### MacArthur Park: The tradition lives on in Huntington Beach

MacArthur Park Restaurant and Grill, Huntington Beach, offers American cuisine in an atmosphere of casual elegance.

Among the restaurant's specialties, the smoked ribs are perhaps the most famous. The original MacArthur Park, in San Francisco, has gained a reputation for having the best ribs in that city, and now the tradition lives on at the Huntington Beach MacArthur Park, located at Peter's Landing.

The restaurant's baby back ribs are marinated for 24 hours, hung in the smoker, finished over a mesquite fire, and served with a creamy coleslaw and crispy French fries. For those who enjoy a variety, the ribs are also available in combination with chicken and homemade spicy sausages for a barbecue feast.

Other outstanding entrees include a wonderful pan blackened fish; a spectacular whole sizzling catfish; smoked, fresh Petaluma duck; and calf liver's steak with Oakwood smoked bacon, all served with buttered new red potatoes and fresh

mixed vegetables. Some of MacArthur Park's unusual regional offerings, not found on many menus, include grilled tuna; ham and escarole; game hens; rabbit; homemade sausage, and grilled pasilla peppers filled with three cheeses and served with saisa. For those who still have room for

dessert, there is Judy's Mud Pie, Turtle Pie with Caramel Sauce; or vanilla ice cream with either homemade hot fudge or bourbon pecan

Monday through Friday, with different regional dishes and drinks offered each day. Monday features a Southern Style

cocktail hour, with fried chicken, corn chowder and hush pupies. Peach Daiquiris and Mint Juleps are available for \$1.50 each.

On Tuesday, visit the Napa Valley for homemade pate, cheese spreads, San Francisco style-Sour Dough bread, fresh fruits, nuts, and marinated mushrooms. Along with the tasty food, try a glass of White Zinfandel.

Come on down to Mexico on Wednesday for "Build It Yourself" Tacos at the Taco Bar. Coors and Miller Lite drafts are 75 cents each, while Margaritas and Mexican Coffees are \$1.50 each.

On Thursday, fly back East to New England, for some of MacArthur Park's famous clam chowder, fish and chips and clam fritters. Long Island Ice Tea, Seabreeze Cocktails and Cape Cods are \$1.50.

Escape to Louisiana on Friday for some spicy homemade sausage, blackened chicken wings, crayfish and gumbo. Beer on this day is 75

cents, Cajun Martinis, \$1.50. Sunday "Brunch at the Park," 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. offers buttermilk pancakes, oakwood smoked meats, fresh julces, and more, as you enjoy harborside dining in a lovely setting

of sailboats and soft ocean breezes. The Park's new Grill, with either sit-down or take-out service, has a come-as-you-are atmosphere along with its great food and fast service. The Grill complements the upscale but casual ambience of the main restaurant.

MacArthur Park's prices are moderate, with appetizers from \$2.75 to \$4.75; salads from \$2.75 to \$7.95, and main dishes \$6.95 to \$12.95. Steaks are \$14.95.

The restaurant is open 11:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday, to 11 p.m. Friday and Saturday, to 10 p.m. Sunday.

With dancing on one side of the massive nightclub and friendly mingling in the lounge side, Promises along with Monaco's is sure to provide the one-two punch for those in search of a spirited dining and dancing spot in Newport Beach.



In addition to a full bar, the restaurant also offers an outstanding wine list with some of the best labels around, truly a collection to suit all palates.





# The Barn: History never tasted so good

The Barn Restaurant and Saloon, a 15,000 square foot, two-story high western eatery, dominates the corner of Redhill and Edinger in Tustin.

The huge dinnerhouse is a 1980 reincarnation of the Francis Citrus Packing House, built in 1914, in Irvine. Owner Cal McCollum spent three years dismantling the original building and reconstructing a portion of it at the present location.

Today the restaurant is a colorful showplace of turn-of-the-century Americana, particularly early Calitornia artifacts, antiques, and farm equipment. Many of the decorative items come from the Irvine Ranch or the old packing house. "I collected these artifacts for

"I collected these artifacts for seven years before the restaurant was opened," said McCollum. "There's a lot of history here."

The Barn is proof that a restaurant can provide both diversity and quality. It is possible to order a steak with all the trimmings for dinner, but you can also have a quiche or go to the salad bar. "You don't have to spend 15 or 20 bucks to eat here," points out McCollum.

McCollum's breakfast offerings are what he terms "Country Gourmet," and range from Eggs Benedict for \$4.95 to a Paul Bunyan Special which includes a 14-ounce steak, 4 eggs, 4 flapjacks, and potatoes for \$14.95.

Lunch includes a selection of seafood, steaks, Mexican dishes, salads, and some specialty sandwiches. The dinner menu is even more

eclectic. There are over 25 items, including Italian food, Mexican cuisine, steaks, and seafood. The prices range from \$4.95 to \$16.50, and even the more expensive dinners are a bargain.

The large salad bar, in the center of the restaurant, is spread across a long chuckwagon with cold plates stored inside an old Coke machine standing nearby. Tureens of soup are kept warm on top of an oldfashioned cookstove.

Chef Salvadore Mares masterminds the menu offerings. An ever popular favorite is Mares' barbeque ribs. Also very much in demand are his ethnic specialty dishes, both Mexican and Italian.

The Sunday Champagne Brunch gives new meaning to the word "variety." It is offered from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., and for \$10.95 (\$4.95 for children 12 and under), you can satisfy the most voracious of appetites. With over 20 items to choose from, you can get an omelette that really is made to order. The brunch also includes Belgian waffles, crepes, a giant salad bar, a full dessert section, and more.

Happy Hour and nightly entertainment are provided upstairs where a 35-foot Victorian backbar fills one end of the room and a 1936 biplane hangs overhead at the opposite end. The Barn has five television sets and a stereo system, and every night patrons can dance to the music of a live band as well.

Not surprisingly, The Barn is also in demand for private parties. For those who want to hold a business meeting for eight people, there is a room small enough to allow them to talk without echoes, and if you want to invite 110 guests to your wedding, there is a room to comfortably accommodate them. Overall, the huge establishment can accommodate 400 people downstairs and another 275 upstairs. The dining rooms range from the 14-seat Country Kitchen to the 100-seat Car Room which contains a 1936 Chevrolet and an antique gas pump.



# Wine Competition - the Super Bowl of vintage judging

It's really called the "American Wine Competition," but its organizer is a sports nut and likes to think of it as the "Super Bowl" of American wine judgings, and in a way it is.

It does accept entries in the four categories judged from any commercial winery, anywhere in America, and probably receives more entries from states other than California, than any other competition. Orange County, of course, is the largest judging of all, but accepts entries only from California.

Unlike other national competitions, this one does reserve the right to purchase certain wines, such as Jordon, when a winery declines, for one reason or another, to enter all eligible wines. From the consumer perspective, this means a broader, more interesting and more meaningful competition.

To my knowledge, the American Wine Competition is also the only one to publish a complete list of wines judged, including the wines that didn't place. This does add a note of credibility and allows the consumer to see exactly which wines

the winners had to compete against. Organized by a publication called "International Wine Review," I have been given permission by publisher

Craig Goldwyn to highlight results even before the winner's issue comes off the presses. This early report should give readers an edge in finding the wines before they're sold out as a result of the publicity

Since I will only be able to mention the very top awards, I suggest you write for a copy of the awards issue. which will include not only a complete list of winners (and nonwinners), but tasting notes, a list of judges, rules and procedures. Send \$6 (includes postage and handling) to: American Winners, P.O. Box 285, Ithaca, NY 14851. This issue will also feature a special four-color map depicting all the major American wine regions.

California dominated this year's top awards, but other states were also heard from. There were a total of 10 platinum, 26 gold, 68 silver and 49 bronze medals awarded to wines produced from Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and White Riesling, A "Best of Class" wine was selected in each category.

In Cabernet, best of class and a platinum medal went to Newton 1981 'Napa'' (\$12.50).

Following Newton were a string of eight gold medalists, the most interesting of which may be Byrd 1982 "Estate" (\$10). Note that Byrd's vineyards are located in the state of Maryland, and this is the third consecutive vintage of Byrd Cabernet to win a gold.

Other Cabernet golds went to: Grgich Hills 1980 (\$16); Jos. Phelps 1981 "Elsele" (\$30); Lambert Bridge 1981 "Sonoma" (\$10); Markham 1980 "Napa" (\$13); Robert Young Vineyards (Belvedere Winery) 1982 (\$12); Simi 1981 "Alexander Valley" (\$11); and Whitehall Lane 1982 Napa" (\$12).

The best of class winner for Chardonnay is big news because it also happens to be a "Best Buy" Run, don't walk, to your favorite wine shop to get your bottles of Concan-non 1984 "Selected Vineyards" (\$9) Winemaker Sergio Traverso's talent with white wine is starting to show.

Other platinum medalists for Chardonay were: Calera 1983 "Santa Barbara" (\$10.75); Inglenok 1984 "Napa-Reserve" (\$18); and Landmark 1983 "Sonoma" (\$9). It's interesting to note that three out of four platinum Chardonnays are what have to be called reasonably priced

Reasonably priced Chardonnays were also well represented among the gold medalists. Golds went to Clos du Bois 1984 "Barrel Fermented" (\$9); Franciscan 1983 "Alexander Valley" (\$9.50); Jekel "Private Reserve" 1982 (\$14.50). and Kendall-Jackson 1984 Vintner's Reserve (\$9.,50), which has to be the winningest wine in America, this vear

Corbett Canyon had to be the biggest "Best Buy" winner, with two ng the gold, and tonnevs tel both selling for \$8. One was the 1984 "Central Coast" while the other is Isheled "Coastal Classic" and comes in a full liter size bottle. making it an even better value.

Sequola Grove also won two Chardonnay golds for 1983 "Sonoma" (\$12) and 1983 "Nappa" (\$14). The remaining two golds went to Obester 1984 "Mendocino" (\$12) and Shafer 1983 "Napa" (\$12).

In Pinot Noir, California dominated (Please see MEAD/Page 24

One of the three oldest restaurants in the waterfront area, the Inn is situated on property first bought in the 1920s by a Swiss couple, Tony and Mina Hershey, who came to the states to pursue the American Dream.

In the 1930s, the restaurant became White's Cafe and Bar, and developed a reputation as a popular corner that through the years was frequented by notables such as Marion Davies, James Cagney and cartoonist Virgil Partch.

In 1975, Robert Yardley estab-lished the Village Inn, which continues to be popular with local

The Lou Family, who have owned restaurants previously in both West Africa and France, have taken their expertise with fine continental cuisine and have combined it with a natural foods approach to offer a menu that is not only natural, but also very tasty.

Francoise's mother Sophie studied with cooks in the various countries where the family has lived, and "she is a real gourmet cook," says her daughter. Sophie's specials include Coquilles a la Puffins, Sophie's Eggplant, Pastry Puffs, and Spinach Greek Pie.

The restaurant uses no canned goods, and all dishes are made from scratch right on the premises.

In addition to the unique Puffin bird decor throughout the restaurant. luscious green plants and tastefully appointed table settings complete the restaurant's upgraded look

# Five Crowns: Olde English charm in Corona del Mar

Five Crowns in Corona del Mar serves a fine continental menu nightly in an old English atmosphere The restaurant is owned by the Frank/Van de Kamp families who have successfully transported the comfort and hospitality of the inns of England to Orange County.

The families bought the restaurant, formerly named the Hurley Bell in 1963. Richard and Mary Alice Frank traveled extensively in England gathering information about authenitic English inns. Upon their return to Southern California, designer Robert Hanley was hired to decorate and remodel the Five Crowns to duplicated the Ye Old Bell. located in Hurley, Berkshire, just outside London. The Five Crowns continues to be one of the most authentic reproductions of an old English inn in North America.

Heavy leaded glass windows, flower boxes and manicured shrubs adorn the exterior of the two-story English inn. The building's original fireplace and hearth still remain to form the central wall in the dining room, just off the entry hall. The interior is decorated with antiques, and many one-of-a-kind pieces. Captains, waitresses, and bartenders are garbed in traditional English costumes including fluffy white bonnets for the ladies and knee pants for the gentlemen

Several intimate and comfortably decorated dining rooms are housed in the two-story inn. In one area, the restaurant also extends to an airy greenhouse/patio, decorated with many lush, exotic plants and open for nightly dining when the weather permits. The patio also provides a lovely setting for special occasions such as wedding receptions Dinners are served from 5 to 10 p m. Monday through Friday; 5 p.m. to 11 p.m. Saturday, and 4-10 p.m. on Sunday.

Roast prime ribs of beef, roasted in the traditional manner, are carved to the diner's preference. Creamed spinach, Yorkshire pudding, and horseradish, grated fresh for the evening's guest and mixed with whipped cream are served with the beef.

Another special entree is roast rack of American lamb. It is carved at tableside and accompanied by fresh vedetables. These and othr entrees follow a tempting selection of first courses. Hearts of Romaine lettuce with Five Crown's notable Stilton Cheese Dressing or a Continental salad tossed with a vinagrette dressing are offered Pride of the Crowns' Salad, a pleasing combination of Bibb lettuce, walnuts, bacon bits, Gruyere cheese, and croutons, enhanced with the chef's secret dressing, is also a favorite. Steaming chicken and leek soup or one of the other freshly prepared selections is also available.



For both food and beverages. Dillman's has some of the most reasonable prices around. "Our daily specials and other items are within a monetary range that people can eat here two to three times a week," says Dillman, "and I know that a lot of our customers do just that. Many of

them, on account here, are long-time customers.

Dillman characterizes his establishment as "a local town restaurant with a hometown, friendly atmosphere. I can come in here on a Friday night, and if there are 50 people, I'll know 40 to 45 of them."





Both pubs base their name on the Durty Nelly of the old Iris: ingend.

In 1620, Durty Nelly's cub was built in County Clare, Ireland, nestled on the arched bridge that leads to Bunratty Castle.

indeed, the little pub became almost an extension of the fortress. Many weary soldiers of the castle sought comfort and grub when it was established there.

In fact, Durty Nelly's was built specifically as a canteen. You may well imagine that the soldiers of old were a rather grubby lot, and this seems the most likely origin of the name. Some of us, however, are a bit more inclined to wonder what Durty Nelly was really up to.

As for the lawsuit, today's owners of Durty Nelly's in Ireland are arguing that they should have not only national, but also international, rights to the logo. Since their pub is located near Shannon Airort, and therefore frequented by many American travelers, they claim that the tavern is therefore famous throughout the United States as well as Ireland.

Delaney's, Inc., owner of the Costa Mesa pub, disagrees, however, and maintains that most Americans have not heard of the Irish tavern. Delaney's therefore, has thrown the gauntlet back at their Irish rivals, challenging them to prove that they are truly famous throughout Ameri-

Another point in Delaney's favor is that the Orange County company currently holds a U.S. trademark for the name, something that the Irish company does not have.

Thus, the two pubs are continuing to slug it out, in good Gaelic fashion.

In the meantime, you sons and daughters of the Emerald Isle, be apprised that you don't have to trek all the way across the Atlantic to experience the charm and atmosphere of the original Durty Nelly's, for Delaney's has recreated it close at hand.

The local Durty Nelly's offers Irishinspired grub and ale in a green and plaid-dominated setting with walls covered with Irish sayings, bawdy limericks, and other Gaelic garnish.







Two newly scheduled events for The Cannery's lounge, according to owner Bill Hamilton, are Lottery Night on Mondays (following Monday Night Football), and Ski Show Night on Tuesdays (following the Newport Harbor High School football tapes.)

The lounge also offers musical entertainment evenings and Sunday afternoons, alongside its seafood bar which has sandwiches, oysters, shrimp cocktails, fish tacos, steamers, clam chowder, and more.

If you're looking for a full meal, The Cannery has high-quality fresh fish and other entrees served amid the ambiance of the converted canning plant, where the dining tables are surrounded by much of the original equipment in this uniquee theme restaurant.

Once you step inside the large, two-story structure, you'll find a panoramic view of Newport Harbor which complements the seafood specialty items on the menu.

Of all the daily fresh fish offerings, "Swordfish is by far the most popular," says Hamilton. "We buy it from boats that bring it right up to our dock, and we take it up to the kitchen, carve it up, and serve it the same day."

Also popular, he adds, are Salmon and Halibut from Alaska, and Sea Bass from Mexico.

Hamilton explains that his approach is "to buy the very best fish we can, cook it properly, and serve it simply without a lot of sauce to that you really are enjoying the flavor of the fish, not the sauces that mask the true flavor. Our cooking is California style: fresh and quickly prepared with the least amount of cooking possible to retain texture, taste, and high quality."

Lunch, offered Monday through Saturday, 11:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., includes a variety of fresh fish, tostadas, sandwiches, omelettes, vegetable dishes, steamed clams, and salads, ranging in price from \$4.75?to \$8.95.

Daily dinner, 5 p.m. to 10 p.m., ranges from \$11.95 to \$19.95. some house specialties, in addition to the daily fish selections, include Lobster Salad (chilled half lobster tail and large shrimp on salad tossed with vinalgrette dressing, \$13.95); Shrimp Scampi Mediterranean (large shrimp cooked in lemon, garlic, wine, and herbs, \$17.95); and The Doryman (the chef's selection of seafood, deep fried in a light batter, \$12.95).

Non-seafood entrees include terlyaki chicken, sirloin steak, rack of lamb, and filet mignon.

Beverage selections include full bar service plus a California wine list, consisting of mostly whites, such as chardonnays, white zinfandels, and chablis. "We think there are enough fine California wines to take care of our requirements," says Hamilton. "The product is excellent; everyone agrees on that."

On weekends, in addition to brunch served inside the restaurant

or on the patio deck, The Cannery also features Saturday and Sunday brunch and dinner cruises around the harbor aboard the Isla Mujeres which boards at the dock next to the restaurant.

Brunch buffet includes baked potatoes filled with scrambled eggs, a variety of fruit, pastries, salads, chicken cordon bleu, stuffed mushrooms, plus complimentary champagne. The supper buffet features bay


The supper buffet features bay shrimp cocktail, a variety of meat and fish entrees, fresh fruit, and champagne.





WASHINGTON — A woman lobbyist who travels frequently leaves the bathroom lights on all night in her hotel room.

A woman journalist says she bars the double-locked door with a chair snared against the knob. And a woman corporate executive says she always leaves the television on in her room when she travels alone.

For years, when business women traveled by themselves they were shown to a tiny table in a dark corner by the kitchen door in the hotel restaurant. So after a while many of them ended up just calling room service to bring up their dinners. With the rising numbers of women

in business and government who must travel, hotels now are more sensitive to their safety and comfort. And, according to the American Hotel-Motel Association, men who travel frequently are pleased with the new luxurious amenities.

At the upscale Morrison House, in nearby Alexandria, Va., for instance, Richard, one of six butlers, serves English tea in the mid-afternoon in the parlor.

There is no bar in the federal-style brick hotel. Mixed drinks may be ordered in the parlor and they are served by the butlers.

"That takes the onus off women who just don't feel right about walking into a hotel bar alone," says Pat Duricka, who must travel often in her job as a publicist for a Washington trade association.

"Women feel intimidated by a bar," agreed Mary Ann Lundgren, who travels to New York City in her job as owner of a Washington-based marketing firm.

In the twin dining rooms, decorated in cool peach and gray colors,

are engraved silver service, Baccarat chandeliers and butlers who have been schooled by the owners to treat guests, male and female, with equal respect.

For security, all room keys are affixed with computerized codes. Every time a room is opened, a printout appears at the main desk, tracing who the key was assigned to, and how long the user stayed in the room. The hallways are wide, well lighted and painted a pastel gray.

"We are looking for the upscale customer," acknowledged builder Robert T. Morrison, who owns the month-old 47-room hotel along with his wife, Rosemary. Rooms range from \$115 to \$330 a night.

A spokesman for the American Hotel-Motel Association, Steven Trombetti, said women accounted for 37 percent of the \$61 billion spent by business travelers in 1984, And, he said, it is forecast that in two years female business travelers will equal the number of men who hit the road for their companies.

If a woman has risen to the point that she travels for her company she is often an executive or a trusted employee so she has reached a career level where she does not have to stay in economy hotels, said Trombetti. "She stays in luxury hotels and can spend more to have someone carry her bags and dine well."

Overall, there is a trend across the country for travelers to check into the more luxurious hotels.

"People have more money to spend because of the upswing in the economy," explained Trombetti. "They have have disposable dollars and they want to pamper themselves."

Also, because of the frequest flyer programs offered by airlines, people have more dollars to spend on a fancy hotel room, with flowers, fruit, wine and chocolate thrown in, said Trombetti.

He said that luxury and economy hotels are the fastest growing segments of the industry. Currently, 15 percent — or 2.1 million — of all hotel rooms are rated as "luxurious." By the end of the year, that will rise to 18 percent, he said.

Women who travel by themselves often prefer to eat their breakfasts and dinners at the hotel where they stay so they won't have to wander unfamiliar streets alone looking for a suitable restaurant.

"Women business travelers started the trend for putting parlors in hotels and serving tea in the British fashion .... They didn't like the ruckus of hotel bars, and it ended up that men enjoyed the tradition just as much," said Trombetti. "It is a return to former elegance, and a way to slow things down."

A harp is played at the Berkshire Hotel in Manhattan.

There are "Captain's Tables" where unaccompanied guests can dine together at the Ritz-Carlton in Boston, the Lowes Anatole in Dallas, Texa, and the Buena Vista Palace in Orlando, Fla.

A string quartet plays at the Plaza in New York City.

"Room designs have also changed. Hotels put in full length mirrors, hair driers and makeup mirrors, and guys are saying 'Hey, I like those things too," said Trombetti.

He said that hotels put skirt hangers in the closets, and men used them to hang up their pants.

Compri Hotels, based in Phoenix, Ariz., sends out questionnaires to customers to determine what magazines or newspapers they read, or if they need an ironing board, said Trombetti. With those items already in the room, there is no need to scour the streets of a strange city looking for a favorite publication.

Trombetti also said waiters are getting instructions not to automatically seat an unaccompanied women to a hidden-away table. Women are to be given a choice of tables. And, some hotels have even installed special lights at tables if a lone diner wants spend his or her time reading before the food comes.

once again, though Oregon continues to place well in this category, and one silver medalist had the unlikely appellation of

"Southeastern New England" Sakonnet Vineyards 1983 (\$14) was produced 80 percent from its own Rhode Island estate, with 20 percent of the grapes coming from Massachusetts.

Platinum and best of class went to Sanford 1983 "Central Coast" (\$11), a very stylish wine that is worth seeking out. The lone other platinum for Pinot went to Mount Eden 1981 "Santa Cruz" (\$15).

At the gold medal level Oregon placed with Amity Vineyard 1982 (\$9) and Knudsen Erath 1983 "Vintage Select" (\$9.95). The final gold went to Calera 1982 "Reed" (\$22.95) from California.

The final category to be judged, White (Johannisberg) Riesling, was divided into the five sweetness levels of ultra-dry, semi-sweet, sweet and extra-sweet.

While it is unusual for California to dominate Riseling, the Golden State did just that this year Washington and New York made their presence known, though primarily among the silver and bronze medalists.

The best of class wine at the ultradry level came from yet another state, with 1984 Barboursville (\$6) from Monticello, Virginia taking the honors.

A single gold and best of class honors for semi-dry Riselings went to Clos du Bols 1984 "Early Harvest" (\$6.50), a wine that I admire every year for its delicacy, low alcohol and lively, refreshing, appley flavors.

Platinum and best of class for semi-sweet Riseling went to the winery with the funny name that has been winning lots of medals this year, both for Riesling and Sauvignon Blanc. Konocti 1984 "Lake County" (\$5) is the wine, and it is the best value you're going to find for this type of wine. Stock up if you like it.

A repeat winner with a gold and best of class in the sweet Riesling class was The Hogue Cellars 1984 "Markin Vineyard" (\$7), which was the top award won by a Washington winery

In the sweetest class of mostly Botrytis-affected, late harvest wines, a platinum and best of class to Joseph Phelps 1982 "Special Select" (\$45). All of these wines are expensive because they are made from raisinized grapes that contain little juice, making their production very limited. I'm quoting full bottle prices, but the wines are mostly available in half bottles for about half the price

# Cheap wine outclasses field at Orange County Fair

### By SUE GILMORE

SACRAMENTO (AP) - A funny thing happened at the Orange County Fair's wine competition this spring. Trader Joe's \$1.99-a-bottle red wine took one of the top prizes among 2,590 entrants.

The Orange County event is the state's largest wine competition. Nearly 10 percent of the 2,590 entrants won gold medals, and altogether there were 928 medals.

But of those 216 gold medal winners, only three got the unanimous nod from their respective fourjudge panels - Trader Joe's 1982 Charbono (\$1.99); Callaway Vineyard's 1982 Botrytis Chenin Blanc, "Sweet Nancy" (\$15); and Calatia Cellars' 1981 Foureeminette Vineyard Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon (\$15).

Trader Joe, also known as Joe Coulombe, is an entrepreneur who

buys close-outs from the wineries and applies his own label. He sells 700,000 cases a year from his chain of 24 stop-and-shop stores in the Los Angeles basin.

Contacted at his South Pasadena office, Coulombe said he was pleased, but a bit perplexed by the honor accorded his Charbono - a little-known heavy red wine - which he bought from Parducci Wine Cellars.

"We thought the Charbono was awfully good - It's just that we were surprised we got such a high rank-" he said. ing.

Coulombe says nothing sells a wine faster than a big competitive prize. "We were down to 300 cases when the gold medal hit, and whammol It was all out of the stores in one

John Movius, chairman of the recently resurrected wine competition at the California State Fair, says the competitions are useful to producers, retailers and consumers.

'The wineries have a need to obtain more recognition for their best wines," he says. "And there's no question that major wine awards sell wine.

Organized wine competitions, which suffered from a general lack of interest in the 1960s and '70s, are on the rebound, increasing in number and influence as the California wine industry grows.

And while the cognoscenti may guibble over which of the contests is most prestigious, they are of one mind on their value. The controlled blind taste test by a panel of experts may not be perfect, but it is the fairest and most reliable method of allowing the cream of the grape crop to float to the top.

Movius says the medals give consumers confidence that somebody besides the retailer is con-vinced of a wine's quality. "With 200 cabernets and maybe 300 chardonnays on the shelves in a major wine store, how is anybody going to know what is better," he says. "Not all of the wines are covered in

the competitions.

A common misconception is that entrants are pitted in some sort of Super Bowl contest from which one winner emerges. In fact, most competitions produce multitudes of medals. When gold, silver, bronze and honorable mentions are tallied up, 25 to 30 percent of the entrants may emerge as winners.

Movius says this doesn't necessarily undermine the significance of the awards

"A common misconception is that food has to be expensive to be good," says Hioureas. "We don't believe that, and our menu proves





A large part of the luncheon crowd, says Reiser, is the local business community, whereas at night the restaurant hosts many families and couples who want to enjoy some fine dining, including many who are celebrating birthdays, anniversaries, or other special occasions.

And, contrary to some people's misconception, says Reiser, boots and hats are not the dominant apparel. In fact, he added, most all of the customers come in normal, everyday kinds of clothing typifying the business people or families.

What is very Western at the Crazyhorse is the decor. The dining areas and theater within the restaurant are all part of the "town" of Crazyhorse, which includes the Virginia City Hotel, a gammbling parlor, a blacksmith and livery stable area, and a saloon. Even the restrooms, enclosed in the "Yuma City Jall," continue the theme.

"Western" does not translate as "primitive," however. On the contrary, the dining rooms are elegantly appointed with comfortable seating (padded chairs and booths) and are softly lit by fringed chandeliers.

The Crazyhorse menu emphasizes fresh, quality products, with the biggest sellers being prime rib, fresh seafood, and pan-sauteed steaks.

"Most of our products are made right here on the premises," says Reiser. "We get fresh seafood delivered daily, packed in ice, and we then cut our own filets. We never serve frozen fish. Also, we buy exclusively corn-fed, Eastern beef which has never been frozen, and then we individually cut all the steaks here. That is kind of a dying art in the

restaurant business."

The steaks range from chickenfried through sirloins and prime ribs to the filet mignon and the whooping 20-ounce Porterhouse steak.

With the generous steak orders come fresh baked bread, a steamed vegetable, and the customer's choice of French fries, baked potato with the "works," or a delicious casserolette of chill beans and tomatoes. Each dinner starts with a choice of soup or salad, and the average dinner price is \$10 to \$15.

The Crazyhorse luncheon menu is quite diversified, offering soups, burgers, sandwiches — including the popular Monte Cristo — several kinds of salads, and pasta, to name just a few of the categories. Luncheon prices range from about \$3.95 to \$8.95. A substantial wine list favors California wines, such as Sutter Home, Beaulieu, and BV Private Reserve, but also represents Europe with Liebfraumilch, Soave/Bolla and Poully Fulsse. The house wine is Inglenook, available by the glass, half carafe, or carafe.

Side dishes include the popular Onion Rings, Potato Skins, Sauteed Mushrooms and Fried Artichoke Hearts, to accompany meals or to serve as appetizers.

Dessert specialties include Amaretto Mousse, Mountain High Mud Pie, Dutch Apple cheesecake, Hot Apple Torte, and Chocolate Mousse Pie.

Some may opt for an after dinner coffee-liqueur drink, choosing from several different varieties. All are made with freshly ground coffee and


the Crazyhorse's specially whipped heavy cream, as well as the various liqueurs and spices. A child's menu, for those 12 and under, offers a variety of items, ranging in price from \$3.50 to \$7.

As the Crazyhorse approaches its sixth anniversary this December, Reiser says he is pleased that the establishment has appealed to cross-section of the marketplace: from those looking for top musical entertainment to those wanting a quality dining experience at a reasonable price.

## Jeannie's out of the bottle again —after 15 years

LOS ANGELES — Considering that she spent 2,000 years sealed in a bottle, the last 15 years should be only the blink of an eye for "Jeannie."

That's how long it's been since the sitcom "I Dream of Jeannie" left the air and settled down into married life with her loving astronaut, Tony Nelson.

"Jeannie," who's really a genie, is returning in the NBC movie "I Dream of Jeannie: 15 Years Later." It will be broadcast tonight at 9 on Channel 4.

Barbara Eden, who starred in the series and then went on to star in a number of TV movies and another series, "Harper Valley PTA," was reluctant at first to let the genie out of the bottle again.

"I didn't want to do it," said Eden. "I loved playing her and I loved playing in the series, but it seemed to me it had been done. Why repeat something?"

But over the two-year period the movie was in development, Eden was persuaded to accept the role. Barbara Corday had suggested reviving the show, and she worked on the idea with her husband. producer Barney Rosenzweig. Over that time, Corday helped create "Cagney & Lacey," and Rosenzweig became the producer of the series (which recently picked up a handful of Emmys). In the interim, Corday was also named president of Columbia Pictures Television.

Irma Kalish wrote the "Jeannie" screenplay and Bill Asher ("Bewitched") directed Apparently, Sidney Sheldon, who created "Jeannie" and wrote nearly all the scripts for the series, was too busy writing his best-selling novels. Or maybe, he felt the same way as Eden

Larry Hagman now starring in (BS' "Dallas," will not return to his former role as Tony Nelson Instead, Wayne Rogers (formerly of "M-A-S-H") plays the astronaut.

"Larry was told it would just be a cameo role," said Eden, "but as the story evolved it became a much larger part. Larry only gets three weeks off from "Dallas" and he wanted to go to London. I don't blame him.

But what was a young and frightened actor to do? He really wanted to act, but he had this fear of the boards. He'd done some summer stock and a little off-Broadway stuff before the trepidations set in.

So he started working part time at the store. One promotion followed another until he was floor manager. "I was assistant to the toy manager one year," he says. "Then I ran the department for two Christmases. I stayed with them for eight years. I was 29 when I quit."

After eight years before the cash register, there was a chance for another off-Broadway role.

But what really swung him back to acting was an offer to join Edie Adams in a stock production of "Sweet Bird of Youth." After that, the offers tumbled in.

He was soon working in soap operas on the side. He made his Broadway debut in "Borstal Boy." then, went into the original

production of "Streamers" Television and movies quickly followed

He started in two other series, "Rhoda" and "Suzanne Pleshette is Maggie Briggs."

Pleshette is Maggie Briggs." "Our Family Honor," from Lorimar Productions, is the story of the McKays and the Danzigs. McMillan as Patrick McKay, the newly appointed police commissioner, is the patriarch of the McKays Eli Wallach, as Vincent Danzig. Patrick's boyhood chum and godfather to a criminal empire, heads the Danzigs.

"We're two pals who grew up in opposite directions, one good, one bad," says McMillan "We're Pat O'Brien and James Cagney from 'Angels with Dirty Faces' — O'Brien became the priest and Cagney the gangster."

But there's another genre tossed in for good measure, "Romeo and Juliet." McKay's daughter, Liz, a rookie cop, is living with her boyfriend, Jerry Cole, who conceals the fact that he's Danzig's son.

"It's not really a cop show," says McMillan. "It's a show about relationships. There's a scene in the pilot that I think's beautiful. I'm in bed and my wife comes in. I'm worried about a lot of problems. She lies down beside me and we just have a few words about nothing. She says we don't seem to be close any more. I say to her. 'You could make the first move.' She says, 'You're right. I want to. I think about it.' Not much happens. She asks me what I'm thinking and I say I'm thinking how blessed I am. It's a wonderful scene and I loved doing it." Gloria DeHaven has become a central character in the role of Bess on "Ryan's Hope" and evidently her long-term contract has nowhere to go but into extension. Other names include Jane Powell as Rebecca on "Loving" and Jack Carter doing a turn on "Santa Barbara."

At one time any name who dropped into

a soap was trumpeted with lots of publicity. For example, Frank Converse and Roy Thinnes were given major press conferences when they came on "One Life to Live." Well, Converse and Thinnes are gone and in their place come the likes of the aforementioned Callan, Saxon, etc., whose appearances didn't spawn major press conferences.

More and more producers are realizing that the viewers are taking these "Oh-Iknow-that-face" feelings more matter-offactly. It's no longer big news when a known actor appears on a soap. (However, a known singer is about to make a guest appearance on "As the World Turns" and

But the big news isn't what happens at the wedding but what happens after the ceremony.

The only word on this is that it's going to have everything — life, birth, death and a storyline that could possibly go on into infinity.

## City's thriving tax base may generate more money than it's allowed to spend

Costa Mesa may soon find itself in the unusual position of making more money than the state will allow it to spend.

And the dollar dilemma has sparked debate among city officials on whether to drain the excess by offering landowners a break in prop-

An alternative would be to hold an election asking voters to raise the spending cap placed on Costa Mesa as part of the 1979 Gann Initiative. Unless the ceiling is lifted the city would have to return the money collected past its limit by such methods as lowering various service fees or offering tax reductions.

Costa Mesa's \$47 million budget

for fiscal 1985-86 came within \$75 of the appropriations limit, and a healthy sales tax base is expected to push next year's budget well past the fiscal boundary.

The initiative, named after its against the financial ropes. author Paul Gann, sets a maximum on city spending according to population and yearly inflation rates.

It was part of a one-two combination that staggered government agen-cies during the California tax revolution of the late 1970s.

First came Proposition 13, the 1978 initiative penned by Gann and tax guru Howard Jarvis that lowered property taxes by 57 percent, knocking many publicly-funded agencies

Proposition 13 lowered the tax dollars the government could collect. while the Gann limitation, approved the next year, put a lid on how much it could spend, catching the money coming and going.

Since the tax revolt, government

agencies have jealously protected what was left of their incomes.

## Irvine man hit by car, near death

A 29-year-old Irvine man was near death Saturday night from injuries suffered earlier in the day when he was struck by a hit-and-run driver while riding his bicycle along an Irvine street.

Craig Casey was listed in "extremecritical" condition at Western Medical Center in Santa Ana with massive internal injuries, a fractured vertebrae and a possible severed spinal chord.

According to Irvine Police Sgt. Mike Ogden, Casey was riding his bike westbound along Irvine Center Drive near Orange Tree when a car traveling in the same direction struck him from behind.

The driver did not stop.

Police investigators questioned witnesses to the 11.15 a.m. accident who described the vehicle an "older, full-sized American vehicle, faded green in color." Ogden said. The driver was described only as an adult male.

Casey was rushed to Western Medical Center where he was placed on life-support systems. A nursing supervisor described his condition as gravely ill and near death.

Because Casey was not carrying any dentification, authorities had difficulty notifying family members.

Later in the afternoon, his wife called Irvine Police to inquire about his whereabouts since he had not returned from his bike ride. She was referred to Western Medical Center where she met with doctors to discuss Casey's condition.

Edison student Joe Mendoza touched off a controversy two weeks ago when he asked school trustees to reverse school policies and make classrooms, the PA system and bulletin boards available to a group of youngsters who read scripture, discuss the Bible and have group pravers.

Mendoza said that religious groups are being denied use of the facilities by officials who have failed to comply with a 1984 equal access law that bars federal funds to school districts that allow non-academic groups to meet in classrooms but denies those facilities to religious groups.

The U.S. Supreme Court this week heard arguments on the constitutionality of the new law. School officials say they'd prefer to wait until a ruling is handed down, probably in about 11 months, before taking action

reverse it.

But Mendoza said there shouldn't be any delay. He plans to try to persuade trustees at their meeting Monday night to scrap the old policy and institute a new one right away.

Mendoza and Simonds use virtually identical arguments against a delay until the Supreme Court hands down a ruling on the issue.

They both claim said that motorists couldn't wait for a ruling by the Supreme Court before complying with the 55 mile speed limit.

rather than eliminating Costa Mesa's share of property taxes. And business property as well as residential should partake of the tax cut, the chamber said.

The chamber's two-pronged approach would give taxpayers a break while allowing the city to keep some of the money for public improvements, according to its memorandum.

"Residents have been inconvenienced in various ways by the rapid commercial development," said the letter. "A tax reduction is a fair way to give residents direct return on the economic growth of the city.

The statement continued, "On the other hand, it seems a shame to lose the opportunity to provide better services," thus, the need for a tax break combined with a waiver of the appropriations limit.

# New York rattled byquake

ALC: NO. OF TAXABLE

NEW YORK (AP) - Residents throughout the New York metropolitan area were jolted or nudged awake Saturday morning by an earth-quake which, although minor, packed enough punch to be felt from southern Canada to Philadelphia.

But a bigger quake 51/2 hours later in southwestern Montana went virually unnoticed in a swarm of tremors that have kept the mountains shaking for

days. The New York quake, which struck at 6:08 a.m., registered 4.0 on the Richter scale and was centered about 15 miles north of midtown Manhattan near the suburban Westchester County community of New Rochelle, according to seismologist Klaus Jacob.

The U.S. Geological Survey's Na-tional Earthquake Center in Golden, Colo., gauged the quake's force at 3.8 on the Richter scale.

"It sounded like a sonic boom or an explosion," said Doris Selig, who lives in Dobbs Ferry, about 11/2 miles from Ardsley. "The building shook momentarily.

"My whole bed, my body was actually shaking. I thought I was dreaming but it was too long," said Shavon Bryan, who lives in Ewing Township, N.J., about 90 miles from the guake's center. "I sat up in bed and I could hea things vibrating in my



#### medicine cabinet."

Though polce switchboards in New York, New Jersey and Connecticut lighted up instantly after the quake. there were no immediate reports of injuries or damage.

In Montana, a quake regstering 4.1 on the scale occurred five miles west of West Yellowstone at 8:35 a.m. PDT, the National Earthquake Information Center reported.

It equaled the region's strongest quake so far this year, just two days earlier

At least 20 quakes have shaken the West Yellowstone-Hebgen Lake area in the past four days, a fresuency high even for southwestern Montank, which has an earthquake almost every day, police said. There have been no reports of damage or injury.

# ATION Reagan to hit Gorbachev on rights, spying issues

#### By the Associated Press

WASHINGTON - President Reagan, saying it will take more than nuclear weapon cuts to insure "true peace" with Moscow, announced Saturday he will bring up human rights, armed intervention and subversion when he meets with Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev. In his weekly radio address, the president also asserted anew his conviction that the United States should pursue testing as well as research of "Star Wars" weapons. Reagan will meet in Geneva on Nov. 19-20 with Gorbachev, the general secretary of the Soviet Union's Communist Party. It will be the first meeting between Reagan and the top Kremlin leader.

#### **Budget-balancing** plan criticized

WASHINGTON - The chairman of the congressional Joint Economic Committee blasted the Senate-passed Gramm-Rudman plan to balance the budget by 1990 Saturday, calling it a threat to economic growth. "This scheme is a prescription for making recessions worse and for doing the least about the deficit when we can most afford it," Rep. David Obey, D-Wis., said in a broadcast response to President Reagan's weekly radio speech. Congress could reduce the federal budget deficit with lowered spending, tax increases or both under the administration-backed plan sponsored by Sens. Phil Gramm, R-Tex., and Warren Rudman, R-N.H. If the House and Senate failed, mandatory cuts would take effect.

# **Reagan: Italy relations 'solid'**

#### President reaffirms common views on terrorist policy after flap over hijacking

ROME (AP) - A top U.S. official delivered a letter from President Reagan to caretaker Premier Bettino Craxi Saturday that said U.S.-Italian relations remain "solid" despite differences over the Achille Lauro hijacking.

The letter, delivered by Deputy Secretary of State John C. Whitehead during a meeting which lasted nearly two hours, was "particularly friendly," Craxi said.

In the letter, Reagan said that despite "differences on the best way to respond to the hijacking" the two countries "share the fundamental commitment on the necessity to respond with firmness to the challenges posed by international terrorism. The letter, released by Craxi's office in Italian and translated by the Associated Press, said U.S.-Italian relations "have been and remain

comfortable, deep and solid and I am sure that our personal ties continue to be welded to this tradition. Craxi's coalition government fell Thursday after Defense Minister Giovanni Spadolini quit to protest its

allowing Mohammed Abbas to leave the country Abbas is the PLO official accused by the United States of masterminding the luxury liner hijacking

that terrorized more than 500 passen-gers from Oct. 7-9 and resulted in the killing of an American passenger.

The Reagan administration has criticized Craxi for allowing Abbas to leave Italy for Yugoslavia.

Abbas and the four hijackers ar-rived in Italy when U.S. warplanes forced the Egyptian airliner carrying them to land in Sicily Oct. 11. The hijackers are in Italian custody and face murder charges in the death of Leon Klinghoffer, a 69-year-old, partially paralyzed American passen-

Whitehead refused to answer reporters' questions after the meeting in Chigi Palace, the premier's office. Instead he read a statement, scribbled with black felt tip pen on paper, in which he called the talks a "warm and friendly" discussion.

Whitehead, who flew to Rome for

the meeting, said, "We agreed that the events of the past few weeks indicate the need for better coordination between all nations in the ongoing fight against terrorism.

The U.S. envoy said Reagan's letter "expressed the president's hope that we should now put our differences behind us."

Craxi said his conversation with Whitehead helped make clear the facts and led to a "better comprehension and better evaluation."

Craxi told reporters he "would be pleased" to accept Reagan's invitation to meet him and other Western leaders on Thursday in New York in preparation for the November summit between Reagan and Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev. He said he would go unless the Italian government crisis prevents him.

# **POW-MIA** protesters arrested

WASHINGTON (AP) - Eight protesters who handcuffed them-selves to the White House gate Saturday to call public attention to U.S. soldiers still listed as missing after the Vietnam War were arrested. U.S. Park Police said.

The demonstration was sponsored by the National Vietnam Veterans Coalition of the Sons and Daughters of MIAs and was staged to call attention to the MIA issue, said Tom Burch, head of the coalition.

Police said the five women and three men handcuffed themselves to the fence of the executive mansion at the north east gate shortly before 11 a.m

After being warned they were violating a law regarding demon-strations at the White House, the group refused to leave. All eight demonstrators were arrested.

WASHINGTON - A Senate Armed Services Committee staff recommendation to abolish the Joint Chiefs of Staff was the focus of most headlines last week, but the report's proposals to overhaul and reshape the Pentagon went far beyond that. The report stands, in the first place, as one of the most sweeping indictments in decades of a system which it said gives highest priorities to the demands of the individual armed services and short shrift to the needs of a rational and unified national defense. "Service interests rather than strategic needs play the dominant role in shaping program decisions," the report states.

LOS ANGELES - In accordance with Rock Hudson's wishes, close friends gathered Saturday for a memorial service in the home where the AIDSstricken actor spent his final days. "It's a very private gathering," said publicist Chen Sam, who organized the memorial. "There were about 150 people. I am not giving out the guest list." The Police Department's special events section closed Beverly Crest Drive to all but invited guests during the service. Hudson died Oct. 2 at age 59 and his body was cremated. His ashes were scattered at sea last week.

#### Preschool molesting suspects 'lost'

The parents said state law requiring children to personally testify against alleged molesters, and the statute of limitations requiring that child molestation charges be filed within six years after the alleged crime, have been the great st factors discouraging arrests and prosecutions.

#### Last of Southland fires contained

LOS ANGELES - Firefighters have contained the last Southern California brushfire remaining from the dozens that burned more than 100,000 acres, destroyed 21 homes and caused one death. The 45,710-acre blaze inside the rugged Los Padres National Forest was 85 percent contained Saturday morning. The fire 60 miles northwest of Los Angeles started last Monday, along with the others that were pushed across parched brushland by hot, dry Santa Ana winds.

#### Bush heads home from China trip

HONG KONG - U.S. Vice President George Bush left for home Saturday after a six-day tour of China and said Chinese-U.S. relations were on a "good track" despite differences over Taiwan and other issues. He spoke at a news conference in Hong Kong before departing for Anchorage, Alaska, en route back to Washington. Bush said the Reagan administration has sought improved relations with Peking, adding, "That is happening and I don't see there would be call for any new dramatic action."

#### Guerrilla plot foiled in Nicaragua

MANAGUA - The Sandinista government has arrested five guerrillas who planned to blow up economic targets to coincide with an offensive by rebels in northern Nicaragua, according to Interior Minister Tomas Borge. He told a news conference that a rebel sympathizer tipped off authorities about the planned bombings of the offices of the national bus company ENABUS, the Soviet airline Aeroflot, an electrical substation and a supermarket. Borge and other officials have said 2,500 Honduras-based rebels are planning to launch a new offensive soon.

#### Killer typhoon leaving Philippines

MANILA - Typhoon Dot moved away from the Philippines Saturday after battering the main island of Luzon with heavy rains and up to 70 mph winds, leaving 31 people dead and thousands homeless, officials said. In India, flooding triggered by storms earlier in the week killed 29 people Saturday. bringing India's two-day death toll to 78.

# Transplant patient 'doing fine' after getting an artificial heart

HERSHEY, Pa. (AP) - The first recipient of the Penn State artificial heart, implanted to keep him alive until a transplant can be performed. thanked his doctors Saturday and told them "I'm doing fine."

Anthony Mandia complained of mild pain from the incision but was doing "remarkably well" one day after five hours of implant surgery at Hershey Medical Center, said hospital spokesman Dr. John W. Burnside.

Mandia, a 44-year-old Philadelphia bachelor who was near death when surgeons decided to implant the one-pound, plastic, air-driven device. was taken off a respirator Saturday afternoon and a breathing tube was removed from his throat.

He was talking freely, his head was

elevated and he drank some fluids. Burnside said

He said Mandia praised his doctors, and said. "Between you guys and the man upstairs. I'm doing fine The Penn State heart, named after

the hospital's affiliated university. will stay in Mandia until a suitable human donor heart can be found. possibly within a week or so, said Burnside

Burnside said doctors could see no evidence of bleeding or other complications that have plagued recipients of other artificial hearts.

Mandia's relatives told reporters Saturday they had initially resisted the idea of an artificial heart implant. but changed their minds Thursday


when they realized there was no other option

Mandia was told after he suffered heart failure in March that he was a likely candidate for an implant, but his reaction was "no go." said his brother, Ernie, 43.

"When they said there was a possibility you might need a heart transplant, he wouldn't believe that, until he finally got worse and went in the hospital." Ernie Mandia said He couldn't breathe And then he decided it was the best way to go.

As he was being wheeled into the operating room early Friday morning. Mandia said "I'm rolling sevens," Ernie recalled.

The official, who spoke on the condition of not being identified, said dozens of students were hurt, including some who were hit in the face by the canisters. Others fainted in the melee





# Israel can sidestep Arab takeover of Jewish state

Constitutional codicil could be added, setting up nation as Jewish homeland

shock sensitive Israelis, blessedly the majority, puts it very simply when he describes the Israeli dilemma:


**ON THE RIGHT** 

1) Israel is a democracy. 2) Israel has 3 million Jews. 3) Israel has 2 million Arabs. 4) Arabs breed faster than Jews. 5) The future, under the circumstances, is bound to see an Israel in which Arabs outnumber Jews. 6) As of that moment, Arabs will use democratic mechanisms to prevent Israel from being a Jewish state. Accordingly, 7) the time has come, before it is too late, to expel Arabs from Israeli soil.

There are any number of humane and constitutional objections to doing what Rabbi Kahane proposes. But before dwelling on these, one ought to examine whether his dilemma comprehends all possibilities for Israel

not a secret member of the Roman Catholic Church. An ancient tradition, dating back to the Reformation, or more specifically, to the Jacobite tensions of the 17th century. But it is as plain as that the sovereign of Great Britain is ex officio the head of the Church of England. So that Great Britain is officially and constitutionally a Protestant country, And so it would remain, presumably even if its Catholic population (about 10 percent) were gradually to outbreed the Protestants.

Kahane's hypothetical threat could be removed by a constitutional codicil, declaring the state of Israel to be a Jewish state, defining briefly what customs and protocols would be observed in the state of Israel (foremost among them being the right of any Jew to immigrate into Israel). Any citizens of Israel could then be asked to vow to support that constitution before being accorded a vote. Such an evolution in the Jewish Constitution would be perfectly harmonious with the very idea of Israel. namely that it is the Jewish homeland Would such a measure stop Kahane and his movement? One fears it would not, primarily because there are palpable grounds for believ-ing that Kahane is a virulent anti-Arab racist, and that he wants the Arabs expelled less because he fears their democratic strength than because he loathes their ethnic presence. His arguments are similar to those of Professor William Shockley, who peaked when he discovered the transistor, and devoted himself thereafter to elaborating a theory of what he called "dysgenics," namely the tendency of the less-bright (he speaks of American blacks) to breed faster



than the more-bright (he means whites). Professor Shockley's bizarre idea has been to bribe blacks into submitting to sterilization, in order to catch the rising black population before it overwhelms us.

These are solutions offensive to any notion of equality at whatever level. If the Israel of Kahane does not acknowledge that at one level all men are equal, then he does not read carefully the words of Yahweh who, although the Jews were the chosen people, was bent on redeeming all of mankind.

Kahane is not going to take over Israel, though he disturbs many friends of Israel by the splash he is making, particularly among the young and thoughtless. We have just finished declaring him to have lost his U.S. citizenship, on the grounds that he serves in the parliament of another nation. That may be the unfriendliest thing we ever did to Israel.

# ANDERSON and JOSEPH SPEAR Heckler kills ban on color additives

WASHINGTON - Certain lipsticks, candies, soft drinks and ice cream may be hazardous to your health. But the government has refused to ban them. And unlike cigarettes, these products bear no warning from the surgeon general that they could make you sick.

Many products contain color additives that have been found to cause cancer. Under a 25-year-old law, these products normally would have been banned from the market.

But outgoing Health and Human Services Secretary Margaret Heckler overruled the recommendations of three recent Food and Drug Administration commissioners and has allowed the six color additives to stay on the market. To do this, she used a radical interpretation of the law, ruling that cancer-causing chemicals must be banned only if their use is shown to be more of a risk than a benefit to society.

To support her view, Mrs. Heckler asked former Sen. Jacob Javits what the "legislative intent" of Congress was when it passed the law banning cancer-causing food and cosmetic additives in 1960. Javits wrote that his view, then and now, is that "the rule of reason is to be applied.'

In his letter, which was seen by our associate Vicki Warren, Javits explained: "This rule would dictate that where the danger to the public is negligible in using products with such color additives, then use should not be prohibited."

While this supports Mrs. Heckler's interpretation, an ex-senator was hardly the one to ask about what Congress intended in 1960. The Senate's version of the Color Additives Amendment that year did not contain an absolute ban on cancercausing chemicals in foods and cosmetics. It was only at the House's insistence that the ban was written into the law.

Although some Republican members of the Government Operations Committee want the law modified along the lines of Mrs. Heckler's more permissive interpretation, there is little likelihood that the House will tamper with it. And as recently as 1983, a budget official reminded Mrs. Heckler that the Cabinet Council had decided that food and drug safety policy should not be changed without congressional action.

Yet this is precisely what Mrs. Heckler has since done by allowing the six cancer-causing color additives to remain on the market.

THE OMBUDSMAN: The families of nine Navy airmen killed in a crash 37 years ago on a rugged Canadian mountainside are engaged in a macabre bureaucratic battle with the Navy. The families want the fragmentary remains of the airmen brought home for burial in Arlington Cemetery. The Navy says such an undertaking would cost almost a quarter-million dollars, and would be dangerous to boot.

The remains of the airmen and their plane were discovered in 1961 by a geologist surveying the area, near Tofino, British Columbia. The next year, a Navy search party reached the scene, 3,000 feet above sea level, found the plane and a "minimal quantity" of human bone fragments buried in the ice and rubble of a landslide caused by the crash.

The search party buried the human remains in a shallow grave, erected a cairn of rocks and cement and put up a marker bearing the names of the victims and the date of the crash.

Rick Swentek, a former Navy ensign whose brother was killed in the crash, told us: "We want the Navy to do one of two things. They can either disinter the remains and bring them back for proper burial in Arlington, or they can maintain the grave site."

# 'Dead Sea of the West' center of fight for its life

#### Mono Lake's water being diverted for city of Los Angeles

#### By STEVE LAWRENCE

LEE VINING, Calif. - The license plate on the little pickup truck spells out the issue concisely. "H204MNO," it reads. Translation: out Water for Mono.

Mono Lake, that is. The eerie, salty lake on the arid eastern side of the Sierra Nevada. The place that Mark Twain labeled "The Dead Sea of the West" and naturalist John Muir called a "country of wonderful contrasts: Hot deserts bounded by snowladen mountains ... frost and fire working together in the making of beauty.

It's the lake around which Congress created the Mono Basin National Forest Scenic Area last year.

And it's a lake that is shrinking because four of its five main feeder streams are tapped by Los Angeles to provide part of that city's water

supply. Hence the license plate and a campaign by environmentalists, fishermen and others to reduce Los Angeles' water diversions and prevent the lake from becoming what one environmentalist refers to as "an alkali wasteland."

"We are trying to keep the lake filled with water. If we don't, we're going to lose our town," says Ernie Peigne, a local resident who fears that the water diversions could turn the lake basin into a dust bowl. Peigne's wife, Pat, bought the specialized pro-Mono license plate a few years ago for her pickup truck to help draw atten-tion to the lake's plight.

The campaign has been waged in Congress, the California Legislature and, currently, in the courts. One court battle may decide the fate of a thriving population of trout that a leader of a fishermen's group discovered accidently in a previously dry stream.

Mono, one of North America's oldest bodies of water, was formed a million years ago in a volcanic area just east of what is now Yosemite National Park. The lake is probably best known for its high salt level and the oddly shaped limestone formations — tufa — that stand cactus-like along part of its shore.

Since 1941, Los Angeles' Depart-ment of Water and Power has diverted fresh water from Sierra Nevada streams that feed the lake through 280 miles of pipes and aqueducts to help fill the city's water taps and power its fountains.

The diversions, which now supply about 17 percent of the city's water and produce a small amount of hydroelectric power, lowered the lake's elevation 43 feet between 1941 and 1981, cutting its volume in half, exposing 17,000 acres of lake bottom

vironmental group that has led efforts to improve lake levels.

LeVal Lund, an official of the Department of Water and Power, acknowledges that the lake will continue to drop, but says it will stabilize in 80 to 100 years at about 40 square miles. It currently covers about 60 square miles

Despite the reduction in the lake's shrinkage, Lund disputes claims that the environment will be spoiled.

"Our philosophy is there is still going to be a unique and scenic location," at Mono Lake, says Lund, the DWP's Los Angeles aqueduct engineer. "It certainly will be much smaller, but you have to look at it as balancing. There are people on earth and people need water.'

Environmentalists contend that the city could make up the loss of some Mono Basin water through greater conservation efforts or by using more expensive water available th the giant Metropolitan Water District.

They cite a 1979 interagency government report that recommended a reduction in diversions.

The Department of Water and Power says it's not that easy, that the city is trying to conserve water and that water it takes from other sources to make up for lost Mono Lake diversions will shorten someone else's supply.

Creation of the 57,000-acre scenic area from other federal lands in the basin won't affect Los Angeles' water

more sympathy for the lake. Ul-timately, what the lake needs is more friends.

But not all Mono Lake residents are happy with creation of the scenic area, which was officially dedicated at ceremonies July 31. Jeff Hansen, a contractor and trucking company operator who lives along the lake's north shore, says the federal legislation won't stop the diversions but will make it more difficult for local residents to develop private property

bordering on the scenic area. "The only thing Mono Lake needs is water," he says.

The scenic area legislation protects existing uses of private property but limits major new development on private land. The law also requires the U.S. Forest Service to "protect geologic, ecologic and cultural resources" and bans commercial

timber harvest and new mining. Lund says that although the law strongly protects the city's water rights, it would be "very difficult to predict" how creation of the scenic area would be used by the courts in deciding how to divide up the basin's water.

Environmentalists and fishermen are waging two court battles to try to limit the water diversions.

One struggle, started by the Na-tional Audubon Society and other environmental groups, challenges the diversions under the "public trust" doctrine, a concept inherited from English common law that says the

The extra water covered the land bridge that had formed between Negit Island and the mainland, and California gulls have begun to return to the island's nesting grounds.

At the same time, the lake's population of brine shrimp, one of the bird's favorite foods, has been making a comeback after bad years between 1979 and 1981, environmentalists say

But they claim that unless the diversions are reduced, evaporation will eventually shrink the lake to an "alkali wasteland" unable to support the brine shrimp and the various types of birds that use the lake's islands and islets.

# **FDAOKs** growth hormone

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Food and Drug Administration on Friday approved the latest product of genetic engineering — a synthetic growth hormone that can help many undersized children grow to normal or near-normal height.

The manufacturer, sensitive to speculation the product could be used to breed super-athletes, said there is no evidence the hormone can prod the body into growing beyond the limits set by its own genetic blueprint at conception. The hormone simply lets the body meet that blueprint.

The synthetic protein will be used to treat an estimated 10,000 to 15,000 children whose pituitary glands do not produce a normal amount of growth hormone. Without treatment, they would grow to an adult height of only about 4 or 5 feet.

The synthetic hormone is produced by Genentech Inc., of South San Francisco, and will replace a natural hormone supplement that is feared to be contaminated with a slow-acting, lethal virus.

The natural hormone, derived from the pituitary glands of cadavers, was pulled from the market this spring after four young adults - three in the United States and one in Great Britain - died of Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease, an extremely rare but in-variably fatal brain infection.

Q.-In a recent column, you mentioned that the new version of the Goren system will include five-card majors and weak two-bids. What exactly are the requirements of a weak two-bid and how do you show a strong hand?-L.R., Nashville,

A.-If you play weak two bids, opening bids of two spades, two hearts and two diamonds are, in ef fect, preemptive opening bids, although opener usually promises more defensive values than with other preempts. All strong hands are opened with an artificial bid of two clubs, and opener's rebid shows his suit. Thus, with a hand that, under your present methods, you would open with two spades, you now open two clubs and then bid spades at your next turn.

The requirements for a weak two bid are simple. You show a hand



with a good six card suit and 6-12 points. Most of the strength should be concentrated in the long suit, and the hand should not contain more than two defensive tricks-rarely two aces.

Note that, when you open with a weak two-bid, you deny the values for an opening bid of one in that suit. Not vulnerable, you should try to avoid making a weak two-bid on 11 and 12 point hands; vulnerable, don't open 6- or 7 point hands - that could prove to be expensive. In addition, when you are vulnerable your long suit should contain two of the three top honors. Lastly, don't open with a weak two-bid if your hand contains a secondary four card major suit - you might end up play ing in, and perhaps going down in, two of your suit with game avail able in the other major. Consider these examples:

Hand 2 is a maximum weak two bid vulner able, but too strong for a non-vul nerable weak two-bid: not vulnerable, either open one heart or pass and come into the auction later. Hand 3 is the opposite case-a sound weak two bid if you are not vulnerable, but the suit quality leaves something to be desired if you are vulnerable. And the last example is a comfortable weak fwobid if you are not vulnerable, but a nervous weak two-bid vulnerable.

If you adhere to these requirements in first and second seat, the weak two-bid is a powerful weapon. both offensively and defensively. Defensively, it makes it more dif ficult for the opponents to enter the auction; offensively, it allows part ner to judge the potential of the hand with reasonable accuracy. Naturally, in third seat you may relax the requirements for a weak two-bid, but for tactical reasons only.

# **Catcus** makes the 'Tova Difference'

"I didn't know I couldn't do it." said Tova Borgnine discussing her now multi-million dollar skin care products company in Beverly Hills.

Besides a thriving mail order business, this month she opened a facial salon in her Penthouse suite on Wilshire Boulevard (the first in a series soon to be introduced nationally) and left two days later for Oslo, where she launched a Scandinavian distributorship.

Upon her return, she will embark upon an 11-city talk show tour to promote her book "The Tova Difference" published in July 1984, as well as Star and Charity Cruises in the Mediterranean and Beauty and Glamour Cruises from Rio to Rome.

"I've been in the industry for 20 years, but if someone had told me 15 years ago this would happen to me I would have said 'you are out to lunch,"" Borgnine said during a telephone interview.

The trip to Norway is a dream come true. . . the highlight of my life," said Borgnine, who came to New York at age 9 from Oslo. "It's my Viking background and some Italian that gives me my energy.

In the spring - hopefully- she will have her makeup line out to join the now 14 skin care products, bath line and her Tova fragrance (now in

its second year). "It all started in 1977 with four products — a bar for cleansing, a masque, toner and emollient. The

main ingredient is cactine." (Cactine comes from the root of a cactus, an Aztec Indian secret) and from '78 to 85 Tova said she paid \$1 million for the formula.

Borgnine, who began her career as a makeup artist and salon proprietor on the East Coast, eventually moved to Las Vegas where she first heard of a cactus root formula that the Indians used to prevent their skin from becoming dried out.

After using cactus preparations and sharing it with friends, the word "My husband (actor Ernest spread. Borgnine) used it and talked about the cactus masque during an interview The writer found it amusing, I guess, because he wrote about the skin care products.

"At the time I was handling my husband's fan mail . . one day after the story was published 1 picked up the mail and thought it was requests for his picture and autograph. but it was filled with orders for the masque.

The mail order business was put together in six weeks.

Originally, Borgnine began by running full page ads in publications throughout the nation. The products were sent out with a catalog and a personal lettter. "We kept it very simple.

We try to turn around an order. say from the farthest distance. New York, in seven working days." (Until the salon opened in Beverly Hills Oct. 10, mail order was the only method of purchasing TOVA products).

The products are good for anyone at any age. They are pure enough to be eaten. Children should be taught to always use moisturizer after cleaning their face.

Borgnine says it only takes three things to be beautiful. learn to deal with stress, exercize and tone your body, and take care of your skin.



"It takes a little time for the great skin. It requires cleansing, toning and moisturizing," she added. The people who order her cactine-

based products can get their money back if they are not satisfied with the results they see in the mirror.

The cactus masque, the primary product in her collection, is priced (last catalog) at \$39 for eight ounces; the cleansing bar is \$6; emollient (night) \$15, and Cactus Silque (moisturizing cream), \$15. (They are made in Arcadia).

From the prickly cactus, she says, comes the Tova Difference.

'The cactus grow in a harsh climate and live to be 200 or 300 years old. They have the most beautiful blossoms.

## China to sell antiques to U.S. for first time

The People's Republic of China for the first time is amassed during periods of revolutionary upheaval selling some of its finest antiques in the United States, with sales to take place in October in Chicago and San Francisco.

The antiques are of museum quality or just below, according to an article in the October issue of Connoisseur, and their sale may open up a new market in Chinese antiques.

The People's Republic owns whole warehouses of furniture, rugs and art objects of every description,

For the past four or five years, foreign dealers have been given limited access to these goods, but in general they have been allowed to export only 20th century

reproductions — bright, gaudy second-rate merchandise. Now the Chinese will bring to the United States about 300 examples from the highly refined Qianlong and Jiaqing periods (1736-1821). The shipment includes fine jades and textiles, but the prize items are the two dozenodd superb pieces of furniture, including lacquer cabinets in pristine condition.

# Starship slicker than ever

With the exception of Grace Slick, Starship is a whole new crew. Yet as generic as the new sound has become, Starship remains more interesting than any of its former members' solo projects.

# Cards play the field for Game 1 victory

#### Their defensive efforts, relief pitching lead way to a 6-1 win over Kansas City

KANSAS CITY (AP) - Sometimes the best offense is a good defense.

The St. Louis Cardinals not only won that battle with the Kansas City Royals Saturday night, but they also won the first game of the World Series, 3-1, behind the pitching of John Tudor and Todd Worrell.

Game 2 of the best-of-seven Series tonight will send Cards right-hander Danny Cox, 18-9 and 1-0 in the playoffs, against left-hander Charlie Leibrandt, 17-9 and 1-2 in the playoffs.

The defensive play of Game I came from Cardinals third baseman Terry Pendleton, who turned a popup in the foul territory of no-man's land into an inning-ending double play at home plate on a runner trying to score from third.

Tito Landrum, substituting for injured Vince Coleman in left field, also made a couple of fine plays, offsetting a defensive gem by Royals second baseman Frank White. White threw out Willie McGee at third base as he was trying to stretch a double into a triple.

Pendleton made his catch running away from the plate, then turned to make the long throw, beating runner Jim Sundberg by 15 feet.

"I ducked my head to run and make the play." Pendleton said. "And as I

caught the ball, I thought about the runner trying to score and just turned and threw to the plate. I wasn't surprised. I feel you have to tag and try to score there."

Of the throw, he said: "I think it was a pretty tough throw. What surprised me was that it reached home on the fly. I thought it would bounce once or twice."

Did Royals Manager Dick Howser egret sending Sundberg?

'It was a good play by the third baseman, going away from home plate, and it was a good throw," Howser said. "When you're having trouble scoring runs, you can't wait around for something to happen, though.

Tudor, 21-8 during the season and 1-1 as St. Louis beat Los Angeles in the National League playoffs, allowed six hits in 6% innings but, perhaps even more importantly, nullified the offensive threat of George Brett.



Sheehan had won two more holes with the "improper" ball and was actually 1-up with three holes to play even after the twohole penalty. Sheehan volunteered the information to Widener.

OCC earns 19-16 win on field goal with 5 seconds left

SAN DIEGO — Orange Coast College broke into the win column for the first time this season as place-kicker Tom Cortez booted a 38-yard field goal with five seconds to play to give the Pirates a 19-16 Mission Conference football victory over San Diego Mesa.

Being named head coach of the Bears was the 'fulfillment of a dream," said Ditka.

The Bears always have been a rugged team, especially on defense. Ditka has maintained that, and brought in some of the sophisticated offenses he learned under Landry.

Although Ditka is only in his fourth season as Bears coach, most of the players arrived after he took over. If players can't produce, they're gone.

"When I came here, we had some players who felt they didn't have to give it that extra effort," said Steve McMichael, a defensive tackle who signed as a free agent in 1981, before Ditka became coach. "That attitude was in abundance. But Mike got rid of all of them

"I think Mike is young enough to know what the players are thinking and old enough to know what is good for them," said star running back Walter Payton. He can relate to the players. That's a unique talent."

IOWA CITY, Iowa - It was billed as Iowa's irresistible offense against Michigan's immovable defense

But in the end it was Iowa's unpublicized defense which made the difference - along with four field goals by Rob Houghtlin, including a game-winning 29-yarder on the final play of the game to give the No. 1 Hawkeyes a dramatic 12-10 victory over second-ranked Michigan in a rare 1-2

pairing. "Coming into the game, I thought there were overlooked." said two or three things that were overlooked," said Iowa Coach Hayden Fry. "No. 1, there was no question that Michigan had a great defense, but if you look at the (Big Ten) defensive categories, there was Iowa No. 2 in all of them. And we have nine new starters (on defense)."

It was the 19th meeting of No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the 50 years of The Associated Press poll and was just as close as such a matchup figured to be. The triumph gave lowa a 6-0 record for the first time since 1960.

Although the Hawkeyes were held to 32 points under their nation-leading 44.2 average and had to go down to the final second to win, they dominated the statistics, outgaining Michigan 422 yards to 182 and controlling the football for 38:05 to Michigan's 21:55. "We did what we had to do to win," Fry said.

"All the great teams do that."

Fry called it the biggest win in his seven seasons at Iowa and said Michigan's Bo Schembechler agreed that Iowa was a great team.

'I told Coach Schembechler before the game and repeated it after: It's too bad that one team had to lose this one," Fry said.

# Get the Regis Touch

#### Marketingguru shares his secrets with executives

#### By EVE C. LASH

When it comes to marketing strategies for the high technology executive, the key is to go with your instincts, adapt to change quickly and don't rely on statistical analysis, says a noted Silicon Valley "guru."

Regis McKenna recently spoke to a crowd of about 200 executives who gathered at the Newporter Resort as part of nine-stop series of "Regis Touch" seminars throughout the United States and England. The seminars were sponsored by the Peat Marwick High Technology Practice, an international public accounting firm.

Business Weekly recently named McKenna a member of the "new corporate elite." He is chairman and founder of Regis McKenna Inc., a national and international high technology marketing consulting firm. He is president of the National Commission on Industrial Innovation and a member of the Berkeley Roundtable on International Economy. He is also author of the new book, "The Regis Touch: Million-Dollar Advice from America's Top Marketing Consultant.

Peat Marwick Orange County part-ner-in-charge Dale A. LeMasters said, "This is the neatest thing, to have a guru in the high tech industry. It's an opportunity for all of us to learn to establish market strategies. Having someone as knowledgeable as Regis is real exciting."

Before the seminar McKenna revealed his magic "touch" as being a qualitative look at marketing rather than a quantitative outlook. "We should make our decisions with more qualitative factors. Many judgments are made with statistical analysis and they lose sight of human factors. It's a market share mentality rather than a market development mentality creating new markets."

When one has this market share mentality, he says, one believes in the maxim that what you can measure, you can control. "But, that doesn't work. You can measure the size of your market, but, it's not going to tell you how it will act."

He says, customers should be part of the design process. "And all successful company (representatives)

are successful in being adaptable to the market place. Products are never born perfect. You adapt by being close to the market."

There are several key forces underlying the need for new approaches to marketing. He says in his book, most important is the quickening pace of change. "Traditional marketing rules were inverted for static markets and static industries. They assume technologies and markets only change slowly. But the modern busi-ness world is anything but static. Advances in techonology are causing products and companies to change more rapidly than ever before."

Technological change used to come along gradually, he notes. It took 30 years for antibiotics to go from a research concept to commercial reality. And it also took 30 years to commercialize the zipper. But, high tech development is much different today. He says, just as one year in a dog's life is equivalent to seven years, one year in the high-technology business is like seven years in any other industry.

McKenna maintains that in this new environment, marketing managers must learn to treat every customer as an individual. "As times goes on, customers will demand more and more diversity in their products.

The diversity of technology-based products is even greater. Dozens of new products are introduced every Catalogs for semiconductor day companies list thousands of different types of chips. There are tens of thousands of different types of chips. There are tens of thousands of

# Centralize your assets

If you haven't checked the back of a U.S. penny for investment advice, check again. E pluribus unum (out of many, one) suggests that you can simplify your money management by organizing cash and investments in one all-purpose account - a central assets account

A central assets account is not an investment but a vehicle to manage money and investments. This type of account is popular because it combines most of the major financial services you need - investment, credit, checking, savings, recordkeeping - in one convenient place and, at the same time, ensures that excess cash is always earning money market rates of return.

If you value convenience and like the idea of your money working for you at all times. a central assets account can help meet your needs.

Whether you are primarily a saver or an investor, one of the most attractive features of central assets accounts is the "sweep," an automatic daily or weekly gathering of idle assets - dividends and interest payments - into a primary money market fund of your choice. Whether funds will be swept daily or weekly depends on the amount available to be swept and the specific terms of your account.

Funds offered by different financial institutions vary greatly You can usually choose either a general money-market fund that invests in short-term U.S. Government securities, bank certificates of deposit and corporate commercial paper or more specific funds such as those that invest only in government or taxexempt municipal securities. The goals of all primary funds are current income, preservation of capital and liquidity. Another choice offered by some financial institutions is an FDIC-rotected insured savings account

Your central assets account also provides considerable borrowing power. Account holders have access to a credit line - usually through a margin account - and some firms even offer special rates on loans. In most instances, the securities in your account serve as collateral, some financial institutions, however, now also offer unsecured credit as well. You can tap into your credit line in two convenient ways: through personalized checks and either a debit card (such as Visa or Mastercard) or a harge card (like American Express) nlike credit cards, debit cards work like plastic checks. When you use the card the balance in your account will be decreased by the amount of your purchase Many centralized accounts are designed to use your most efficient mones at all times. This means that your least expensive tunds (assets earning the lowest rate of return) will be used first to pay debit card purchases. It there are insufficient funds in your account to cover the nurchase you can automatically borrow the exact amount needed. And unlike conventional credit cards, centralized accounts allow you to create your own repayment schedule There are differences, though, among accounts. Depending on where you open your account, you may be able to also use your debit or credit card to access cash in automatic teller machines. And while some firms return canceled checks. others do not. However, all your transactions will be recorded on your monthly statement Because the monthly statement also records your investment activities, it reduces the amount of paperwork you have to save for tax purposes. Minimum initial investments required to open central assets accounts range from \$5,000 to \$25,000, though you normally do not have to maintain those sums in your account. Annual fees may run as high as \$100 but you can usually deduct them from your fderal income taxes

# **BankAmerica** reports huge drop in earnings

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) -BankAmerica Corp., battling the highest quarterly loan loss in its history, has reported a drop in earnings for the third quarter despite a \$310 million pre-tax gain from the sale of its world headquarters.

The drop reported Thursday may lead to the bank's first full-year loss since the Great Depression.

The San Francisco-based parent of Bank of America, the nation's largest bank with deposits of \$94.8 billion, posted earnings of \$65 million, or 31 cents a share, for the quarter ended Sept. 30, 1985. This is down from net income of \$91 million, or 47 cents a share, for the same period of 1984.

The third quarter results follow a loss of \$338 million reported for the second quarter. For the first nine months of fiscal 1985, BankAmerica shows a deficit of \$159 million.

Although the bank realized some \$155 million on the bottom line from the sale of its 52-story headquarters building, which was final on Sept. 30,

it was not enough to make up for nagging problems in its loan portfolio

Without the gain from the sale, BankAmerica would have shown a pretax loss of \$153 million.

"Our results continue to be de-pressed by the high level of loan osses," said Samuel H. Armacost, BankAmerica's president and chief executive. "We're seeing ongoing pressure in the foreign, shipping, commercial real estate and agricultural sectors of the economy.

Net loans losses and provisions for possible future losses both rose dramatically during the third quarter.

Loan losses were \$470 million for the third quarter of 1985, up from \$249 million the year before. Provisions for loan losses increased to \$488 million, compared with \$250 millon in the third guarter of 1984.

In addition, the bank experienced a 20 percent increase in non-interest expense to \$560 million, principally reflecting higher litigation, leasing and equipment costs.

Corallo said the violations in the latest case involve alleged violations in oil trading transactions by ARCO as opposed to simply pricing its own crude oil production in excess of the

federal ceilings. He said ARCO, in its role as a trader, is accused of reaping "additional compensation" above the federal ceilings for price-controlled supplies in deals with other oil traders.

Without getting into the specifics of the case, he said that could have occurred by charging above-market prices for oil that was not under the federal controls or paying belowmarket prices for such oil in transactions involving both controlled and decontrolled categories of the fuel.

Scott Loll, a spokesman at ARCO's headquarters in Los Angeles, said the company had no comment on the proposed order.

An Energy Department official, speaking on condition of anonymity. said some of the transactions involved ARCO and Marc Rich & Co. a Swiss-based trader which pleaded guilty a year ago to criminal fraud charges and was fined \$150 million.

Corallo would not name any of the oil traders involved in the ARCO transactions being challenged by the government.

Over the past five years, the government has won more than \$5 billion in settlements with or suits against hundreds of traders, refiners and crude oil producers accused of violating the controls between 1973 and 1981

Corallo said about 90 other cases are still being investigated.


