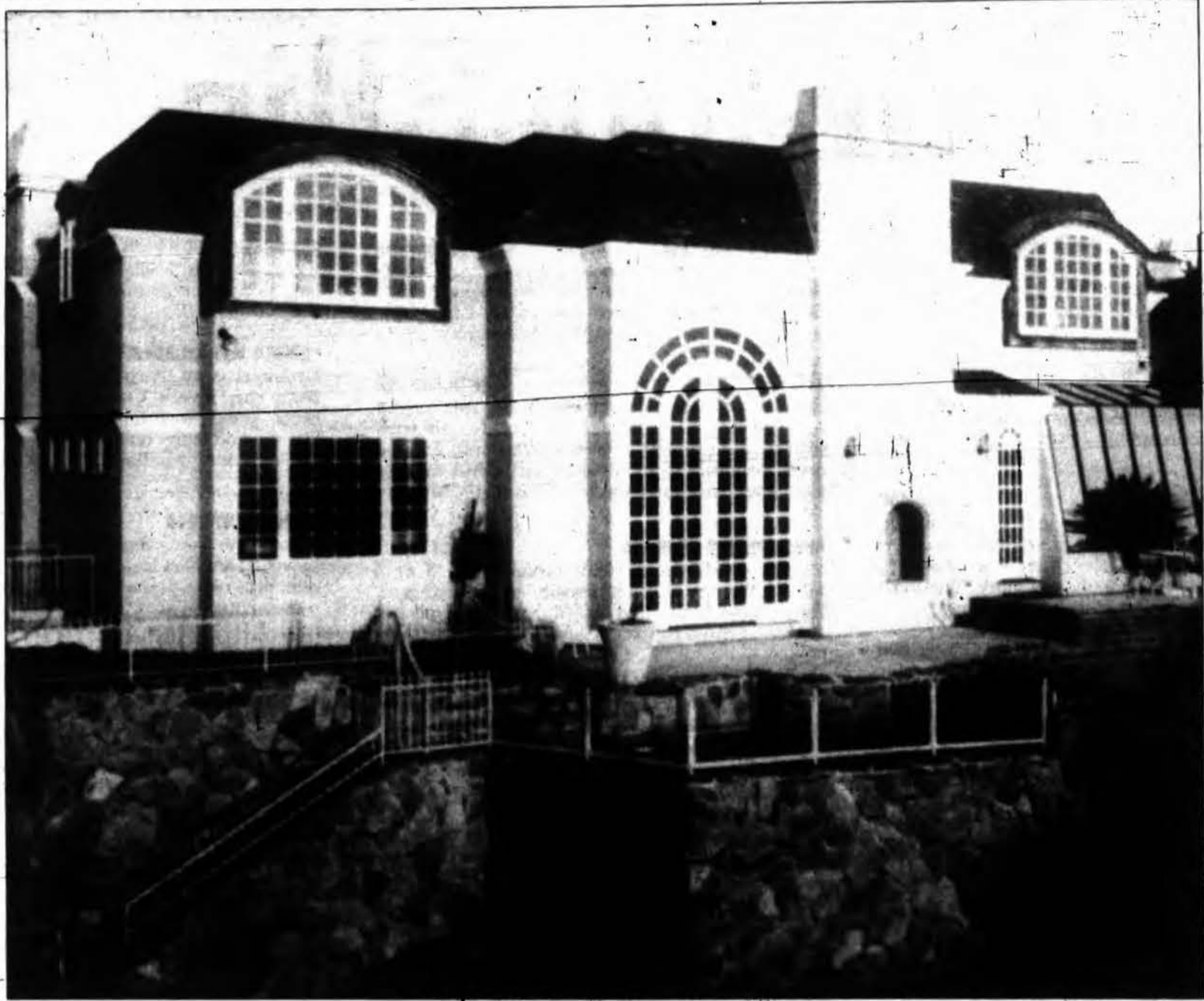

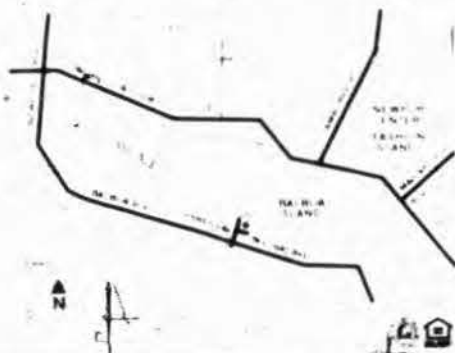

Convert existing closet for maximum efficiency, increased storage area

Easy, do-it-yourself project requires no special skills while offering organization

How often have you found yourself plowing through an overcrowded closet only to find the skirt or pair of slacks you were looking for has been crushed and is now too wrinkled to wear?

Households which always seem to run smoothly, with everything in its place and a place for everything, have one common feature: Well-planned storage.

Fortunately, existing storage space can easily be made more efficient and more spacious. At the same time, an existing closet can be converted into a moth-repellent storage center. It's a do-it-yourself project with no special carpentry skills needed.

Before starting the remodeling project, determine exactly what will be stored in the closet. Then, make the most of the space available. Two parallel horizontal rods, for example, can provide double the amount of hanging area for suits and pants than a single rod in the same space.

A bank of shelves, used for shoes, sweaters and other folded clothes, and shelves on top of the hangar bars provide additional storage in areas once considered "dead space." Each individual's belongings and lifestyle help determine

the size and arrangement of the closet areas.

Once a plan for the existing space has been made, measure the walls, ceiling, floor and the inside of the door to determine the amount of aromatic red cedar material needed to make the closet moth-repellent.

Available at lumber yards and home centers, cedar lining for this purpose comes in convenient strip form with tongue-and-groove edges and ends for easy, sturdy installation. It is available in bundles or cartons, in random or uniform lengths.

The cedar pieces are installed horizontally over existing walls, starting at the floor with the groove side down. Additional boards are added, row by row, until the wall is covered. The interlocking of the cedar's tongue-and-groove edges assures a tight fit. For maximum moth-repellency, line the floor, ceiling and back of the door using the same procedure.

Next, add the shelves and hanger bars. The end result: A sweet-smelling storage space that repels destructive moths and eliminates closet clutter.

REACHING OUT TO THE SMALLEST PATIENTS

A visit to a ward for critically ill newborns — with a doctor who cares.

Dr. K. is a soft-spoken man with sandy hair, a sparse beard, steel-rimmed glasses, and rough skin. He inspires confidence not by the arrogant theatrics that some doctors affect but by his obvious thoughtfulness. Reflection and care are qualities inherent in his personality, but they have been strengthened by years of decision making. Dr. K. is a neonatologist, a doctor specializing in the care of newborn babies, and associate director of the neonatal intensive care unit at a large metropolitan medical center.

Like many fields of medicine today, neonatology is developing so rapidly that the profession is reeling from the changes. Doctors are saving premature and critically ill babies in numbers undreamed of a decade or two ago. In his book *Playing God in the Nursery*, journalist Jeff Lyon points out that 25 years ago, the mortality rate for babies weighing less than 3 pounds 5 ounces was 70 percent. Today between 60 and 70 percent born at this weight survive. Many of these infants, however, are severely retarded, deformed or crippled. Advances in the care of newborns are creating moral and ethical dilemmas that even a young physician such as Dr. K., who is 40, could not have anticipated when he was in medical school.

Dr. K.'s intensive care unit (ICU), which treats some 900 critically ill newborns a year, has one of the lowest infant ICU mortality rates in the country, and yet inevitably with children of this degree of illness, some die. And some are allowed to die. When — and whether — a desperately ill infant should be allowed to die is one of the most vexing questions facing society today. Over the past three years, two controversial "Baby Doe" cases, each involving an infant born with severe birth defects, have brought these issues to the courts and, via the media, into every household. For Dr. K., these matters are, if not daily occurrences, considerations that underlie his entire professional life. He agreed to talk to *FAMILY WEEKLY* about the ethical problems and emotional difficulties of being in the position of "playing God." He asked that his name not be used, to protect the privacy of his patients.

The nursery where Dr. K. works is on a locked floor marked No Admittance, and one gains entrance only after pressing a buzzer and being approved by way of a closed circuit TV system. Visitors don surgical gowns, remove watches and jewelry,

and scrub with Betadine.

The nursery consists of five glassed-in areas, each containing five or six incubators and bassinets. The sixth room, the critical care area, has 12 "beds." These are open warming tables where the smallest and most critically ill babies lie naked and exposed — a matter of necessity for nurses and doctors who require immediate access to their tiny patients.

The whole area is brightly lit and warm, bustling with the tidy, quiet movements of nurses and doctors going about their routines. Despite the undeniable presence of a welter of tubes, monitors and bandages, the babies seem serene. They sleep, most of them, and those who are awake gaze about them. Some have pacifiers, some have stuffed animals or colorful signs on their cribs; all have pink or blue tags giving their names and birthdates, just as they would in the well-baby nursery downstairs.

But they are very small. And they are very thin. A premature baby is about the length of a full-term baby, but without the fat that is put on in the last weeks of pregnancy. Some breathe laboriously, the result of immature lungs; some twitch spasmodically because their nervous systems are not yet developed. One baby born addicted to methadone cries piteously, a high-pitched wail. Dr. K. checks his chart to see if he is being given enough Phenobarbital to ease his withdrawal from the drug. He is one of the few babies in the nursery who is crying. Dr. K. says that unless they have undergone surgery, the babies rarely seem to be in pain.

For Dr. K. this is an off-duty visit, so

he is free to talk. What does it mean to be a neonatologist in these difficult times? "Historically, the pediatrician has considered himself to be the child's advocate," he says. "The obstetrician has the mother's best interests at heart, but the pediatrician wants what is best for the baby." Sometimes what is best for the baby is not easy to determine. How do you weigh the value of life per se against the quality of life? "It's difficult," he acknowledges.

There rarely comes a point when Dr. K. feels a baby is sick beyond hope. But this situation can arise. "The pediatrician finds it very difficult to say to himself, much less to anyone else, that he's just going to back off." That decision, Dr. K. says, paradoxically becomes harder with experience. "You can better identify kids that have a chance versus those who don't, which should make the decision clearer. On the other hand, experience allows you to see more kids that you were wrong about — kids you thought wouldn't make it, who did."

Dr. K. had one such case early in his medical career. "I was a young doctor, at another hospital. A baby was born 14 weeks early and weighed less than 2 pounds. He'd been mismanaged at birth and came to us after he'd been severely asphyxiated and had suffered intracranial hemorrhage [bleeding in the brain, which often results in death or permanent brain damage]. He was on a respirator with no spontaneous breathing or any other kind of spontaneous activity for a week. Finally, at my urging, everyone agreed we should stop. So we disconnected the respirator, at which time he started breathing." He shrugs,

helplessly. "The baby didn't turn out to be a vegetable. He's not institutionalized. He is blind, and he has a severe hearing difficulty, and he has moderate but not devastating cerebral palsy. But he is not spending his life lying in a bed."

"The overwhelming majority of the babies in our [neonatal] nursery, 90 percent, are premature," Dr. K. goes on. "The babies range in age from 36 weeks gestational age down to 25 or 26 weeks." Twenty-six weeks is 14 weeks premature. Below that age a baby is generally considered too young to survive, but there are a few who make it. These exceptions mean that there really are no rules. For instance, a baby born at 26 weeks usually weighs about 2 pounds, but one baby born at Dr. K.'s hospital who weighed only 450 grams — less than a pound — is now 3½ years old and "doing well." Although very small, the baby was probably 28 to 30 weeks old at birth. Dr. K. explains: "Between 26 and 28 weeks, statistically, survivorship jumps from between 2 and 3 percent to 40 percent. We don't know why. We don't know exactly what happens developmentally. It seems to be a combination of things — development of the lungs, the liver, the immune system, the renal system [the kidneys]."

This increase of survivorship is a key element in decisions about treating premature babies. Pediatricians may never even see a baby born at 25 weeks because, Dr. K. says, the obstetrician who delivers it decides it can't live and opts for "what we call benign neglect, though it's really malicious neglect." What kind of neglect? "Some of the monitoring techniques might not be used. The baby certainly would not be put on a respirator. We don't argue at 25 weeks if the obstetrician decides against measures, but at 26 weeks we begin to get uncomfortable. And because of that sharp statistical rise in survivorship, establishing the true age of the baby can prove crucial. But there are still mistakes in dating of pregnancies."

When Dr. K. is called in at the time of a very premature birth or the birth of a damaged baby, he and the parents have traditionally made a decision about treatment that is based on various factors. One is whether the baby has any hope of surviving. Another is whether the baby has any hope of surviving intact. "There are medical options,

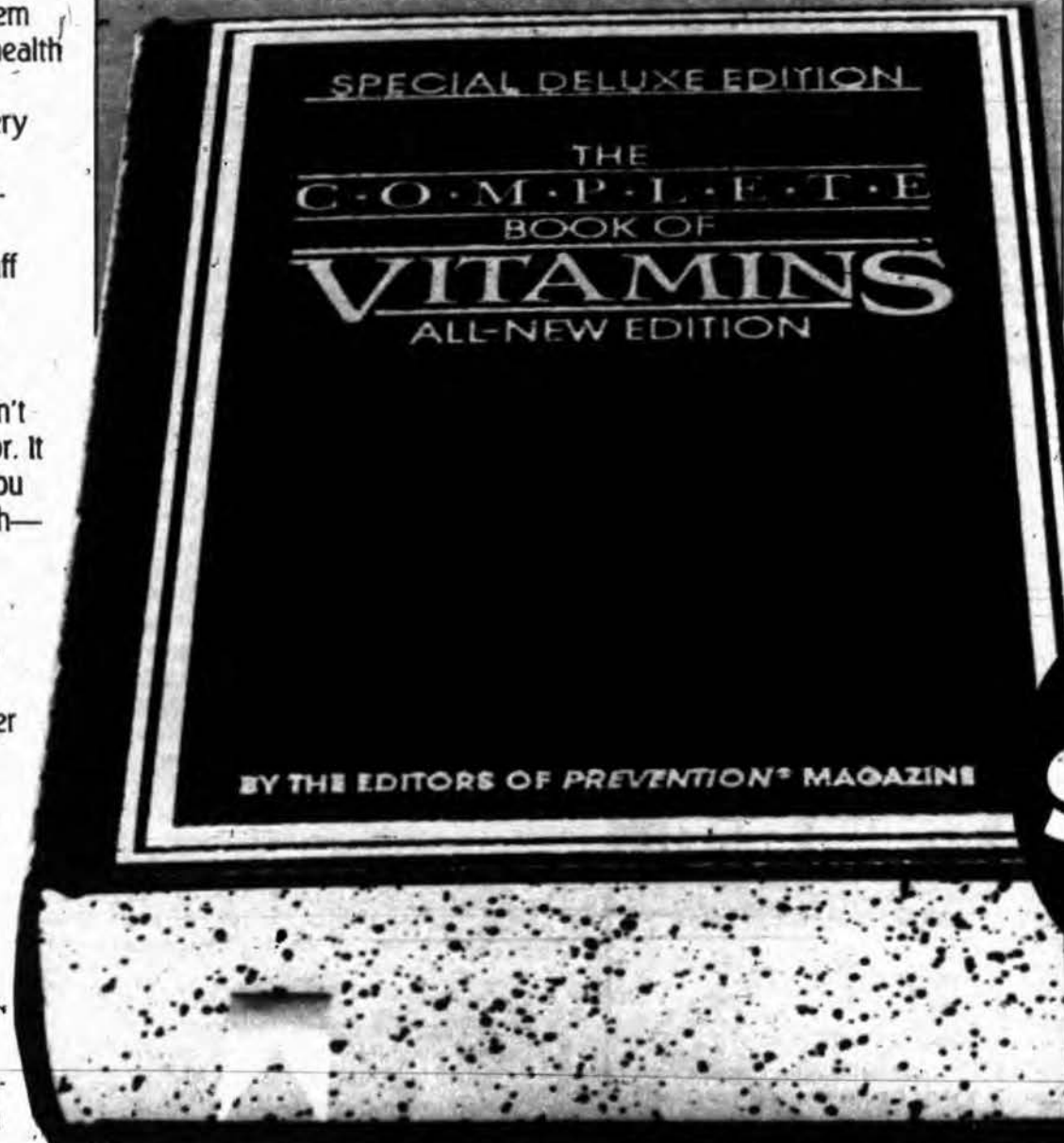

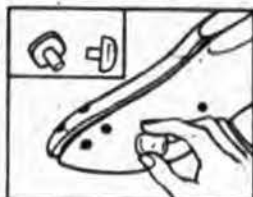

measures that may or may not be taken, based on our estimate of the expected mortality and morbidity. These include surgical procedures, respirator care, some therapeutic techniques like white blood cell transfusions to fight infections. What we would never not do for a baby — even a baby with a congenital anomaly who has only a week or a month to live — is deny him a place to live and something to eat."

As most people now know, these basics sometimes have been denied. One of the Baby Does, an infant boy born in 1982 in Bloomington, Ind., with Down's Syndrome and an intestinal blockage, needed either corrective surgery or intravenous feeding in order to live. His parents refused both, and six days later the baby died of a combination of starvation and dehydration. The case came to the attention of the federal government after Indiana's highest court found that the parents and hospital had been acting within their legal rights. The other Baby Doe case involved a little girl known publicly as "Jane" who was born in Port Jefferson, N.Y. "Jane" was suffering from myelomeningocele (a severe form of spina bifida), congenital hydrocephalus (excess fluid on the brain), and a host of complications.

Her parents, who initially signed a consent form for corrective operations, decided instead to pursue a "conservative" course of medical treatment, which consisted of feedings, antibiotics and hygienic care of the baby's exposed spinal sac. A right-to-life lawyer filed suit in the New York courts to force the surgery. But the New York Court of Appeals ruled that "Jane's" parents were not required to permit the surgery. In the end, however, the parents allowed doctors to perform an operation to relieve her hydrocephalus. A recent, public prognosis of her future condition was uncertain.

As a result of both the Baby Doe and Baby Jane Doe cases, the federal government instituted regulations governing care of newborns, now revised as an amendment to the federal child abuse statutes, which specify that a baby must be treated — regardless of the doctor's prognosis and the parents' wishes — unless it is irreversibly comatose, or unless the treatment would merely prolong dying or would not contribute to prolonging the infant's life. The rules specifically prohibit "quality of life" considerations.

Dr. K. feels that the rules may be workable — but only if decisions about what constitutes "irreversibly comatose," for instance, are based on a doctor's assessment rather than test results. Tests rarely predict anything with 100 percent certainty — and often produce results far short of that.

Still, he says, "I really, emotionally, in a way agree with the way the law reads this time — moving away from the con-

cept of the quality of life. That concern makes me uncomfortable. Who am I to judge what the quality of life is?"

Dr. K. says he errs on the conservative side, opting for treatment where it might be better to let well enough alone. And he sees the same kind of behavior in many parents.

"We have a case now in the pediatric ICU," he says, "a baby who's been here six months and who has a degenerative neurological disease. She has been on a respirator repeatedly. She's 3 years old, and there is little hope she will stabilize, but the neurologists, since they can't

identify the disease, say they can't be 100 percent sure she will die. She doesn't respond to anybody, doesn't see, can't eat by mouth, can't hear. The case was brought before the [hospital's] Ethics Committee, who said it was the parents' decision to make. They decided to hang on." Dr. K. is not unaware of the argument against keeping such a child alive for so many months: She is taking up a critical care bed in the ICU, that might well have been denied to another baby who could live with the proper ICU care. (Nobody yet knows how the new federal regulations will impinge on this crucial question of allocation of scarce resources.) Her medical bills are astronomical and, since this is a Medicaid case, are being paid by the public. Still, he supports the parents' decision. "I think the parents are getting some... profitable experiences out of it. In this case we're treating the parents. We really take care of the parents emotionally. It's as much a part of the job as caring for the babies."

As we talk and walk around the ICU, Dr. K. touches a baby here, checks a chart there, stops to ask a nurse about progress and setbacks. The faces of these babies are beautiful, recovered from the trauma of childbirth, perfect infant faces with round cheeks and pursed lips. Dr. K. encourages the parents to visit, and says that they almost always find the sight of the babies comforting. Grandparents and siblings are also allowed to come, and mothers are encouraged to feed the babies if possible. Normality and the future are emphasized.

In the same way that the routine is reassuring, the workaday practicality of the situation also makes questions about "playing God" seem melodramatic and remote. Dr. K. is involved in the practice of healing. "Do no harm," says the Hippocratic Oath. And even though life-and-death decisions are made here, they are made with humility and conscience. FW

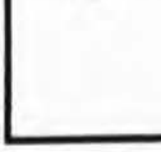

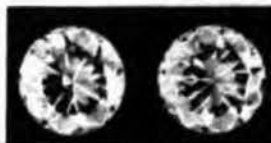

LETTERS FROM AN EARTHQUAKE

April 21, 1906

Dear Friend Ethel:

Only to say that I am safe and with friends. Lost my home, but saved many of my things and most of my clothing. Too early to make definite plans; will remain here for some days.

The fear of an epidemic is present, but I hardly think it will reach large proportions. Relief is coming in nicely. Two-thirds of the city, and that the best part, is burned. The earthquake was terrific, and nearly every building was more or less damaged. It happened about 5:15 Wednesday morning, and many were caught in their beds and either killed or wounded. Many have been shot by soldiers since for different reasons. Don't worry about me. I will get along somehow.

"Dear Friend Ethel" did not hear from her cousin again for several days. On May 1, he wrote:

Your letter reached me today, and I hasten to answer. No doubt ere this you have received my note or postal (I forget which I sent) telling of my safety.

I cannot describe the sights here — they are way beyond me and, I believe, anyone else. It is something I never wish to pass through again, yet I am glad that I was permitted to take part in it.

As I watched the city burning from my out-of-doors bed on the ground in Jefferson Square the first night, I recalled a picture I once beheld entitled "The Destruction of Rome." The sight was both wonderful and awful.

The earthquake . . . certainly was a good one. I truly expected to be shaken from my bed. As I went downtown, the streets were strewn with bricks, stones and debris of various kinds.

Ambulances and express wagons were hurrying away with the dead and wounded. Heavy fires were raging south of Market Street. I went to the Club [California Camera Club] and secured my cameras and took them to my rooms, some six blocks away; later I made two more trips. I was the last to leave the building, and I closed the window to keep the heat from the fire outside away from me while I tied up a package. The Club rooms were a sight — a complete wreck from the earthquake.

At midnight I saw my own rooms were doomed and finally succeeded in getting my trunks taken to Jefferson Square, eight blocks away, by paying ten dollars for the service. I saved one old and one good suit and left many things in my room.

The following day I had the trunks taken to where I am now, with friends, near the Golden Gate Park. As the fire still came on, we were prepared to flee into the park or to the Cliff House Beach, but finally the fire was stopped at Van Ness Avenue, and we breathed easier. I am a loser, but far better

On May 9, Hoyt informed his cousin he would be forwarding photos showing the damage done by the earthquake, or "tremblor," as he called it.

a secure place after you have shown them to members of your group.

We are beginning to feel quite at home again, but to be sure, things will never be as they were. The map of the city is undergoing a great change, and it looks odd to see the signs of the once great and prosperous downtown stores now occupying hastily constructed one-story rough buildings on side streets far from the business center.

There is plenty of activity in the burned district, and thousands of men are busy cleaning away the debris; tracks are being laid in the streets to enable trains to be run in so that four square miles of wreckage can be hauled away.

Fortunately, the fire was kept from destroying the waterfront, although the ferry building and several of the piers suffered badly by the big tremblor. I was over on the Mission District yesterday, and some of the buildings there are a sight; the one that fared the worst [was] the Valentia Hotel, where 200 or more people lost their lives. The earth opened up and swallowed the first story, and the second story gave way to the third.

It makes one sick to look over that vast area and to think of the loss and suffering it stands for.

The continuation of the quakes naturally causes uneasiness, and people hardly know what to do. Last night, as I was about to retire, we were visited by a fairly hard tremblor — about the 105th since the big one of the 18th hit. These tend to make folks restless, and there are many who have not slept in a bed since that memorable morning; they want to be ready to quit wherever they are staying at a moment's notice.

San Francisco was not the only place to suffer. Santa Rosa, the home of Luther Burbank, was badly shaken up and afterward suffered heavily by fire. Stanford University, too, was hard hit, and several of those beautiful buildings must be rebuilt, the memorial chapel being one of them. And there are other towns both north and south of us who can reckon their losses far into

I have no definite plans yet, but I shall remain here for a while.

In the weeks that followed, Hoyt, who died in 1961 at the age of 93, penned three more letters to his cousin in the Granite State. The last one, written on June 25, told details of an encounter he had with his former landlady and her husband.

Dear Friend Ethel:

Instead of writing letters yesterday, as was my intention, I strolled out through the park to the beach, stopping at times to look at refugee camps, the new home for thousands of sufferers.

On the trip, I met my former landlady and her husband, the first I had seen of them since the night we were forced to vacate the house. They, like everyone else, had their experience and saved only what they could load onto a bicycle and wheelbarrow.

Mr. Miller, the following day, left his wife to guard their meager possessions in the small park where they had found refuge and then started to push his bicycle, which was loaded with belongings, to Golden Gate Park. He got near, only five blocks from the park, when his

strength gave out, and he said he leaned up against a corner drugstore and cried.

The druggist looking out saw him, invited him in, gave him a tonic, and told him to rest for a while. After a while, Mr. Miller was able to continue on his way to a place where he stored all that was on the bicycle. He was able to ride his wheel back and rejoin his wife in the park where he had left her. . . .

I shall never forget how I suffered with my three heavy packages, and how my



hands stung, so much so that I had to set the things down to rest my hands from three to four times in each block, for a distance of over two miles. Had I not met a friend, who carried two of my

packages for the last half-mile, I don't believe I would ever have gotten them there. . . .

Imagine yourself given only a few hours or even minutes in which to select what you care most to save out of a house full of possessions that has taken a lifetime to accumulate. . . .

Between the soldiers who drove people, in many cases unnecessarily so, from their homes, and the thieves in many disguises, the citizens had a hard time of it. . . .

Temporary one-story buildings are springing up like mushrooms overnight in the burned district and on Fillmore and Van Ness Avenue, the new shopping districts. Things are pretty lively. Rents all around that section have advanced tremendously, and fortunes are being made right and left by men who got in at once and leased block after block of property on which the new stores are now being built.

There is a tremendous task ahead, but I think, with a concentrated effort by all, a far more beautiful San Francisco will arise from the ashes. . . .

I can't promise now to visit New Hampshire this summer, but I am going to as soon as I can. I don't like to run away from good opportunities. I wish New Hampshire was nearer.

FROM PENNSYLVANIA

IT'S A JUNGLE OUT THERE

It's not easy being a public servant; there are so many viperous voters out there. So sighs Clark Shiffer, Pennsylvania's endangered species coordinator. Shiffer's department recently banned snake sacking, and many venomous letters have slithered into Shiffer's office in protest.

What's snake-sacking? Teams of two chase rattlesnakes around a small enclosure, scoop them up barehanded, and stuff them into a gunnysack. The first team to sack five snakes wins.

Fans say the sport is harmless and contests often raise money for community projects. Counters Shiffer, "People say, 'How can you side with the snake against the people?' But our agency has to look out for the welfare of the animal." Shiffer points out that snakes are vital in reducing the number of rodents, and the "obvious decline" in the number of timber rattlesnakes in some counties may lead to an imbalance in nature's check on the rat and mouse population.

Nevertheless, there's bound to be lots more hissing and spitting before the snake-sacking devotees are satisfied.

FROM ARKANSAS-MICHIGAN

WHEN MR. BIG IS A MS.

In this so-called post-liberation age, are there any differences between men and women worth studying further? Well, yes.

Dr. Nina Gupta and G. Douglas Jenkins of the University of Arkansas and Terry Beehr of Central Michigan University interviewed 651 workers at five companies and discovered that employees of both genders found women bosses to be "more supportive and caring" than men. And employment records revealed that male bosses evaluate female subordinates more favorably than male workers, just as female bosses "reciprocated," by rating men more favorably than women. *Hmm...*

Despite the generally favorable attitude toward female bosses, women workers still receive fewer pro-

motions. Says Nina Gupta, "While opinions [of women in positions of authority] may now be positive, actions (i.e., promotions) still follow traditional patterns." Perhaps all it would take to alter those traditions would be for "supportive and caring" bosses of both genders to make promotions by simple merit, not by sex.

Bored with cruises in the Caribbean? Does skiing in St. Moritz leave you

cold? Here's just the ticket for the jaded jet-setter: a night in the Taylors Falls, Minn., jail. Whether your confinement is solitary or you're doing time with a partner in crime, the tab is \$50.

The Historic Taylors Falls Jail was built prior to 1880,

and now that its punitive days are behind it, this snug slammer has been listed in the National Register of Historic Places. For the past four years, it has been impersonating a bed-and-breakfast lodging.

It's our conviction that a visit to the Taylors Falls Jail should be put on the 10 most-wanted list of every sophisticated traveler. But we don't want to lead the witness; just call the Minnesota Travel Information Center at 1-800-328-1461. One suggestion: You might want to pack a cake with a file in it.

What are Americans reading before they retire for the night? Or whenever they have the time? We asked a couple of folks, both reading experts.

Evelyn Wood, founder of Evelyn Wood Reading Dynamics, Salt Lake City, Utah

It has been difficult for me to do a great deal of book reading since I suffered two strokes a few years ago. I do a great deal of reading, however. In my reading courses, I have always stressed the necessity of "keeping up" — it is something most people have great difficulty doing. But I am still intent on doing this, so I consistently keep up with weekly and monthly journals and newspapers. Two I particularly enjoy are *U.S. News and World Report* and *Psychology Today*. I attribute a good deal of my recovery from the strokes to the fact that at the time they occurred, I was well-informed on treatment and resources for stroke victims because of the reading I had done.

Dr. Nancy Marshall, National Reading Conference, Homestead, Fla.

The book is *The Sword of Calandra* by Susan Dexter. I've always loved fairy tales, and these are just adult fairy tales. There's a cat in the book who has the most delightful sense of humor. He is not central to the plot — more a commentator on it. The thing I really appreciate about fantasy is that because of the simplicity of the characters the author is able to deal with some of the real truths of humanity, and of the world in general.

There's a book I've recently read in my work. It's called *Comprehensive Instruction* by Gerald Duffy, Laura Roehler and Jana Mason, and it's an absolutely fantastic book. After reading this book, one can walk into the classroom and teach someone how to think about what they read. To me this is about the most exciting professional piece of work that's come across my desk in years.

THE NEW DISC-O SOUNDS

A shimmering rainbow-hued recording played on by a laser beam. Musical reproduction as close to a live performance as anything now in existence. No clicks, pops, hisses, or rumbles. What is this phenomenon? It's the new compact disc (CD), an innovation that is revolutionizing the recording industry.

And there's more good news. With an LP, the music is literally carved into the vinyl — all those grooves you see. Then a diamond stylus tracks along each groove, recapturing the music as best it can. Dust and scratches mar the sound. So does the noise of the turntable and of the stylus dragging along the record.

A CD is something else — a product of the computer age. Marc Finer, product communications manager for CDs at Sony, explains that the surface of a CD only looks smooth. It's really pocked with 13 billion minuscule pits. As the grooves hold the music on an LP, the pits hold the music on a CD — in the form of digital code, just as a computer handles information in the form of digital code. As the stylus "reads" the grooves on an LP, a laser beam inside the CD player reads the pits on a disc.

Since only the laser beam strikes the disc, there's no wear. Just to be safe, CDs are coated with plastic to protect them from damage. There's sound on only one side of a CD. Even so, a CD will hold more than 70 minutes of music. (The industry standard: A disc must be able to hold Beethoven's entire *Ninth Symphony*, which runs about 70 minutes.)

CDs appeared in the United States two years ago, with the first CD players selling for \$900 to \$1,400, against as little as \$100 for a conventional record player. But prices of CD players have since plunged. Last year, Sony rocked the industry with a portable unit, an inch-and-a-half thick, hardly bigger than the disc itself and priced at \$299. The price of discs is coming down from \$20 two years ago to \$13 to \$15.

Representatives of Polygram Records, the unit of Philips of Holland that invented the CD, say that in 1983, 35,000 CDs were sold in the United States alone. Last year the figure grew to 200,000 — against 1 million conventional turntables. By 1986, sales of CD players are predicted to match sales of turntables.

Worldwide, some 2 million discs were sold in 1983 — against 210 million LPs and 236 million tape cassettes. But we'll probably buy 20 million discs next year.

Predicts Harry Losk, senior vice president for CD marketing at Polygram, "We think the LP, as we now know it will be virtually gone from the marketplace within five years."

There are CD units for your car, and now a machine is out that will play both CDs and video discs. By next Christmas, there will be plenty of players priced at less than \$300, says Marc Finer of Sony.

Overall, however, disc prices will be slower to slip. That's because CDs are so hot these days, producers of the discs simply can't keep up with the demand. **PW**

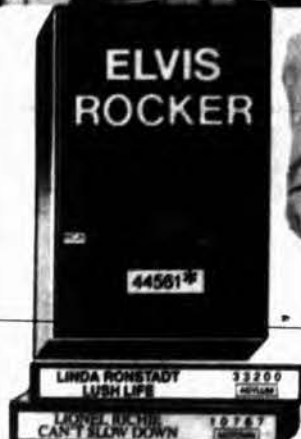

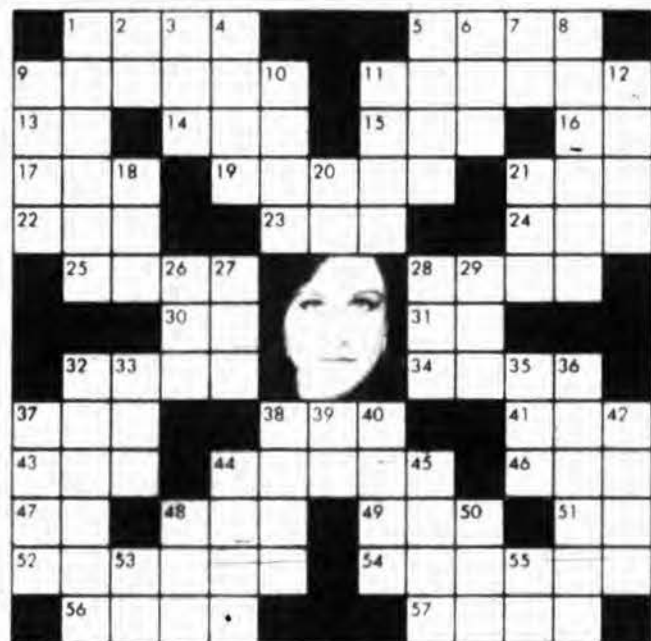

Viewers push quality TV

Women from Texas and Michigan form Nielsen 'alternate'

LOS ANGELES — In a totally unscientific poll, CBS' "Cagney & Lacey" was named the best quality drama series and NBC's "The Cosby Show" was named the best quality comedy series.

The key word was quality. The poll was conducted by Viewers for Quality Television, a grass-roots organization formed last fall to encourage better television.

The group was put together by two women who have never met. Donna Deen lives in Plano, Texas, and works in a real estate office. Dorothy Swanson is a housewife with three children who lives in Hillsdale, Mich.

"Dorothy read about me in a Detroit newspaper when I was conducting a campaign to boost the ratings of 'St. Elsewhere' in 1983," said Deen in a telephone interview. "Dorothy sent me a letter of encouragement and told me about her campaign to save 'Cagney & Lacey.'"

"We found we liked the same shows and we got to wondering if there were other people out there who also supported quality television. We organized VQT last December and we now have about 800 members around the country."

Swanson said by telephone. "What we're trying to accomplish is involving viewers of quality shows in the decision-making process at the networks. We feel the networks rely exclusively on the Nielsen numbers, with the exception of NBC. We want viewer participation and we want the networks to be more aggressive in discovering the views of the public."

But first the results of the First Annual VQT Awards:

Best quality drama series — CBS' "Cagney & Lacey."

Best lead actress, drama — Sharon Gless, "Cagney & Lacey."

Best lead actor, drama — Daniel J. Travanti, NBC's "Hill Street Blues."

Best supporting actress, drama — Veronica Hamel, "Hill Street Blues."

Best supporting actor, drama — Bruce Weitz, "Hill Street Blues."

Best quality comedy series — NBC's "The Cosby Show."

Best lead actress, comedy — Shelley Long, NBC's "Cheers."

Best lead actor, comedy — Bill Cosby, "The Cosby Show."

Best supporting actress, comedy — Rhea Perlman, "Cheers."

Best supporting actor, comedy — Nicholas Colasanto, "Cheers." (Colasanto died earlier this year.)

Deen said Viewers for Quality Television sent out 534 ballots and got 190 back.

In some categories the vote was very close, she said. "Cagney & Lacey" edged out NBC's "St. Elsewhere" by only six votes. Betty Thomas, also of "Hill Street Blues," trailed Veronica Hamel by just several votes. For lead actor in a drama series, second place was a virtual tie between William Daniels and Ed Flanders of "St. Elsewhere."

"Many members wrote that they had a very tough time choosing a favorite among favorites," she said.

Deen said the group's aim was to encourage viewers to write letters to the networks and advertisers in support of quality television.

"So many people write negative letters," she said, "but we believe they should be encouraged when they do good programs."

VQT has received notice in the press and Swanson was brought to New York in March for a one-minute segment called "What Makes Me Mad" on ABC's "Good Morning America." She talked about the Nielsen families and their influence over network programming.

"I think one drawback of the Nielsen ratings is they don't tell why people watch these programs," Swanson said. "We think viewer attitudes are equally important as passive viewing. We want to encourage shows that confront viewers and involve them emotionally and inform them."

"We're telling viewers to stop being passive and start telling the networks why they like a certain show. We're not knocking the other shows because we realize television is a mass medium. But we do want to raise the quality of television."

2 killed in fiery air show crash

Pilot, passenger killed as vintage craft plows into empty Marine base chapel

A World War II-vintage airplane that was to fly over a crowd of 200,000 attending the El Toro Marine Corps Air Station's charity air show crashed on takeoff Saturday, killing its pilot and a passenger.

The crash of the single-engine AT6-SNJ touched off a fire in the unoccupied base chapel, completely gutting the structure.

Only seconds earlier, a flower deliveryman, identified as Tustin resident Gary Downe, had left the small building, said Master Sgt. John

Michalski, the base spokesman.

The pilot of the plane was identified as Merrel Gossman, 55, of Canoga Park, a former Marine aviator who was to perform in the air show as a member of the Condor Squadron flying club.

His passenger was identified as Robert Arrowsmith, a 25-year-old Navy hospital man assigned to the base clinic, Michalski said.

Arrowsmith apparently had accepted an offer to ride along, he said.

Witnesses to the crash, which occurred at 9:38 a.m., said the plane appeared to lose power, struck some power lines and careened into the street before sliding into the base chapel.

Michalski said flight controllers reported that the plane, used as a Navy trainer during World War II, executed a left turn before stalling and falling from the sky.

Both the National Transportation Safety Board and the Federal Aviation

Administration were called in to investigate the cause of the crash. However, investigators from the two agencies could not be reached for comment.

"The plane... went straight into the church," witness Patricia Ford told a reporter shortly after the accident.

The crash site was about 1 1/2 miles from where an estimated 200,000 spectators were gathering for the 11 a.m. kickoff of the annual Navy Relief Air Show.

"At no time were the spectators at the air show in any danger and the show went on as scheduled," Michalski said.

Lt. Col. Paul Brown, commanding officer of the Marine Wing Headquarters Squadron 3, called the crash an "extreme tragedy."

"It was very sad," said base commander Brig. Gen. William Bloomer, adding that "it was the only

Schools mirror mood of nation

Dramatic shift occurs every decade or so, HB educator believes

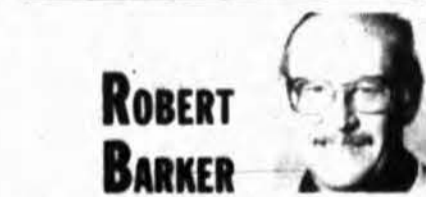
Dr. Ann Chlebicki believes that the pendulum in American education takes a dramatic and drastic turn every 10 years or so. It's her opinion that one can fathom the nation's educational priorities by looking at the president in power.

Strong on academics and strict discipline one decade, the pendulum shifts to broad choices and personalized instruction the next, said Chlebicki, who is the principal at Huntington Beach High School.

"About every 10 years we go from the 'hard stuff' to the 'soft stuff,'" she

said. "I'm not sure we're paying enough attention to the 'right stuff.'"

It's Chlebicki's contention that the "right stuff" is somewhere in the middle of the two extremes; where there's still a push for rigorous academics, and where the individual needs of the youngsters also can be met — where they can mature and where schools care for those youngsters who don't go to college.

Chlebicki said that schools today emphasize academics and a back-to-the-basics approach, reflecting the conservative mood of the people who gave President Reagan an overwhelming victory last fall.

But she's predicting that Democrats will triumph in the next election and the pendulum again will shift — back "to meet the criteria of the minorities and toward 'an era of equity.'"

It's the future of the pendulum to stop in the middle, she said, that helps to put "incredible pressures on our students."

"These 180-degree swings are not made easily by massive institutions such as school systems. Curricula

Fair board ignores residents, rejects more studies on hotel

Concludes expansion won't have negative environmental effect

Despite pressure from neighboring residents and Costa Mesa city officials, the Orange County Fair Board has refused to order more environmental studies before expanding the fairground's hotel project.

Board members voted 8-1 this week to prepare documents stating that the plan to add another 65 rooms to the 150 already proposed for the hotel will have no "significant" impact on the environment.

As part of the decision, fair officials

ruled that traffic and other problems caused by the proposed 215-room Ramada Hotel can be offset by various measures.

The dissenting vote came from board member Robert Seat, who noted that the last environmental impact report on the multi-story hotel was conducted in 1977.

Seat, reflecting the concerns of city officials and residents living near the fairgrounds, said traffic patterns and other conditions have changed since the original study.

But the board followed the recommendation of its Building and Grounds Committee, bolstered by advice from private consultants, Economic Research Associates of Los Angeles, the architectural firm POD of Santa Ana, and the state Attorney

General's office.

The committee's recommendation came despite a March 12 public hearing that attracted a small crowd of residents and city officials, all wary of the hotel to be built at the corner of Fair Drive and Newport Boulevard.

Many residents in neighborhoods west and north of the fairgrounds have grown distrustful of the board because of noise problems generated by one of its tenants, the 18,000-capacity Pacific Amphitheatre.

Russ Millar, president of the homeowner group formed to battle the amphitheater, said the hotel expansion brings to mind a similar episode over plans for the arena — one he said has proved disastrous.

Alcohol blamed in 2 fatal collisions

Drinking and driving combined with tragic results early Saturday, apparently triggering two unrelated traffic collisions near Laguna Beach that took the lives of a 30-year-old Mission Viejo man and a 20-year-old Irvine woman, authorities reported.

Michael Trost of Mission Viejo and Lorraine Hill of Irvine both were pronounced dead at the scene of separate, head-on collisions about two hours apart, according to both the California Highway Patrol and Laguna Beach police.

Trost was killed instantly when the pickup truck he was driving north on Pacific Coast Highway at 6 a.m. was struck by a car driven by 31-year-old Steven Baird of Garden Grove.

Baird, who sustained major injuries in the crash, was flown by a Life Flight helicopter to Mission Community Hospital where he was reported in critical condition with head, face and chest injuries, said hospital spokeswoman Bernice Cioli.

A CHP spokeswoman said Baird allegedly was weaving between two lanes as he drove south on PCH in the

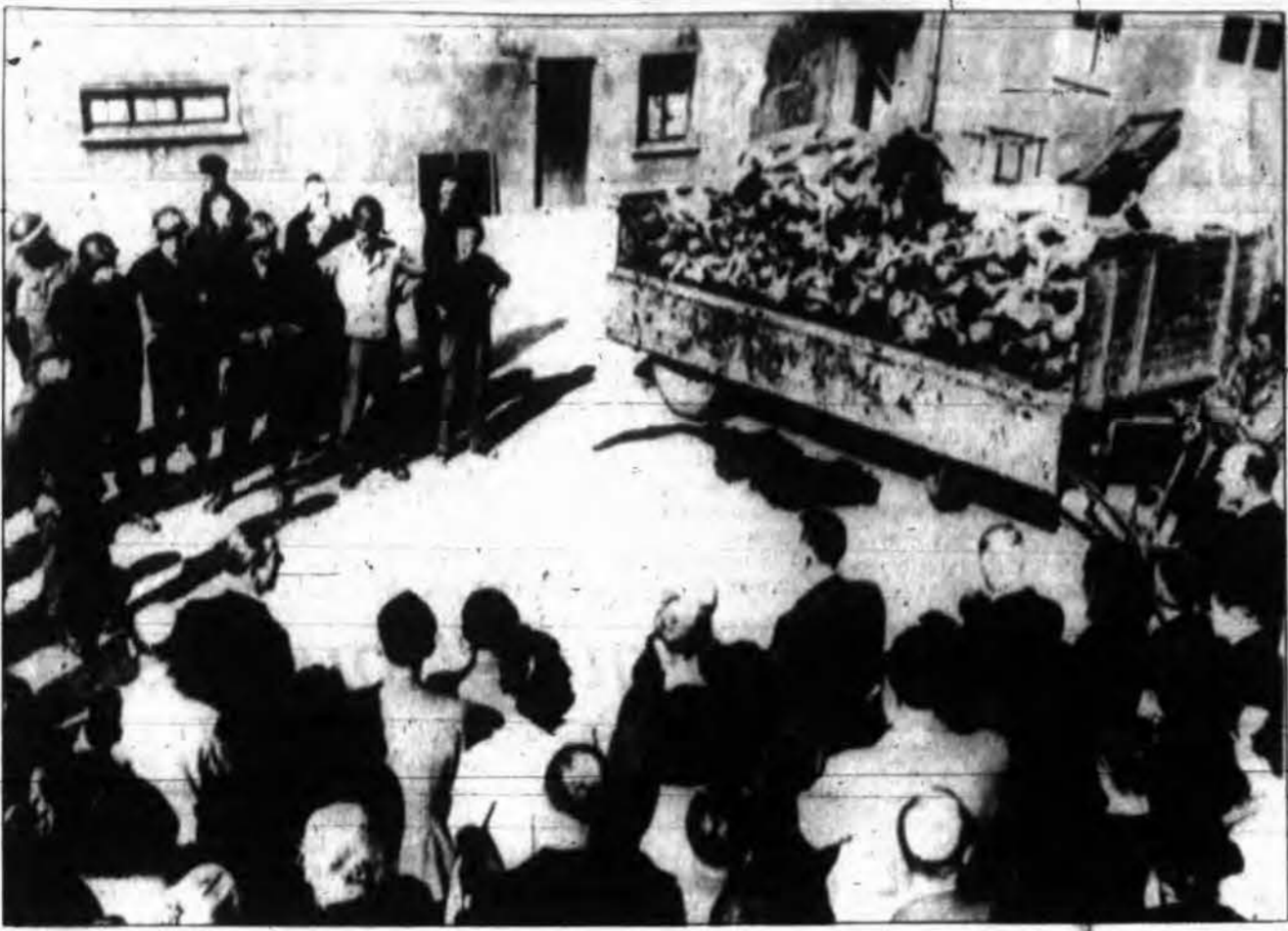

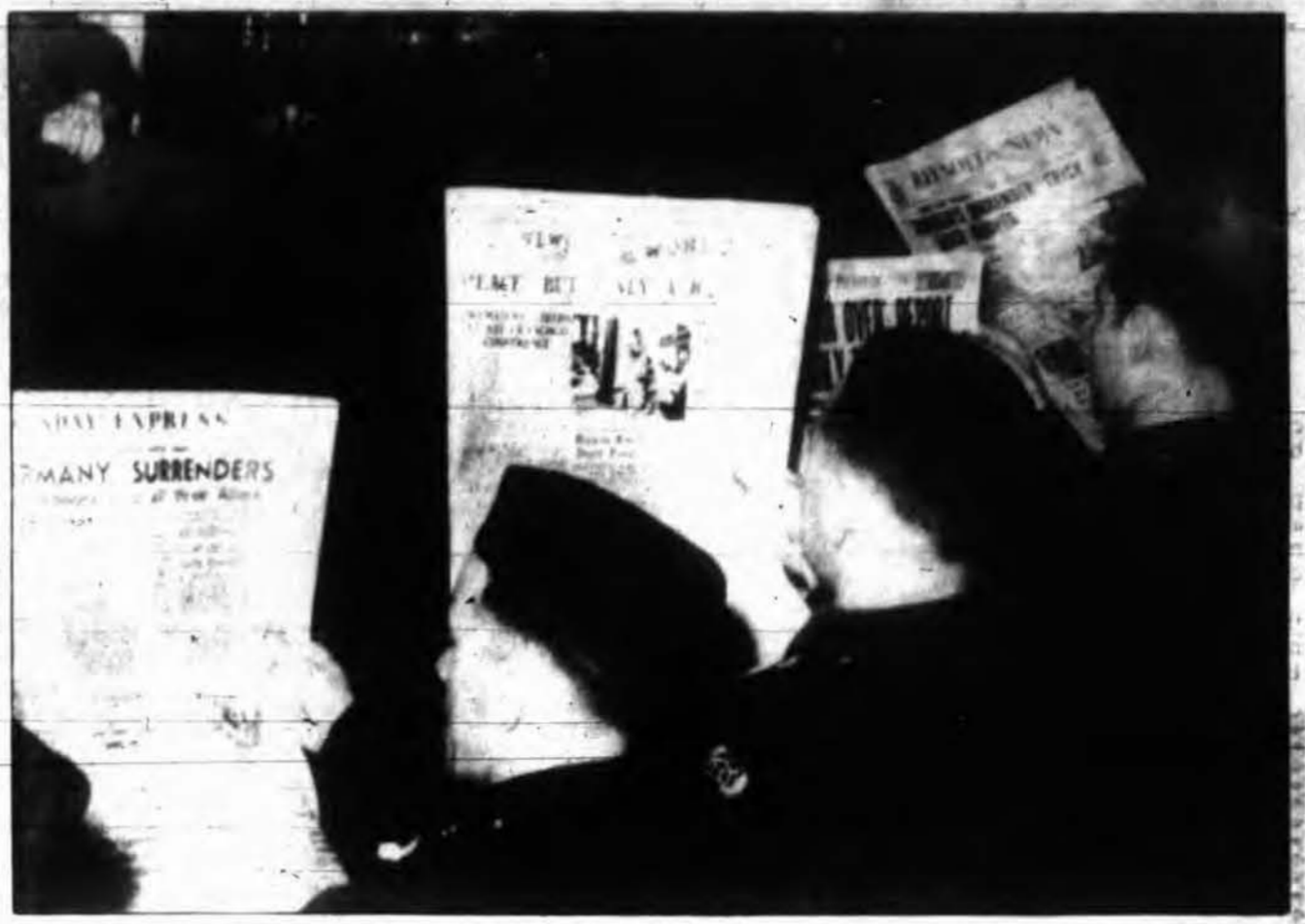

WWII remembered: The Jews return to Germany

Elderly victims of Third Reich return to birthplaces for VIP tours, treatment

NEW YORK (AP) — It was so unexpected. Warner Goldsmith never thought he would return to his native Germany, yet 49 years after he and his parents fled the Nazis, the country that persecuted him so cruelly was treating him to a gala homecoming. He dined at a lavish kosher banquet Frankfurt gave for its exiled citizens and pushed away memories of the hunger pangs he had felt as a boy when the Nazis tried to starve the Jews. He rode the cheery tourist trolley that serves passengers the region's famed apple wine and tried not to think of the cattle car his grandfather died in en route to a concentration camp. He sat over cake and coffee with old neighbors and reminisced about the happy times instead of the sad

And then he saw the picture hanging on a wall. "It was a framed photograph of a proud, handsome young German soldier standing there with a swastika on his sleeve. He was wearing a Nazi uniform," Goldsmith said. It was so unexpected. Guilt over the Holocaust has prompted several German cities and towns to spend millions of marks since World War II bringing elderly Jews persecuted by the Third Reich back to their birthplaces for VIP visits before they die. Like Goldsmith, many find the experience bittersweet. "We're not trying to make people forget. No one should ever forget. But we want to reach out our hand," explained Berlin Senate spokesman Johannes Volckers. Munich had the first program in

1960, and most major cities followed suit along with several smaller towns. West Berlin, with the largest program, has spent 2.5 million marks (about \$835,000) to bring some 16,000 former residents back for one-week visits since 1969. Volckers said, Berlin's waiting list has 11,000 names. Like most other large cities sponsoring such programs, Berlin picks up the tab for airfare, hotels and most meals. Pocket money and free tickets to cultural events are also provided. The majority of guests come from Israel or the United States, with smaller numbers hailing from South America, New Zealand, Australia and various European countries. Invitations are on a request-only basis. The emigrants usually hear about the programs through Jewish organizations and publications or word-of-mouth. Thousands have put their names on waiting lists, which give priority to the oldest and those who have been away the longest. Ellen Troy, 85, came home to Riverdale, N.Y., from her 1980 visit to Berlin with mixed feelings.

"Of course it was difficult," she said. "All the memories come back to you. But it is now so long ago and the people are so different — the atmosphere is changed. It is not the Berlin I know." She left June 23, 1941, a 40-year-old housewife with her lawyer husband and 17-year-old daughter. Her parents stayed behind and died of cholera in a concentration camp. Mrs. Troy rhapsodized about the warm reception she enjoyed in 1980 and the joy she felt upon seeing the same park bench where she used to sit as a young mother, basking in the sunshine with her baby, before the Nazis came. Then a city official urged Mrs. Troy's group to forgive the Germans. "Can I forgive them? I don't know," Mrs. Troy said hesitantly. Her soft voice suddenly hardened. "No, no, I can't forgive them for taking my parents, or forgive them for the terror I felt whenever a small noise woke me up in the night, or when I heard someone on the stairs and thought they were coming for my husband. I can never forgive that."

Goldsmith, now a 63-year-old salesman in Paramus, N.J., described his return to Frankfurt last year as "a good experience, but it will not erase the events of history." He remembers waiting until after dark and scuttling down side streets to go home from school as a frightened boy trying to escape the Hitler Youth gangs who stalked Jewish children and beat them up. Goldsmith was 14 when he fled with his parents in 1936. Many friends and relatives besides his 79-year-old grandfather stayed behind and perished. Goldsmith was torn about ever going back. "We went reluctantly," he told The Associated Press in a telephone interview, explaining that he didn't want to give the Germans "the satisfaction" of being able to apologize. He found his old home and even his boyhood sandbox but still "didn't feel too comfortable about being in the country" at first. But after a few days, Goldsmith said, he accepted the Germans' warmth and compassion as genuine

and was convinced that "these people don't want to sweep it all under the rug." Two of the 113 people in Goldsmith's group left Frankfurt early because it was too depressing for them, he said. Over the years, hosts and guests recall many touching reunions. One of the most dramatic came when three people who had befriended each other in a concentration camp were reunited on a charter flight to Berlin as guests of the city in 1971. "Each had thought the others were dead all these years," Volckers said. "It turned out they all lived in New York and had practically been neighbors for more than 25 years." Today's Germans also benefit from the homecomings, said Margot Loelhoeffel, director of Nuremberg's program. "Our goal is to show that we have become something else," she said, "and we also do it for today's Nurembergers, to remind them and to make them proud of what we are today."

Note in bottle changes refugee family's destiny

Vietnamese family arrives in LA after couple who wrote note sponsors them

LOS ANGELES — A former South Vietnamese soldier said he was "the most lucky man in the world" after arriving with his family for a tearful meeting with a couple whose bottled message floated 9,000 miles to Thailand and answered their prayers for freedom.

"Welcome to the United States of America," Dorothy Peckham said in

a quavering voice Friday at Los Angeles International Airport as Hoa Van Nguyen and his family arrived after an 18-hour flight from Singapore.

Nguyen, 31, told reporters through an interpreter that he was "the most lucky man in the world."

He arrived with his wife, Joang Kim, 27, whom he met at a refugee camp in Thailand, their 16-month-old son, Hoang Gia Thai Nguyen, whose name means "Souvenir of

Thailand," and Nguyen's brother, Cuong Van Nguyen, 17.

The brothers were making their way from Vietnam in a rickety riverboat in 1983 when Nguyen spotted the bottle off the coast of Thailand, where they took refuge. It had been cast into the ocean by Dorothy Peckham on a Christmas 1979 cruise to Hawaii with her husband, John Henry Peckham, and contained a dollar bill and a request to use the money for postage to write back.

Nguyen said "a sixth sense" prompted him to fish the bottle from the sea.

His response to Mrs. Peckham's

note prompted a correspondence between the two families and the Peckhams of Whittier finally decided to sponsor the family in the United States.

At the airport, Peckham, grinning widely despite tears streaming down his face, took the sleeping baby in his arms. Nguyen then gave the Peckhams a picture he drew in the Thai refugee camp.

Officials from the Catholic Welfare Bureau, who had selected an apartment for the Nguyens to live in, whisked the two families away. The agency resettled about 1,800 Vietnamese refugees here last year.

Earlier, Peckham said his wife and their three children's families had furnished and supplied the apartment. "You got four families, you can get together a lot of stuff," he said.

Mrs. Peckham said a Manhattan Beach auto dealer had offered a job to Nguyen, a mechanic.

She said she had forgotten all about the 1979 shipboard lark until March 4, 1983 — her husband's birthday — when she received an Aerogram postmarked in Thailand.

"We have received a floating mailbox by a bottle on the way from Vietnam to Thailand," Nguyen wrote. The bottle had drifted 9,000

miles in three years and two months in the Pacific Ocean, the Peckhams estimated.

At first they regarded the incident as "kind of a fun ending," Mrs. Peckham said. "But when we got his second letter back, he told us that from the minute they saw the bottle, they felt it was a prayer answered, that this bottle was somehow their way to freedom."

During the time they exchanged letters, the former soldier married, fathered a child and eventually asked the Peckhams' help in taking refuge in the United States.

Asians honor Vietnam veterans

First event paying tribute to American soldiers by refugees

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Old memories were tearfully recalled Saturday, 10 years after the fall of Saigon, as a group of Vietnamese-Americans gave thanks to the American GIs who were not only allies, but friends.

About 800 veterans and refugees gathered for an appreciation ceremony sponsored by the Vietnamese-American Association of America at the Indiana War Memorial.

Nicholas Nguyen, president of the 2,200-member Vietnamese-Americans group, said it was time to let the GIs know their efforts were appreciated. He said the former refugees were grateful for the chance to make America their second homeland, and to the men and women who fought to give them freedom.

"I had mixed feelings about it," said Mike Creager of Indianapolis, who served in the Army's 101st Airborne Division in Vietnam. "It brings back a lot of bad memories. It's hard to reconcile, but you can't carry a grudge forever."

Jesus Quintana of Indianapolis, a Marine who lost both legs during the Vietnam War, said he went to the remembrance out of curiosity, and he liked what he saw.

"There is a burn in us that's never going to heal. Too much time went by before the Americans did anything about the veterans," he said. "The country waited too long to welcome us back. But we have to deal with it individually."

Rep. Dan Burton, R-Ind., told the group that President Reagan appreciated their efforts and thanked them for honoring the American servicemen.

Burton, a House Foreign Affairs Committee member, added, "Southeast Asia would be free today if our goals were set at the outset. If we are ever involved in another military conflict, our objectives and goals should be well-defined before we send in our troops. We must give them the ability to win or not send them at all," he said.

Loc To, who helped organize the event, said the American Legion and other veterans groups believe the ceremony is the first time Vietnamese refugees have paid tribute to American soldiers.

"Ten years ago we got here because of the generosity of the United States and we're grateful," To said.

"We also have a high regard for the American men and women who served during the conflict. Because of them, we got a democracy and could live in freedom. They understand us and know us best. The Vietnamese people, particularly those who live here, owe a thank you to the Vietnam veterans."

Bob Foster, a spokesman for the Indiana chapter of the American Legion, said he wondered at first why the Vietnamese would organize such an event.

"But they simply want to say thank you, and I sure can't find any fault with that," he said. "I think there are a lot of veterans who have been wanting to hear those two words for several years."

Ron Stamps, state chairman of the Vietnam Veterans Civic Council, says he hoped contact will continue between veterans and Vietnamese-Americans.

"We have to work with them," he said. "They fought beside us and they suffered the same things, and they lost their country."

Meanwhile, in Annville, Pa., about 20 miles from Harrisburg, about 2,000 Vietnamese from all over the East were gathering Saturday at Fort Indiantown Gap for ceremonies marking the 10th anniversary of the arrival of Southeast Asia refugees.

In the months after the collapse of Saigon in 1975, more than 22,000 Vietnamese and Cambodian refugees were housed at the military post, one of a number of locations across the country where refugees stayed until they could be resettled.

I know too many young people whose lives have been wrecked because of inherited wealth. Their grandparents (and parents) would have done them a favor had they left them a modest sum and given the rest to charity.

If tragedy strikes, such as a catastrophic illness, I say help the kids out, by all means, but if they are able to make it on their own let them do it. Nobody ever drowned in his own sweat.

Putting Mom in the driver's seat

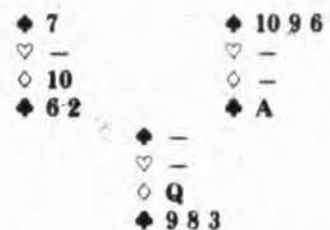

Declarer returned to hand with the king of diamonds and led the jack of spades. West won and, not knowing the position, she understandably made the safe return of a trump. A cascade of trumps followed, and West steadfastly held me close to her breast. The hand was reduced to this position:

♣ 9 8 3



Declarer led the queen of diamonds and discarded the king of clubs from the table. East was in a quandary. She knew I had not yet been played, so she consigned me to declarer's hand. In that case if she held the ace of clubs, dummy's spades would take the last three tricks. It seemed that the one chance was to hope that her partner held the nine of clubs, so she reluctantly discarded the ace of clubs. Now declarer scored three club tricks for a highly satisfactory result for North-South.

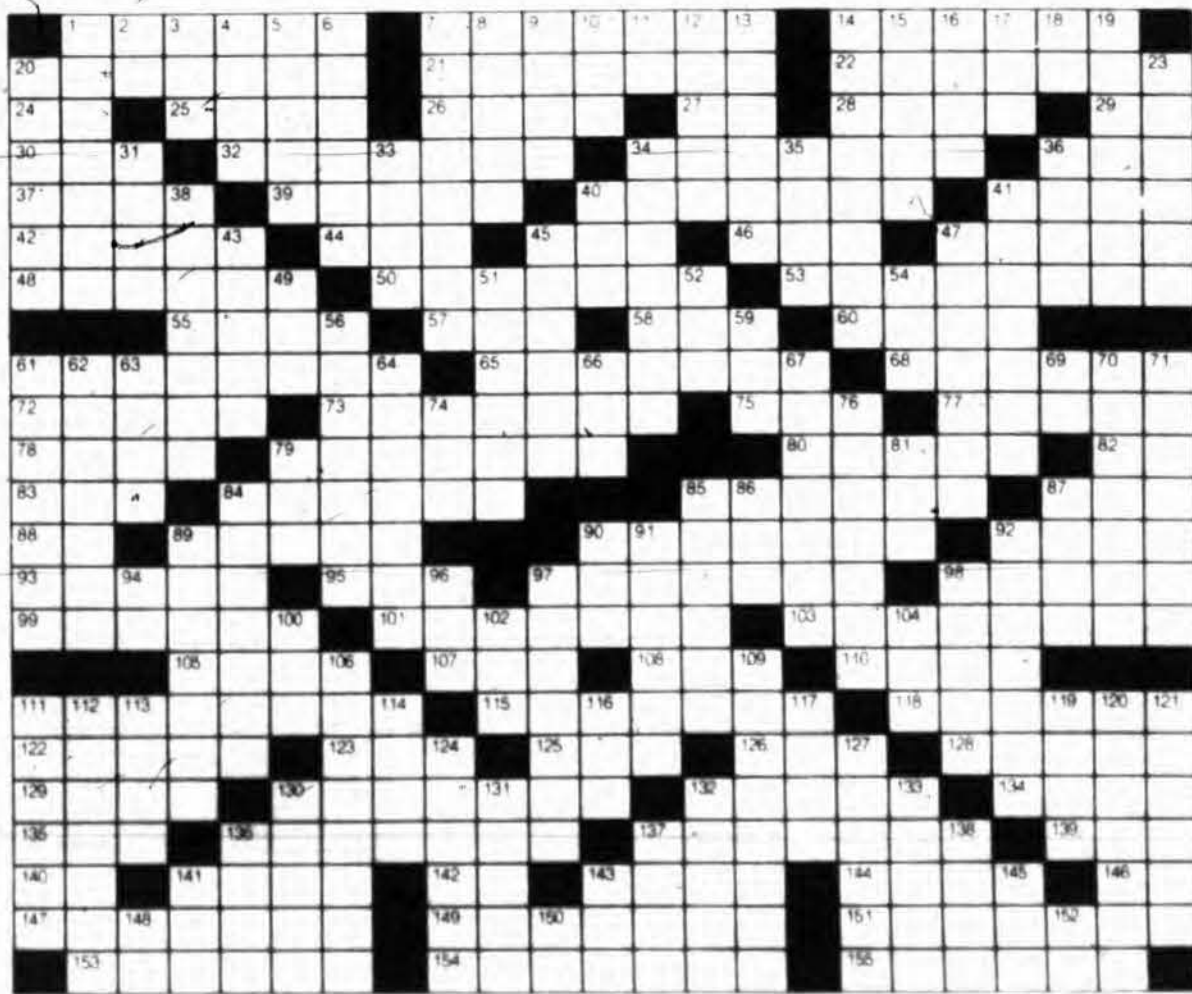

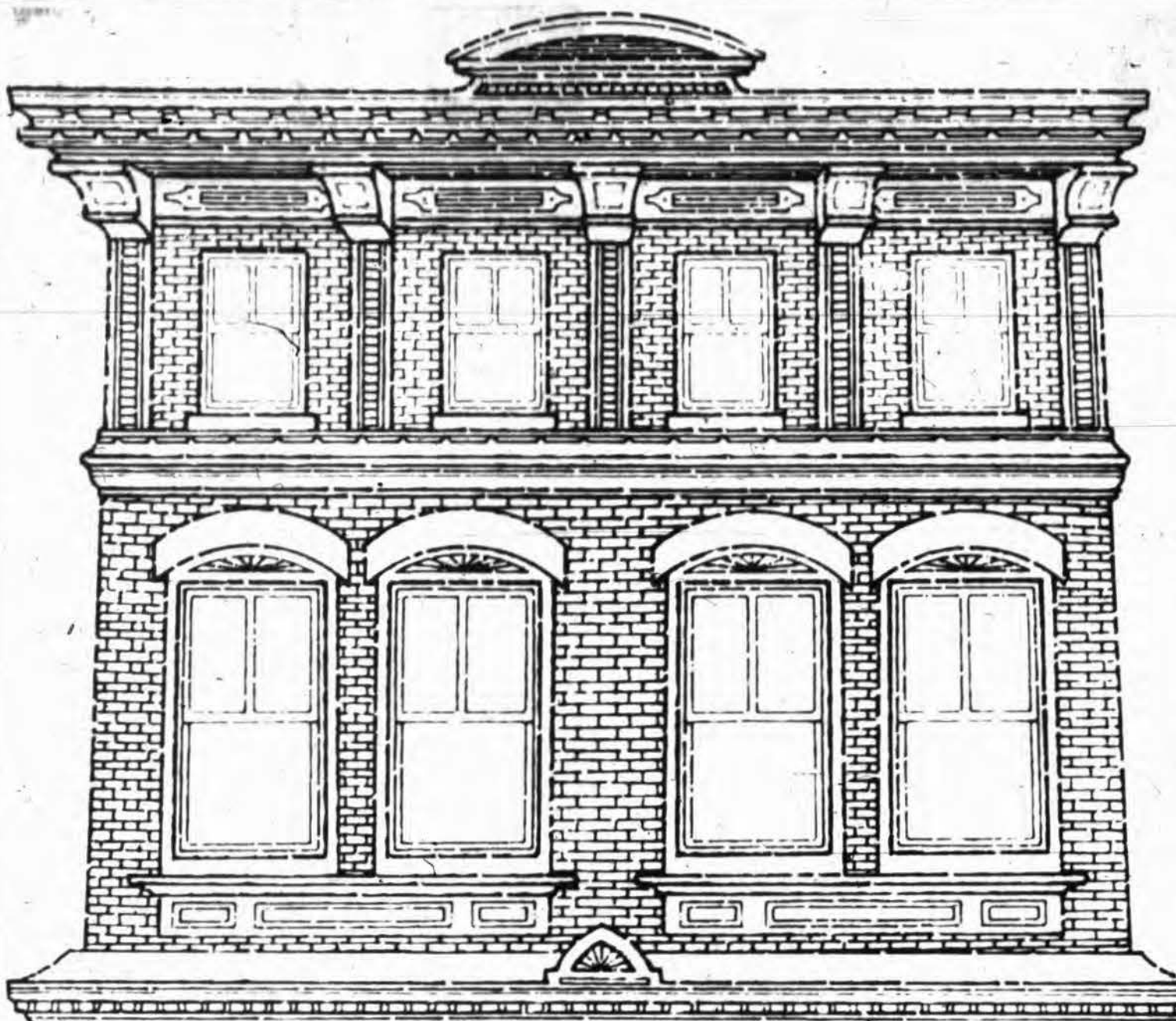

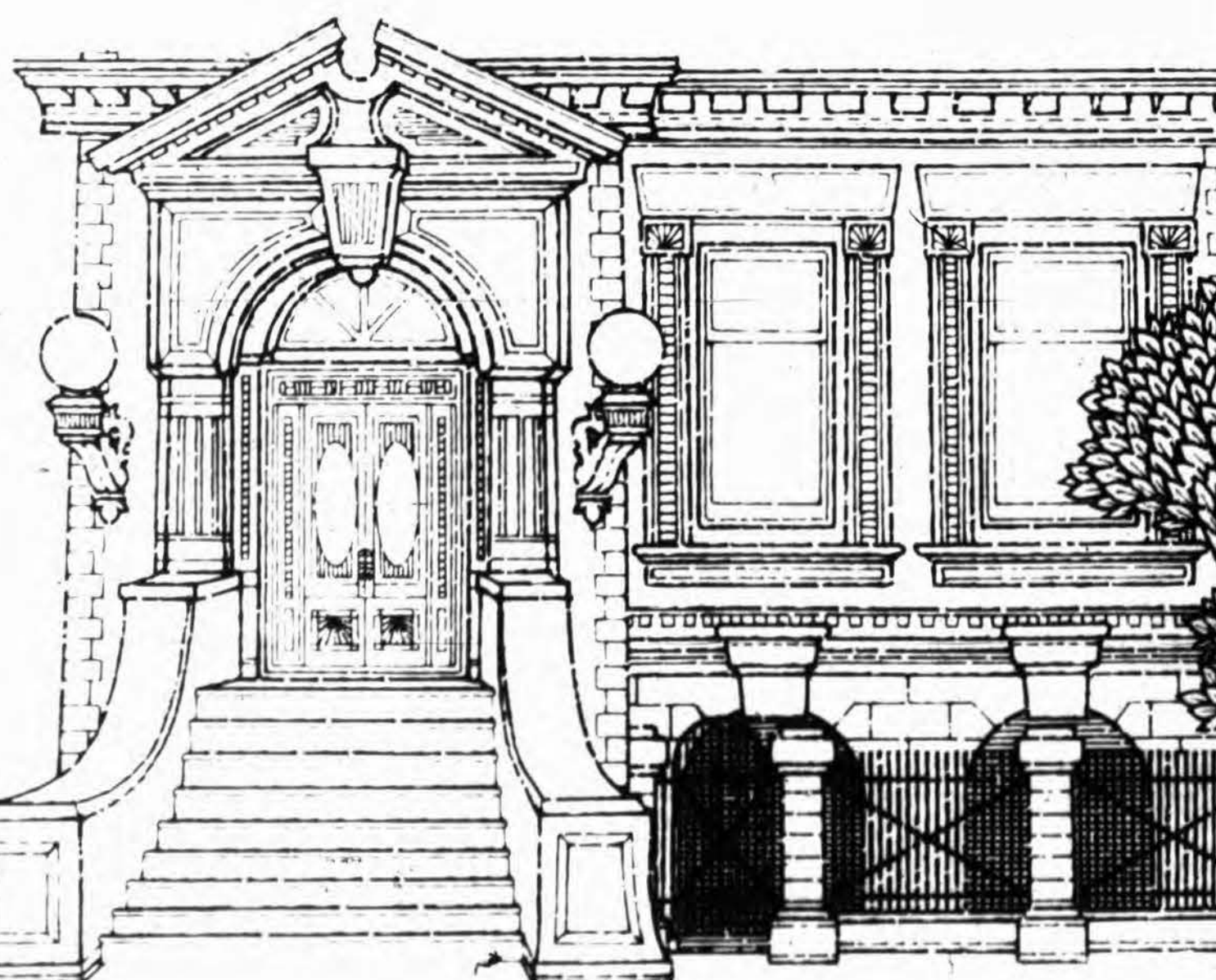

Owners take on fix-it tasks

Do-it-yourselfers praise convenience, sense of satisfaction

Do-it-yourself home repairs have gone from stigma to status symbol as more individuals discover the joy of accomplishment it can bring them.

Financial incentives and convenience are other reasons for a spurt of interest in doing one's own repairs, according to authorities in the field.

The Do-It-Yourself Research Institute claims more than half of the \$68.8 billion hardware market. The group, which is supported by approximately 40 companies who make and sell do-it-yourself products, put the value of products sold to do-it-yourselfers in 1984 at \$38.6 billion.

Among its other findings: Women (especially those who work outside the home) are engaging in do-it-yourself activities with greater frequency; the prime do-it-yourself age group is between 25 and 55, and do-it-yourselfers, once they begin the process, generally move from simple to complex and even extensive jobs as they gain experience and confidence.

While saving money has been an important reason for the growth of the market in the past 15 years, other reasons advanced by do-it-yourselfers include the sense of satisfaction they derive from completing the tasks and the greater convenience of doing the work themselves, compared with calling



and then waiting for a repair person to arrive.

Manufacturers have helped the trend along by changing their packaging to include better instructions geared to the consumer, either on or in the package. Home center retailers have also contributed by holding repair workshops and by offering advice on installation to encourage consumers to take on more complicated tasks, according to a spokesman for the Do-It-Yourself Research Institute.

Terry Gallagher, editor of Hardware Age, a trade publication that recently published a study of the do-it-yourselfers in the United States, says that doing one's own repairs no longer carries the stigma of suggesting an inability to pay for the repairs. "More middle and upper-income individuals are getting into the act for the sheer enjoyment of it. A side effect is

that they sure save a lot of money," he adds.

Hardware Age found that painting is the most common do-it-yourself project. Other types of home decorating jobs consumers tackle with greater frequency today include installing window treatments such as blinds, shades and draperies, hanging wallpaper, paneling a room, and refinishing furniture. About 45 percent of painting and decorating chores are done by women.

The publication found that even quite complicated projects, such as installation of kitchen cabinets and major appliances, are being completed by consumers. Also popular are lawn and garden jobs, installing insulation and other products for energy conservation and car care such as waxing the car, changing the oil or adding transmission fluid.

Leaky faucet? It's a simple endeavor to change washer

Washerless faucets are all over the place these days, but the large majority of houses still have faucets with washers. By the very nature of things, that means the washers periodically need replacing.

People who can handle most do-it-yourself problems often steer clear of anything to do with plumbing. While their attitude may be justifiable in most respects, it is a false fear when it comes to the replacement of washers, a chore that requires knowledge more than skill. Put a new washer in a stem or compression faucet, the usual type, and you not only stop a leak, you save a bundle.

The most important step in this procedure comes right at the start: SHUT OFF THE WATER.

You can do it by closing the shutoff valve right at the sink or other fixture or by closing the main water valve to the house. When you locate it (every homeowner should know where it is as

soon as or even before he moves in), the water is shut off by turning the valve clockwise.

The handle is held in place with a screw under a cap, which has been snapped on or screwed on. Jiggle the handle a bit to get it off, since it may be stuck in place.

Use a wrench to loosen the packing nut, which is just under the place where the handle was — but before you do that, put a piece of adhesive tape around the nut to keep it from being marred. Try to lift out the faucet stem. If it doesn't come out, replace the loose handle on the stem and turn it counterclockwise, which will unscrew the stem.

When the stem is in your hand, you will see a washer at the end of it, held in place by a brass screw. Unscrew it and take off the washer, which probably will be worn or chewed up.

Again, we have to go backwards in time to the day when you should have gone to a hardware store and bought a box of assorted washers. If you failed

to do it (before the need arose), do it now.

All you have to do now is to put in a new washer and screw, replace the stem in the same way you took it off and turn on the water. Nine times out of 10, the leak will have disappeared.

If there is still a leak, observe carefully exactly where it is coming from. If it is from the packing nut under the handle, remove the nut the same way you did after you shut off the water. Under the nut will be a large washer or some packing material that looks like thick thread or thin cord.

Whatever it is, replace it and you will have stopped the leak when the faucet is reassembled. If the leak came from the original source, the spout of the faucet, it means water is still coming past the washer, even though it is new. That's because the valve seat, on which the washer rests, is damaged. Buy a valve seat refacing tool and smooth the valve seat with it. It usually comes on a card with directions. If not, have the dealer show you how to use it.

New type of paneling relieves traditional wallpapering mess

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Do-it-yourselfers can avoid the mess associated with wallpapering by installing a new type of gypsum wallboard with the wallpaper already pasted on it.

"You can buy them, take them home and put them up in a one-step operation" with a few nails or adhesive glue, says Lee Poole, a spokesman for Charlotte-based Gold Bond Building Prod-

ucts.

Gold Bond sold similar paneling about five years ago, but the new product, sent out to distributors this summer, incorporates improvements in manufacturing and design, he says.

The old patterns were traditional, but the new patterns reflect more contemporary design. Eight designs are available,

including floral patterns, floral stripes, fabric, bamboo and bamboo with willow patterns.

The wallboard, five-sixteenths of an inch thick, is nailed or glued directly to the wood wall studs or even over cracked plaster and other existing surfaces. The edges are slightly beveled and can be left butted up against each other for a seamless appearance or joined with molding.

Irvine project closing out sales

Miller, western regional manager for Kroh Brothers, says the Laguna Sur blufftop development above Monarch Bay and Three-Arch Bay is designed for 355 condominiums and townhouses and 28 custom-home lots. A major portion of the development will be a gate-guarded community, with a recreation center, swimming pool, and tennis courts.

"Almost every unit in the development will have one of the most panoramic views in California," Miller said. "Laguna Sur also will include a park, lavish landscaping, and nature trails along the bluff."

Laguna Sur is on Pacific Island Drive in Laguna Niguel, about 1 mile from the intersection of Crown Valley Parkway and Pacific Coast Highway. The project is a partnership between Kroh Brothers and Hon Development Co. of Laguna Hills.

Choosing right air conditioner calls for forethought

Make sure you know what size you'll need and whether it will fit spot you've selected

In choosing a window or wall air conditioner, you want one that will cool a certain area, yet not be so large that it will waste energy in the form of electricity.

Generally, you want one of 6,000 BTUs for the first room of average size and upward of that figure for larger rooms.

But what is an average room? You can look at charts that are printed in various places, but the entire process is somewhat confusing.

You are better off to write down the dimensions of the room and any additional space that is to be cooled, plus the number and size of windows, doors, exposures,

etc. When you shop for an air conditioner, take all these facts with you.

Every dealer has his own chart that tells you the approximate size of the conditioner you will need. In making your choice, consider such other factors as high-efficiency models and the types of controls.

Important in your analysis is whether the unit can be used on an ordinary 120-volt circuit or requires a 240-volt circuit. Many

houses these days already have 240-volt circuits for special machines, such as clothes dryers. Be sure you know whether you will be able to use the conditioner you buy in your house or whether a 240-volt circuit may have to be installed, which often is a good idea in any case.

Also, be certain you get a size and type of unit that fits in the kind of window you have. Case-

ment windows, for example, usually need one a little narrower than the regular models. Again, ask questions of your dealer so you don't get surprised when the air conditioner is brought home.

When you get a window unit, it will come with complete instructions on how it is mounted. The installation usually is within the capabilities of even a novice do-it-yourselfer. Be careful to follow the directions on the best possible place for the installation.

Redesign a room for high tech gadgetry

NORTHBROOK, Ill. (AP) — Space is the biggest concern today as the family's media center grows with the addition of videocassette recorders and personal computers alongside the traditional television set and stereo.

"But," says interior designer Rosalie Krone, "space doesn't necessarily have to limit your tastes for gadgetry."

Even if you live in a small urban apartment, she says, it's still possible to create extra space for a complete home entertainment center. In fact, the popularity of home electronics has given life to a new, high-tech method of interior design, says Mrs. Krone, of the American Society of Interior Designers.

"Take another look at the old family room, den or extra bedroom," she says. "With some minor reconstruction, it can be transformed into a technological funhouse."

Storage space is the No. 1 priority, so she suggests a simple storage unit be constructed along one wall in the room. The unit can accommodate a multiple shelf arrangement, drawers, cabinets and even a drop-down bed, with durable Naugahyde fabric covering the underside of the bed and columns separating each shelf unit.

"By utilizing existing space in the most functional and attractive way," she adds, "you'll have plenty of room for your new computer, as well as your typewriter, telephone, TV set, stereo, video equipment and books — without sacrificing style or esthetics."

Using books as weights

In many gluing operations, such as regluing veneer on a table top, one of the easiest and best methods of holding the parts together is with books. Place as many books as necessary on the reglued area. Use the heaviest books you have and distribute them on the veneer so that weight is distributed fairly evenly.

FDIC approves efforts to control Beverly Hills bank

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. (FDIC) has authorized a group of individual investors headed by Miami bankers Abel Holtz and Daniel Holtz to proceed with efforts to seek control of First Beverly Bank in Beverly Hills according to Abel Holtz.

Abel Holtz, chairman and president of Miami-based Capital Bancorp, said the group plans to make a cash tender offer next week for 100 percent of the authorized, issued and outstanding shares of the California bank.

Holtz said he already owns approximately 28 percent of the outstanding stock in First Beverly Bank. According to Holtz, the group plans to provide the California bank with additional capital of at least \$1.5 million if shareholders respond favorably to the tender offer.

First Beverly Bank has two offices in the Los Angeles area. The main office is on Rodeo Dr., an exclusive retail shopping district in Beverly Hills. The branch office is located in the Century City commercial office district. As of Dec. 31, 1984, First Beverly Bank had assets of \$42.2 million deposits of \$39.6 million, and capital of \$2 million.

"We are interested in establishing a significant presence in Southern California to complement the group's banking activities in South Florida and Washington D.C.," Holtz explained.

Holtz controls Capital Bancorp, the parent company of Miami-based Capital Bank.

Storing radioactive wastes a hot issue, bigger business

Decommissioning, decontamination of old nuclear plants an overlooked issue

DETROIT (AP) — Storing the radioactive remains of 14 aging nuclear plants could be one of the hot issues of the 1990s, pitting aging population centers in the Midwest and Northeast against less populous states, say two experts.

Those 14 plants — the oldest electricity producing nuclear facilities — will be ready for retirement in the next 10-15 years, say Barry D. Solomon of the federal Nuclear Energy Regulatory Commission and Diane M. Cameron of the University of Maryland in a report to the Association of American Geographers.

"The decommissioning and ultimate decontamination of older nuclear power plants is a major nuclear-related hazard that continues to be overlooked," says the report, presented at the geographers' convention in San Diego this week.

"Approximately 14 commercial nuclear plants will be ready for dismantlement before the end of this

Trusts move from the rich to middle-income Americans

Once considered the province of only the very rich, trusts are fast gaining respect among middle-income Americans. Many modestly well-off people are realizing that trusts are an efficient and flexible way to manage money.

Efficient, in part, because they help save on income taxes by allowing you to transfer income to a family member in a lower tax bracket. Flexible, because their variety offers the freedom to tailor a trust to your own needs.

The idea behind a trust is relatively simple: You turn over assets to a trustee who manages them for you or your designated beneficiary. You give up direct day-to-day control over those assets in exchange for tax savings and other benefits. In some instances, you can designate yourself as trustee. Depending on the type of trust, you can elect to get back your assets after the trust expires or give them up to the trust's beneficiary.

Needs Oriented

The benefits of a trust can be numerous. Clifford and spousal remainder trusts offer tax savings while you build funds to pay for future expenses, such as a college education. As you grow older, you can use a trust to manage assets and provide steady income. You can even use a trust to save taxes for your heirs and direct the disposition of your assets after you die. And, only with trusts can you make tax-deductible gifts to charity and still earn income from the assets you've given away.

Types of Trusts

To give you an idea of the possible ways a trust can help you manage assets and save income-taxes, here's a sampling:

• **Clifford Trust** — Named for the man whose court case established the law on this kind of trust, Clifford lets you give away assets temporarily (at least 10 years and a day, unless the beneficiary dies) and then get them back. A Clifford trust is an ideal way to pay for your child's education or to help support a retired relative. That's because the main advantage to this type of trust is that it shifts income from your high tax bracket to the lower or zero rate of the trust's beneficiary. Married couples can put up to \$32,549 in a trust annually without owing Federal gift taxes; for an individual donor the amount is \$16,275.

• **Spousal Remainder Trust** — If you don't like Clifford's 10-year and one day requirement, consider a spousal remainder trust. It works like a Clifford, but you can write your own time requirement. Its basic difference from Clifford is that it is funded by only one spouse and legal title to the principal passes to the other spouse when the trust period is over. This is true even if you get divorced in the interim, so a spousal remainder trust may not be an appropriate choice if you are having marital difficulties.

• **Charitable Remainder Trust** — If you are thinking about willing property or assets to charity, consider this: A charitable remainder trust will do the same job and, at the same time,

provide you fixed income for life. Because the trust's assets will eventually go to charity, you can also claim a current income tax deduction for their future value. You can arrange the trust so that your spouse — or other survivor — will continue to receive the income after you die.

• **Charitable Remainder Unitrust** — The difference between a charitable remainder trust and a charitable remainder unitrust lies in income received. Whereas income from a regular charitable remainder trust is based on the value of your original donation, income from a charitable remainder unitrust is a fixed percentage of the trust's assets each year. So your income may go up or down depending on the annual performance of the trust.

• **Charitable Lead Trust** — A charitable lead trust lets you provide income to a charity over the years. When you die, the principal reverts to your heirs. While you won't save on income taxes, your estate will save on family estate and gift taxes.

• **Sprinkling Trust** — A sprinkling trust, which you can set up for your children and even grandchildren, lets your beneficiaries receive income as needed. The trustee can, for example, give a greater percentage of the trust's income to the child who needs it most — during college years, for instance. At the end of that period, the trustee

can reappropriate income distribution.

• **Q-Tip Trust** — A Q-tip trust (qualified terminable-interest property trust) allows you to decide the final resting place for your assets even after your surviving spouse dies. This type of trust works especially well for couples involved in second or even third marriages. You can, for example, provide income for your surviving spouse and, at the same time, assure yourself that after he or she dies, the assets will automatically go to your children.

• **Exemption-Equivalent Trust** — While you can leave all assets to your spouse free of estate tax, this route is not necessarily the most equitable if you have a large estate and children or other beneficiaries to consider. That's because you can leave part of your estate to non-spouse beneficiaries up to a certain dollar value with the remainder to your spouse and still incur no federal estate tax bill. In 1985 you can leave up to \$400,000 to others without your estate owing federal estate taxes. (This amount will rise to \$600,000 by 1987.) You can avoid future tax bills for your heirs by setting up an exemption equivalent trust for them now. Here's how it works: You set up the trust in your children's names. It will pay current income to your spouse, but, because its assets are not in your spouse's name, they are not considered part of

his or her estate and will not be subject to estate taxes.

Means To An End

A well planned trust can be the ideal means to provide for yourself and your loved ones. An important part of your planning is whom you name as trustee. While your first thoughts might be of a relative or close friend, don't base your decision solely on the fact that they care about you. Look for someone qualified to manage finances. Banks and trust companies generally make good trustees because their asset managers are experienced professionals who know how to use and make money.

You can obtain additional peace of mind and the assurance that the trust will carry out your wishes by seeking up-to-date professional tax and legal advice to help set up your trust.

century, due to old age and various operating problems," the report says.

Three are on the Pacific coast: the San Onofre plant, owned jointly by San Diego Gas & Electric Co. and Southern California Edison Co.; Pacific Gas & Electric Co.'s Humboldt Bay Power Plant in California; and the N reactor on the Hanford nuclear reservation near Richland, Wash., a dual-purpose reactor operated by UNC Nuclear Industries which produces plutonium for nuclear weapons and sells steam to the Washington Public Power Supply System.

As the plants near retirement age, utilities and governments will have to deal with not only the waste generated by the reactors but the reactors themselves, parts of which become radioactive over the life of the plant, the study says.

Some wastes can be transported away from the plant site to special nuclear dumps, and that could be the twin trouble that triggers a new war between states, the study says.

As the number of trucks and trains carrying the hazardous material increases, the risk to small towns situated along the travel routes will go up accordingly.

Less-populous areas that didn't benefit from the nuclear power — which primarily serves Midwestern and Northeastern regions — will suffer the consequences in the event of an accident, the report warns.

"However, since no large-scale commercial nuclear plant has ever been decommissioned, it is too early to properly judge the seriousness of the hazards that will be presented," the study adds.
