Old boats find new life

hey bob slowly on the ripples of boat wakes, sometimes listing ever so slightly on the chains of their rusty moorings.

They're boats that were once snug and tidy, clean and cheerful. They're boats that once wore fresh coats of paint and highly polished wood.

paint and highly polished wood.

Now they're forgotten, all but abandoned. Day after day, they float dormant in the harbor currents, slowly growing more decrepit. Eventually, as their hulls warp and collect layers of bird droppings, they deteriorate from objects of desire into objects of contempt and complaint.

But when Carlos Lopez looks at

the derelict vessels rotting in the sun, his eyes light up.

He looks beyond the warped, leaky wood and the rusted metal, and he sees potential. Lopez has a knack for detecting potential, even in the most unlikely places.

He's embarked on a program to

pluck some of Newport's mangiest, least-wanted boats out of the harbor and transport them to a community center he's been running on the shores of Lake Elsinore since 1998.

There, Lopez performs some modest cleanup work on the boats, slaps a little paint on them and anchors them to the ground.

The boats that were once floating eyesores become something else: a playground serving as an inland armada for the children who act as sailors. For the kids from churches and nonprofit groups who come to the community center, it's a lot more interesting than a jungle gym.

"Lake Elsinore is a very poor community," Lopez said. "It's good for



mid a spontaneous burst of applause from the hundreds of graduating seniors, Sonja William tearfully accepted the high school diploma that her son, Andre Stewart, had worked so hard to earn.

Although a tragic accident on the Pomona Freeway in May took the life of Newport Harbor High School's star running back, all who knew him said he would never be forgotten.

Last month, thousands flooded the very same field on which Wednesday's commencement was held to honor and remember Stewart. School officials invited the family to participate in the ceremony to

honor Stewart's memory and the accomplishments of his shortened life.

For his family, and especially his mother, it was important that they finish what he had started.

Greenlight would get out the vote, study says

■ Analyst says six of the city's 46 areas are built out; if passed, initiative would trigger many elections.

NEWPORT BEACH — As many as 18 projects, from the expansion of Fashion Island to a zone change on a four-unit residence, would have required citywide votes if the Greenlight initiative were in effect, a city study found.

The results mirror those gathered by Allan Beek, one of the measure's proponents, in an informal survey last year.

"It provided factual information in terms of what the current impacts are," said City Manager Homer Bludau. "I thought it did what we wanted it to do."

The city study, conducted by former employee John Douglas, concluded that six of the city's 46 areas have been built to capacity and therefore every new project in those areas would require a vote. Those areas are Newport Center, Pacific View, North Ford, Old Newport Boulevard, Bonita Canyon and the airport area. These areas reached their growth limit between 1994 and 1999 and, should Greenlight be approved, almost any proposal would trigger a citywide

Because of the dramatic effects the proposed slow-growth measure could have on the city and local government, in February the City Council decided to pay \$11,500 to an outside analyst for the study.

Set to appear on the fall ballot, the Greenlight measure proposes to allow voters the final say on certain "major" developments. Prior to the study, neither city officials nor the measure's proponents had been able to effectively outline the potential ramifications of the measure.

Teacher salary negotiations to continue into summer

NEWPORT-MESA — Teachers' ongoing salary negotiations with the school district have been put on hold this week while their young charges graduate and finish out the school year, but the discussions are by no means over. Although they did not reach an agreement by Friday as anticipated, both parties said they have made some headway.

some headway.

"Things are by no means done and by no means at a standstill," said Mike Fine, assistant superintendent in charge of finances. "There is

a lot of good discussion and there are a lot of positive things on the table."

While teachers would have liked to resolve the issues before school let out for the summer, they are optimistic an agreement can be reached before school begins again in the fall.

Since the board has committed to making salary increases a priority, teachers have decided first to tackle two side issues — money for new teachers, and money for a peer assistance and review program — said Linda Mook,

Always looking for a silver lining

Restoring faded glory.

ANTIQUE FREAK

Silversmith Sam Kutz has a fascination with all things old.

"I comb garage sales for something interesting," Kutz said.

His shop, a corrugated tin igloo-like structure on West 17th Street in Costa Mesa, is a museum of restored bicycles, transistor radios, antique silver vases, Lenny Bruce posters and a pinball machine.

Even his table saw, fans, engraving tools and stools have deco curves and a dull, metallic sheen sought after by astute collectors.

Kutz - 43 years old with jet-black, spit-curled hair, a tattoo on his arm and a barrel chest - looks a bit like a World War II hero from a 1950s movie.

SHIMMERING STUDENT

Kutz started polishing silverware and plates at his father's shop when he was 16. "You have to pay your dues before you ever touch solder," he said.

When Kutz was 19, he joined the Marine Corps. When he returned, his father owned a silver shop in Laguna Beach and he continued his apprenticeship, learning how to engrave, solder and sculpt silver.

But instead of continuing in the trade, Kutz took a brief hiatus, touring the comedy club circuit. But he realized it was time to stay put after the birth of his daughter, Brittany, who is now 11. He once again became a silversmith, making jewelry and repairing antiques.

In 1998, Kutz moved into what he calls the "tin can," the first shop of his

Kutz said no job - fixing parts of garbage disposals, polishing candle holders, flattening knives — is too mundane for him. Those projects pay relatively well compared to the amount of time they take to complete.

This frees up time for Kutz's paintings, his true passion. He is working on a painting of an alien woman riding a flying saucer in the style of World War II aviation nose art.

A TEST OF HIS METAL

"To be good at this, you have to have a steady hand, good hammering tech-nique and a good eye for symmetry," he said, pointing to a silver vase that he recently restored. Each intricate etching, each groove in the metal, each rim, looked precisely like its invert.

Kutz's three years of apprenticeship trained him to use the table saws, etching tools and soldering irons needed to do his jobs. The additional 15 years taught him the importance of being as flexible as molten metal.

"Each job has its own set of problems," he said. "You have to adapt by learning from yourself."

For instance, what tools does a silversmith use to repair a match safe? For that matter, what exactly is a match safe? A Newport Beach doctor, claiming to

have the second largest collection of the antique silver match holders, asked for Kutz to help polish and restore them.

"You can't go to The Home Depot and buy match safe tools," said Kutz, who instead made his own.

SILVER DYNASTY

Kutz hopes to one day pass the shop onto Brittany or his 4-year-old son, Sammy J.

"I have dreams for this to become something lasting, but I won't pressure them," he said. "There really aren't too many silversmiths left. But it's a trade everyone should know is still around."

Mentoring proves beneficial for students—and adults

wo Fridays ago, I attended a box lunch at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church that was equally divided between enthusiastic Newport Harbor High School juniors and assorted adult professionals who live in this school dis-

I was there pretty much on a pass. Most of the adults had served during the past school year as mentors of the students attending the lunch. I'd been at it for only two months.

The occasion was the third annual Mentor Thank You Luncheon for the Newport Harbor High School Da Vinci Academy — so named because Da Vinci was a man for all seasons who integrated a whole spectrum of passionate interests into his creative life. And from the testimonies I heard at lunch that day, Da Vinci is alive and well at Newport Harbor.

There was, for example, student Rob Robinson, who was "feeling lost" at the beginning of the school year and even thinking about dropping out when he met his mentor, actor Mike Villani.

"For the first time, I was able to talk with someone who was doing what I want to do," said Robinson. "He not only helped me with my passion, but to become a better person, too. I owe him the world because he helped me lose my fear and my troubles.

To which Villani added that in a family of a wife and three daughters, he had

acquired a son - and a chance to "do the guy

An impressive number of similar comments were offered up as Newport Harbor history teacher Joe Robinson worked the room with a portable microphone. Student Melissa Scharfe will be campaigning this fall for her mentor, Superior Court Judge Sheila Fell, who "took me into her chambers and taught me so much about our justice system and our political system,

I got involved in this program when its dynamic director, Mary Anne Robinson, called and asked if I would take over the mentoring of a student named Tom Peter, whose passion was writing and whose original mentor had to bow out. I said I would, and did.

Tom and I had a limited time together, but I think we both learned from the experience. Tom has some excellent writing skills, especially in the area of satire, which the Newport Harbor newspaper would do well to

make use of next year - a year in which Tom and I are going to get better acquainted.

After this brief - and highly positive — brush with mentoring, I needed to know how this program works. Mary Robinson whose efficiency and enthusiasm spill all over it complied happily.

Mentoring, she explained, is the junior year focus of a four-year academy program for which students sign up at the start of their freshman year. The Da Vinci Academy, created in 1995, was the first on the Harbor campus. A second followed in 1996, two more a year later and the final two will be launched next September.

Then, nearly threefourths of Newport Harbor's incoming freshmen will likely be enrolled in a fouryear academy - each with a different focus, but all embracing the mentoring program during the junior year.

The academy idea came out of Sacramento about a dozen years ago as an effort to make the public school experience more meaningful. Interested public school administrators can apply for a grant to start such a program in which its enrollees share the same teachers and focus the first year on the integration of their chosen group of subjects (for Da Vinci, it is science, math, history and English). The second year, students focus on a single large group project illustrating that integration; the third year on relating to and drawing from a professional mentor; and the fourth year on pursuing their college entrance requirements.

The program was started at Newport Harbor when then-principal Bonnie Maspero wrote a successful grant application six years

It is neither focused on nor restricted to students who are high achievers or come from homes with a strong parental educational background and support. Directors of the program work with teachers and administrators in elementary and junior high schools to identify at-risk students with promise who often need to learn the discipline required to make mentoring work.

One such student was Juan Gonzales, who didn't show up at the mentors' luncheon, then phoned his mentor — inventor-engineer Jack Heiser - two days later to apologize. He followed up with an appearance at the Heiser home with his mother and a tray of homemade enchiladas.

Since then, wrote Heiser to Mary Robinson, "Juan has visited my office and I've been to one of his soccer games and watched his AP physics paper boat trials. ... Juan is a great kid and has given me insight on some of the unfortunate divisions between the haves and have-nots at Harbor and many interesting fac-

toids about Latino culture. We've had long discussions about college, and I have encouraged him to seek opportunities outside the area.

One of the student requirements is to write a brief summation of their mentoring experience. Browsing through a pile of this year's entries, I was astonished at the almost universal enthusiasm expressed by the students.

One example will illustrate: Student Jenna Booth wrote of her mentor, pediatrician Cara Todd, "I have always been interested in becoming a doctor, and I thought that this program would be a way for me to see what it was really like. That was only the tip of the iceberg. I learned so much more. For the first time in my life, I was actually in full contact with an adult who was not a teacher, employer or family friend. I was friends with an adult, and a really cool one at that. This has been the most educational thing I have ever done.

I hope Tom Peter will feel that way at the end of next year. Because he was shortchanged last year, we're going to stretch the rules a little and carry his mentoring into his senior year. Then maybe I will have earned the oversized engraved paper clip given to each of the mentors at the Thank You lunch.

BRIEFLY IN THE NEWS Local ticketing company folds

A Costa Mesa-based ticketing company that competed with the giants of the industry announced Wednesday that it will cease business and turn over its accounts to Ticketmaster, the biggest of its rivals.

The president of ETM Entertainment Network Inc., Peter Schniedermeier, said the company had simply run out of money.

'It's an expensive business to be in," Schnieder-meier said. "There's a lot of infrastructure costs."

ETM's clients, including the Los Angeles Dodgers and the San Diego Sports Arena, will be transferred to Ticketmaster, the USA Networks company that dominates the ticketing industry.

In addition to the high cost of doing business in the industry, Schniedermeier cited a \$15-million lawsuit in 1999 as a factor in the company's financial hard times.

A former employee successfully sued the company for what he considered to be misappropriation of ticketing-related technology that he had developed. Schniedermeier said the size of the award was a blow to the company.

"That pretty much took the wind out of the corporate sails," he said. "It was tough to recover from that.

Police issue warning about look-alike guns

■ Pellet guns that look like automatic pistols seem to be a new trend among Newport-Mesa teens, authorities say.

COSTA MESA — Police offi-cers who responded to a 911 call last week were startled when a teen reached, underneath his shirt and pulled out awhat looked like an automatic pistol.


The teen held the gun at his side, then put it down when authorities drew their weapons. It turned out that the boy's gun was a look-alike that fired pellets, not bullets.

Authorities searched the teen's car and found another pellet gun inside, said Costa Police Officer Jeff Gra-

Look-alike pellet guns are a growing trend among Newport-Mesa teenagers, police said. In the last few weeks, authorities have encountered several situations with these replicas and even confiscated some of them.

It is difficult to distinguish an actual automatic handgun loaded with lethal bullets from one of the replicas, which fire BBs or pellets.

On the streets, with only a

the dangers of them," said Gra-

ham. "Kids don't recognize it's such a serious situation.

Authorities, concerned that they will see more teens carrying the replicas during summer vacation, are turning to parents for help. Graham said the pellet guns should only be used in a supervised environment, such

as target shooting, and should not be fired in public.

Costa Mesa residents can legally carry pellet guns, but are not allowed to fire them within city limits. And police can arrest a person who threatens someone with a look-alike





Douglas was commissioned to study the more technical aspects of the measure and find out which proposals would potentially trigger citywide votes. The report is intended to help both residents and city officials decide whether the measure is beneficial for the city.

Although residents would get the final vote on proposals, the initiative's complex wording has made it difficult to discern precisely which projects would trigger such a vote.

According to the Greenlight initiative, a "major" development requiring a general plan amendment is defined as one that would create more than 100 peak-hour car trips, more than 100 homes or more than 40,000 square feet of floor area over what the city's general plan

The catch is that these thresholds do not apply to the city as a whole, but to each of the 46 distinct neighborhoods, which all have a different history of general plan amendments.

In addition, the measure is cumulative. It requires that 80% of projects that prompted changes to the general plan during the last decade be added to the proposed project to determine whether a vote is neces-

The only other study on the initiative was prepared by Greenlight proponent and former planning commissioner Beek. As in the city's study, Beek also found that six areas were already maxed out and one more is close to reaching that **GREENLIGHT STUDY**

in the past? No, I wasn't. Even though I'm a developer, I had a responsibility for the overall

good of the city."

When the Traffic Phasing Ordinance was first proposed more than two decades ago by a group of community activists, the Chamber of Commerce, Pacific Mutual Life Insurance Co. and the Irvine Co. staunch-

ly opposed the effort. The ordinance, which was eventually adopted, required developers to pay for road improvements to prevent traffic congestion.

Over the years, the chamber continued to oppose the ordinance and, as late as last April, supported what Greenlight members have

called the "gutting" of the law. In 1999, the City Council amended the ordinance to ensure the law would stand up to legal challenges following recent court decisions. The amendments balanced out the way costs were assigned to developers and lowered the number of City Council votes needed to override the changes.

Greenlight member Allan Beek said the chamber does not have residents' interests at heart and that this dramatic shift in support shows "how much those people really like the TPO."

In response to the weakening of the ordinance, some of the drafters of the original law came together and created the Greenlight initiative. The measure proposes to give voters the final say on certain major developments even if they've been approved by the Planning Commission and City Council.

But the Chamber of Commerce and many city officials fear that the measure, if passed, will put a moratorium on developments.

Earlier this year, the Irvine Co. and Pacific Life pulled their plans for Newport Center, citing the uncertainties created by the Greenlight

Going through the planning process is expensive and time-consuming, and should the Greenlight measure pass, the chamber fears that developers will simply take their proposals elsewhere. The problem with this, officials say, is that it could cut into Newport's funding for city services.

The Traffic Phasing Ordinance measure — which could appear alongside the Greenlight initiative on the November ballot - was created to both strengthen the existing law by making it part of the city charter, and to dismantle Greenlight.

Former mayors Turner and Tom Edwards drafted the initiative and say the measure can't be changed or "gutted" without a vote of the people.

"A bunch of people throughout the city called meetings and said 'let's talk

about this,' " Turner said. While Turner and Luehrs say the chamber is not sponsoring the measure, the business community is certainly a strong supporter.

From the chamber's perspective, while Greenlight threatens to halt development depending on voters, the Traffic Phasing Ordinance simply tacks on extra expenses to offset a development's effect on traffic.

Beek, however, insists that the entire creation of the Traffic Phasing Ordinance measure is a sham.

"It's just a cover-up and excuse to kill Greenlight," Beek said.

people to have a place to go for camping and that type of stuff."

As far as Newport Beach is concerned, said harbor inspector Wes Armand, Lopez is doing the city a favor.

A year and a half ago, he said, there were more than 20 boats in the harbor that appeared to be hopelessly unseaworthy. Since then, some have been restored, others have been destroyed and about half a dozen were given to Lopez. The harbor has grown cleaner as his fleet at Lake Elsinore has grown.

These are boats that peo-

ple wanted to get rid of," he said. "They became a liability. They weren't of a quality they wanted to maintain, but destroying a boat can cost \$5 or \$6,000. Lopez gets the boats for

free, but he pays to have them trucked inland. It's the kind of savvy, inventive approach to business he's been taking since he moved

here from Ecuador at the age

Back in 1965, when he came to America, Lopez was a dishwasher at the Balboa Bay Club. Through long years of work, however, he's become the owner of the Santa Ana electronics company Alphanetics, which

employs about 100 people. The community center at Lake Elsinore, he says, is just something he does to give kids a chance to play and use their creative powers.

They can climb aboard the deck of an old powerboat and pretend they're crossing the sea, or they can take the tiller of a sailboat and strain their eyes looking for mermaids and pirate ships.

The other day, Lopez was out in the harbor looking at a boat owned by Newport Beach resident Carter Ford. It was a 41-foot ChrisCraft, a once-gorgeous boat that was now a leaky, crusty mess.

Lopez' opinion? He thought it looked pretty good.

It might not have a whole lot of seaworthiness left in it, but to Lopez, it looked like an excellent vessel to navigate the oceans of a child's imagination.

Mesa Teachers Federation. The peer assistance and review program, which will replace an existing teacher mentor program, was proposed by Gov. Gray Davis during a special education session. If the teachers and

the district can settle on terms to apply for the state funds, it could bring nearly \$600,000 to Newport-Mesa.





Anything but uniform

Despite their matching caps and gowns, graduates of Newport-Mesa's Alternative Education Center celebrated their diversity.

The cake was cut in neat rectangles. Each piece had its own paper serving basket and was skewered, dead center, with a single plastic fork.

But if dessert at the Back Bay and Monte Vista High School graduation looked uniform Wednesday, the people munching on it were anything but.

The schools (both are under one roof) and the students who attend them are unconventional. Back Bay is considered a continuation program for students whose experiences in ordinary high schools haven't always been the best, and Monte Vista features independent study for kids whose lives are complex enough to require a flexible approach to education.

And in the brief, spirited ceremony that marked their graduation, the students' enthusiasm for the idiosyncratic and unconventional was evident.

In front of an overflowing crowd of parents, friends and supporters, a few students were recognized for their

extraordinary achievements. But one of them, Monte Vista's Stephanie Skidmore, used her time on stage to raise a philosophical question. "What is success?" Skidmore asked the audience. "Is success to make the most money?"

She thought differently. "Success is to win the respect of intelligent people and to win the laughter of children," she determined. "It's to leave the world a bit better.

Many of Skidmore's classmates - judging by the skateboarding shoes that

poked out from beneath red graduation gowns and the spiky haircuts peeking out from under mortar boards had their own, somewhat inventive philosophies of life.

The willingness of the schools to tolerate and even encourage the diversity of students' approaches to learning, parents suggested, was essential to their success.

Teri Layman, mother of Back Bay grad Stephanie Womack, came outside the crowded auditorium toward the end of the graduation ceremonies. Sitting at a table covered in red construction paper and fringed with Mylar balloons, Womack discussed the changes Back Bay had made in her daughter's feelings about education. The school's flexibility, she thought, had made a big dif-

"It really gives young people a lot of hope," she said. The teachers here really try to meet the needs of the individual students.

Erick Maldonado, who

cruised through Monte Vista in only three years while taking computer courses at Orange Coast College, said the small class sizes and personal attention he received from teachers had made it

easier to get where he wanted to go.

"I plan to transfer to UC Berkeley for engineering," he said. "And then, if I've got anything left over afterward, I'm thinking about MIT.

As for Jesseca Mendoza, who had been homeschooled through one of Monte Vista's programs, she

was just happy to be done. "I've been waiting for this for four years," she said.





COSTA MESA - Thirty six students graduated from Orange Coast Middle College High School on June 8, and it was anything but the typical commencement.

It was short and intimate - even enjoyable.

The commencement took place in the Forum, an amphitheater-like building on campus. The cozy environment allowed friends and family to see their special graduates up

As students received their diplomas, a large screen behind them displayed their baby pictures and a brief statement each had written.







'Shaft' gets shafted; 'Fantasia' shows best of animation

'Shaft' is watchable. but not great

haft" is eminently watchable. It has all the ingredients of an action movie, and it has all the talent on the screen you could ask for.

Samuel L. Jackson in the title role gives his usual high-caliber performance, and the scenes between Wade (Christian Bale) and Peoples Hernandez (Jeffrey Wright) steal the movie.

Toni Collette as the key witness is supremely wellcast. Remember her in "Sixth Sense"? The rest of

the "Shaft" cast was equally strong in

porting roles. It is a good, although by no means original, plot.

John Shaft is the consummate policeman and defender of the law, and he has a long memory when it comes to bringing to justice the rich and spoiled playboy who admitted to murder.

Wade, the playboy and murderer, had fled the country when the judge allowed bail. When Wade returns from exile two years later, Shaft meets and arrests him at the airport. Again, the judge allows bail and so, enraged, Shaft quits the force by hurling his badge at the wall. Great scene.

Now the race is on to see who can be first to find the missing witness

Shaft's search attempt involves roughing up the

neighborhood toughs, an alliance with a former fellow police officer, a ploy to set Peoples' henchmen and Peoples against each other. All of these pursuits have some tense scenes.

"Shaft" is not a great movie. It is a reasonably entertaining albeit predictable piece of work that even Samuel L. Jackson and his excellent support staff could not quite slide from watchable to good.

Original score helps movie keep its cool

Tho is the man, that would risk his neck for his brother, man? Shaft - can ya dig it?"

Well, the song remains the same, as written by Isaac Hayes back in 1971 for the original "Shaft" movie. But the aura of Shaftness has been passed down from the first Shaft (portrayed by Richard Roundtree) to his nephew and namesake John



Shaft (Samuel L. Jackson). Jackson plays a streetwise and ultracool New York City police detective who's on the assault-turned-murder case, involving the killing of a black man by racist yuppy Walter Wade Jr. (Christian Bale, fresh from "American Psycho").

Wade, the son of a wealthy and politically connected real estate developer, literally thinks he can get away with murder and snidely dismisses Shaft as a minor annoyance in Wade's silver-spoon existence.

But he doesn't realize Shaft knows there was a witness to his crime, Diane Palmieri (Toni Collette), who disappeared from sight after

being threatened by Wade. Throw in the requisite element of crooked cops and Shaft busting a drug kingpin - in this case Peoples Hernandez (Jeffrey Wright of "Basquiat") — and you've pretty much got the entire plot of the film.

One missing element to the film is the sex, as in, there ain't none (at least none on screen, although it is implied).

Then there is the extended cameo by Richard Roundtree as "Uncle Shaft." Could someone get me some crackers and wine to go with this cheese? Puhleaze! Why the uncle/nephew thing?

Didn't anyone see the TV remake of "Kung Fu" a few years back, when they tried this shtick? It failed then too, Grasshopper. Why not just make an all new, updated "Shaft" and forget the '70s

good marks though. It retains the original Oscar-winning film score and has Jackson as the title character.

Like Jules in "Pulp Fiction," Jackson oozes dangerous cool in a role that could easily have been turned into a parody reminiscent of Keenan Ivory Wayans in "I'm Gonna Get You, Suc-

The funny thing about cool is you can say you're cool, and you can act like you're cool; but if you do either, chances are you probably aren't.

Jackson is Superfly. He is cool with a capital C (can ya dig it?).

"Who's the cat that won't cop out, when there's danger all about? Shaft - right on."

The other plus in this "Shaft" is that the bad guys Wade and Hemandez do work pretty well. However, as in a typical Anaheim Angels baseball season, they start out strong, then turn into pale shadows of their former selves by the end of the show



Widows yuck it up in new play

he Grim Reaper may be the sixth character in Ivan Menchell's offbeat comedy "The Cemetery Club," but for most of the show he's not all that grim.

In a play centering largely around death, its characters - three

enjoyable if uneven production at the Menorah Theater, a project of Costa Mesa's Jewish Community Center.

The humor, at least in the first act, is of the soft variety, eliciting gentle chuckles as the characters and situations are established. The second act, however, cuts loose with more substantial guffaws, particularly in the scene in which the three old gals arrive from a wedding reception, smashed to the gills.

Veteran director Terri Miller Schmidt stages the comedy with a tender, loving touch, overcoming the talkiness of its first act with extensive emphasis on the contrasting characters. One widow is a shameless flirt, another locks her feelings inside and the third totters on the edge, tentatively desiring another relation-

Of the three, Laurie Freed in the latter characterization is the most fully realized. Although a bit shaky in the opening scenes, Freed brings her role into sharp focus when a potential romance develops with a butcher who's also lost his mate. Her facial expressions convey her feelings in volumes during this period.

Ann Ross virtually steals the show as the man-chasing widow, boasting of her conquests with hedonistic glee. She is endowed with the play's funniest lines, and she fires them with abandon, particularly during the postwedding scene as she paces

the tipsy tipplers.

Less effective is Elizabeth Jaquay as the more reserved member of the trio. Jaquay's role allows for a minimum of showiness, and the critical scenes she does have are diluted by a lack of dramatic emphasis.

Tom Leary enacts the uneasy widower with a natural sense of reserve, rendering his halfhearted advances with a splendid aura of credibility. His uneasy relationship with Freed is especially

well presented.

The appearance of Marie Nussle in the second act spices the proceedings considerably. Nussle is a hoot as the flashy, gum-cracking "date" of Leary, whose presence unhinges the others, particularly Freed. It's a pity she wasn't written into the first act, which could use this sort of comic adren-

The conservative residential setting, also designed by director Schmidt, is well appointed and serves as a natural backdrop. The cemetery scenes, played downstage, effectively shift the location of the action.

"The Cemetery Club" may move at a funereal pace during its opening scenes, but its second act clips along at the pace of an Irish wake. It's a fine present for the Menorah Theater's 10th anniversary season.



Family love grows at one-of-a-kind Mama Rose

ood news! There's yet another little gem of a restaurant off the beaten path in Costa Mesa where it is worth stopping by and sharing the love.

Mama Rose, owned and operated by Elaine and Richard Lombardi at Wilson Avenue and Newport Boulevard, is a cucina Italiana that lives and cooks by the saying "to love good food is to love life."

Nothing goes into this restaurant that doesn't hold a special place in Elaine Lombardi's heart.

It is all about the love, styled not after cities or

Pining restaurants in Italy but after warm living rooms and

sitting rooms of Italian homes. The Rose Room is named after not only Richard's mother, Rose Lombardi, but the many bouquets of dried roses that hang from the ceiling and the rose wallpaper.

The New York room is perhaps the most glamorous, with red walls, gold wain-scoting and red and white striped wall paper below. Above, in the center of the ceiling is the very Italian painting of blue sky dotted with white clouds, plus angels watching over you. The candelabra that hang on the walls make this room truly romantic.

Then there is the beautiful little ladies-who-lunch-style room, the Piazza de Gertrude. It's named after Elaine's Polish mother, who gamely understood that the Italian restaurant needed to be named after an Italian mother.

And finally, there is the

wedding gallery, where family wedding photos — dating back two and three generations — adorn the wall. It is here you can meet Mama Rose Lombardi herself and pictures of the entire family she helped to create.

There is one seemingly random couple on the wall, who are not part of the Lombardi family but were engaged there and hold a special place in Elaine's heart.

One of the coolest, most up-to-date things about dining here is the sign out front that reads: No Cell Phones. Kind of sad that it even has to be said; but in true New York style, it is said here, and boldly.

I have said before that the bread served prior to dinner can define in a moment the caliber of restaurant. Mama Rose and her family must have known that because the melt-in-the-mouth, freshout-of-the-oven slices of bread, drizzled in fresh olive oil and herbs, ensure that this place will be a treat.

And then you are actually served a treat: a traditional palette cleanser from the region of Bari, Italy: a slice of orange, sprinkled with that same fresh olive oil and herbs. An unusual taste and quite delicious. We added to that by ordering roasted peppers (\$8), fire-roasted with grapes, pine nuts and caramelized garlic.

Know in advance that there is no shortage of roasted garlic at Mama Rose. Just be prepared.

I ordered the night's special, large prawns in a creamy crab sauce over bow tie pasta. This rich dish could have been shared by all four of us and we would have all been satisfied.

Instead, I tried to do the honors myself. Remember, it is all about the love.

Salmon piccata was another nightly special that I hope will be again. Husband Brian ordered the delicious chicken Gorgonzola (\$14), lightly breaded chicken, golden-fried and smothered in creamy Gorgonzola sauce, all served with tortellini. He is still at the gym.

My father ordered that Italian restaurant staple, chicken Parmesan (\$13), served with a generous side of rigatoni and marinara. Thankfully, he had enough to share. The only disappointment was the slightly soggy tomato basil risotto

(\$16) with chicken.

Several trips will have to be made to sample this family's recipes, from the escarole and beans with sweet sausage to the pork tenderloin and rib-eye steak. For those of you just in from the Jersey shore, sausage and peppers is served every night to take back your taste buds.

And to answer the burning food lover's questions, yes, there is wine. A solid list of rich and hearty Chiantis, cabernets and merlots.

Even the desserts are rich with family history. Their best seller, pistachio pie, was a favorite that Elaine Lombardi made with her daughter as a child and has been popular with the family — and customers — ever since. Traditional New York cheesecakes are also offered.



Housing need supersedes 'neighborhood character'

I've been reading with concern opinions published recently in the Daily Pilot that express the fear many have of losing so-called neighborhood identity.

Every Costa Mesa development whether it's on the East Side, in Mesa Verde or Home Ranch - is "too big." I chuckled when Mesa Verde residents claimed their neighborhood character would be destroyed by the proposed project when the area in question faces two huge apartment complexes on the south and west; a large commercial shopping center, including a bowling alley on the east; and Adams Avenue with the main post office, large physical fitness center and more on the north.

Excess traffic, congested parking and overcrowded schools are listed as legitimate concerns about each development. However, it seems to me a more pressing concern all of us should have as a community is: How are we going to provide housing for all who need it?

The shortage of housing in Southern California is listed as the most crucial in the country, and Orange County's need tops the list. We have a choice. We can take every opportunity to provide housing for our low- and moderateincome families, even if it calls for smaller yards, cookie-cutter houses (same as tract homes?) and parking problems.

Or we can ignore one of the most critical issues facing us as a society today.


The moratorium on building more than four units on a lot, even if it complies with existing zoning, is very sad. Some people want larger yards and gardens; some people just want to have a decent and safe place to live for their chil-

The projects being questioned will certainly not be low-income housing. But people moving into those homes would probably be moving up, and a ripple effect could provide homes for others moving up.

Those of us who got here first and have large lots and four-bedroom homes are the lucky ones. We should be willing to share those blessings by making room for others, even if it cramps our lifestyle a bit.

Treasure Island is privately owned land. The Dunes project site is statetied lands granted to the county and is under long-term lease. The entire project site lies within the coastal zone and is therefore under the jurisdiction of the state Coastal Commission.

The land-use designation of the project site contained in the certified landuse plan is "recreation and environmental open space."

The state Coastal Act states, in part: "lower cost visitor and recreational facility shall be protected, encouraged and, where feasible, provided. Developments providing recreational opportunities are preferred.'

An amendment to the certified landuse plan must be obtained from the Coastal Commission for the Dunes project's change of use. Anyone can obtain copies of the commission's communication through the city Planning Depart-




