# Another cycle rider thrown to her death

For the second time in four days in Huntington Beach, a motorcycle slammed into a vehicle from the rear and a female passenger riding on back was thrown to her death.

In both incidents, the driver of the motorcycle was arrested on suspicion of being under the influence of

Ironically, Thursday's accident which claimed the life of Debbra Egeler - happened just hours after funeral services were conducted for a 16-year-old girl killed Sunday under identical circumstances.

The most recent traffic fatality occurred at 10:18 p.m. Thursday when a motorcyle driven by Mark Byers, 31, slammed into a Dodge van while it was pulling away on a green traffic signal on Golden West Street, north of Warner Avenue.

Egeler, 33, was killed when she was thrown from the machine and hit her head against the van, traffic in-vestigator Greg Sander said Friday. Byers, a Huntington Beach resi-

dent, was thrown to the pavement also, and suffered a broken right leg. He was booked into the jail ward at UCI Medical Center on suspicion on driving under the influence and manslaughter.

The earlier accident occurred last resuc Chossi student at Huntington Beach High School, was riding on the back of a speeding motorcycle when it ran into the rear of a car on Pacific Coast Highway, Grossman, 16, was thrown from the bike and died at the scene.

# Hart wants BBC's apartments for park

By LANCE IGNON

If Newport Beach Councilwoman Evelyn Hart has her way, a five-story luxury apartment complex at the Balboa Bay Club will be torn down to make room for a public park.

But the idea has apparently found little favor with an administrator at the private club, which sits on 13 acres of prime bayfront property leased from the city

The apartments occupy a lion's share of the site and are situated about 50 yards to the west of the clubhouse. The complex is located in Mariners Mile at 1221 W. Coast Highway.

Hart said that because the property was originally donated to the city by James Irvine for a park, at least a portion of it should eventually serve that purpose.

'My intent would be that after so

many years it should come back to the city, at least a part of it.

Hart emphasized, however, that the clubhouse and its docks, swimming pools and buildings to the east should be allowed to remain.

"I'm not opposed to the Bay Club. hey give back to the community. They're a good corporate sponsor,

In most cases. Hart has been an avid supporter of the facility. Indeed, in 1984 she wrote the forward to the book "Host of the Coast, The Story of the Balboa Bay Club.

Hart's proposal is a response to a request from club officials to extend their lease by 50 years. The extension would allow the club time to recoup the cost of an ambitious renovation that would include a new clubhouse and a face-lift for the apartment.

But Hart is vehemently opposed to 50-year extension and will only

support an additional 25 years begin-

ning this year. Once that lease expires in 2014, Hart said the city should take back the land on which the 145-unit apartment complex is built and raze the building. The city could then build a park on one of the most valuable water-

front parcels in the city.
"After 65 years (in 20!4) ... it's time for part of that (property) to definitely go back to the city for public use," she

Hart plans to introduce her proposal Monday, when the council is scheduled to consider the club's request for the 50-year lease ex-

Hart concedes that turning the site into a park would mean reduced revenue for the city. In fiscal year 1987-88, the club paid the city \$269,356 to operate the apartments (Please see BBC/A2)

Backing up Snowden at the conference were chiefs from several other

# UCI crowd amicable at 'Satanic Verses' reading

Whether it was due to a lack of advertising or the protective cloak of the university setting, a rare reading of Salman Rushdie's "The Satanic Verses" passed without incidence Friday afternoon at UCL

A discussion after the reading was not without heated tempers and debate, but there were no formal protests or, apparently, serious objections to literature professor Lillian Manzor-Coates's decision to include the controversial novel as her contribution to the Faculty Reading

One concession was made, at the request of the Moslem Students Association, regarding the time of the reading.

Because Friday is the Moslem Sabbath with the prayer hour scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. - which coincided with the schedule time for the reading - event organizers agreed to delay the reading for 20 minutes.

"This is not a protest reading," said student organizer Karl Sherlock, "the fact that the reading was scheduled to begin at the same time as their prayer hour was strictly an oversight on our

While the one sensitive issue surrounding the reading had been taken care of in a friendly manner, the mood in the small room - hot and crowded with more than 60 in attendance - was tense with excitement as Manzor-Coates began with the opening words of Rushdie's

contentious novel, "To be born again...

After the first breathless moments, the audience relaxed as Manzor-Coates delivered passages from the novel in her fluid Cuban accent and, for a while, it was easy to forget that this novel is not only banned in Islamic countries, but that a death sentence has been levied on the head of the "blasphemous" author.

The novel begins with a hijaked plane cracking open, the contents of the plane spill out in mid-air and everything that falls also hangs, suspended, against the sky - where they can be described and analyzed by Rushdie:

- mingling with the remnants of the plane, equally fragmented, equally absurd, there floated the debris of the soul, broken memories, sloughedoff selves, severed mother-tongues, violated privacies, untranslatable jokes, extinguished futures, lost loves, the forgotten meaning of hollow, blooming words, land.

Where do you draw the line between freedom of speech and slander." Khan asked. "Under the pretense of fiction, Rushdie uses historical names and insults them ... calling a companion of Mohammed a word which translates as spineless,"

Stating that Rushdie did not even

bother to include a disclaimer anywhere in the book, Khan said, "You don't understand how much it hurts us to have our prophet called such names ... or to say that he called a wife such names. Think how you would feel if someone said your prophet Jesus called his mother Mary a bitch or a whore.

# Police raid illegal AIDS clinic, arrest Laguna Beach man

Police arrested a Laguna Beach man for operating an illegal AIDS clinicand seized an experimental drug and hazardous materials, including possibly contaminated blood and syringes, according to a prosecutor in San Bernardino County.

Earl Myer Rice, 48, was arrested Thursday for the unlawful practice of medicine with risk of serious injury at Associated Immune Testing Center, located at 317 West F St. in Ontario. Rice, who is not licensed to practice

extensive investigation that involved several state and federal agencies and the Ontario Police Department. Rice was the owner of the now defunct Cardiovascular Testing Services in Upland and was involved with another bogus AIDS clinic in

medicine, was the subject of an

Montclair last year, Rancho Cucamonga Deputy District Attorney Dennis Stout said. Rice dropped out of sight when that clinic closed and opened the new clinic in April 1988, Stout said, Law officers, whom Stout said had been concentrating on what could be a

larger network of clinics, had just become aware of the Ontario office "This is just part of a very complex organization," said Stout, who is also mayor of Rancho Cucamonga. "We are not at liberty to discuss his activities and links with the rest of the organization at this time.

"We are just now finding out there are a number of people taking advantage of AIDS patients. The type of treatment that's involved is very expensive.

During the arrest, police con-fiscated a variety of drugs not authorized for use by the Federal Drug Administration. The drugs included reticulose, an experimental drug from the West Indies used primarily in the treatment of AIDS patients, Stout said.

One patient at the Montclair clinic had been diagnosed as testing positive for the HIV virus and spent 3,000 on treatment, Stout said. In reality, that patient had an infected pancreas, Stout said.

"Can you imagine the trauma that person went through?" Stout said. "Those people are willing to pay anything for any glimmer of hope, no

matter what it is. A private hazardous waste management company was called to clinic to remove possibly contaminated blood, syringes and cotton swabs, Stout said were stored in which

An Orange County judge ruled Friday that a woman who was found to be inside when she killed her son can be treated without having to be confined to a mental

Superior Court Judge Robert R. Fitzgerald, who last year overturned Sheryl Lynn Massip's second-degree murder conviction for running over her 6-week-old son Michael, said the situation was unique and Massip should be treated in an outpatient program.

Massip hugged relatives and friends after the decision and said she had come to court Friday ready to be taken into custody and sent to a psychiatric institution.

Outside of court Massip said "My hope is that society will begin to open their thanks and minds to understand this illness. If it can be prevented, it will stop what happened to my son and L

When Fitzgerald oversumed the murder conviction, he ruled at Massip was suffering from postpartum psychosis, a rare hormonal disorder that causes some mothers to behave violently.

Her attorney, Milton Grimes, said he believed Fitzgerald's repeated surprise decisions in the case showed he was forward thinking.

"Judge Fitzgerald is a courageous and brave judge," Grimes said.

# Coast shipments of Rushdie's controversial book dwindling

The book that has caused a worldwide religious furor and broken diplomatic relations between Iran and Great Britain finally arrived on the Orange Coast.

But supplies of Salman Rushdie's "The Satanic Verses" are dwindling fast, according to area booksellers.

The book, which had hitherto received good reviews but little publicity, became an instant best seller last month when Moslem religious leaders called it blasphemous, fomenting book burn-ings and street riots in Pakistan and other Islamic countries.

Then last month, Iran's Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini escalated the controversy by condemning Rushdie, an Indian born British citizen, to death for allegedly defaming the

prophet Mohammed. An allegorical satire, the novel contains a dream sequence with reference to an apocryphal story about the origin of certain Islamic scriptures, a story which Moslems consider sacrilegious. Moslems also blast the novel's language, which they

say is obcene. For weeks, the book was almost impossible to find as curious readers snapped up every copy of the modest

first printing. Demand still far outstripped supply at Orange Coast bookstores until late this week, when several stores

"We got a shipment of 28," said Devon Golub of Doubleday Book Shop in Newport Beach. "But they're selling fast. That was two days ago and there are only three copies left." Lido Book Shoppe in Newport

Beach reported receiving a small shipment of the controversial novel. but an employee said there were no more left.

"This is the foundation of what we hope down will happen in the downtown for the next five years," Mayor Wes Bannister told about 300 people who gathered under a huge tent for dedication ceremonies

Former Mayor Jack Kelly, the master of ceremonies, told the audience that the development has progressed to the point that they are "on the brink of incredible opportunity for the city

We've been working 81/2 years for this," Kelly said, "and I can see the beginning of the future in Huntington Beach. In six to eight months we will see sticks and bricks.

After years of wrangling, city officials held a ceremony last month to mark the razing of the Security Pacific bank building to make room for an 850-space parking structure in the 200 block of Main Street, another redeveloment project.

SAN DIEGO (AP) — The wife of the USS Vincennes' captain who ordered the mistaken downing of an Iranian airliner in July narrowly escaped injury Friday when a fiery pipe bomb blast destroyed her van at a stop light.

Sharon Rogers, 50, the wife of Capt. Will Rogers III, was driving to a teaching job at an unidentified school when the bomb went off at an intersection in the La Jolla area and fire quickly gutted the van.

A Justice Department source in Washington who spoke on condition of anonymity said investigators suspect the bombing was the work of terrorists. The FBI said it had not ruled anything

Rogers was in charge of the San Diego-based Vincennes in July when the cruiser, on duty in the Persian Gulf, mistakenly shot down a civilian Iran Air Airbus A300 carrying 290 people. Everyone aboard was killed.

No one claimed responsibility for the bomb-

"We have no motive at this point in time certainly, we have no suspects, Tom Hughes, special agent in charge of the local FBI office, told a press conference. "We certainly do not rule out the potential retribution to Capt. Rogers for his . command in the Navy. But on the same token this could have been perpetrated for some other reason unknown at this time.

WASHINGTON - Oliver North's former White House boss testified Friday that James A. Baker III suggested to then-President Reagan in 1984 he could be impeached for allowing solicitation of money from other countries for the Nicaraguan Contras.

The suggestion by Baker, then Reagan's chief of staff and now President Bush's secretary of state, "was strongly countered" by other top officials at a meeting with Reagan, with the conclusion that Baker was wrong, testified former National Security Adviser Robert McFarlane.

Still, Reagan said "we'll all be hanging by our thumbs" if word got out that McFarlane or other administration officials were indeed seeking help from abroad at a time that Congress had forbidden direct U.S. aid to the Contras, according to minutes of the meeting read into the court record

McFarlane, testifying at North's trial, said Reagan knew in 1984 that arrangements had been made to get \$1 million a month from Saudi Arabia for the the U.S.-backed rebels in Nicaragua.

# Bush names Cheney defense secretary

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush on Friday named Rep. Richard Cheney of Wyoming as defense secretary, moving with surprising speed to leave behind the controversy caused by John Tower's rejection by the

Bush said he would order the FBI to speed up its background checks to get the nomination moving. "Too much time has been wasted here." he said.

The president won a pledge of quick action from leaders of the Senate Armed Services Committee, who praised Cheney and said confirmation hearings would begin next week "I know of no impediment to his nomination," said

Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., the Armed Services chairman who led the successful battle to kill Tower's nomination. Cheney, 48, is a six-term conservative congressman who served as White House chief of staff during the Ford

administration. His selection was a surprise in view of his

relative lack of experience on defense issues.

Appearing with Bush at a hurriedly called news conference, Cheney said he had an "active interest" in defense matters but acknowledged that "obviously there are areas that I need to know and I'll have to work hard on

In naming Cheney, Bush picked the No. 2 man in the House GOP leadership, depleting his party's minority ranks there after a post-campaign pledge not to choose anyone from Capitol Hill for his Cabinet.

This is the exception that proves that rule," Bush said when asked about his earlier declaration.

And Cheney said "I did agonize" over leaving the Hill, where he has often said he enjoyed his work.

Bush, brushing aside the divisive battle over Tower. said, "That's history. That's done." However, Vice President Dan Quayle reignited the furor by accusing Democrats of engaging in "a McCarthyite mud-slinging campaign" against Tower and waging an "assault on the powers of the presidency



# Scotsman, German winners of 1989 Templeton Prize

NEW YORK (AP) - The Rev. George MacLeod, an innovative Scottish churchman, and West German physicist Carl Freidrich von Weizsaecker were named winners of the 1989 Templeton Prize for

The prize, amounting this year to \$435,000, is the world's biggest and is deliberately kept larger than Nobel prizes in the sciences and

MacLeod, 92. of Edinburgh, was chosen for his founding of the famed Iona Community, an ecumenical center of prayer, peacemaking and work that has influenced church life in many countries.

Weizsaecker, 76, of Munich, was named for initiating dialogue between the disciplines of science and religion and for research into links between physics, cosmology and theology

# Vatican official assails Planned Parenthood

VATICAN CITY (AP) - The Vatican's senior official on families Friday accused Planned Parenthood of "encouraging promiscuity" and criticized feminism in a speech to the U.S. Roman Catholic hierarchy.

Cardinal Edouard Gagnon, president of the Pontifical Council for the Family, applauded Catholics who fight against the Roe vs. Wade decision of the U.S. Supreme Court allowing abortion.

But he charged that in the United States some forms of ministry to divorced Catholics had "degenerated into dating services." He urged caution in granting annulments, saying want to keep abortion services safe their own way on matters like birth control the Catholic Church allows

In Chicago, the acting president of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, David J. Andrews, said Gagnon "is absolutely right" in suggesting that the group opposes the church's position on birth control.

Andrews said Gagnon's speech reflects "the desperation of a church trying to come to grips with the issue of sexuality and with the fact that people the world over rely on effective methods of birth control and

Gagnon spoke on the third day of an extraordinary four-day meeting on 52 million-member Catholic Church in the United States. Pope John Paul II summoned 35 American prelates to the Vatican to discuss how bishops should defend Catholic teaching in the face of dissent and

While Gagnon's speech repeated well-known Vatican positions on sexual issues, it was strongly worded and unusually specific, reflecting the church's concern about the high number of American Catholics going control and divorce. Gagnon told the prelates that

Planned Parenthood was challenging the Vatican's ban on artificial contraception by trying to set up schoolbased birth control clinics. "Planned Parenthood programs of

sex education in no way resolve the problem of teen-age pregnancies but rather increase it by encouraging promiscuity," he said, according to a text of his speech that was released by the Vatican.

The Canadian cardinal also accused Planned Parenthood of trying to undermine the only form of birth







# Charges at Red Cross service clubs in WWII tarnished image

Cross volunteer. I was delighted to have someone bring to my attention a column you wrote in 1976.

If you could print the column again, it might shed some light on an issue that is still on the minds of many World War II veterans who resented paying for coffee and doughnuts at Red Cross Service Clubs. E.K. HOMOSASSA, FLA

DEAR E.K.: I'm happy to rerun the 1976 column for those who have come aboard since it first appeared, and for readers who have asked to see it

The lesson to be learned is this: Before you condemn, consider the possibility that you don't know the whole story. Here it is:

DEAR ANN LANDERS: I was irritated by your kinds words for the American Red Cross. As a veteran of World War II who served overseas for three years. I'd like you to know that the organization you praised was no favorite of the men and women in uniform. We had to pay the Red Cross for coffee, doughnuts, meals and overnight lodging while the Salvation Army supplied coffee, doughnuts and meals free. So please, Ann, don't be so generous with your bouquets. Toss them only to the worthy and preserve your credibility.

DEAR JOE: A blizzard of letters similar to yours hit my desk after



that column appeared. I wrote to the top officials of the American Red Cross for an explanation and received. an eye-popping response. It was documented by a copy of a letter dated March 28, 1942, from Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson to Norman H. Davis, chairman of the American Red Cross. Here's the inside story. Pretty it is not.

All English and Australian men in uniform had to pay for all off-base food and lodging because voluntary giving (which is characteristic of the nited States) is not the pattern in other countries.

The Red Cross, which has never accepted a dime from the U.S. government (and to this day relies totally on voluntary contributions), was asked to establish club facilities for U.S. servicemen overseas where troops from all Allied forces would be welcome. The Salvation Army did NOT have this responsibility.

The British High Command then made an official request that U.S.

servicemen be required to pay for whatever they received, just as their men had to pay in English service clubs. The Red Cross was adamantly opposed to this and protested vehemently. They lost the fight, however, when a request came from Secretary Stimson. His letter was tantamount to a command.

Allegations have persisted since World War II that the Red Cross made a profit overseas. Nothing could be further from the truth. The clubs operated at a loss and represented a heavy financial burden to the Red Cross. Moreover, the public image of the Red Cross was badly tarnished when it was forced by Stimson to go along with the British High Command.

How unfair that this splendid organization has had to take the rap for a decision made by the United States Army. Today, 35 years later, the truth is known by only a few.

# Volunteer talent is key to pageant

When the lights go up Friday on opening night of the Crystal Ca-thedral's "Glory of Easter Pageant" they will be illuminating more than the bigness — the downright Broad-wayness — of Robert Schuller's annual passion play.

Besides the goats, sheep, horses, pigs and tiger named Sara, besides the pyrotechnics and professional actors, the lights will also be shining on the hundreds of bit players who donate thousands of hours each year to the

Two such actors are Al and Lisa Zultz of Costa Mesa, a fatherdaughter team and members of the Reformed Church of America and Crystal Cathedral since 1979. Twenty-one year old Lisa has been participating in the Christmas play since 1981, her father joined the annual cast in 1983.

As if the rigors of the Christmas pageant - which can include as many as 90 performances plus rehearsals - weren't enough, when the Easter production was created in 1983 the Zultz's signed up.

"I feel like they (cast members) are a family," the younger Zultz said recently, "and besides, I love performing. It's really fun to be up there on stage. I love the spotlight.

"And, of course," her father said, "(we perform) for the message we convey

At 66 years old, a retired navigator for the Air Force's Strategic Air Command currently working for McDonald Douglas, Zultz is less interested in the footlights than his daughter.

He donates his time to the Easter production, including three weeks of rehearsals and 31 performances this

In a brief written ruling, Superior ourt Judge Billy Mills said the language of the release the screenwriters signed when they submitted their work to Reeve's agent is ambiguous.

Taff's and Stoller's attorney, Gerald Kroll, called the decision "a major victory." He said the main defense put forth by Reeve's attorneys and the basis for a \$500,000

cross-complaint was that his clients' lawsuit was barred by the release.

In court papers, the screenwriters claim they submitted a story treatment for "Superman: The Confrontation" in August 1985 to Reeve's agent Rick Nicita. The plaintiffs claim they signed a release after Nicita told them he would not read their material unless they did so.

They also mailed a copy to Reeve. his secretary and Warner Bros. The release, on its face, does not

authorize theft of the plaintiffs' intellectual property." Kroll wrote in support of their petition.

Plaintiffs' clear intent, from the face of the release, was merely the usual promise among people in the industry not to sue Mr. Nicita if it turned out that (similar) ideas had already been under consideration from another source." he said.

# Wrigley's rooftop rooters club opposed by Cubs, neighborhood

CHICAGO — Rooftop rooters are a Chicago Cub tradition, but the team and the neighborhood are up in arms over a proposed private club atop a building across from Wrigley Field that would sell seats for baseball games.

"They are clearly stealing our product," Cubs president Donald Grenesko said.

We strenuously object to it. If they can do it, then the people next door can do it, and the people next door to them and the people next door to them," he told the Chicago Sun-Times in an interview published Friday. Grenesko was attending a league meeting in Fort

But Mike Quigley, vice president of the community group that battled unsuccesfully to block night baseball at Wrigley Field, said his group will joining the team's fight

"We feel the neighborhood is already past the saturation point in ability to deal with parking and traffic and liquor-related problems in association with the ballpark," said Quigley, speaking for Citizens United for Baseball in Sunshine.

The last thing we need is 30 or 40 private clubs just adding to that," he said.

The neighborhood around Wrigley Field is a close-packed, mostly residential area on the North Side. Cubs fans are known to relax in lawn chairs with a

beer and a television set on other rooftops to watch Cubs games. But members of the planned rooftop club would have to pay for their seats, which could compete with the Cubs' 65 new skyboxes already sold out for this season at prices ranging from \$45,000 to \$65,000.



# Wrigley's rooftop rooters club opposed by Cubs, neighborhood

CHICAGO — Rooftop rooters are a Chicago Cub tradition, but the team and the neighborhood are up in arms over a proposed

private club atop a building across from
Wrigley Field that would sell seats for baseball games.
"They are clearly stealing our product," Cubs
president Donald Grenesko said.

We strenuously object to it. If they can do it, then the people next door can do it, and the people next door to them and the people next door to them," he told the Chicago Sun-Times in an interview published Friday. Grenesko was attending a league meeting in Fort

But Mike Quigley, vice president of the community group that battled unsuccesfully to block night baseball at Wrigley Field, said his group will joining the team's fight

"We feel the neighborhood is already past the saturation point in ability to deal with parking and traffic and liquor-related problems in association with the ballpark," said Quigley, speaking for Citizens United for Pacchall in Sunching Baseball in Sunshine.

"The last thing we need is 30 or 40 private clubs just adding to that," he said.

The neighborhood around Wrigley Field is a close-packed, mostly residential area on the North Side. Cubs fans are known to relax in lawn chairs with a beer and a television set on other rooftops to watch Cubs games. But members of the planned rooftop club would have to pay for their seats, which could compete with the Cubs' 65 new skyboxes already sold out for this season at prices ranging from \$45,000 to \$65,000.

Maryland tried a new game plan in its fight for survival in the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament, and the result was the rarest victory in the league's 36 years of postseason play.

John Johnson scored 17 of his 23 points in the second half as Maryland climbed from the bottom of the ACC standings for a 71-49 victory over 17th-ranked and top-seeded North Carolina State in the opening game in

"Everybody knows State is very impatient. They like to run the basketball down your throat," John-son said, "We just tried to cut the

game in half." Never in the history of the tournament had an eighth-seeded team beaten the first-place team. But the Terrapins, who won just one of 14 conference games, raised their record to 9-19 and advanced to today's semifinals to face North Carolina.

The Wolfpack dropped to 20-8. "They just beat us in every phase, every aspect of the game," Wolfpack Coach Jim Valvano said. "As far as I'm concerned, it was a nightmare on Peachtree.

North Carolina 77, Georgia Tech 62: J.R. Reid scored 17 points to lead five North Carolina scorers in double figures as the No. 9 Tar Heels dominated Georgia Tech, 20-11. The Tar Heels, 25-7, seeded fourth after finishing tied for second during the regular ACC season, led 39-25 at the

Duke 88, Wake Forest 64: Danny Ferry scored 24 points as seventh-ranked Duke, 23-6, hit its first eight shots and raced away to the victory over Wake Forest, 13-15, which got got 19 points from Tom Greis and 15 31 points from freshman Chris King.

The new system also offers incentives to participants, Caillouette noted: "Purchasers who take part are automatically entered in a luxury cruise vacation sweepstakes, while sales/marketing managers receive a summary report of buyers' rat-

### ay care is not against project's CC&Rs

By Jasper and Amey Hempel

Q: We live in a planned unit development and have strict Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions covering the property. The CC&Rs are quite clear that an owner may not run a business out of his or her home.

Recently one of our neighbors in the development seems to have started a day-care center in her home. This creates a traffic problem and seems to be just the thing the CC&Rs were meant to prohibit. It seems to me there probably is a zoning ordinance making this illegal, too. What can we do?

— C.R., Citrus Heights

A: In 1984, the Legislature enacted the California Child Day Care Act. One type of day-care facility covered is called a "family day care home," defined as a home that regularly provides care of 12 or fewer children in the provider's own home for periods of less than 24 hours per day, while the parents are away. Another section states that it is the public policy of the state to provide home settings for day

In accordance with the importance placed upon this type of care by the Legislature, the law declares that any covenant, condition or restriction placed upon property which directly or indirectly restricts the right to have a "family day care home" is void and unenforceable.

In addition, the act makes it clear that any zoning ordinance restricting such day care would also be void.

ş

As long as your neighbor fits the

criteria for operating such a day care home, your CC&Rs and any zoning ordinance would be unenforceable. If you believe that there is an associated parking or traffic hazard, however, you should speak directly with your neighbor and work out whatever compromises are necessary to ensure the safety of the children and the comfort of the residents.

Q: We are a retired couple in our mid-60s and have often seen unfairness to the offspring of a deceased spouse when the survivor has remarried. The new spouse wants his or her own "nest," and the family home has been sold. The couple has then bought a new home, and the property is put in joint tenancy, thus eliminating the inheritance a spouse had intended for his or her children and grandchildren.

How can this be prevented?

M. H., Sacramento A: For assistance in answering your question, we spoke with Gary Perry, partner in the law firm of Boutin, Lassner, Gibson, Perry and Delehant, who practices estate planning and tax law. Perry told us that the problem is partly, although not totally, preven-

First, the original husband and wife should not hold their property as joint tenants, but rather hold it as community property. Both spouses should have wills naming as the beneficiary a trust called a bypass trust. The surviving spouse would then own one-half of the property and the trust would own the other half. The trust provides that upon the death of the surviving spouse, the

half remaining in trust is distributed to the children or other beneficiaries.

With substantial property involved, both spouses would put their property into a living trust to avoid probate, but the principles are similar.

If the surviving spouse remarries, and the trust is properly drawn, he or she would have no power to put the half of the property owned by the trust in joint tenancy with the new husband or wife. The surviving spouse, however, has been the owner of one-half of the property all along and is free to dispose of that half however he or she pleases.

In the situations you have witnessed, if we assume that the surviving spouse understands the consequences of having property in joint tenancy, there

has been a decision by the surviving spouse not to make provision for the children to inherit any of the house. Sometimes loyalty to the wishes of a deceased spouse is overridden by the desire of the survivor to provide for the needs of the new spouse. And sometimes people just think they will live

Perry emphasized, and we agree, that every situation is different, and that a person concerned with protect-ing the interests of children from the possibility that the surviving spouse will not dispose of the property in accordance with his or her wishes should consult with an attorney for guidance in that particular situation.

### Relocation is a part of American heritage

Ever since Conestoga wagons moved along the Oregon Trail, Americans have realized that relocating is often the key to upward personal and professional growth.

A recent survey of major corpor-ations by Merrill Lynch Realty's Re-location Management Division shows that a typical major U.S. corporation relocates nearly 200 people annually. Moving isn't easy for most people. It can cause financial and emotional strain that hinders personal rela-tionships and professional productivity. In response to this, a large number of companies have implemented relocation programs to help their employees settle into the new location and remain productive

throughout the move. Most companies are aware of today's real estate challenges and, therefore, offer to help employees self their former homes and find new ones. This assistance can include reimbursing the employee for many of the homeselling expenses, buying the employee's home for resale or hiring an outside relocation firm or bank to buy the old home.

When an employer hires an outside relocation firm, a great deal of the home selling pressure is taken off of an employee's shoulders. For example, some relocation firms will assign the employee personal move consultants. These professionals help coordinate all spects of the move — from appraising the old home to finding a new one. The employee can be as active in the home lling process as he or she would like and, at the same time, be free to concentrate on other things.

Some companies also provide additional reimbursements that help to make a transfer more welcome. These

Loss protection programs to provide reimbursement for loss on the sale of a home where the market has dropped since the employee's

Cost-of-living allowance to assist those relocating to higher-cost areas.
 Tax-adder payments to "make the employee whole" for any additional taxes levied upon the relocation-

related payments that are considered compensation to the employee.

 Mortgage buydown programs to offer mortgage loans with interest rates below current market interest rates. This lowers the monthly mortgage payments for a few years and sometimes even for the entire term. A mortgage buydown is particularly useful for an employee transferring to an area where housing prices are higher than an employee's current residence, and where the employee will need to qualify for a larger mortgage just to maintain his or her previous standard

Ensuring a successful move is in the company's best interest as much as the employee's. Companies make a sizable investment whenever they relocate an employee: A typical transfer of a homeowner family can cost a company more than \$35,000.

Today more than ever, American families are supported by two careeroriented salary earners. If a poorly planned relocation results in an unemployed or underemployed spouse, the stress at home usually affects your performance on the job. As a result, many companies help "trailing" spouses search for jobs as part of their relocation services. Dual-career couples considering a move to another city should find out exactly what assistance the transferring employer will provide. Although many relocation packages are standardized, most companies leave room for negotiation. When you negotiate a proposed transfer with your employer, remember to ask about a spouse career planning and assistance program.

A comprehensive spouse-assistance package might include re-sume counseling, training in interview techniques and organizing a full-scale job search.

### Research defines what consumers want in 1990

What features will the trend-setting houses of the 1990s have in common? And what should consumers look for in a new house, so it will be livable and marketable throughout the 1990s?

Those are the questions asked of the top architects and home designers by the editors of House Plans, a new quarterly publication that makes available to consumers 200 model home designs used by the nation's top builders.

As a result of the research, House Plans has identified 12 trend-setting design features that will be seen widely in the best houses of the next decade. According to the publication's editors, designers are combining traditional styles of homes with bold, new looks in exterior and exterior space. Attention to details will distinguish the homes of the 1990s, including stylish entryways, dramatic window treatments and increased use of skilled brickwork and gabled roofs. But those are just a few of the dominant trends in home design, according to the publication's publisher, David Link.

"In home design, we're seeing fascinating trends. Homebuyers aren't abandoning traditional styles but they do want imaginative use of space, top quality, value, and special design features that distinguish a home and make it unique," Link said. According to Link, it's important for consumers who intend to buy or build their home to recognize the emerging trends. "People should be cognizant ofthe kinds of design features that will be prevalent in the 1990s, so their new home's appeal and liveability will endure," he said. "We're seeing many of these features on the best model homes today.

House Plans features plans that builders are using to produce some of the country's best model homes, ranging in size from 1,500 to 5,000 square feet. The publication identifies 12 trends that will distinguish homes of the next decade:

\*Bold, geometric exterior architecture, particularly in the west and southwest. The eye-catching facades will be accented by deeply-recessed windows and niches and deep shadow lines. Other elements: Bold color accents and crisp, balanced exteriors.

 An emphasis on regional traditionalism is another decided trend, from Florida "crackers" to Ohio farm styles, Colonials, Federals and Georgians. Classic details and forms will be employed, along with adroit use of brick, shutters, hand-crafted touches, dormers, gabled roofs. There's also a move to neo-traditional designs — eclectic mixes of contemporary and traditional styles.

 Exciting use of space, creating the impression of spaciousness, with both Cathedral ceilings and raised flat ceilings. Other space-related features include clerestory windows, interior bridges and balconies, stair elements and plant ledges to emphasize height. Coffered and detailed ceilings, also.

•"Power" master suites, meaning that bathrooms and master suites will become larger and nicer. These rooms, in effect, are becoming "retreats" within a house and space is being created for them from hallways and secondary bedrooms. More plans will have the master suite downstairs and the other bedrooms upstairs.

Trend to open interiors, with openness achieved by use of angles and long sight lines. More creative naming of rooms (such as gathering rooms" and "play rooms" will become common)

•The garage will be de-emphasized. In the 1990s, garages won't disappear, but they will be less obtrusive. Some plans will move the living area forward to counterbalance the garage, others will use various techniques to soften the impact. Look for more three-bay garages.

\*Better indoor/outdoor relationships, with design features in effect blending the outside and inside environments. This is achieved with the use of bigger windows, verandas, screened porches, pools and abundant landscaping.

 Expanded opportunities for outdoor living with more homes having verandas, pools, porches, recreation areas as standard features.

•Impressive entries that will give a distinctive first-impression impact to houses. Seen more frequently will be entry courtyards, covered walks, gateways or arches before the front door. Curb appeal will be extremely important.

\*Interior "sculpting," which means architecturally-detailed interiors with such features as plant shelves, wall niches for art work, angled walls, rounded corners and radius walls, pillars, arches, and sculpted or dramatic ceilings.

 Dramatic window treatments will play an important role in making interiors seem more open. New houses

will have multiple window arrangements and a variety of window shapes.

•More higher-density, detached housing, including cluster housing and other variations of the zero-lot-line concept. Designers will make better use of the wide-and-shallow lot concept, reducing the depth to add space to the streetscape.

"All of these trends mean that

consumers will be spending more time and more money on the features that make their homes unique to them," Link said. "Additionally, changing lifestyles—the desire to get outdoors, the desire for large, useful gathering areas within a home—will bring about other changes in homes. It's going to be an exciting, challenging decade ahead in home design."






