

Hostages en route to Damascus

U.S. officials say they expect captives' release hours after being sent to Syria

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Most of the 39 American hostages held in Beirut since the start of the Lebanese civil war today and left carrying red roses from their captors. Syrian officials told reporters the hostages would be taken to Damascus.

In Washington, senior administration officials said they believed the hostages would be released hours after being sent to Syria.

"The end is coming," said hostage Thomas W. Murry, of Newbury Park,

Calif. "I hope it's coming, but I don't want to get my hopes high again...." he shouted at reporters from the back seat of a car outside the Summerland Hotel on west Beirut's seafloor in the early hours of the morning.

"All we've been told is we're going to Damascus — we're getting out," another hostage, who could not immediately be identified, said as they were leaving.

However, a bearded Amal militiaman at the restaurant who said he was a "tourist guide" told reporters the hostages "are going to sleep ... in Lebanon."

Dozens of heavily armed gunmen stood by as the hostages were taken away in several cars and a white minibus.

"I think it's over. We are going now," George Lazansky, 53, of Algonquin, Ill., said as the vehicles drove off. "I don't know where."

Like the other hostages, Lazansky was clutching red roses given him by his Amal Shiite Moslem captors.

Meanwhile, freed hostage Jimmy Dell Palmer arrived home Friday night and told 200 people greeting him at the Little Rock, Ark., airport that "American people are the greatest people because they love freedom."

Palmer, 48, was accompanied by his wife, Sammie, on the flight from Beirut. (Please see HOSTAGES/A2)

Reagan meets with captives' kin

CHICAGO HEIGHTS, Ill. (AP) — The brother of a Roman Catholic priest kidnapped in Beirut five months ago said a meeting Friday between President Reagan and the families of Mideast hostages "gave us something tangible we could reach out and touch."

"We know the president is with us and we're behind him," said John Jenco of Joliet, brother of the Rev. Lawrence Martin Jenco, who was one of seven people held in Lebanon before the June

14 hijacking of a TWA jetliner by Shiite Moslems.

Reagan met privately with 29 people for about 30 minutes on the hostage situation before making a tax-reform speech to several thousand people at Bloom Township High School. The private gathering also was attended by National Security Adviser Robert McFarlane and White House Chief of Staff Donald Regan.

Answering reporters' questions during a luncheon with

community leaders, the president used strong language when he was asked if it was a mistake, as one of the TWA hostages suggested, to insist upon the simultaneous release of all 46 Americans held captive in Lebanon — the 39 TWA hostages, taken June 14, and seven people kidnapped earlier, one as long ago as March 1984.

"I don't think anything that attempts to get people back who have been kidnapped by thugs (Please see FAMILIES/A2)

Grand jury issues stinging rebuke of county system

Several members of the 1984-85 Orange County Grand Jury called Friday for the Board of Supervisors to undertake a comprehensive, top-to-bottom overhaul of county government, which they characterized as being outdated, inefficient and under-organized.

Their comments were made at a morning news conference called to discuss the final report issued by the Grand Jury, whose one-year term formally expires Sunday.

Summarizing their government watchdog experience, several grand jurors, who emphasized they were not speaking for the entire panel, urged an overhaul of the county's entire governmental structure.

"We should restructure the entire county government. There is no control anywhere. We need to see dynamic leadership and we don't see much of it anywhere. We should start from the top and work down. It is something the board will have to do," Grand Juror Linda Linder said.

Linder, the panel's most outspoken critic of county government, chaired the Grand Jury's criminal justice committee, which issued a series of reports criticizing medical and mental health services in the county jail.

The reports called upon supervisors to transfer responsibility for jail medical and mental health programs from the county Health Care Agency to the Sheriff's Department, a recommendation board members have deemed unacceptable.

Although the Grand Jury's final report to its presiding judge, Superior Court Judge Francisco Briseno, did not formally call for an overhaul of government, it did touch on the Grand Jury's pervasive feeling that all is not well with county government.

"Despite the present size of Orange County, we repeatedly encountered prevailing philosophies, procedures and practices reminiscent of yesterday," the final report states.

Foreman Thomas Kehoe explained that grand jurors' feelings on the subject stemmed from "an ac- (Please see GRAND JURY/A2)

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Artukovic's release pending

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A federal magistrate said Friday he plans to free Andrija Artukovic on bail because the continued imprisonment of the accused Nazi war criminal constitutes "cruel and unusual punishment."

The Surfside Colony resident, whose ailments include senility and partial blindness, has been held at the federal medical facility in Springfield, Mo., since March 15 as he battles extradition to Yugoslavia.

"The man is 85. He could go tomorrow," said U. S. Magistrate John R. Kronenberg, who promised a final ruling Monday afternoon.

Attorneys for the man reputed to have been the murderous wartime "Butcher of the Balkans," fought for his release on humanitarian grounds, saying his health and mental state are deteriorating in prison.

The lawyers say it will take years before all appeals in his case are resolved and it is determined whether the old man must return to Yugoslavia to face trial for thousands of murders.

"There is absolutely no question in my mind under the circumstances to place him in a facility separate from his family in my view constitutes cruel and unusual punishment," said

the magistrate.

Artukovic's lawyer, Gary Fleischman, said after Friday's hearing he would not be surprised if the government quickly moves Artukovic to a prison facility in California in an effort to avoid the release.

Assistant U. S. Attorney David Nimmer said he still believes it is inappropriate for Artukovic to be freed. But he added, "We obey all relevant court orders."

Kronenberg told the prosecutor and defense attorneys to meet and confer on proposed conditions for Artukovic's release.

Well-wishers pay tribute to feisty dean

Reception marks the end of van den Noort's 12-year stint as UCI medical school overseer

Accepting gifts and kind remarks from friends and colleagues, Dr. Stanley van den Noort was guest of honor Friday at a reception marking the conclusion of his 12-year stint as dean of UC Irvine's California College of Medicine.

Well-wishers praised van den Noort's skills in attracting distinguished faculty members and upgrading the reputation of the medical school.

But privately, even his supporters acknowledged that van den Noort's

feisty personality and strong political stands cost him the support of some important people. In particular, he fought unsuccessfully for construction of a campus teaching hospital, putting himself at odds with backers of a rival plan for an off-campus community hospital in Irvine.

In January, UCI Chancellor Jack Peltason announced that van den Noort would not be reappointed after his term as dean ended. Van den Noort will remain at the school, resuming teaching and research duties as a professor of neurology.

On Friday, more than 100 teachers,

graduates, students and friends gathered outside the medical school buildings to pay tribute to the outgoing dean.

Unveiled was a van den Noort portrait scheduled to hang in the entrance of UCI's Medical Science Building No. 1. A "Van den Noort Arbor" designed by the staff of Rogers Gardens was dedicated nearby. In the skies above the medical campus, a plane carried a congratulatory banner.

One of the speakers, Paul C. Alloy, president of the medical school's Associated Alumni, described van den Noort as "a rather tough street brawler."

Alloy said his only advice to the outgoing dean was, "If you had come out with your guard up instead of

swinging, you might have warded off a few punches."

But he added, "There is no doubt Stan, that you are a champion."

Van den Noort told the audience, "I'm deeply touched by this occasion."

Regarding his accomplishments with the medical school, he added, "What we've achieved is nothing compared to what's to come."

In a brief interview after the ceremony, van den Noort said he had no misgivings about stepping down from his leadership post.

"I look forward to doing new things," he said. "I am first and foremost a doctor and a researcher, and I'm delighted to be going back to

Newport racer falls by the wayside

Bill Halliday joins more than a dozen competitors whose cars gave up ghost

WICHITA, Kan. — Bill Halliday's effort to cross the country in a 1926 Chevrolet Roadster came to an end Friday on a dusty, meandering highway in the northernmost stretch of Texas.

Halliday, a Newport Beach clothing shop owner who has been competing in the grueling Great American Race, ran out of luck — and spare parts — on the outskirts of Amarillo.

"Sure I'm disappointed but it's all in the spirit of the race," said Halliday, whose lemon-yellow roadster had suffered one mechanical

setback after another since the race began Monday in Los Angeles.

"The car just doesn't have enough muscle," said Halliday, whose effort has been underwritten in part by the Daily Pilot.

Halliday drove a 1936 Chevrolet delivery van to a 20th place finish in last year's race.

"These old cars just shake apart on the roads and there's only so much you can do to keep them going," he said. "We tried."

The casualty list in the Great Race, which today moves out of Kansas and into Missouri, has begun to swell.



Mike Little, the owner of an El Toro graphics firm, fell out of the race near the Arizona border where his 1914 Cadillac heaved, choked and threw a rod.

"Things started going wrong before we even got to Palm Springs," Little said. "Near the end, parts were just

flying all over the place, things falling out on the road and everything."

"We probably could have kept making repairs but things would have just kept breaking," said Little, who now is helping sell promotional T-shirts along the race route.

Eddie Schuler, the 71-year-old car dealer from Morrison, Ill., called it quits when he broke a piston in his 1924 Chrysler Phaeton and found himself stranded at the crossroads in Cline's Corners, N.M.

"I tried to get a new piston but there just wasn't enough time," said Schuler, who recently had open-heart surgery and wears a pacemaker.

"Last week when it didn't count for nothing I drove up Pike's Peak," Schuler said. "This week I blow a (Please see RACER'S/A2)

piston on the flattest land in the nation. That's the breaks."

The Great Race, which ends July 4 in New York City where a \$100,000 first-place prize awaits the winner, is a blend of endurance and bad breaks.

Tom Webb, a resident of Guthrie, Okla., sees all the bad breaks.

Webb is the truck driver who, without charge or complaint, picks up the antique cars that have busted down along the race route.

"I love it. I really do," said Webb, who has snared eight stranded antiques since the race began. "This is sort of like my vacation."

Webb, traveling with his wife and son, can fit up to six of the antique cars in his tractor-trailer, which is equipped with hydraulic lifts that enable him to double-stack the old autos inside the rig.

"The only problem I've had so far is with one of the fire trucks that broke down," Webb said.

"It took us four hours to load it. We had to take off the bell, the siren, let the air out of the tires and take off one axle," Webb said. "And even then it just barely fit in."

Webb accepts no money for sweeping the race route for cars every night, though he has been known to take a steak dinner or a cold beer in lieu of payment.

"When I tell them there's no charge, people just don't believe it," Webb said. "I make a lot of friends."

The Great Race is now far enough along, having taken racers to six states and through two time zones, that the field of contestants has become divided and several have emerged as early favorites in the 11-day race.

Jack Cassan of Oceanside, who is navigating his 1914 Dodge touring car, has been leading since the race left New Mexico and is in first place by a very slim, one-second edge.

Tom Lester, the Florida industrialist who is driving a 1909 Mercedes Benz worth \$1.25 million, is in sixth place, only 17 seconds off the mark.

Costa Mesa plumber Wayne Stanfield, who is the navigator of a red, 1916 Lancia Kappa, has slipped back to 13th position after holding the lead in the first days of the

race. Others, especially those traveling in less powerful cars that sputter and slow to a crawl on inclines, are just hoping to finish.

Miss Jennifer Goodheart, the Fountain Valley woman whose antique clothing matches the spirit of her 1906 Mitchell, is in 77th place, nearly a full hour off the front runners.

"If you want to win the race, you don't drive a car like this," said Goodheart, motioning to her white and pink convertible. Goodheart is known as Ginni Withers when she's not racing.

Cal Woolsey, an Irvine civil engineer driving a 1931 Pontiac Coupe, is in the 55th position, which, he says, is not great but probably will have to do.

"I'd just like to finish. This is a tough race, it really is," Woolsey said. "I'd also like to finish respectable. I know I'm not going to win."

The field of racers, now diminished to 90 out of the original 108, took off from Amarillo, Texas, on Friday before the sun slipped over the flat horizon.

A cold wind blew from the east and the smaller antique cars jerked back and forth, fighting the gusts along the road to Oklahoma.

"This ain't no surfing weather," said Cliff Hayden, an Amarillo car salesman who paused to watch the cars drift by. "This is your basic Amarillo special."

The Texas flatness gave way to the Oklahoma flatness, the only noticeable difference being in the color of license plates.

The racers pulled through Oklahoma City (home of the Cowboy Hall of Fame and the largest horse shoeing school in the nation) and then turned north to Guthrie.

A tiny highway town that provides an unexpected break from the nothingness that appears to make up the Oklahoma landscape, Guthrie has been restored to its late 1800 appearance.

"This is a nice town," said Jim Atkinson, an antique car racer from Missouri. "I'm almost ready to forgive Oklahoma right here on the

spot. And then came Wichita, the gateway to the Kansas prairie and the midpoint of the Great Race.

For Don Shawver, it was a homecoming. One of three Wichita residents entered in the race, Shawver was showered with attention and cold beer.

"At least I made it this far," said Shawver, who is driving a 1934 Ford Cabriolet. "I'm sure I'll be able to make New York. Who knows, I may even get competitive in this thing."

Angie Mayers, a Kansas City native visiting relatives in Wichita, stumbled into the huge crowd of spectators waiting for the racers.

"I was driving to Pizza Hut and I thought there'd been an accident. Something horrible, you know," Mayers said.

Fred Sanders, a retired electrician who said he has lived all his life in Wichita, was impressed by the old cars.

"I wish people still drove cars like that," Sanders said, squinting against the sun. "Cars back then had lots of class."

"My very first car was a Model T. My first wife made me get rid of it. Then she got rid of me," he said, laughing.

"Don't believe a word he says," added Harry Stone, another Wichita native. "He's still married and I doubt he even knows what a Model T looks like."

A favorite with spectators in every city is also the youngest crew member.

Gar is a year-old Dalmation who is provided plenty of leg and tail room on his master's 1912 American La France fire engine.

But Gar (it stands for Great American Race) also gives Robert Fuson and the rest of his fire engine crew one more thing to worry about.

"We stop, we gas up, we tune up and we walk the dog," said Fuson, a Warsaw, Ind., heart surgeon. "It's got to be done."

Today begins what veterans of the Great Race call the "longest day," the 400-mile journey from Wichita to St. Louis.

Buster said. "But that was not a measure of how he conducted himself as dean."

cumulation of minor problems that point toward the need for better-organized departments that operate more efficiently."

Foreman Pro Tem Paul Moreau added that the general administration in the county "seems to be a problem, a problem in every department."

Specifically, the Grand Jury pointed to four general problem areas identified by its 19 members during their year in office:

- The repeated use of consultants and outside experts on matters that normally would be handled by internal personnel in private business or other governments. "One must conclude that either Orange County government has not yet acquired the appropriate expertise despite its size, or that a proper level of confidence does not prevail toward those within the present government," the panel

wrote in its final report.

- The inability of county government to make progress on "vital issues" that have been studied and debated for years. "Indecision in dealing with prolonged and growing problems can result in management by crisis, requiring temporary "Band-Aid" measures, usually expensive and of questionable value," the report states.

- The lack of basic operating procedures within the various arms of county government. Such procedures would "improve efficiency and better serve the taxpayer," according to the report.

- County government's continued failure to more closely scrutinize private industry and business for parallel activities "developed after years of experience in their battle to survive in a competitive environment." Among activities noted are

record keeping, organizational efficiencies, accounting, personnel hiring and tracking, and space control. Neighboring county governments could also serve as an example, the foreman said.

Elaborating on the comments made in the final report, Kehoe said John Wayne Airport stands as "Exhibit A," an example of a vital issue on which no progress has been made despite years of debate and study. Problems with the Orange County Jail are another example of the kind of "traumatic situations" the Grand Jury was addressing, he said.

The foreman added that many of the problems county government faces are a direct result of the explosive growth the county experienced during the 1960s and 1970s. "We still wish we were growing (up) faster," he commented.

London via St. Louis to Little Rock.

Reagan administration officials in Washington said they had been notified late Friday of the imminent release of the remaining hostages held in Beirut, but did not make an announcement because "we just want the damn thing to happen. We don't want to screw up."

"We are presuming that all 39 are coming out," said an official who spoke on condition he not be identified. A second official said the hostages would stay in Damascus only for a few hours after their arrival

by car from Lebanon, and then sent home.

The Amal militiaman in charge of the hostages at the dinner said 32 of the passengers were at the dinner.

That was the message two speakers from government and private industry brought to roughly 30 Orange County business leaders who gathered Friday at the Airport Inn in Irvine for a breakfast meeting of the Industrial League of Orange County.

Dr. David Morell, senior policy analyst for the Environmental Protection Agency and Kenneth B. Kazarian, president of BBK Corp., a waste disposal company, told members of the industry and commerce association to plan on a radical change in the disposal of hazardous wastes during the next few years — replacing current landfill methods with more sophisticated, and more expensive, techniques for processing the waste.

"The whole approach to land disposal, in a word, stinks," Morell said. "All landfills leak," he said, and warned that hazardous wastes nationwide will be banned from disposal in landfills by 1990.

Instead, industries that produce hazardous wastes will be required to pay for a more costly disposal process, involving processing in special waste treatment plants. The treatment will include neutralizing the acids and bases, precipitating the metals, and removing the water from the waste.

The sludge that remains after the treatment process will then be dumped in "residuals repositories," designed especially for treated hazardous waste, some of which are already being built in California and elsewhere.

"The visibility of this issue, politically, is absolutely enormous," Morell said of the burgeoning hazardous waste issue in the United States. The issue is of concern to Southern California, in particular, because the area produces roughly 2.5 million tons of hazardous waste every year, or about a pound per person each day, according to Morell.

"We have a public that's increasingly fearful," he said. "We have a growing feeling we're on the edge of an abyss, or we've already fallen into it."

Kazarian of BBK Corp. said although the technology for effective treatment of hazardous waste has been available for several years, companies are unwilling to pay the extra costs for such treatment unless required to do so by government regulation and enforcement.

## Date for Hughes retrial set

Murder case against HB woman that ended in a mistrial this week to resume in October

The prosecution of accused Huntington Beach murderer Jeanette Hughes, which ended in a mistrial Wednesday, will resume in October, an Orange County deputy district attorney said Friday.

Prosecutor Richard Toohey said a new Hughes trial has been set for Oct. 21 in Orange County Superior Court in Westminster. It was not necessary to re-file charges after Wednesday's

mistrial, said Toohey, adding that Hughes will continue to face charges of first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit murder.

The mistrial resulted from a hung jury.

Hughes, 30, is accused of plotting with her lover, Adam Salas Ramirez, 42, to murder her husband James, a 37-year-old computer engineer. The alleged motive was the husband's

\$440,000 life insurance policy. James Hughes was smothered and shot in bed on Jan. 10, 1984.

Jeanette Hughes initially stood trial with Ramirez, but the cases were separated by Judge Leonard H. McBride. In March, Ramirez was convicted of murder, and earlier this month he was sentenced to 28 years in state prison.

Hughes' own trial began June 10 and ended Wednesday when jurors reached an 11-1 stalemate, with the majority favoring conviction.

Hughes is expected to remain in jail awaiting the Oct. 21 trial.

## Hearing in retiree slaying postponed

Arraignment of suspect in Irvine murder continued after attorney declares conflict

The arraignment of a Santa Ana man suspected of murdering an Irvine retiree has been continued for the second time.

The Friday arraignment of Sinatra O. Washington, 26, was continued to July 12 after an attorney from the county public defender's office declared a conflict of interest, Deputy District Attorney Richard King said. The attorney has been replaced by a court-appointed attorney, he said.

Attempts to arraign Washington and another man arrested with him were delayed once before because doctors at UC Irvine Medical Center ruled Washington unfit to stand

before a judge.

Washington was taken to the medical center's jail ward for treatment of superficial dog bites received while trying to escape police. He was held there for observation after routine testing disclosed a possible internal injury.

Washington has since been transferred to Orange County Jail.

The second man — William Agee III, 26, also of Santa Ana — who was arrested with Washington June 17 will not be charged in the murder. "We could find no evidence connecting him with the crime," King said.

However, Agee was arraigned on a separate burglary charge. He pleaded not guilty to helping Washington steal

items from a Westminster Radio Shack the same night an Irvine man was killed.

Police suspected Washington and Agee of suffocating and bludgeoning 66-year-old William C. Farley at his Via Torino home. Farley was found on the floor of the residence about 10 p.m. by his roommate.

Washington and Agee were arrested by Westminster police about two hours later as they allegedly burglarized the electronics store on Brookhurst Street.

Westminster police Sgt. Rick McKinney said officers observed the pair break the store's plate glass window and start to remove items from its shelves.

Agee was taken into custody without incident, McKinney said, but Washington tried to run away and had to be stopped by a police dog.

A license check revealed the car

they were driving belonged to Farley.

Washington and Agee have been held without bail since their arrest. Both have refused to talk to police officers, Irvine police Lt. Al Muir said. Bail was set for Agee after the district attorney decided not to pursue a murder charge against him.

Irvine police officer Larry Montgomery said investigators are not really sure what happened at Farley's home the night he died. But Montgomery said he and partner Pete Linton traced Washington from a 3 p.m. court hearing on a previous burglary charge to the residence in the city's Turtle Rock neighborhood. Farley was last seen alive about 4 p.m., he said.

Blood analysis and other laboratory tests should help determine the course of events leading to Farley's murder, Montgomery said.

### Milk samples to be tested for bacteria tied to deaths

LOS ANGELES — Milk samples taken from 27 dairy herds will be tested for the bacteria found in tainted Mexican-style cheese and linked to 52 deaths and stillbirths, a state official said. The milk samples from the herds in Riverside and San Bernardino counties that supplied Jalisco Mexican Products Inc. were sent to labs Friday to be tested for *Listeria monocytogenes*, said state Department of Food and Agriculture spokeswoman Lydia Rosbey.

### Condors' days in wild may be numbered

SAN DIEGO — With the California condor on the brink of extinction in the wild, biologists have begun the process that could see the remaining birds placed in protective custody at zoos, officials said Friday. An adult male condor captured earlier this week in rugged terrain near Ventura is making itself at home in a flight cage at the San Diego Wild Animal Park known as the "condominium," park spokesman Tom Hanscom said. It is the first of three condors to be captured under permits issued June 7 by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

### USS Missouri will go to San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO — Ignoring strong, local opposition to nuclear weapons, the Navy chose San Francisco on Friday as the home port for the revamped, historic battleship USS Missouri, a guided missile cruiser and six support ships, Sen. Pete Wilson announced. Mayor Dianne Feinstein said she had a classified briefing with the Navy that convinced her the Missouri would have enough safety measures to prevent accidental triggering of nuclear devices.

### No new evidence beneath torture bunker

WEST POINT — Excavation under the foothills bunker of survivalist Leonard Lake produced no new evidence in the mass murders apparently committed at Lake's remote Sierra Nevada home, investigators said Friday. "There is absolutely nothing down to four feet under the floor of the bunker," Calaveras County sheriff's spokesman Jim Stenquist told reporters Friday after officers completed a day of digging and sifting dirt under the suspected sex and murder dungeon — the last major site remaining for investigators to probe on Lake's 2½-acre retreat. He is linked to the disappearances of at least 22 people.

## NATION

### Police officers indicted in looting

BOSTON — Four of six Revere police officers sent to a drugstore after its burglar alarm sounded were indicted Friday on larceny charges, and two of the six were indicted on perjury charges, a lawyer said. Three of the officers had been picked from a lineup by a hooded witness who claimed he saw six police officers looting the store Feb. 1, said another lawyer, who spoke on condition he not be identified. About \$3,000 in merchandise was reported stolen from the store.

### 'Ecstasy' users stock up before ban

DALLAS — Sales of a trendy drug, known as "ecstasy," have been booming in nightspots as users try to stock up before midnight Sunday, when the amphetamine becomes illegal. The new federal ban will make possession of the drug a felony, carrying maximum penalties of 15 years in jail and a \$125,000 fine. Ecstasy parties are being planned around town, despite warnings by medical experts that the drug may cause brain damage.

### Police reportedly find arms cache

GLASGOW, Scotland — Police hunting alleged Irish Republican Army bombmakers sealed off a section of this Scottish industrial city's south side Friday, and there was a report they had found an arms cache. Bystanders near cordoned-off James Gray Street, where dozens of families were evacuated from their homes, said they heard a muffled thud from the vicinity, but police refused comment. They did say they had found "material," but did not give details.

### World's oldest man turns 120

TOKYO — Shigechiyo Izumi, considered the world's oldest man, turned 120 today and, aside from a slight weakness in his legs and back, is doing well, according to relatives. His daughter-in-law, Yorie Izumi, 52, told newspapers that Izumi still follows a daily routine of getting up at around 5:00 a.m. on sunny days and 6:00 a.m. on cloudy days, talking to tourists who visit his home on the remote southern island of Tokunoshima, and having his daily cup of fruit liquor. The township of Isen on Tokunoshima planned to hold a major celebration for Izumi, called the "Great Kanreki." Kanreki is a special celebration for those Japanese who turn 60 and mark the return of their sign on the Chinese 60-year zodiac. Records show that Izumi was born in 1865.

## Governor signs budget after cuts of \$501 million

SACRAMENTO (AP) — Gov. George Deukmejian signed a \$34.8 billion state budget Friday after cutting \$501 million and anti-apartheid language added by the Legislature.

The Republican governor did not remove anti-abortion restrictions for family planning funds that had mistakenly been left in the budget by legislative staff, saying those keep "faith with my own convictions about abortion."

Deukmejian signed the budget for the 1985-86 fiscal year that begins Monday privately in his Capitol office, without a public ceremony. He did deliver a 10-minute statewide television address Thursday night, but did not detail his cuts then.

Almost all of the cuts made in the \$35.3 billion budget sent the governor by the Legislature two weeks ago were deletions of spending increases added by legislators to programs such as community colleges, housing, mental health, schools, Medi-Cal hospitals and child care.

He also deleted money added by lawmakers for comparable worth for female state employees; museums for Japanese-Americans, AIDS research; and cleanup of underground tank and Tijuana River pollution.

Assembly Speaker Willie Brown

called the vetoes "a series of vengeful and vindictive cuts that make a mockery of the six months of work" of the legislative budget committees.

"The cuts were not needed in order to acquire their surplus ... They were only the actions of a governor who doesn't fully appreciate that in the state government there are three branches," said the San Francisco Democrat.

The Legislature's budget had a \$1.07 billion "rainy-day" surplus, close to the amount Deukmejian had insisted was necessary. The budget he signed has a reserve of \$1.343 billion. That includes \$289 million he said he was setting aside for programs he wants the Legislature to approve.

Those programs include \$125 million for transportation, \$68 million to repay special funds from which money was borrowed during the 1983 budget deficit and \$25 million for drinking water projects near Stringfellow toxics waste dump in Riverside County.

The anti-apartheid language he eliminated was added by Assembly Democrats, who wanted to restrict state investments in firms that do business in South Africa.

"I have concluded that the state budget is not the appropriate instrument in which to express our abhorrence of apartheid," he wrote.

## Youth shot by Goetz arrested

NEW YORK (AP) — James Ramseur Jr., one of the four teenagers shot by Bernhard Goetz on a subway train, was arrested Friday on charges of raping and robbing a young woman at gunpoint last month, authorities said.

Police arrested Ramseur, 18, after the victim — who was hospitalized for four days after the attack — identified him in a lineup at the 48th Precinct in the Bronx, law enforcement sources told The Associated Press.

Bronx District Attorney Mario Merola, who announced the arrest, said in a statement that Ramseur allegedly accosted the 18-year-old victim in an elevator in her building at the Claremont Houses, a Bronx housing project.

## Stocks post record as half-year ends

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks used a modest advance Friday to close the first half of 1985 at record levels.

Prices moved within a narrow range for most of the day, but the upturn shortly before the closing bell was enough for several of the market's key averages to best their previous highs reached Thursday.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials rose 3.25 to an all-time high of 1,335.46, and for the week the measure advanced 10.98 points. Through the first six months of the year, the blue-chip average is up 123.89 points, or 9.3 percent.

The Dow Jones transportation average also set a new high, gaining 1.05 to 664.09, as did the New York Stock Exchange composite index, which rose 0.39 to 111.11.

Overall advances led declines by 3 to 2 on the NYSE, and Big Board volume totaled 105.24 million shares, against 106.73 million in the previous session.

Stocks again were underpinned by a rally in the bond market, where prices of Treasury bonds rose about a point, or \$10 for every \$1,000 in face value, for the second consecutive day. Conversely, some short-term interest rates fell by about a tenth of a percentage point.

Nationwide turnover in NYSE-listed issues, including trades in those stocks on regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 125.25 million shares.

The NASDAQ composite index for the over-the-counter market closed at 296.20, up 0.86.

## U.S. recruited war criminals as spies

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. spy agencies recruited Nazi war criminals to gather intelligence on the Soviet Union after World War II, and then helped some of them immigrate illegally to the United States, congressional investigators said Friday.

The General Accounting Office said the recruitment took place when an ill-prepared intelligence system was suddenly ordered, in 1946, "to produce the highest possible quality of intelligence on the U.S.S.R. in the shortest time possible."

The report by Congress' investigative arm also said the U.S. government employed Klaus Barbie, the Gestapo chief in Lyons, France,

This country protected Barbie from extradition and organized his escape to South America, according to the GAO.

The study was requested by Rep. Peter W. Rodino Jr., D-N.J., chairman of the House Judiciary Committee.

Rodino said the report makes it "painfully clear that some of our intelligence agents allowed their preoccupation with the Soviet Union to cloud their judgment and that the anti-communist frenzy of the times led to some highly questionable decisions about the use of Nazi war criminals."

The GAO said the 1946 order came

when U.S. forces were demobilized, the Office of Strategic Services (the wartime intelligence agency) dismantled and many experienced agents already home and pursuing private careers.

"Their replacements, besides being inexperienced, were believed by some former intelligence officers we interviewed to be philosophically and politically naive" about the beginning of the Cold War, the report said.

The GAO studied cases of 114 aliens — including Nazis and Axis collaborators — and identified five with undesirable or questionable backgrounds who were employed by U.S. intelligence agencies and re-

ceived some form of assistance to immigrate. Seven other aliens with similar backgrounds immigrated without identifiable assistance.

"Among the five assisted aliens were two alleged war criminals, a former Nazi SS officer, a convicted conspirator in an assassination and a 'traitor,'" the report said.

The recruited Nazis included members of the Gestapo, SS and East European fascist organizations. But one former U.S. intelligence agent told the GAO that their use was a question of weighing their value against their past.

piston on the flattest land in the nation. That's the breaks.

The Great Race, which ends July 4 in New York City where a \$100,000 first-place prize awaits the winner, is a blend of endurance and bad breaks.

Tom Webb, a resident of Guthrie, Okla., sees all the bad breaks.

Webb is the truck driver who, without charge or complaint, picks up the antique cars that have busted down along the race route.

"I love it. I really do," said Webb, who has snared eight stranded antiques since the race began. "This is sort of like my vacation."

Webb, traveling with his wife and son, can fit up to six of the antique cars in his tractor-trailer, which is equipped with hydraulic lifts that enable him to double-stack the old autos inside the rig.

"The only problem I've had so far is with one of the five trucks that broke down," Webb said.

"It took us four hours to load it. We had to take off the bell, the siren, let the air out of the tires and take off one axle," Webb said. "And even then it just barely fit in."

Webb accepts no money for sweeping the race route for cars every night, though he has been known to take a steak dinner or a cold beer in lieu of payment.

"When I tell them there's no charge, people just don't believe it," Webb said. "I make a lot of friends."

The Great Race is now far enough along, having taken racers to six states and through two time zones, that the field of contestants has become divided and several have emerged as early favorites in the 14-day race.

Jack Cassan of Oceanside, who is navigating his 1914 Dodge touring car, has been leading since the race left New Mexico and is in first place by a very slim, one-second edge.

Tom Lester, the Florida industrialist who is driving a 1909 Mercedes Benz worth \$1.25 million, is in sixth place, only 17 seconds off the mark.

Costa Mesa plumber Wayne Stanfield, who is the navigator of a red, 1916 Lancia Kappa, has slipped back to 13th position after holding the lead in the first days of the

race. Others, especially those traveling in less powerful cars that sputter and slow to a crawl on inclines, are just hoping to finish.

Miss Jennifer Goodheart, the Fountain Valley woman whose antique clothing matches the spirit of her 1906 Mitchell, is in 77th place, nearly a full hour off the front runners.

"If you want to win the race, you don't drive a car like this," said Goodheart, motioning to her white and pink convertible. Goodheart is known as Ginni Withers when she's not racing.

Cal Woolsey, an Irvine civil engineer driving a 1931 Pontiac Coupe, is in the 55th position, which, he says, is not great but probably will have to do.

"I'd just like to finish. This is a tough race, it really is," Woolsey said. "I'd also like to finish respectable. I know I'm not going to win."

The field of racers, now diminished to 90 out of the original 108, took off from Amarillo, Texas, on Friday before the sun slipped over the flat horizon.

A cold wind blew from the east and the smaller antique cars jerked back and forth, fighting the gusts along the road to Oklahoma.

"This ain't no surfing weather," said Cliff Hayden, an Amarillo car salesman who paused to watch the cars drift by. "This is your basic Amarillo special."

The Texas flatness gave way to the Oklahoma flatness, the only noticeable difference being in the color of license plates.

The racers pulled through Oklahoma City (home of the Cowboy Hall of Fame and the largest horse shoeing school in the nation) and then turned north to Guthrie.

A tiny highway town that provides an unexpected break from the nothingness that appears to make up the Oklahoma landscape, Guthrie has been restored to its late 1800 appearance.

"This is a nice town," said Jim Atkinson, an antique car racer from Missouri. "I'm almost ready to forgive Oklahoma right here on the

spot. And then came Wichita, the gateway to the Kansas prairie and the midpoint of the Great Race.

For Don Shawver, it was a homecoming. One of three Wichita residents entered in the race, Shawver was showered with attention and cold beer.

"At least I made it this far," said Shawver, who is driving a 1934 Ford Cabriolet. "I'm sure I'll be able to make New York. Who knows, I may even get competitive in this thing."

Angie Mayers, a Kansas City native visiting relatives in Wichita, stumbled into the huge crowd of spectators waiting for the racers.

"I was driving to Pizza Hut and I thought there'd been an accident. Something horrible, you know," Mayers said.

Fred Sanders, a retired electrician who said he has lived all his life in Wichita, was impressed by the old cars.

"I wish people still drove cars like that," Sanders said, squinting against the sun. "Cars back then had lots of class."

"My very first car was a Model T. My first wife made me get rid of it. Then she got rid of me," he said, laughing.

"Don't believe a word he says," added Harry Stone, another Wichita native. "He's still married and I doubt he even knows what a Model T looks like."

A favorite with spectators in every city is also the youngest crew member.

Gar is a year-old Dalmation who is provided plenty of leg and tail room on his master's 1912 American La France fire engine.

But Gar (it stands for Great American Race) also gives Robert Fuson and the rest of his fire engine crew one more thing to worry about.

"We stop, we gas up, we tune up and we walk the dog," said Fuson, a Warsaw, Ind., heart surgeon. "It's got to be done."

Today begins what veterans of the Great Race call the "longest day," the 400-mile journey from Wichita to St. Louis.

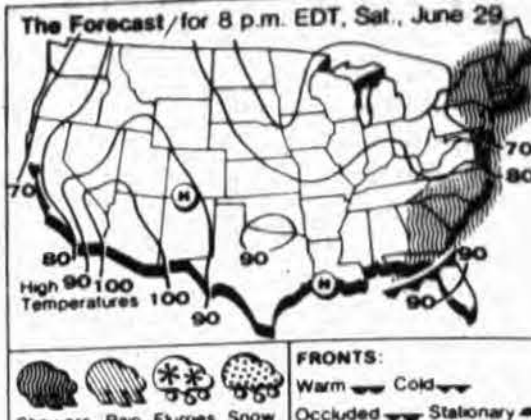

London via St. Louis to Little Rock. Reagan administration officials in Washington said they had been notified late Friday of the imminent release of the remaining hostages held in Beirut, but did not make an announcement because "we just want the damn thing to happen. We don't want to screw up."

"We are presuming that all 39 are coming out," said an official who spoke on condition he not be identified. A second official said the hostages would stay in Damascus only for a few hours after their arrival

by car from Lebanon, and then sent home.

The Amal militiaman in charge of the hostages at the dinner said 32 of the passengers were at the dinner.

Sources involved in the complex, multinational discussions said they expected the hostages to arrive in Damascus sometime Saturday afternoon local time.

In Damascus, officials at the government information office also told reporters the hostages would arrive in Syria sometime Saturday afternoon. The officials also demanded

anonymity. Syria is six hours ahead of Eastern Daylight Time.

On Friday, government sources said a U.N. envoy was negotiating a plan under which the 39 American hijack hostages would be moved to Syria and held there until Israel frees the 735 Lebanese prisoners.

Nabih Berri, the Shiite Moslem Amal militia leader who has taken responsibility for the hostages, produced three of them for reporters. Allyn Conwell of Houston, Texas, said he believed Israel should release the prisoners "because there's got to be one hell of a strong cry from the American people for justice..."

Conwell said later he was upset to learn that the United States is now demanding the immediate, unconditional release of seven Americans kidnapped earlier in Lebanon as well as freedom for the airline hostages.

"That distresses me," Conwell said in a taped CBS News interview. "Because they are certainly requesting an entity — the Amal movement — to make concessions that they have absolutely either no control over or would appear to not even have adequate channels of communication to that other group."

Islamic Holy War, a shadowy group believed linked to Iran, has claimed responsibility for kidnapping the seven Americans.

and murderers and barbarians is wrong to do," said Reagan.

In a Friday interview with the Daily Pilot, Sara Jacobsen, former wife of a Huntington Beach man abducted in West Beirut last month, said she "just assumed that from the very beginning the government was dealing with all 46 Americans being held by terrorists. Mrs. Jacobsen's husband, 54-year-old hospital director David Jacobsen, was kidnapped May 28.

Those at the meeting in the Illinois school library included relatives of nine of the 10 Illinoisans still captive as a result of the hijacking; members

of Jenco's family; and the Rev. William McDonnell, a TWA passenger released shortly after the hijacking.

"He (Reagan) is in agreement that we're going to release all the hostages," said Mae Mihelich of Joliet, Jenco's sister.

"He's praying that all 46 will be released. He said all 46 will be included in negotiating," Mihelich said, referring to the 39 TWA passengers still being held and the seven kidnap victims.

She declined to discuss details of the meeting, saying the president had asked the families not to do so.

cumulation of minor problems that point toward the need for better-organized departments that operate more efficiently.

Foreman Pro Tem Paul Moreau added that the general administration in the county "seems to be a problem, a problem in every department."

Specifically, the Grand Jury pointed to four general problem areas identified by its 19 members during their year in office.

• The repeated use of consultants and outside experts on matters that normally would be handled by internal personnel in private business or other governments. "One must conclude that either Orange County government has not yet acquired the appropriate expertise despite its size, or that a proper level of confidence does not prevail toward those within the present government," the panel

wrote in its final report.

• The inability of county government to make progress on "vital issues" that have been studied and debated for years. "Indecision in dealing with prolonged and growing problems can result in management by crisis, requiring temporary 'Band-Aid' measures, usually expensive and of questionable value," the report states.

• The lack of basic operating procedures within the various arms of county government. Such procedures would "improve efficiency and better serve the taxpayer," according to the report.



## Time to revise toxin disposal

It's time to start treating hazardous waste instead of dumping or burying it raw.

That was the message two speakers from government and private industry brought to roughly 30 Orange County business leaders who gathered Friday at the Airport Inn in Irvine for a breakfast meeting of the Industrial League of Orange County.

Dr. David Morell, senior policy analyst for the Environmental Protection Agency and Kenneth B. Kazarian, president of BBK Corp., a waste disposal company, told members of the industry and commerce association to plan on a radical change in the disposal of hazardous wastes during the next few years — replacing current landfill methods with more sophisticated, and more expensive, techniques for processing the waste.

"The whole approach to land disposal, in a word, stinks," Morell said. "All landfills leak," he said, and warned that hazardous wastes nationwide will be banned from disposal in landfills by 1990.

Instead, industries that produce hazardous wastes will be required to pay for a more costly disposal process, involving processing in special waste treatment plants. The treatment will include neutralizing the acids and bases, precipitating the metals, and removing the water from the waste.

The sludge that remains after the treatment process will then be dumped in "residuals repositories," designed especially for treated hazardous waste, some of which are already being built in California and elsewhere.

"The visibility of this issue, politically, is absolutely enormous," Morell said of the burgeoning hazardous waste issue in the United States. The issue is of concern to Southern California, in particular, because the area produces roughly 2.5 million tons of hazardous waste every year, or about a pound per person each day, according to Morell.

"We have a public that's increasingly fearful," he said. "We have a growing feeling we're on the edge of an abyss, or we've already fallen into it."

Kazarian of BBK Corp. said although the technology for effective treatment of hazardous waste has been available for several years, companies are unwilling to pay the extra costs for such treatment unless required to do so by government regulation and enforcement.

## Date for Hughes retrial set

Murder case against HB woman that ended in a mistrial this week to resume in October

The prosecution of accused Huntington Beach murderer Jeanette Hughes, which ended in a mistrial Wednesday, will resume in October, an Orange County deputy district attorney said Friday.

Prosecutor Richard Toohey said a new Hughes trial has been set for Oct. 21 in Orange County Superior Court in Westminster. It was not necessary to re-file charges after Wednesday's

mistrial, said Toohey, adding that Hughes will continue to face charges of first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit murder.

The mistrial resulted from a hung jury.

Hughes, 30, is accused of plotting with her lover, Adam Salas Ramirez, 42, to murder her husband James, a 37-year-old computer engineer. The alleged motive was the husband's

\$440,000 life insurance policy. James Hughes was smothered and shot in bed on Jan. 10, 1984.

Jeannette Hughes initially stood trial with Ramirez, but the cases were separated by Judge Leonard H. McBride. In March, Ramirez was convicted of murder, and earlier this month he was sentenced to 28 years in state prison.

Hughes' own trial began June 10 and ended Wednesday when jurors reached an 11-1 stalemate, with the majority favoring conviction.

Hughes is expected to remain in jail awaiting the Oct. 21 trial.

## Hearing in retiree slaying postponed

Arraignment of suspect in Irvine murder continued after attorney declares conflict

The arraignment of a Santa Ana man suspected of murdering an Irvine retiree has been continued for the second time.

The Friday arraignment of Sinatra O. Washington, 26, was continued to July 12 after an attorney from the county public defender's office declared a conflict of interest, Deputy District Attorney Richard King said. The attorney has been replaced by a court-appointed attorney, he said.

Attempts to arraign Washington and another man arrested with him were delayed once before because doctors at UC Irvine Medical Center ruled Washington unfit to stand

before a judge.

Washington was taken to the medical center's jail ward for treatment of superficial dog bites received while trying to escape police. He was held there for observation after routine testing disclosed a possible internal injury.

Washington has since been transferred to Orange County Jail.

The second man — William Agee III, 26, also of Santa Ana — who was arrested with Washington June 17 will not be charged in the murder.

"We could find no evidence connecting him with the crime," King said.

However, Agee was arraigned on a separate burglary charge. He pleaded not guilty to helping Washington steal

items from a Westminster Radio Shack the same night an Irvine man was killed.

Police suspected Washington and Agee of suffocating and bludgeoning 66-year-old William C. Farley at his Via Torino home. Farley was found on the floor of the residence about 10 p.m. by his roommate.

Washington and Agee were arrested by Westminster police about two hours later as they allegedly burglarized the electronics store on Brookhurst Street.

Westminster police Sgt. Rick McKinney said officers observed the pair break the store's plate glass window and start to remove items from its shelves.

Agee was taken into custody without incident, McKinney said, but Washington tried to run away and had to be stopped by a police dog.

A license check revealed the car

they were driving belonged to Farley.

Washington and Agee have been held without bail since their arrest. Both have refused to talk to police officers, Irvine police Lt. Al Muir said. Bail was set for Agee after the district attorney decided not to pursue a murder charge against him.

Irvine police officer Larry Montgomery said investigators are not really sure what happened at Farley's home the night he died. But Montgomery said he and partner Pete Linton traced Washington from a 3 p.m. court hearing on a previous burglary charge to the residence in the city's Turtle Rock neighborhood. Farley was last seen alive about 4 p.m., he said.

Blood analysis and other laboratory tests should help determine the course of events leading to Farley's murder, Montgomery said.

### Milk samples to be tested for bacteria tied to deaths

LOS ANGELES — Milk samples taken from 27 dairy herds will be tested for the bacteria found in tainted Mexican-style cheese and linked to 52 deaths and stillbirths, a state official said. The milk samples from the herds in Riverside and San Bernardino counties that supplied Jalisco Mexican Products Inc. were sent to labs Friday to be tested for *Listeria monocytogenes*, said state Department of Food and Agriculture spokeswoman Lydia Rosbey.

### Condors' days in wild may be numbered

SAN DIEGO — With the California condor on the brink of extinction in the wild, biologists have begun the process that could see the remaining birds placed in protective custody at zoos, officials said Friday. An adult male condor captured earlier this week in rugged terrain near Ventura is making itself at home in a flight cage at the San Diego Wild Animal Park known as the "condominium," park spokesman Tom Hanscom said. It is the first of three condors to be captured under permits issued June 7 by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

### USS Missouri will go to San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO — Ignoring strong, local opposition to nuclear weapons, the Navy chose San Francisco on Friday as the home port for the revamped, historic battleship USS Missouri, a guided missile cruiser and six support ships, Sen. Pete Wilson announced. Mayor Dianne Feinstein said she had a classified briefing with the Navy that convinced her the Missouri would have enough safety measures to prevent accidental triggering of nuclear devices.

### No new evidence beneath torture bunker

WEST POINT — Excavation under the foothills bunker of survivalist Leonard Lake produced no new evidence in the mass murders apparently committed at Lake's remote Sierra Nevada home, investigators said Friday. "There is absolutely nothing down to four feet under the floor of the bunker," Calaveras County sheriff's spokesman Jim Stenquist told reporters Friday after officers completed a day of digging and sifting dirt under the suspected sex and murder dungeon — the last major site remaining for investigators to probe on Lake's 2½-acre retreat. He is linked to the disappearances of at least 22 people.

## NATION

### Police officers indicted in looting

BOSTON — Four of six Revere police officers sent to a drugstore after its burglar alarm sounded were indicted Friday on larceny charges, and two of the six were indicted on perjury charges, a lawyer said. Three of the officers had been picked from a lineup by a hooded witness who claimed he saw six police officers looting the store Feb. 1, said another lawyer, who spoke on condition he not be identified. About \$3,000 in merchandise was reported stolen from the store.

### 'Ecstasy' users stock up before ban

DALLAS — Sales of a trendy drug, known as "ecstasy," have been booming in nightspots as users try to stock up before midnight Sunday, when the amphetamine becomes illegal. The new federal ban will make possession of the drug a felony, carrying maximum penalties of 15 years in jail and a \$125,000 fine. Ecstasy parties are being planned around town, despite warnings by medical experts that the drug may cause brain damage.

### Police reportedly find arms cache

GLASGOW, Scotland — Police hunting alleged Irish Republican Army bombmakers sealed off a section of this Scottish industrial city's south side Friday, and there was a report they had found an arms cache. Bystanders near cordoned-off James Gray Street, where dozens of families were evacuated from their homes, said they heard a muffled thud from the vicinity, but police refused comment. They did say they had found "material," but did not give details.

### World's oldest man turns 120

TOKYO — Shigechiyo Izumi, considered the world's oldest man, turned 120 today and, aside from a slight weakness in his legs and back, is doing well, according to relatives. His daughter-in-law, Yorie Izumi, 52, told newspapers that Izumi still follows a daily routine of getting up at around 5:00 a.m. on sunny days and 6:00 a.m. on cloudy days, talking to tourists who visit his home on the remote southern island of Tokunoshima, and having his daily cup of fruit liquor. The township of Ison on Tokunoshima planned to hold a major celebration for Izumi, called the "Great Kanreki." Kanreki is a special celebration for those Japanese who turn 60 and mark the return of their sign on the Chinese 60-year zodiac. Records show that Izumi was born in 1865.

## Governor signs budget after cuts of \$501 million

SACRAMENTO (AP) — Gov. George Deukmejian signed a \$34.8 billion state budget Friday after cutting \$501 million and anti-apartheid language added by the Legislature.

The Republican governor did not remove anti-abortion restrictions for family planning funds that had mistakenly been left in the budget by legislative staff, saying those keep "faith with my own convictions about abortion."

Deukmejian signed the budget for the 1985-86 fiscal year that begins Monday privately in the Capitol office, without a public ceremony. He did deliver a 10-minute statewide television address Thursday night, but did not detail his cuts then.

Almost all of the cuts made in the \$35.3 billion budget sent the governor by the Legislature two weeks ago were deletions of spending increases added by legislators to programs such as community colleges, housing, mental health, schools, Medi-Cal hospitals and child care.

He also deleted money added by lawmakers for comparable worth for female state employees; museums for Japanese-Americans, Hollywood and science; selenium and AIDS research; and cleanup of underground tank and Tijuana River pollution.

Assembly Speaker Willie Brown

called the vetoes "a series of vengeful and vindictive cuts that make a mockery of the six months of work" of the legislative budget committees.

"The cuts were not needed in order to acquire the surplus ... They were only the actions of a governor who doesn't fully appreciate that in the state government there are three branches," said the San Francisco Democrat.

The Legislature's budget had a \$1.07 billion "rainy-day" surplus, close to the amount Deukmejian had insisted was necessary. The budget he signed has a reserve of \$1.343 billion. That includes \$289 million he said he was setting aside for programs he wants the Legislature to approve.

Those programs include \$125 million for transportation, \$68 million to repay special funds from which money was borrowed during the 1983 budget deficit and \$25 million for drinking water projects near Stringfellow toxics waste dump in Riverside County.

The anti-apartheid language he eliminated was added by Assembly Democrats, who wanted to restrict state investments in firms that do business in South Africa.

"I have concluded that the state budget is not the appropriate instrument in which to express our abhorrence of apartheid," he wrote.

## Youth shot by Goetz arrested

NEW YORK (AP) — James Ramseur Jr., one of the four teenagers shot by Bernhard Goetz on a subway train, was arrested Friday on charges of raping and robbing a young woman at gunpoint last month, authorities said.

Police arrested Ramseur, 18, after the victim — who was hospitalized for four days after the attack — identified him in a lineup at the 48th Precinct in the Bronx, law enforcement sources told The Associated Press.

Bronx District Attorney Mario Merola, who announced the arrest, said in a statement that Ramseur allegedly accosted the 18-year-old victim in an elevator in her building at the Claremont Houses, a Bronx housing project.

## Stocks post record as half-year ends

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks used a modest advance Friday to close the first half of 1985 at record levels.

Prices moved within a narrow range for most of the day, but the upturn shortly before the closing bell was enough for several of the market's key averages to best their previous highs reached Thursday.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials rose 3.25 to an all-time high of 1,335.46, and for the week the measure advanced 10.98 points. Through the first six months of the year, the blue-chip average is up 123.89 points, or 9.3 percent.

The Dow Jones transportation average also set a new high, gaining 1.05 to 664.09, as did the New York Stock Exchange composite index, which rose 0.39 to 111.11.

Overall advances led declines by 3 to 2 on the NYSE, and Big Board volume totaled 105.24 million shares, against 106.73 million in the previous session.

Stocks again were underpinned by a rally in the bond market, where prices of Treasury bonds rose about a point, or \$10 for every \$1,000 in face value, for the second consecutive day. Conversely, some short-term interest rates fell by about a tenth of a percentage point.

Nationwide turnover in NYSE-listed issues, including trades in those stocks on regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 125.25 million shares.

The NASDAQ composite index for the over-the-counter market closed at 296.20, up 0.36.

## U.S. recruited war criminals as spies

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. spy agencies recruited Nazi war criminals to gather intelligence on the Soviet Union after World War II, and then helped some of them immigrate illegally to the United States, congressional investigators said Friday.

The General Accounting Office said the recruitment took place when an ill-prepared intelligence system was suddenly ordered, in 1946, "to produce the highest possible quality of intelligence on the U.S.S.R. in the shortest time possible."

The report by Congress' investigative arm also said the U.S. government employed Klaus Barbie, the Gestapo chief in Lyons, France,

This country protected Barbie from extradition and organized his escape to South America, according to the GAO.

The study was requested by Rep. Peter W. Rodino Jr., D-N.J., chairman of the House Judiciary Committee.

Rodino said the report makes it "painfully clear that some of our intelligence agents allowed their preoccupation with the Soviet Union to cloud their judgment and that the anti-communist frenzy of the times led to some highly questionable decisions about the use of Nazi war criminals."

The GAO said the 1946 order came

when U.S. forces were demobilized, the Office of Strategic Services (the wartime intelligence agency) dismantled and many experienced agents already home and pursuing private careers.

"Their replacements, besides being inexperienced, were believed by some former intelligence officers we interviewed to be philosophically and politically naive" about the beginning of the Cold War, the report said.

The GAO studied cases of 114 aliens — including Nazis and Axis collaborators — and identified five with undesirable or questionable backgrounds who were employed by U.S. intelligence agencies and re-

ceived some form of assistance to immigrate. Seven others, aliens with similar backgrounds immigrated without identifiable assistance.

"Among the five assisted aliens were two alleged war criminals, a former Nazi SS officer, a convicted conspirator in an assassination and a traitor," the report said.

The recruited Nazis included members of the Gestapo, SS and East European fascist organizations. But one former U.S. intelligence agent told the GAO that their use was a question of weighing their value against their past.

# Irvine's high school grads get scholarships worth over \$1 million

College-bound seniors at Irvine's three high schools have qualified for more than \$1 million worth of scholarships, Irvine Unified School District officials say.

A district report states that \$1,104,700 in university and college scholarships has been awarded to graduating seniors from Irvine, Woodbridge and University high schools.

Scholarship figures were provided by each of the high schools, but district officials noted that some awards have not yet been announced and in other cases, financial arrangements are still being concluded.

Based on the latest figures, however, University High School seniors have been awarded more than \$375,000 in scholarships. These include an Air Force Academy appointment, a financial aid offer from Stanford University and seven National Merit scholarships.

Other University High students have received Bank of America grants and state grants earmarked for expenses at two- and four-year campuses.

Although not all college-bound students have received scholarships, University High administrators reported that 70 of their seniors will attend University of California campuses, 20 will attend private schools in California including USC and Stanford; 26 will attend out-of-state private schools such as Cornell, Yale and Harvard; 16 will attend public colleges and universities in other states; 36 have been accepted by the California State University system; four plan to attend trade schools and 51 are registered at community colleges.

The scholarship total for Irvine High School seniors is \$404,700. Irvine High students have received more than 38 scholarships from community sources including the Bank of America.

Also, 13 students have received scholarships from the school they will be attending, while 25 have been awarded state grants. Destinations of Irvine High seniors include M.I.T., Princeton and the universities of Dallas, Nebraska and Arizona.

Accepted by the UC system are 73 students, while 80 others have enrolled in the Cal State system. About 75 students will attend California's community colleges, while other will attend private California schools such as USC and Stanford.

Scholarships worth more than \$325,000 have been awarded to seniors at Woodbridge High. Local sponsors include the Junior Ebell Club, Dollars for Scholars, the Irvine Co., Orange County Performing Arts and the Orange County Teachers Credit Union.

Two Woodbridge seniors have received appointments to West Point, while others will attend Princeton and Stanford.

Also, 65 Woodbridge seniors have enrolled in the UC system, 33 in the Cal State system and 85 in the community college system. Private California schools have accepted 32 Woodbridge seniors, while 20 others will attend out-of-state universities.

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# Memories of Halley's Comet's last visit still bright

PEMBERTON, N.J. (AP) — Ever since the tail of Halley's Comet swept across the Earth 75 years ago Saturday, witnesses have been spinning tall tales about how they lived through it despite the then-current talk of disaster.

As astronomers prepare for November and the comet's first visit to these parts since 1910, a man with a burning interest in the passing phenomenon is collecting the stories of those who hope to see it for the second time.

Joseph M. Laufer, 49, an associate dean at Burlington Community College, says he gets 10 to 20 answers a day to solicitations in several national publications.

Many respondents say they remember being held by their parents to watch the comet in 1910, Laufer said.

"We were told that the tail of the comet consisted of poison gases and that it was possible that life on Earth would be wiped out if we passed through the tail of the comet," wrote Oliver Johnson of Sacramento, who was a boy of 10 at the time.

"We are still alive," he added. Laufer, who hopes to compile his researches into a book, said he found that coal miners in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., refused to go into the shafts while the comet was around for fear of dying underground.

"Down in Texas, they were selling comet pills," he said. "They said if

you took those pills, nothing would happen to you. So people were gorging themselves on sugar pills."

For some, it was an occasion for celebration. On May 18, 1910, Laufer said, guests at one elegant Chicago hotel quaffed 50 bottles of champagne on the rooftop, then held the empties aloft to collect comet dust.

Laufer said most accounts by astronomers describe the 1910 comet as a big star with a wisp of a tail, a far more modest sight than that reported in many of the letters.

One letter, from 87-year-old Carl Wheaton of Boonsboro, Md., described the comet as "about the size of a full moon, with a long tail stretching miles toward the sun."

Laufer publishes a "Halley's Comet Watch" newsletter for those who share his fascination, and teaches a course on the comet at his college.

The comet will become visible to the naked eye near the end of 1985 and the best areas for viewing are expected to be in Southern Hemisphere. Because of its relative position to the sun and Earth, however, it is likely to appear a lot less spectacular than it did in 1910.

"There's a lot of hype associated with Halley's Comet," he said. "From a scientific point of view and a sociological point of view, it really is a major cosmic event. But as far as looking at it, I have a feeling it's going to be a bit disappointing."

While the comet is visible, Laufer has been invited as a guest lecturer for a week-long Caribbean cruise of comet watchers.

A few of Laufer's correspondents say they see the comet as a measure of their lives.

Mildred Coalter of Austin, Texas, born in 1910, said: "I've always believed when the comet returns that it will take me back into space with it."

Mark Twain, who was born in 1835, the year of an appearance by the comet, died 75 years later, on April 21, 1910, the day after the comet's perihelion, the point at which it was closest to the sun.

He had predicted that "two freaks will go out together," Laufer said.

## Comet's just a dusty snowball

Scientists view birth of an atmosphere while comet-gazing

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. (AP) — Astronomers say Halley's comet has given them their first look at the birth of any comet's atmosphere and their findings support the prevailing theory that the unearthly visitor is a "dusty snowball."

Based on observations of the comet and its changes in brightness, the ice-and-dust nucleus of Halley's sprouted a coma, or gas-and-dust atmosphere, in October, said Susan Wyckoff, of Arizona State University.

The findings by researchers from Arizona State and the Institut d'Astrophysique in Paris were presented this week at the annual meeting of the Astronomical Society of the Pacific. Wyckoff said the study will be published next month in the British journal Nature.

"This is the first time we've been able to follow a comet through the transition from a bare nucleus to the onset and development of its atmosphere," said Michael Belton, an astronomer at Kitt Peak National Observatory outside Tucson.

Belton said other astronomers also observed the transition, but the Wyckoff group is the first to publish findings. Halley's comet will be visible to the naked eye by late January.

"We've never followed a comet from this far out," said Eyal Weissman of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, Calif. "We've actually watched it go from an inactive nucleus to a point (where) we can see gas coming off the nucleus."

Analysis of light from the comet revealed that water ice is evaporating from its nucleus, a finding consistent with the broadly accepted theory that Halley's comet is basically a dirty snowball made primarily of water ice, but also containing dust and ices of various gases, Wyckoff said.

Water ice and ices of gases evaporate at different temperatures and thus at different distances from the sun's heat. The point at which the evaporation formed a coma — about 600 million miles from the sun — showed that the comet's ice is primarily water, she added.

A comet appears brighter when it develops an atmosphere because particles of dust in the gas reflect more light than the bare nucleus. The nucleus of Halley's comet is believed to be only a few miles in diameter, while its coma is expected to measure 10,000 miles across during its nearest approach to the sun Feb. 9.

Wyckoff said the observations were made between the first sighting of the comet's current visit on Oct. 16, 1982, and April. Her team studied the observations of astronomers worldwide and photographs of the comet made through the Multiple Mirror Telescope near Amado.

The comet was lost to view because of glare from the sun in April and will reappear to professional astronomers in August and to amateurs sometime between November and January, Wyckoff said. It should be visible to the naked eye by January, but views from the Northern Hemisphere will be poor.

"In February, we made the first detection of the gaseous atmosphere coming out of the comet" then determined from brightness increases that the coma was born in October, she said.

While astronomers took months to realize what they had seen in October, "our observations indicated for the first time the onset of evaporation of the dusty snowball that is the comet nucleus," she continued. "Nobody has ever documented this before."

Belton, however, said evaporation of the comet's icy surface always occurs to some extent, but "what suddenly started (last October) was that the process was powerful enough to lift the small dust particles from the nucleus and form a coma."

There is evidence that a coma briefly flared in September, he said. The event, not seen, apparently was caused when gases were emitted by fast change in the state of the comet's ices, not by steady evaporation, he said.

The dirty snowball concept of comets was first proposed in the 1950s by Fred Whipple of Harvard University but some astronomers have argued the ice is mainly dry ice, or frozen carbon dioxide, rather than water ice, Wyckoff said.

Belton said that during the comet's current voyage around the sun, astronomers have viewed all of its major features except its gas and dust tails, and "that will probably happen in September or October."

## Russian emigre helps free persecuted Christians

## Leader of 'Siberian Seven' scheduled to speak in Mesa church

While millions of Americans celebrate their independence on the Fourth of July, a Russian emigre will be in Costa Mesa commemorating her freedom from religious persecution in that country.

Lida Vaschenko, leader of the "Siberian Seven," will speak at 7:30 p.m. in the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church.

She made world headlines in 1978 as one of a group of Russian Pentecostal Christians who successfully broke through Soviet guards outside the American Embassy in Moscow to seek aid and refuge.

Their victory was bitter-sweet, how-

ever, because a soldier overtook the eighth member, Lida's 17-year-old brother John. As Lida, her parents, two young sisters and two family friends watched, John was severely beaten and then sent home to Siberia.

Next began what has been called the longest sit-in in history, as the Siberian Seven took up residence in the basement of the embassy, where they received a number of guests from the Western world, including Vice President George Bush and evangelist Billy Graham. Finally, Lida's 1982 hunger strike made it possible for all members of both families to obtain visas to the U.S.

In 1983, Lida arrived in St. Louis, Mo., where she worked for the United Pentecostal Church, and nine months ago she established her ministry, Set Them Free, in Orange County. It is dedicated to helping Russian Christians get exit visas.

Vaschenko, who is studying for her citizenship, will spend the sum-

mer speaking at local churches and for other organizations and then embark on a national tour.

"I am now speaking in many cities about my family's fight for freedom and the need to help others of many denominations who are oppressed by the Soviet government," Vashchenko said.

Her family's problems date back to World War I, she said, when her grandfather converted to Christianity while a prisoner of war on an Austrian farm. Upon returning to his home in the Ukraine, he and his family were exiled to Siberia.

Thereafter, persecution became a regular part of their lives, causing her parents to first apply for emigration in 1960, she said, but the government refused their request.

In 1968, her parents tried to go to the U.S. embassy for help, but they were arrested. As a result, her father spent time in both a psychiatric hospital and a labor camp, and her

mother spent three years in a labor camp. Four of their children were sent to orphanages.

Ten years later, six members of the Vashchenko family, along with two friends, successfully entered the U.S. Embassy. "It was a miracle we got through," Vashchenko said, "because many others before us were unsuc-

cessful." They remained inside the building. "Because of the punishment we received the last time, we were afraid to leave."

Today, Vashchenko, her parents, 12 brothers and sisters and the family dog are settled in various parts of the United States.

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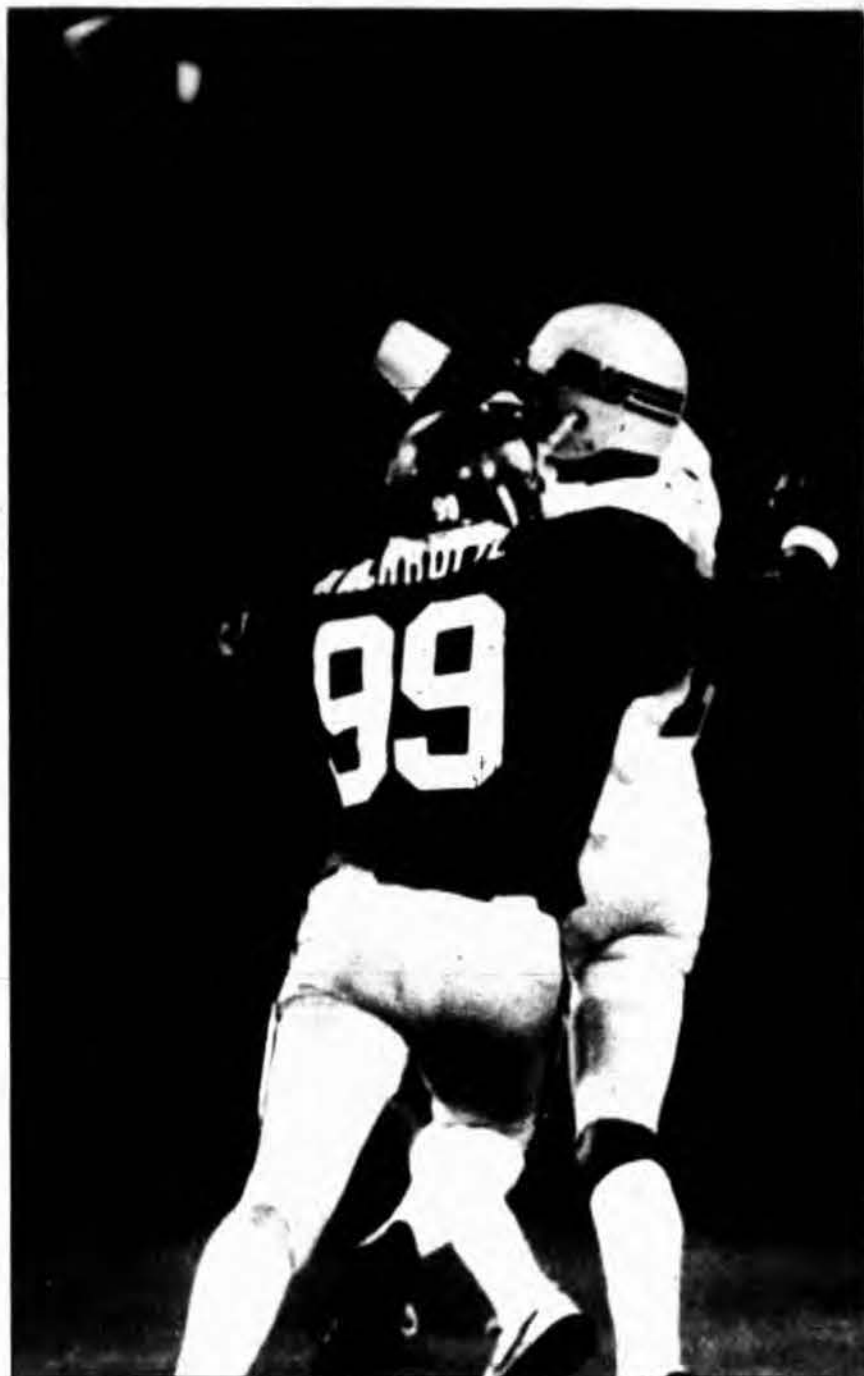

## South unable to contain Yankees' QB, La Habra's Owens controls every facet

"They had Owens and we didn't have anyone who could handle him," was South Coach Jerry Witte's first reaction to his team's 30-16 loss from the North All-Stars Friday night at Santa Ana Stadium, but that's just the tip of the iceberg in the aftermath of the 26th Orange County All-Star football game.

In addition to the presence of La Habra High's Dan Owens, a 6-4, 240-pound package headed for USC in the fall, the North had Arizona State-bound Brett Johnson of El Modena at quarterback and a supporting cast that was obviously distressed with the North's inability to win anything in the past seven years.

As a result the North hung a deceiving 14-point decision over the South All-Stars in a game which found the Rebels outplayed in nearly every department.

Take away Mater Dei High's Mike Mitchell's six second-half receptions for two touchdowns and some stand-out play at quarterback by Jeff Bielman of Irvine and the remaining South output totals zero.

It was 27-3 at halftime and the only thing that kept it close in the second half was the all-stars rule that a team down by eight points or more can elect to receive the kickoff after a score.

"I told them at halftime we could get back in it by just playing offense," said Witte. "But those two turnovers right before the half really hurt us."

The South, trailing by a 13-0 count in the second quarter after the North drove 27 and 71 yards with Johnson at the controls, got its first (and last) break — a five-yard punt.

Taking over at the North 43 after the Yankee punt went up, then down, the South drove to the 15, sparked by a 13-yard pass from Foothill's Jud Dutrisac to Mission Viejo's Henry Gray and a 12-yard spurt by Newport

Harbor's Fritz Howser.

The drive began to self-destruct, then Owens burst through for a 10-yard sack to force the South to settle for three.

Fountain Valley's Micky Penafior drove a 47-yard effort through the uprights in his soccer style convention, but after he was roughed on the attempt, he tried a second place-kick, this time in a conventional manner.

His kick into the back of El Modena's Sean Sawyer moved the opposition only a few inches, but it moved Penafior and the North's Tim Wachholtz of Fullerton out of the game after an ensuing skirmish.

"Micky regrets it, he knows that," said Witte.

Still, the South was on the scoreboard and was receiving the kickoff, but whatever momentum generated, it was soon forgotten.

The first of two crippling fumbles was recovered by El Modena's Rick Bauer on the South 27 on the first play from scrimmage and Johnson directed a seven-play drive, capped by his second touchdown sneak from a yard out with 27 seconds left to up the lead to 20-3.

But the North wasn't through yet. First an incompleting, then the Rebels muffed a handoff and there to pick up the ball and race 26 yards for a touchdown was (who else?) Owens.

Fountain Valley's Dave Swigart caught him at the 2-yard line, but Owens' momentum carried him into the end zone.

The second half was simply a matter of running out the clock as the North defense was asked to contain. Johnson got off just two pass attempts in the second half for the North because of the game's rules which simply kept giving the ball back to the South.

North Coach Tim Devaney said he was "pleasantly surprised" at his team's ease in moving the ball.

## At least Mitchell gave South a show

His six receptions for 111 yards, 2 TDs, takes some of the sting out of 30-16 loss

Before hanging up his football cleats in favor of hightops, Mike Mitchell, formerly of Mater Dei High, played what he said will be his final football game Friday night.

The high-flying, 6-6, 210-pound receiver was one of the lone bright spots for the South squad in the 26th annual All-Star game at Santa Ana Stadium, as the Rebels bowed to the North, 30-16.

Mitchell, who will now start his collegiate basketball career with Fresno State, hauled in six of the 12 completions by South quarterbacks.

good for 111 yards. He also grabbed the only two touchdowns for the Rebels that came a little too late after the North took command early.

"That was it for me," said Mitchell waving back to the crowd up turf after the game. "I like football but I'm not coming back no matter what."

Even if the Fresno football staff starts knocking?

"Nope, the door's closed on that one," he said with a smile.

In the first half of the game, Mitchell and his South teammates couldn't generate much of an offense, totaling just 26 yards while trailing 27-3.

In the second half, though, the South made it a bit more respectable by finally getting its passing game going.

"The safeties were playing close up to the line, leaving me one-on-one," said Mitchell, who did all his damage in the second half.

"We worked on deep post patterns when I was covered man-to-man and it worked," he said.

Mitchell's first scoring catch came with 1:31 left in the third quarter to bring the South to within 27-10. The play was a — you guessed it — a deep post pattern over Todd Prukop, who was defending.

When Mitchell came down with the ball, he pointed at Prukop and then tossed him the ball.

Prukop and Mitchell are familiar with each other, with Prukop coming

from Angeles League foe Servite High.

"Before the game, he was pointing at me and talking some stuff with some other North guys," Mitchell said. "I pointed at him after the touchdown to show him I wasn't scared of him or anyone else."

Mitchell's first TD pass came from Irvine's Jeff Bielman, who came on to take over at quarterback and give the Rebels something they sorely needed — life.

Bielman guided the South 84 yards in 12 plays on the Rebels' second possession of the second half. Bielman completed three passes on the drive with two of them coming Mitchell's way, including the scoring toss of 34 yards on a third-and-10 play.

Bielman ended with 76 yards passing, 56 of them to Mitchell.

Mitchell was asked if the Bielman connection should have been used earlier (Bielman didn't play quarterback in the first half). "You never know about something like that. There were all kinds of things going on. Who's to say it would have worked in the first half?" he said.

Mitchell, a superb leaper with good hands, pulled down his second TD pass from Jud Dutrisac of Foothill with 47 seconds left in the game. That play covered 10 yards, the last 10 yards of Mitchell's grid career.

"Before the game, (Fresno basketball coach) Boyd Grant told me to go ahead and play but be careful. He kept saying, 'just don't get hurt, just don't get hurt.' He was a little worried, but I wasn't. You can't think about getting hurt and play well," Mitchell said.

## Pryor sends Royals home happy, 4-3

KANSAS CITY (AP) — Greg Pryor may have been the happiest man in Kansas City. He was certainly the happiest man in Royals Stadium Friday night after slapping an RBI single in the 14th inning to propel the Royals to a 4-3 victory over the Angels.

The marathon contest lasted 4 hours and 30 minutes, just eight minutes shy of the club record.

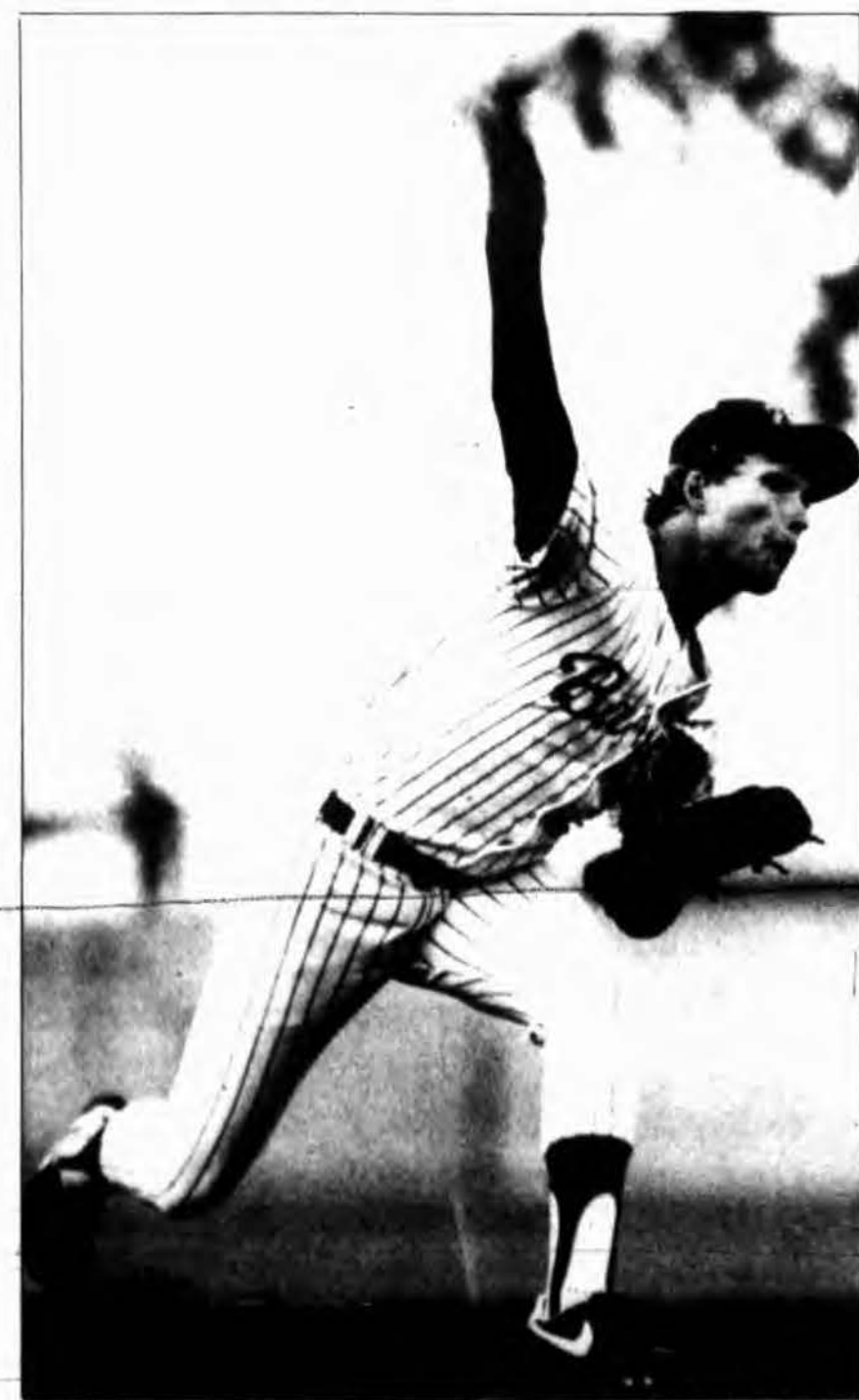

Fountain Valley High's 1-2 punch of pitchers Bob Sharpnack and Donnie Snowden head the All-CIF 4-A baseball selections as chosen by the First Interstate Bank Athletic Foundation's board.

Snowden struck out 114, walked 52 and had a 1.20 ERA to go with his 7-3 won-loss record and six saves.

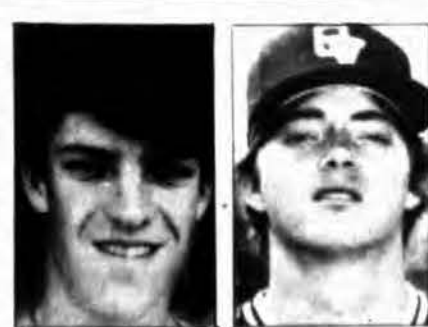
In the title game, it was Snowden getting the victory in a 3-2 decision with Sharpnack picking up the save.

WIMBLEDON, England — When Jackie Pushong, a shy 15-year-old, appeared on Wimbledon's Court No. 1 last week, another custom fell at the tradition-rich All England Tennis Championships.

Pushong, a shy, bespectacled 15-year-old is the first ball girl ever to appear on a showcourt — Centre Court and Court No. 1 — at the world's most prestigious tennis tournament.

"The best thing about it is being near the players you've watched on the television," said Pushong, whose job is to scurry about the court, quietly collecting balls.

"I could not believe it when I was on for (Ivan) Lendl's opening match. He's my favorite player, so good looking," she said.

Although ball girls still are not permitted on Centre Court, Wally Wouf, manager of the Wimbledon youngsters, believes that custom, too, will eventually fall.

"We've come this far. Now there's only one more barrier for the girls here to break down," he said.

Ball girls were introduced at Wimbledon in 1977, Queen Elizabeth II's jubilee year, the same year Virginia Wade won the women's singles title for Britain.

The following year, there were 12 ball girls, then 18. The figure has increased steadily, and this year, 22 of the 100 ball persons are girls.

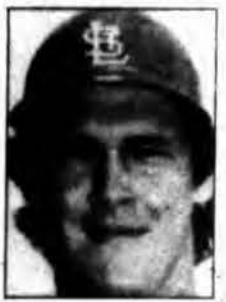
But never, until Pushong's Wimbledon debut, was a ball girl allowed on a showcourt.

### Lloyds of London enjoy big day on Center Court

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — The atmosphere in the Lloyd house-hold was tense as tennis' No. 1 married couple prepared for an unusual day.

As Chris cooked scrambled eggs for John, she could see he was very nervous.

Perhaps his anxiety was understandable. It's not every day that your wife follows you onto center court in the Wimbledon tennis championships.

John, a 30-year-old Briton, defeated No. 13 seed Elliot Teltscher of the United States, 6-3, 6-4, 4-6, 3-6, 7-5 in a dramatic match that lasted six

minutes short of three hours. Next on court, his American wife downed countrywoman Susan Mascarin, 6-0, 6-3 in 58 minutes.

After John Lloyd had squandered a two-set lead, he was asked later if he felt guilty about keeping his wife waiting.

"I didn't think about it at the time. But she had to bloody well wait," he said.

It was the latest chapter in the lives of The Lloyds of London (and Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), who came together through tennis, were temporarily split by tennis and whose lives still revolve around the sport.

### Nehemiah wins fight to run track

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The International Amateur Athletic Federation has decided to allow San Francisco 49ers wide receiver Renaldo Nehemiah to run track again, according to a newspaper report.

The report quoted Nehemiah's agent, Ron Stanko, saying of the ruling by the federation, "I was there. I have the decision. It's over. Three years of fighting is over."

Nehemiah, the world record holder in the 110-meter high hurdles, has been trying to gain the right to run in amateur track events ever since he joined the 49ers in 1982, Stanko said.

The report said officials from the federation, which governs international track and field, refused to confirm or deny the reported decision.

"It's not being released yet," a spokeswoman was quoted as saying.

But Nehemiah and Stanko have scheduled a news conference for Monday at which they are expected to announce the decision. The move to reinstate Nehemiah, which does not allow him to compete in the summer Olympics, would effect other athletes as well.

"If it goes the way we want it to, it applies to a whole slew of guys," said Pete Cava, spokesman for The Athletics Congress, governing body for track and field in the United States and a supporter of Nehemiah's bid to regain his ability to compete.

"We've had a phone conversation with the IAAF. They've decided he's been reinstated," Cava said. "We have nothing in writing," he added, saying the federation may not announce it until mid-July.

# Another fine year for housing predicted

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The president of the California Building Industry Association says 1985 will be another 'fine year for housing' if interest rates stay under control.

"If I had to rate this year, I'd give it a B-plus," said Stan Swartz. "It's not our best year ever, but the industry is moving along rather happily."

Swartz, of San Diego, was here to attend the four-day Pacific Coast Builders Conference.

He conceded the industry is still faced with an "affordability gap" in California. The median cost of a new home in the state last year was \$118,000, 48 percent more than the national average.

California housing starts should reach 219,000 units this year, Swartz said. The total would be short of last year's level, which was the best since 1978.

The primary reason is declining interest rates, he said.

Falling rates have a dramatic impact, according to Olden B. Johnson, president of this year's builders show.

"For every 1 percent drop in mortgage rates, another 70,000 to 100,000 people in California qualify" to buy a median-priced home, he said.

# Take tape measure shopping to choose a chair

A half-inch difference in dimension can make a large gap in comfort

The next time you go shopping for a comfortable chair, take a tape measure along. There are differences of an inch and

more in the depth, seat height and arm height of different chairs. These measurements, in relation to your own, help determine the comfort or lack of it in a chair.

A half-inch difference in a dimension may seem very little, but it can make a big difference in seating comfort, according to Alvin Ortnier, vice president of Stratford Furniture.

Ortnier said that three measurements

are particularly critical to comfort. They are the pitch of the chair back, the depth of its seat and the placement of the arms. If you are very short, you may find some chairs are so large that your feet don't even touch the floor; if tall, your knees may be uncomfortably raised in the same chair.

When seated, you should feel perfectly comfortable; feet touching the floor, back supported and knees and arms in a natural position, added Ortnier.

An informal survey in the Stratford showroom at the furniture market in High Point, N.C., showed that some of this firm's recliners and easy chairs were several inches apart in some measurements. One very short person, for example, found that a recliner measuring 16 3/4 inches from seat to floor was the most comfortable. This is the company's smallest recliner. One of its larger models, measuring 22 inches from seat to floor, was so large that the individual's feet didn't even touch the floor.

In most households, of course, chairs will be shared among individuals of differing sizes. In that case, the best advice is take the smallest and largest family members shopping so that a good compromise can be worked out, suggested Ortnier.

Elaine Cohen, president of ECCO Furniture, noted that many consumers get involved in issues such as whether a chair has hand-tied springs or down cushions. While these attributes may indicate durability, they are not necessarily related to comfort, she said. "There are all kinds of ways to accomplish a 'comfortable ride,' and the main question is 'does it sit

comfortably?'"

Furthermore, she added, what represents comfort to one person may not be the same for another. "To me, a comfortable chair or sofa is one I can sit on, not in. I find it unpleasant to have the sofa cushions all round me."

For John Mascheroni, a furniture designer whose designs are shown by Swaim Originals Inc. at the market, "a large enveloping fully-enclosed chair is the most comfortable."

Mascheroni said the ultimate in chair comfort is provided by the classic leather Eames chair. "It is mobile, has an ottoman and it swivels."

He added that comfort alone is rarely the sole consideration. An important issue to most consumers is what use the chair will be put to. If it's for a living room, some comfort may be sacrificed in favor of a chair that is in keeping with the rest of the room.

Perhaps the most extraordinary example of how far some people are willing to go for a comfortable seat is seen in the Balans chair which was created by three Norwegian architects on a grant from the Norwegian government.

The chair which has no back looks entirely different from other chairs. Instead of backing into it, and easing down onto a seat, one leans forward, placing the knees on front rest, and then distributes the weight on the back portion. The position is said to result in less stress on the back and neck and the chair is said to be particularly useful to those who work for long periods of time seated at a desk.

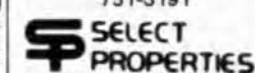

# New finance methods key for industry, homebuyers

Collateralized loans, fast payback concept cited by savings exec

SAN FRANCISCO — New mortgage instruments are the key for the industry as well as new home buyers, believes Robert Adelizzi, chairman of the California League of Savings Institutions and president of Home Federal Savings of San Diego.

Instruments such as the collateralized mortgage obligations — which he termed "a latter-day version of the mortgage-backed bond" — offer the best hope for home buyers and the industry, Adelizzi told participants at the 27th annual Pacific Coast Builders Conference last week.

Adelizzi was joined on the panel by Lester Day of the Costa Mesa-based American Diversified Capital Corp.; Wayne Wedin, Wedin Enterprises, La Habra; David B. Kuhn, Lane-Kuhn Development, San Diego; and Stan Ross, Kenneth Leventhal Co.

"In 1983-84," said Adelizzi, "ARMs (adjustable rate mortgages) accounted for 500,000 home sales nationwide that would not have occurred without that instrument."

He also said that the fast payback instrument — by which a buyer commits to paying higher monthly mortgage rates in order to pay off a home loan in a shorter time frame than the traditional 20 or 30 years — has gained in public acceptance, "from about 1 percent in 1980 to 12 percent last year."

Day indicated that syndications are emerging as the best method for builders to raise "that needed up-front money on a project." He said a builder could opt for any of three ways to approach raising the capital: "By starting a syndicate, by direct sale of the property to a syndicator or by joint venture or sale to a venture capitalist."

Day also said that if the current Reagan tax reform package is adopted as written, "apartment house building will drop to the (near-zero) level of three or four years ago."

Wedin, former city manager of southern California's Santa Fe Springs, said that the changing business climate means that "more meaningful private-public partnerships are needed. I know how old that sounds, and how many times you've heard that before. But it's never been more true."

Wedin said that the public and private interests who are increasingly developing property — using a variety of economic buydowns and incentives, such as shared infrastructure or parking development — "are learning to trust each other. I don't think there's ever been any intrinsic dislike (of one another). Now that they're working together, there can't be."
