to children. The injury was caused by an externely sharp

caused by an externely sharp blow or blows, he said.

Gill and Mrs. Sevent are being tried on seven counts of contributing to the delinquents of a misior under a section of the Health and Safety Code which states lack of proper care or providing a fit place to raise children is construed as contributing to the delinquency of the child.

An earlier charge of felony child beating against the couple was dropped when Mrs. Sarant took the Fifth Amendment and released to testify beating of the child.

Southland Building To Boom

Nearly \$60 billion of construction will be necessary during the next 15 years to sustain the population growth of Southern California, according to W. D. Shaw, manager of the Southern California chapter of Associated General Contractors.

Shaw said about half this amount will be required for housing, the other half going for support of public works construction.

Under the public works category are such requirements as streets and highways, water supply, sanitation, education, parks and playgrounds, public buildings, communications, and heat and power facilities.

"Estimates, which we believe are reliable, place the population of the metropolitain area at 12.5 million by the year 1980, as compared with 7.5 million now," said Shaw. "This indicates an increase of 5 million during the 17-year period.

"If these figures are any where near accurate, the indications are that construction will continue to be one of the op ranking industries in Southern California for many years to come

Shaw estimated the amount of construction required would provide roughly 1.25 billion man days of employment during the 15-year period, or 82 million man days per year in out and off-site construction payroll.





Teaching Sex Facts

By NORMAN NIXON, M.D. A few weeks ago 125 ministers, priests, and rabbis attended the Presbyterian Medical Center's annual interdenominational conference in San Francisco. The conference subject was "The Unwed Mother". A number of physicians, most of them psychiatrists and obstetricians, participated in the discussion.

SINCE ONE out of every 11 babies born last year in San Francisco was illegitirith even a mother in cidence in other sections of the country, the clergymen were rightly concerned with the magnitude of this ever-increasing problem. They learned from sociological studies that girls and women of all ages, from 12 to over 40, have become mothers illegitimately, and that data concerning their economic level, degree of intelligence, race and religious background showed that "it could happen to anyone.

One Presbyterian minister said: "Our schools are spending fantastic sums on driver education and nothing on marital education; yet it's driver education that puts wheels under the teen-ager's bedroom".

MOST OF THE clergymen present agreed with one of the Catholic priests who said a prime responsibility of the church is to encourage parents to teach their children the sexual facts of life, beginning as early as they are able to absorb it and continuing until they are married. But a Baptist minister pointed out that too many parents do not know enough about the facts of life themselves to be adequate teachers. Others felt that many par-ents fail in passing along sexual information to their children because of a "cloud of puritanical anx-

Countless parents, without realizing what they are doing, are pushing their daughters into earlier sexual activity. Encouraged to be popular, the girl quite prematurely wants boy, and boy wants sex. But if the girl becomes pregnant, everyone is appalled.

CERTAINLY, American teen-agers today begin dating earlier than ever before. And with early dating, particularly if it leads to going steady, comes premature necking and ' ploration." The committee conducted its own hearings, and issued an unfavorable report. Stennis and other commit-teemen were among the leaders of the unavailing fight to reject the pact.

STRONG ARMY OPPO-SITION - Particularly disturbing these senators is the fact that under Rusk's proposal, Senste approval would not be necessary to put it into effect.

Under a ruling by the State Department's legal officer, the Senate could be bypassed on the ground this was an exchange of insimilar to other agreements of that kind between the U.S. and Russia.

These include various "cultural" exchanges, and the recent understandings the exchange of information obtained from weather and communications satellites. None of these hilateral accords has been submitted to the Senate, and no challenge of that has been raised.

BUT SENATE Preparedness committee men view Rusk's unannounced "life" ogy-for-peace research plan as falling into an en-tirely different "exchange" category. They consider that a far-reaching disarmament move definitely requires Senate considera-

That's why they deem it essential to be kept fully informed of what is transpiring to ensure that the Senate is not ignored.

A key factor behind this demand is the Army's great alarm over the plan. Chemical warfare experts bluntly view Rusk's socalled "research ex-

change" move as opening the way for the Soviet's obtaining vital information that could be used with le-

thal effect against this country in the future.

THESE AUTHORITIES are especially disturbed about certain provisions in Rusk's proposal under which the Russians could learn much about U.S. counter biological warfare measures. This country is further advanced in this crucial field than the So-viet.

Also being stressed by the Army is the high importance the Reds attach to chemical warfare.

It is pointed out that at least 15 per cent of the munitions in the hands of Russian troops in Europe are chemical and biolog-ical. Also that Russian troops are well trained and equipped in this type of

U.S. policy is to resort to gas and germ warfare only if it is used by an enemy. That was laid down by the late President Roosevelt in 1943, and has been continued by Pres-Sents Truman, Eisenhower

have developed methods of spreading a number of deadly diseases, including plague, anthrax, tularemia, psittacosis, bacillary dysentery, acute brucellosis, and human glanders. The Soviet is not deemed to have adequate defenses against latest U.S. gasses and germs.

FOREIGN FLASHES -During Marshal Tito's White House talks, he told President Kennedy that Premier Khrushchev's choice as his successor is Leonid Brezhnev, president of the U.S.S.R. According to Tito, after Khrushchev dies or is ousted, his job probably will be split up, with the attendership going to Breziney, and the crucial post of Secretary of the Communist Party to someone else. Tito was significantly silent on who he might be; whether he didn't know or didn't want to say was not indicated.

Meet the People...



First the

Seed'

Nearly a quarter-century ago, Majorie Beach came to Laguna Beach to make a new life for herself. In Missouri she left behind the memories of another full, rich life with her late husband, Albert Beach, mayor of Kansas City in the thirties.

Next month Mrs. Beach celebrates two auspicious occasions; she will be 78 years old and will see her second book, "First the Seed," on book store shelves.

"When my husband died it seemed much of me died too," Mrs. Beach reflected. "I felt so lost until one day when I sat alone in our home waiting for an auctioneer to come and list the furnishings that were to be sold.

"Then my husband's old chauffeur came for a final visit. He brought with him maps from my basband's done at city hall and a small cloth bag.

"Mis' Beach," he said, "the mayor was awful fond of looking at these maps and planning a second honeymoon 'round the world with you. He sure loved these maps."

"I took the maps and looked at the black crayon marks my husband had made — France, Malta, Egypt, Burma, China — the heavy underlining showed the course he had planned," Mrs. Beach

"I looked up at Henry Clay, the chauffeur, and asked what was

in the small cloth bag."

"Why, that's sorghum corn seed. That's Henry's contri-bution to that trip around the world. Mis' Beach. I gave them seeds to your husband some time back and he chuckled when I told him to plant 'em along the trail around the world as sort of a little advertising for Missouri. Now, you take the sorghum with you. He would tell you to do this, Mrs. Beach. Don't disappoint him."

So Mrs. Beach made the trip, planting the seed wherever she could. In her book she tells about the trip, in a leisurely, fascinating style, enlivened by humor, in the world as she saw it in 1939.

Although a book of travel written from her diary of the late thirties and two years in the actual writing, it is more than just another travel guide. It is also the story of the advent of World War II and has historical significance in this respect. Only a handful of travelers began the world tour with Mrs. Beach, as even then, murmurs of war were heard. As the tour progressed, so did the threat of actual war, culminating in the terrifying blackout in Shanghai when Great Britain and France declared war on Germany.

A native Kansan, Mrs. Beach graduated from the University of Kansas more than half-century ago. As a teenager, she studied voice in Paris with Monsieur Chevalier. Her book also makes the comparisons of Paris in 1904 and 1939.

A son, Marshall Beach, is an attorney in Laguna; her daughter, Mrs. Charles Arnold, resides in Kansas City.

"The experiences of the trip helped to heal my heart," Mrs. Beach said. "My hope is that this book will show all those who have lost a loved one that they are still needed. No matter where they are - at home or abroad, on a farm or in a city - there are lonely people waiting for their love. They will find it if they have hope and faith."

Mrs. Beach's other book, "The Mayor's Wife: Crusade in

Kansas City," was published in 1953.

And what of the future for this lady who will be an octo-

genarian in two years?

"I hope to live out my life here by the sea, doing what I can to help those I know and meet, in finding new hope and love in life", Mrs. Beach said.



Growing house plants successfully seems to depend primarily on two factors — light and proper watering. Commonly more plants die from over-watering than any other cause, even lack of water. Some plants, in fact, prefer the soil a little on the dry side and Cordyline Stricta, Dracaena Marginata, Aralia Elegantissima, Croton and the Palm Family are in this group.

A well lighted location is necessary to most house plants but not where the sun beats in through glass. This, naturally can damage foilage severly in a very short time.

Planting mix for indoor plantings is ready-mixed and contains peat, leaf mold, horticultural charcoal, sponge rock, and all ingredients necessary for growing a healthy plant. Feeding once a month with plant-tabs or liquid fish is advisable to keep your plants happy.

One thing more. Don't shift your house plants outside for a breather. This can be fatal to some—especially the diffen-bachia family. Sun or too much wind can destroy the foilage in just a few hours time so leave them in their natural environment — in the house.



Garden Notes



Ferns

Ferns, with their cool yet tropical appearance, make nice garden subjects whether grown in the ground or in pots. Tree ferns in particular add a lush look to a sarden setting.

There are two basic patterns of growth in ferns. In one type, the fronds — fern leaves are called fronds — come from a single growing point as in the tree fern. The other type of fern has its fronds come up from a wandering root or rhizome. Consequently, there is no central crown to the plant and the clump gets larger and larger as the rhizomes spread in all directions. Some varieties grow so rapidly and send up their fronds at some distance from the starting point that they become a pest.

Ferns do best in shade where they are moist but not wet. In other words, use a porous mix in planting such as leafmold, redwood sawdust, or firbark so that the water drains well yet the organic material will retain moisture.


The most popular of the house ferns is the sword fern in many varieties, among which is the Boston. These were immensely popular 90 years ago but have lost ground lately to philodendrons and flowering plants such as African Violets.

Some of the Boston ferms — Smithit for example — have their fronds so finely divided that the plant is like a hig ball of mist. You must be careful in watering these plants, for if these fine leaves in the center of the plant get wet they cannot dry out readily and will turn brown.


Boston ferns must be propagated vegetatively, by dividing or by pegging down one of the "feelers" they periodically throw out. If one of these long leafless stolons is secured in a pot of soil by a piece of wire it will soon root and form a new plant. When it is growing well the stolon can be cut separating the new plant from the mother plant.

Another popular fern for baskets is the hare's foot or rabbit's foot fern, Dayallia canariensis. This fern has a frond much like a carrot leaf and has a creeping rhizome that winds around the basket in which it is planted. The end of the rhizome is hairy and resembles a rabbit's foot, hence its name.







Acoustical Ceilings Help Muttle Noise

No one likes to live in a noisy environmente it's hard on the ears, hard on the nerves, and worst of all, hard on the family's disposition.

Unfortunately many of us do live under such conditions whether we realize it or not. Our homes are filled with practically every type of noisemaker imaginable, including chimes, bells, buzzers, grinders, mixers, motors and pumps.

Acoustical tiles are able to achieve this effect because of their low-density, fibrous composition, and the small openings across the tile face. Sound entering through these openings is absorbed into the porous material and immediately dissipated. Reflection in the room is cut sharply, and sounds are much easier to distinguish from one another.

In addition to their noise quieting ability, modern acoustical materials also provide new beauty for the home. From the many different patterns and designs available today, the home owner can choose precisely the right pattern to fit her decorating plan. If necessary, acoustical tiles can even be repainted without affecting their noise quieting efficiency.

Another advantage of acoustical materials is that they can be used to cover ceilings when redecorating without the usual mess and bother of the old-fashioned repair mehods. Costs for an average 12' x 15' room run as low as \$45 including all necessary tile and lhstallation materials.





For Young Homemakers

Some hints for young homemakers who are furnishing and decorating their first apartment or home, come from Charlotte Brown, a National Society of Interior Designers member.

"In the choice of furniture, a key solution for most pleasing effects is having the heights of furniture and objects against a wall broken into thirds. Furniture one of two-thirds the height of a room is more interesting than if broken to half the height, an arrangement too even and monotonous to the eye," Mrs. Brown explained.

"Other rules to follow are: a table beside a sofa should be the same height as the sofa's arms. Therefore, to achieve the necessary proportions, the lamps or wall objects behind the table can achieve the needed two-thirds. The average ceiling today varies between 93 and 96 inches, and if your ceiling is higher, your furniture or objects must be proportionately higher.

"The average height of a sofa back is 28-30 inches. A wall treatment above a sofa should equal, approximately, the two-thirds balance of the wall height.

"High pieces of furniture are in another category. They are part of a room's architecture and, therefore, are guided by the heights of doors and windows. For example, a breakfront should be approximately the height of the doors, or if built-in as part of the wall, can go to the ceiling.

"Dining tables vary from 24 to 31 inches in height. The lower informal chair and table give a ceiling a higher look because they're placed in the middle of the floor and form a plateau.

"Coffee tables are the same height as a sofa seat for comfort. Tables in front of seating pieces should be the same height as the seat before sitting on it.

"The width of a furniture piece should be controlled by the size of a wall, but the color can make it look bulkier or smaller. A chair covered in a red fabric will appear much larger than the same chair covered in a soft blue. In fact, color can be proportioned visually to enlarge a room, or make it appear smaller," according to Mrs. Brown.

She believes today's new homemakers owe a vote of thanks to the late Willis H. Carrier, inventor of air conditioning, for greater freedom in use of space, fabrics and colors.

The central air conditioning system, with unobtrusive air outlet grille on the wall, does not conflict with the furnishings for space. And the clean-liness of a home in which all air is passed through filters six times an hour, summer and winter, allows light colors in walls and fabrics, and more delicate textiles which need not undergo frequent cleaning.

For the home with a room air conditioner, Mrs. Brown prefers the most unobtrusive grille possible, such as the "mandarin bronze" metal mesh featured in the new Carrier window units.
