

Irvine principal agrees to display mural

A controversial mural painted by students at Irvine High School will be permanently displayed in the school's Humanities Building as initially planned, Principal Gary Norton said Friday.

But the mural, entitled "One World, One People," will not adorn the central lobby of the building until several preliminary steps are taken, Norton explained.

The 47-foot-long mural first will go on public display for slightly more than two weeks beginning March 22 at the Orange County Hall of Administration. While it hangs in Santa Ana, faculty members will undergo a training program to focus on using the mural as a teaching tool in their classes, the principal said.

Teachers also will be encouraged to clarify the basic theme of the mural — that prejudice or inhumanity are not

acceptable — in their lectures and to foster sensitivity toward students who have opposed the mural's design, he said. Objections centered on hooded figures, presumably members of the Klu Klux Klan, shown torturing black figures.

Norton said the original intent of the mural, when created last summer, was for use as a curriculum tool. He said the strategy can still work.

"I think the whole thing can be a win for us if we direct it in

the proper direction," he said.

In airing his decision, Norton also released a tabulation of written comments solicited from students, faculty members and residents, who viewed the mural while it was on display in the school theater last week. According to the breakdown, 88 percent of the 1,155 viewers favored hanging the mural just as it is.

High school students were most in favor of seeing the mural on display, with 93

percent in support.

More than 45 percent of the students listed as a reason for their support that they agreed with the theme. Others liked it for artistic reasons, because the detractors had bad arguments or because they wanted to avoid censorship, according to the survey.

In contrast, the group that posted the most opposition to the display of the mural was the school faculty. Fifteen of 78 members, or 19 percent, were

against it. They said it was mis-directed, lacked sensitivity or they feared continuing problems.

Norton said many of the comments were so well-developed and sincere that he is considering compiling them in an anonymous form to serve as a teaching aid with the mural.

The comments, he added, helped him to realize that the outcry against the mural and the (See MURAL, Page A2)

McDonald bail cut to \$500,000

Felony counts on investment firm defendants upped from 19 to 35

Bail on financier Ralph W. McDonald was reduced from \$2 million to \$500,000 Friday while the number of felony charges against McDonald and a co-defendant jumped from 19 to 35 counts each.

In reducing bail against McDonald, the 41-year-old president of Golden Eagle Investment Co., South Orange County Municipal Court Judge David Carter sharply criticized him for failing to put up \$5

million in a trust fund to protect investors in his company.

Carter last week had made establishment of such a fund a condition for reconsideration of bail, which the judge had increased from \$250,000 to \$2 million.

"You have not performed," Carter told McDonald Friday, "and I'm going to tell you that right now. You have not done what you told me you could do — one bit."

It is believed that McDonald, a decorated Vietnam combat

veteran who lives in San Juan Capistrano, revealed to the judge on Feb. 17 the whereabouts of more than \$5 million in cash during a special closed hearing in his chambers.

Carter indicated Friday that he was now lowering bail because the prosecution had come up with new figures to show that less money than originally believed was unaccounted for in Golden Eagle's overall operations.

In a related development Friday, Carter ordered both defense and prosecution lawyers to work through the weekend examining about 200 bags of evidence seized in the Feb. 10 raid on Golden Eagle's offices.

The judge ordered the attorneys to check in with him every four hours to tell him their progress.

Carter ordered the weekend work because of complaints by defense attorney Paul Mast, a former judge, that he had not yet seen documents confiscated in the raid.

By law, the defense is entitled to see whatever documents the

prosecution has in its possession.

Deputy District Attorney Tom Buck said a "more thorough accounting" of records seized in the raid on Golden Eagle's offices Feb. 10 indicated that about \$2 million is still unaccounted for.

Last week, Buck had said that as much as \$8 million was missing.

That figure, he acknowledged Friday, was based on the rough calculations of an Internal Revenue Service agent who reviewed documents seized in the raid.

About \$850,000 in cash was confiscated by officers who took McDonald and David Biggins, a San Clemente resident, into custody.

Buck said new calculations show that about \$3.3 million in cash and receipts for property can be accounted for. It is also believed that about \$5.2 million in interest was paid out to investors and another \$1 million-plus is attributable to commissions paid to salesmen.

This leaves about \$2 million which cannot be traced as yet. Authorities believe Golden Eagle's total assets come to

Crystal Cove park review slated in SA

Members of the state Parks and Recreation Commission will review plans for development of Crystal Cove State Park March 12 in Santa Ana.

The commission meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m. in the Santa Ana City Hall annex auditorium, 23 Civic Center Plaza.

Plans call for picnic areas along a three-mile area between Corona del Mar and Laguna Beach and public access to beach areas.

Also slated for park development are hike-in campgrounds and an underwater park in the area off Crystal and Moro coves for divers. Most of the 2,751-acre park will be left in open space.

Reagan backs off on gas decontrol

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan, bowing to consumer and political pressures, has all but ruled out asking Congress this year for faster decontrol of natural gas prices despite the impassioned arguments of Energy Secretary James Edwards.

The decision could save customers billions of dollars, but consumer groups said Friday that "the war is hardly over."

Officially, White House deputy press secretary Larry Speakes said, "The president has not made a decision on natural gas deregulation — whether to accelerate it or not — and I would assume that it would be next week before he does make a decision."

However, administration sources, who asked not to be named, said they believed Reagan had decided to drop plans to submit a bill to Congress in the face of reluctance to take up the issue in an election year.

The decision came after Senate Majority Leader Howard Baker, R-Tenn., and House Republican Leader Robert Michel of Illinois met with Reagan Thursday to advise him against faster decontrol.

"We've got enough problems without dealing with that one," said Michel, who told reporters there was general agreement in

the meeting that no bill would be sent up.

Reagan since last July has been debating whether to go forward with the unanimous recommendation of his Cabinet Council on Natural Resources to ask Congress for a sharp speedup in the pace at which natural gas pricing is being decontrolled.

Edwards, who has been the main advocate for such a course, made what an aide called an "impassioned plea" for Reagan to push forward with the decontrol proposal at a Cabinet meeting late Thursday.

Under the decontrol law passed in 1978, prices on natural gas discovered since April 1977 are being gradually lifted until all controls are removed on Jan. 1, 1985. This "new gas" represents 60 percent of supplies.

Edwards and other supporters of faster decontrol say the plan leaves the price of "old gas," 40 percent of U.S. supplies, frozen forever.

Reagan's decontrol bill called for faster price hikes on new gas supplies and the inclusion of old gas in the decontrol timetable.

Consumer groups charged this would double homeowners' bills, forcing the 60 percent of the country which heats with natural gas to pay \$40 billion more.

Panel sets hearing on San Onofre appeal

A federal appeals panel will hold hearings on March 12 in San Diego to determine if a low-power test license for Unit 2 of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station should be suspended.

The U.S. Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board will hear the appeal from groups objecting to the issuance of the low-power permit for Southern California Edison Company's 1,100-megawatt reactor.

Edison Co. crews began fuel loading operations last week after the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission issued the permit.

Opponents of the \$3.3 billion nuclear generating station, three miles south of San Clemente, claim that seismic hazards in the area exceed plant design standards and that emergency evacuation plans for residents near the plant are inadequate.

The federal government's atomic safety and licensing board approved authorization for a low-power license on Jan. 11 following lengthy hearings throughout the summer in San Diego and Anaheim.

The appeal board, which has three members who are

administrative law judges, will hear oral arguments in the case beginning at 9 a.m. The hearing will be held in the San Diego County Administration Building, Room 310, 1600 Pacific Coast Highway.

The hearing is open to the public.

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Jurors ponder Williams case

ATLANTA (AP) — Jurors began deliberating murder charges against Wayne B. Williams on Friday after prosecutors reviled him as a "mad dog killer" and the defense begged them not to commit "the ultimate tragedy" of convicting an innocent man.

"You shall take this case and try to find the truth about it," Superior Court Judge Clarence Cooper told the jurors after lawyers completed their emotional final arguments.

Cooper turned the case over to the jury at 4:50 p.m., clearing the fourth-floor courtroom in the Fulton County courthouse for use as a deliberation room so the many exhibits would not have to be moved.

with the operation of Golden Eagle. The two men have pleaded innocent to the charges.

Evans, in court documents, said he gave McDonald the money in return for an unsecured promissory note.

"I was told by the sales agent soliciting my loan on behalf of Mr. McDonald and Golden Eagle Investment Co. that the loan proceeds would, in turn, be reinvested in high-yield business investments," Evans said.

It is alleged by prosecutors in the Orange County District Attorney's Office that McDonald, through Golden Eagle, was operating a high-stakes "Ponzi" scheme to cheat investors, who gave him in excess of \$11 million over a six-month period beginning last summer.

For their money, investors were told they would receive interest payments of between 10 percent and 30 percent per month. The investment funds were supposedly being used to provide short-term, high-interest loans to borrowers on commercial real estate ventures.

However, authorities allege that McDonald was not actually investing the money but instead paying off early investors with money obtained from later investors.

A court hearing on Evans' lawsuit is scheduled for April 7 in Orange County Superior Court.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Yet another safety-related design error, this one involving valves like those that failed in the Three Mile Island nuclear mishap, has been found in the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant, a federal official said Friday.

Money supply rises again after drop

NEW YORK (AP) — The nation's basic money supply rose in mid-February, the Federal Reserve Board reported Friday, leading analysts to predict interest rates would end a steep week-long slide and level off.

The Fed said a measure of funds readily available for spending, known as M1, rose \$1.2 billion in the week ended Feb. 17, to a seasonally adjusted \$447.7 billion. The previous week's \$3.1 billion decline was revised to a \$2.9 billion drop.

Donald Maude, chief financial economist at the investment firm of Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., called the report "a mild disappointment that probably puts a temporary hold on the decline in rates."

Prior to last week's unexpectedly sharp decline in M1, interest rates had been steadily climbing since early December as M1 also surged.

The interest on federal funds, the overnight loans of reserves among banks and a peg for most short-term interest rates, rose from an average of 12.04 percent in the week ended Dec. 9 to an average 15.61 percent in the week ended Feb. 17. But the Fed reported that in the week ended Wednesday, the average federal funds rate plunged to 13.86 percent.

The prime lending rate, the base upon which banks compute interest charges on short-term business loans to their best-risk customers, rose from 15.75 percent on Dec. 1 to 17 percent on Feb. 17. It fell to 16.5 percent Tuesday.

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Ruling rejection feared

Bergeson doubts high court would uphold access decision

Assemblywoman Marian Bergeson told a Newport Beach audience Friday that the state Supreme Court would probably overturn the recent appellate court ruling striking down the state Coastal Commission's right to require public access to beaches.

Mrs. Bergeson, who favors the ruling by the appeal court, spoke Friday to members of the Orange County Coast Association at the Irvine Coast Country Club.

"We're just going to have to hurry and replace the Supreme Court because I'm not sure we're going to see the decision handed down that we want at the state level," she said.

Orange County officials have said that it is unlikely that the 2nd District Court of Appeal declaration Wednesday in Los Angeles that access guidelines are unconstitutional will have any effect on the Orange County coastline.

In the past, the state commission has made public access to beach property a requirement for development and improvements along the coast.

"I think that the decision by the appeal court was in line with what we've been professing for years," said Ms. Bergeson after the luncheon.

Assemblyman Nolan Frizzelle, R-Huntington Beach also made an appearance before the association and discussed increasing energy costs.

Responding to criticism from constituents who have complained that their utility bills have doubled in the last year, Frizzelle said Gov. Edmund Brown Jr. was to blame.

Frizzelle said Brown's desire to use low sulfur fuels and the curtailment of nuclear and hydroelectric energy has forced utility companies to increase prices.

"The public utility companies

have no option but to use the most expensive resources," said Frizzelle. "The governor restricts the amount of energy use. This policy is detrimental to everyone, especially in Orange County with the great technical capacity."

Sitton bed capacity up to 128

In January, however, more than 200 children required emergency shelter care at one time, Steiner said.

Children who could not be cared for at Sitton home were sent to foster families who provide care under contractual arrangements with the county. Families are reimbursed between \$463 to \$654 per month depending on the age of the child they care for.

Steiner said more foster families are needed, particularly since no further expansion can take place at the Sitton home due to space limitations.

about \$11.5 million.

The lower figure for missing funds is significant for bail purposes because Carter said there was more likelihood that McDonald would attempt to flee if there was more money unaccounted for.

Friday's hearing, witnessed as before by more than 50 Golden Eagle salespeople and investors who crowded into Carter's Laguna Niguel courtroom, was supposed to mark the opening of McDonald's and Biggins' preliminary hearing.

Instead, the judge agreed to delay the preliminary hearing tentatively until April 12.

Buck said that additional felony charges were being added to the original complaint against McDonald and Biggins, bringing the total for each to 35 counts.

These charges include grand theft, conspiracy to commit income tax evasion and selling securities without a license.

The two defendants have entered innocent pleas to the charges against them. Biggins is free on \$25,000 bail.

Oral Roberts has money worries

Financial troubles are facing the Oral Roberts Ministries, and the evangelist announced a fund-raising drive for \$120 million a year.

At a news conference, the Tulsa evangelist cited "another financial crisis" resulting from a decline in contributions after his City of

Faith Hospital opened in November.

The ministries are "not broke, but at the rate we're going it might not be that far away," Roberts said.

Roberts' ministries include operation of Oral Roberts University, City of Faith and the Oral Roberts Evangelistic Association.

Disc jockey **Murray Kaufman** — known to millions as "Murray the K" and "The Fifth Beatle" — was eulogized by singer **Tony Orlando** as the strongest, bravest and kindest man he had ever known.

And Orlando, who was 16 when he met Kaufman at a Long Island, New York, rock

'n' roll show, said "I didn't really know him until five months ago."

Kaufman had been battling lymphoma, a form of cancer, for more than two years. He left a Los Angeles hospital last week, returning to his Studio City home, where he died in his sleep Monday. He was 60.

"He's obviously been influenced by **Matisse** and has a feeling for paint and color," said the Blackman Harvey Gallery's artistic adviser, **Marjorie Allthorpe-Guyton**, who decided that Benedetto deserved a showing.

William J. Small resigned Friday after less than three years as president of NBC News, citing "differences in management style," the network announced.

NBC said a successor to Small, whose resignation was effective at once, would be named next week.

Small took over a struggling news division in September 1979, and despite some successes, primarily in the area of personnel, was unable to gain significant ground on the competition.

Condo ad 'misleading'

Coast panel attorney raps Newport developer

A full-page ad for a luxury Newport Beach condominium complex has caught the eye of at least one interested party — the state Coastal Commission.

"It's inaccurate," says commission attorney **Tim Eichenberg**. "Inaccurate and misleading."

The ad, boasting that prices at the Sea Island complex off Jamboree Road near Newport Center have been reduced by as much as \$210,000, made prominent mention of the commission.

Developer **Robert McLain** — in the ad — says that because the commission is now out of the affordable housing business, his firm can avoid subsidizing "millions of dollars" of low-cost

The ad claims that's why prices at Sea Island are being dropped.

"No way," counters Eichenberg. "He's using us as an excuse because he can't sell his units at the inflated prices he was asking."

Condominiums at the partially constructed development had been priced as high as \$700,000.

Further, Eichenberg says, developer McLain still must fulfill his obligation to the commission by buying options on 20 condominiums at the Villa Balboa, a 450-unit complex near Hoag Hospital.

McLain was not available to rebut Eichenberg's charges and nobody at the development firm would say how many of the condominiums at Sea Island have been sold.

The affordable housing condition between McLain and the commission — Eichenberg says — works like this:

The commission allowed McLain to provide low-cost units at the Villa Balboa because the developer said his Sea Island complex would be too expensive to include affordable units.

The commission agreement calls for McLain to purchase options on condominiums at the Villa Balboa as units become available.

The options, in turn, are to be turned over to the Orange County Housing Authority, which has the task of selling the units to low-income wage

earners at prices ranging from \$27,000 to \$70,000.

But problems arose when housing authority officials could find no low-income home shoppers who could afford the low-cost units.

The catch, it turned out, is that while the prices were attractive, the monthly payments, because of interest rates, weren't.

A short time later, legislation was passed that takes the commission out of the business of requiring low-cost housing as a condition to development.

And that has triggered the latest fight.

McLain, in his ad, says he no longer has to buy the Villa Balboa units. Eichenberg says he does.

"He has until August of 1982 to fulfill the conditions," the commission attorney says. "There's not much we can do until that date."

As far as the ad goes, Eichenberg says:

"He can say whatever he wants. I don't care. But the truth is, he's lowering prices because nobody was buying his places."

Principal named for Kaiser school

William Knight, 39, has been named principal of the new Kaiser Elementary School in Costa Mesa, it was announced this week.

The El Toro resident and current principal of Harbor View Elementary School in Corona del Mar will take over as the first principal of Kaiser when it is converted from a middle school to an elementary school in September, said Superintendent **John Nicoll**.

Earlier this week the Newport-Mesa Unified School District voted to close Evening High School, Lindbergh and Woodland elementary school and to convert Kaiser Middle School to elementary.

No one has been chosen yet to replace Knight at Harbor View. Knight came to the district in 1968 and was a teacher and principal at Paularino Elementary School before his appointment at Harbor View.

Light snow and freezing rain spread across Arkansas into Tennessee on Friday, and rain continued in the Mississippi Delta. A winter storm spread a few inches of snow across northern Texas, with up to 4 inches at the towns of Matador and Paris.

Heavy snow reached southwestern Arkansas, where nearly 3 inches of snow was reported near Texarkana. Light rain and freezing rain fell over Tennessee and the southern Appalachians, and a winter storm watch was in effect for northern Georgia.

Schools were closed early in three counties in the Carolinas as temperatures plummeted and snow fell, just two days after the area had 79-degree weather.

Temperatures around the nation at midday Friday ranged from 6 at Caribou, Maine to 82 at Fort Myers, Fla.

For today, scattered thunderstorms were forecast over the Southeast, with snow across the central Appalachians and the northern Plains. Light rain was forecast over the Pacific Northwest.

Highs in the 20s were predicted in the northern Plains and northern New England, in the 30s and 40s in the mid-Atlantic coast through the Ohio Valley and the central Plains into the northern Rockies; in the 50s and 60s in the South, and in the 70s in southern Florida, the desert Southwest and Southern California.

Transit program survives rejection

A final remnant of the Irvine Company's now-dead Newport Center plan was given a coming out party at the circular shopping and professional center Thursday.

Irvine Company's top brass, at an evening reception at Neiman-Marcus, formally unveiled a share-a-ride program they are calling "Centeride."

The program originally was imposed as a condition to the company's plan for expanding Newport Center, a project that was repealed early this month by the Newport Beach City Council.

Irvine Company President Peter Kremer said Thursday

that his firm intends to move forward with the ride-sharing program despite the development setback and continue funding it through June.

He said methods will be considered by which Centeride can be equitably funded by participating Newport Center companies.

Kremer said Centeride will be the first transportation management program in the country that has been developed and totally funded by private business.

The transportation program will consist of organizing employee car and van pools, encouraging Newport Center workers to increase use of public transportation and persuade firms to stagger work hours.

The idea, Irvine Company officials said, is to reduce peak-hour traffic at the center.

So far, the Irvine Company has spent more than \$200,000 on the program. The development firm said the program will become self-sufficient.

Eventually, Kremer suggested, some organization — perhaps the Newport Center Association — will manage Centeride.

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Search pressed for sloop, pair

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Coast Guard airplanes and helicopters continued searching Friday for a \$75,000 sloop with a two-man crew missing for four days, officials said.

"We conducted a 12,000-square-mile search Thursday with two long-range planes and two helicopters. We're going out again over virtually the same area and perhaps a little south of Cape San Martin," said Coast Guard spokesman Anthony Tarrant.

The missing crewmen are Skip Wright, 40, of Richmond and Chuck Baggett, 37, Tarrant said. The 36-foot sloop was being delivered from Santa Barbara to Monterey for owner David Borton of Sunnyvale and two partners.

Tarrant said there was no indication of bad weather in the area the sloop was traveling.

"We're really quite disturbed," said Borton's wife, Laura. "I just hope those guys are all right. When we met them after hiring them through an agency, they seemed like two able seamen. They looked like they could handle anything."

The sloop was four years old and in good condition, Mrs. Borton said.

Degree claim held false

Party leaders suspend support of candidate

Auto oil filters checked

WATERTOWN, N.Y. (AP) — U.S. Senate candidate Bruce Caputo did not receive his master's degree from the Harvard Business School "with distinction" as is claimed in some of his official biographies, a school official confirmed Friday.

In New York City, leaders of the state Republican and Conservative parties Friday suspended their support for Caputo in his bid to get their nominations for the U.S. Senate.

The former Westchester County, N.Y., Republican congressman, already under fire for "exaggerating" about a military career he never had during the Vietnam War, could not be reached immediately for comment on the report, raised in a copyrighted story in the Watertown Daily Times.

"I'm not going to comment on that right now," said Caputo campaign spokesman John Sheehan.

In several editions of the official "The New York Red Book" and in

the 1977 "Congressional Directory," Caputo is listed as having received an MBA from Harvard in 1967 "with distinction."

Since the disclosure last week that Caputo had not been an Army lieutenant or a draftee as he had earlier claimed, several powerful GOP state leaders have called for him to withdraw from his race to unseat incumbent Democrat Daniel Patrick Moynihan.

Caputo was a civilian employee in the Pentagon during part of the Vietnam War.

Republican State Chairman George Clark and Conservative State Chairman J. Daniel Mahoney are going to wait and see how badly Caputo has been hurt by his false claim of military service before deciding whether to support him, according to Serphin Maltese, Conservative spokesman.

"Essentially it is a new ballgame," he said following a meeting between the candidate and the leaders.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chrysler Corp. has agreed to a Federal Trade Commission request that it notify 700,000 owners of Plymouth and Dodge cars and trucks about a potential oil filter replacement problem.

A statement issued by the FTC said the situation involves 1971-80 models with 1600cc engines and 1974-80 models with 2000cc engines. Specific models are the Dodge Colt, Challenger, Colt hatchback and D-50 pickup and the Plymouth Arrow, Sapporo, Arrow pickup and Champ.

The FTC said that some filters may leak or rupture.

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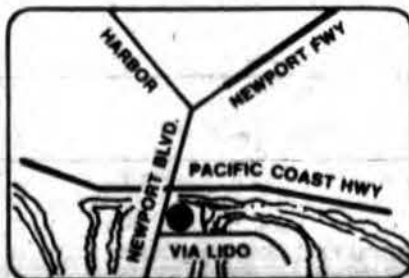
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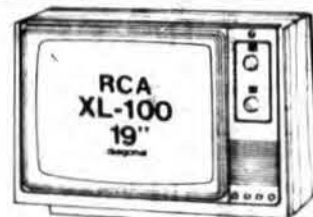


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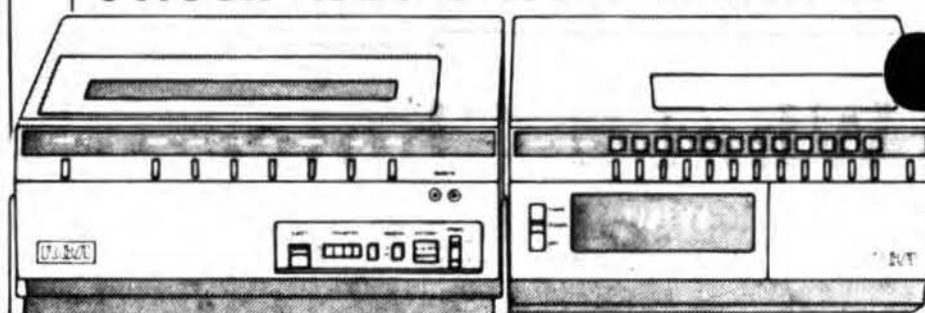


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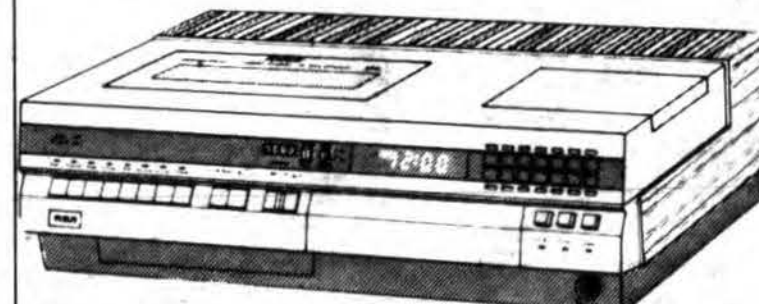
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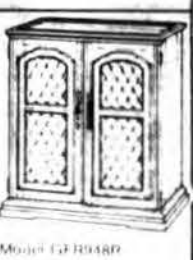

Modern magic bears watching

SACRAMENTO — Magic to me is television.

Everyone knows the performing entertainers who do magic tricks are doing just that, tricks. Self-proclaimed magicians do not really saw women in half, or pull rabbits out of hats. There is always a sleight-of-hand or a split-second distraction which accomplishes the illusion.

But television is real magic. Invisible projectiles of energy rocketing through the atmosphere that are collected by pieces of metal antenna and mysteriously transformed into colorful, complete pictures and sound is magic.

Have you ever considered a phonograph? A dead piece of plastic rotating beneath a sharp needle to produce the sound of a symphony is more magical than any card trick. No sleight-of-hand, no mumbo jumbo, just results.

WELL, THE physicists would have terms or rationales for the chemical reactions involved with radio waves or sound reproduction, but we all know naming it isn't explaining it.

It seems people, especially Americans, have lost their sense of magic. Television is old hat, flip a switch and bingo, "Family Feud." It is amazing how people can sit for hours staring at the magical television watching shows and commercials, without ever considering the incredible physics behind the television set.

It seems modern people have reversed understanding of true magic. Ancient mystics understood that sleights-of-hand are cheap, while honest magic is rare and powerful.

Ancient mystics would also agree that powerful magic like technology should be guarded with caution. Advanced levels of technological magic, such as nuclear power, experimental medicine and serious weaponry, should be carefully monitored.

TOP LEVEL scientists and bureaucrats control the powerful magical forces of split atoms and spliced genes which the average person cannot fathom. Who controls the technocrats?

Throughout most of history, large civilizations have been dominated by religious leaders who were believed to have magical or spiritual powers beyond the grasp of the average person. In retrospect, these self-appointed religious leaders did not deliver too many miracles to the populations.

But today's technocrats do deliver "miracles." Everything from television to rockets to electric can openers to the dams needed to run all the electric gadgets.

And in many ways, these

technocratic leaders hold more power than the religious leaders did in the distant and not-so-distant past. While the religious leaders could muster crusades against their enemies, the technocrats could wipe out millions of people by pushing buttons, or by accidentally pushing buttons.

When contemplating nuclear power or other magic technology one must always consider who will be in charge of the magic.

There is no trick to thermonuclear war. It is a physical process of electric impulses, computer response, aerodynamics, radio wave steering, energy production for thrust and then a sub-atomic reaction and... boom.

Magic is very powerful stuff.

U.S. magazine sales brisk in Russia

WASHINGTON — Although the United States is frustrated by increased jamming of Voice of America broadcasts to the Soviet Union, it enjoys brisk sales of a magazine for Soviet readers that contrasts daily life in the two countries.

America Illustrated is a slick monthly publication of the U.S. International Communication Agency. For the past 26 years it has been distributed in the Soviet Union under an agreement that allows the sale of up to 62,000 copies.

In exchange, an equivalent number of copies of a magazine entitled Soviet Life may be sold within the United States.

"We are a palpable witness of the United States in the Soviet Union — the only one," America Illustrated editor Robert A. Poteete said in an interview.

THE 1956 EXCHANGE agreement requires that the magazines be "non-political," Poteete said. He adds that "it is nonetheless possible to publish subjects very thoroughly without violating the spirit of the agreement."

America Illustrated is "by no means in competition" with the VOA, Poteete said. "The Voice of America is undoubtedly our most important communication with the Soviet Union," he said.

But, the editor said, "it's possible to compare much more of the feel and actuality of life with the magazine than it is on the radio."

America Illustrated, popularly called America, costs the U.S. government about \$2 a copy to produce and is distributed in more than 80 Soviet cities for 50 kopeks, about 75 cents. It is sold

by subscription and at news kiosks by an official Soviet agency known as Soyuz-Puschat.

"Soviets keep collections of them and pass them from hand to hand," according to ICA spokesman Joe O'Connell.

AMERICAN OFFICIALS say demand for the magazine is tremendous but that Soviet authorities are not always cooperative in distributing copies. "When the Soviet Union is displeased with us politically it elects not to distribute a certain number of copies each issue," Poteete said.

About 8,000 copies of the last issue were returned to Washington, a move regarded here as reflecting tensions

that have been rising since the Soviet occupation of Afghanistan and the recent military crackdown in Poland.

A large number of America's articles are reprints from U.S. magazines ranging from Life to Public Opinion. However, the ICA publication, like most other agency materials, is not legally distributed within the United States.

In setting up the predecessor U.S. Information Agency, Congress wrote the prohibition against domestic distribution out of concern that government propaganda efforts might be aimed improperly at the American public.

America and the dozen or so other ICA magazines can be freely examined by members of Congress, journalists and research scholars. Recent articles deal with the political ideology of the Reagan administration, trends in contemporary American literature, the refurbished Baltimore harbor and the history of the American supermarket.

The supermarket article illustrates how the magazine can point out the disparities between American and Soviet societies. The relatively brief text is accompanied by six full-page color photographs of the vast array of items in the average American supermarket, a showcase which Poteete terms "one of the crown jewels of America."

High-quality photos of supermarket aisles on those six pages might dazzle even the American reader. But the text hints that the items on display are not within the budgets of every American.

"Customers who saw food bills rise week by week often blamed the most visible segment of the system — the supermarket," the story reads. All the

same, such a collection of goods is unimaginable in a Soviet store.

The articles are reprinted from domestic magazines with little if any editing. Most of the changes are intended to insert explanatory material for Soviet readers wherever necessary, and to remove criticism of the Soviet Union.

The magazine does take some veiled jibes at the Soviets on occasion. In a recent article commemorating the Battle of Yorktown, professor Irving Kristol wrote: "The American Revolution was successful in that those who led it were able, in later years, to look back in tranquility at what they had wrought and say that it was good."

SOVIET CENSORS look closely at the magazine before it is distributed, and have been known to block its sale because of what they regard as an offensive item. "The Soviets go over this magazine with a very, very fine tooth comb before they distribute it," Poteete said.

The agreement to exchange sales of America Illustrated and Soviet Life appears to have become a solid feature of relations between the two superpowers, even if Soviets grumble from time to time about lagging sales of their publication in the United States.

"Life for our magazine is a bit difficult," said Soviet Life managing editor Felix V. Alexeyev. Soviet Life has about 40,000 American subscribers but moves slowly on newsstands, he said.

Its recent issues have featured the 55th anniversary of the Soviet airline Aeroflot, the daily routine in a woman's watch factory and Lake Ladoga near Leningrad, where "the best fish swim near the bottom."

Feb. 8, 1982

★ President Reagan presented his budget for fiscal year 1983. The fiscal year begins on Oct. 1.



Early March

★ Legislative committees in Congress consider new programs in the budget proposal and restoration of authorization for lapsed programs. If they are rejected or not considered, money cannot ordinarily be appropriated. Appropriations committees determine allocations for government programs. They can propose more or less than recommended.



Mid-March

★ Legislative and appropriations committees make budget proposals to the budget committees by March 15. Tax-writing committees then weigh budget proposals and determine how much revenue is needed. Proposed means of raising revenue can differ significantly from those recommended by the President.



Mid-April

★ With information from all other committees in hand, the budget committees draft the first budget resolution and present it to the full House and Senate by April 15.



Mid-May

★ Congress adopts the first budget resolution, which establishes goals for revenue and spending in broad governmental categories. Appropriations committees then set allocations with the goals of the first resolution as a guide.

September

★ Congress will adopt the second budget resolution, which establishes binding levels of revenue and spending in broad categories. The deadline of Sept. 15 is not always met. Appropriations committees then fit all allotments for specific programs into the overall ceiling set by the second resolution for broad categories.

New Debt Commission: Useful watchdog or more control?

Another new state commission. Ho-hum.

That was the response from most headline writers when the Legislature almost unanimously created something called the California Debt Advisory Commission.

But state Treasurer Jesse Unruh, charged with keeping California solvent, had a completely different response.

He called the bill that set up the commission "one of the most important laws enacted in recent years."

Unruh was excited because he's pushed for the commission since 1975 and because he'll be the chairman.

TWO ASSEMBLYMEN and two state senators, the state controller and the governor will join Unruh on the new group, which will analyze every proposed bond issue or promissory note to be issued by any local government or district in California.

The commission can't stop anyone from going deeper into debt; its job will be to cry out as loudly as possible when anyone is about to go dangerously into the red or when proposed interest rates are too high.

How useful is all this in the day of

Proposition 13, when no government or district can raise taxes — needed to pay off bond issues — without a two-thirds vote in favor?

The answer varies. Doubters say the commission will be just another layer of government, slowing things down a bit more than they already are, as proposed new debts must be reported to the commission at least 10 days before becoming official.

But Unruh thinks otherwise, and Unruh's financial estimates have consistently been more accurate than anyone else's over the last five years.

"THIS MIGHT BE regarded as a fiscal Paul Revere, sounding the alarm whenever questionable bond schemes are being hatched or outrageous interest rates are being contemplated," he said in his annual message to the Legislature.

Unruh adds that "with the knowledge that someone is looking over their shoulder, government agencies and the

ever-creative bond underwriters will be much more cautious about tumbling deeper and deeper into debt, and at higher and higher interest rates. That should be good news to taxpayers and consumers who pay the debt."

The treasurer, whose interest in finance dates back to his mid-1960s pronouncement that "money is the mother's milk of politics," says the "traffic cop" commission is needed to blow whistles before California cities and counties find themselves as broke as Cleveland or New York.

But there's still the issue of how much control the state should have over local spending.

VIA ITS PROPOSITION 13 bailout funds, the Legislature already controls many local programs ranging from

schools to welfare. The new debt watchdog will also give the state a de facto final word on new construction of public buildings, parks and other projects usually unaffected by the bailout funds.

For not many local elected officials would buck the tide of negative publicity if the debt commission raised a ruckus over some of their planned spending, even if it really were justified.

So despite Unruh's high hopes, the jury hasn't yet decided whether the new commission will be useful or just another excessive layer of government.

To be useful, the commission will have to use restraint and hope for full cooperation from the local officials it will police.

But how many powerful government agencies have ever used restraint?

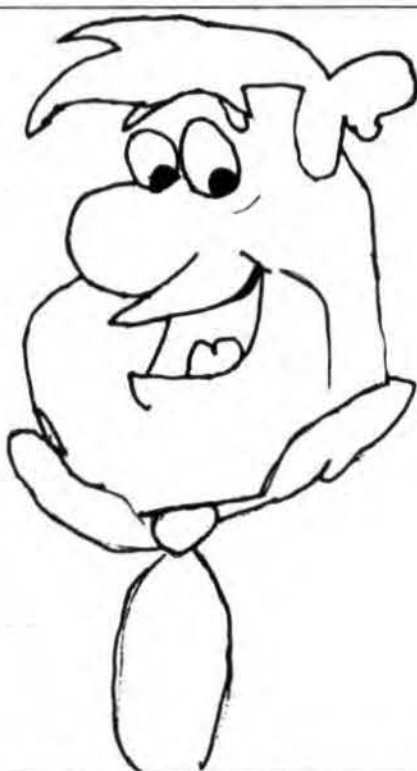

Students plug three R's

Teens develop reading skills, friendships with patients

MERCED — A convalescent hospital might seem like an odd place to plug the three R's, but not to some Merced High School students.

The pupils are the backbone of

the Ready Reliable Readers program.

About 30 students with poor reading comprehension visit Hy-Lond Convalescent Hospital on Fridays to read books, newspapers and newsletters to patients.

The purposes are to improve the students' deficient reading skills and to provide companionship for residents, who are mostly in their 80s and 90s.

"Initially, students were kind of frightened by the idea," said reading teacher Doug Creighton in a telephone interview. "Then you could see the glow on their faces as if they'd done something very important."

Although Creighton is uncertain of the effects on reading abilities, he said the Three R's program showed students "reading is a skill they should treasure, that's good to have and to keep."

The visits started this fall after the program gained the backing of school officials and Sharon Haynes, activity director at the hospital.

"I tried to give the students some cold, hard facts to weed out those who weren't really interested," Creighton said. To his surprise, there were no dropouts.

Mrs. Haynes gave the volunteers a brief hospital orientation, telling students about wheelchair movement, fire safety and quiet spots for reading.

The program is open to 467 students who failed the state competency test and are taking a remedial reading and writing course.

Creighton and team teacher Kim Laughlin deal with students on the low end of the reading scale. On the average, the 10th- to 12th-grade students read below the fifth-grade standard.

The poor skills are not detrimental in the reading program because students "talked slow enough so patients could grasp what they were saying," Mrs. Haynes noted.

Club takes new direction

NEW YORK (AP) — As New York's ethnic population has shifted, so has the role of the 105-year-old Boys' Club of New York, says Robert T. Olson, executive director. Where once members were predominantly of Italian, Jewish and Polish extraction, today the youngsters are largely Hispanic or black.

At one time, the club stressed sport and recreational programs almost exclusively, Olson says. They're still important, he adds, but the organization has started new programs to meet today's needs.

"We now place equal emphasis on educational and vocational guidance and health education directed at combating drug abuse and venereal disease," he explains.

The growing need for counseling and guidance, notes the director, also stems from the fact that many of today's members come from

single-parent households, reflecting the national trend away from the traditional family structure.

"High-school guidance counselors today have so many students to look after that they cannot give the attention they would like to give young people. We're in a position, however, to give individual ongoing assistance to members."

Counselors with master's degrees in educational counseling, he points out, can help boys pick the right courses in school.

"We also offer a vocational guidance program which last year resulted in finding 52 summer jobs," Olson says. "A program we introduced this year includes 12 hour-long sessions that provide simple but important information on how to be good workers. It covers such subjects as promptness, being respectful and working beyond

closing time when the situation calls for it.

"Even those boys who did not get jobs learned a lot in the process," Olson adds.

"A special scholarship fund we instituted in 1957 sends 20 boys annually to prep schools," Olson says. "More than 400 to date have graduated from prep schools and gone to college. Some of the college graduates have entered business, law and medicine."

"While we've added new directions over the years," Olson says, "all our programs continue to have two things in common — they help members and they need money."

The club's primary source for the funds needed to adapt and expand its programs is its annual "All Sport Halls of Fame, dinner," that honors current inductees of the baseball, football, basketball, golf, hockey and tennis Halls of Fame.

Edison's dreams fried again by Servite

Friars eliminate Chargers from CIF 4-A basketball playoffs with 58-54 victory

It began as if Servite High's basketball team was going to pay a big price for the Friars' stunning upset of Edison High in the football playoffs, snapping a 32-game winning streak with a 14-7 shocker.

But when it was over, the Friars had done it again, they have knocked the CIF 4-A's top-ranked team out of the playoffs again.

Servite battled back from a 21-10 first quarter deficit to take a 58-54 quarterfinals victory before a turnaway crowd of 2,400 at Valencia High Friday night, a verdict almost as stunning as the football conquest the Friars posted in November.

"We beat the CIF's No. 1 team, Orange County's No. 1 team and the best player in Orange County (Richard Chang)," said Servite Coach

Larry Walker. "It has to be our biggest win."

"You've gotta be able to make a lay-in," said a dejected Edison Coach Barry Leigh. "I'm not disappointed with our defense, but our offense... we tried 'em all out and even drew a new one."

The Chargers began with a diamond and one (Mark Goudge on Servite guard Tim Osgood) and eventually went to a triangle and two to try to thwart the Friars, who went to a very effective delay game in the second half once they got the advantage (37-35 with 3:56 left in the third period).

Edison was never to regain the lead, although the Chargers did tie it at 46 with 3:52 left on Rick DiBernardo's layup off a feed from Chang.

It was tied again at 47 and 49 (the latter with 2:11 left on a pair of Jeff Stephens free throws), but the Friars turned their delay into an attack with a six-foot shot down the lane by Osgood and a

backdoor play to Andy Maruvich with 1:32 left to make it 53-49, then 55-49 on Osgood free throws.

After that it was just a matter of making free throws as the Chargers could only foul and pray after each failed opportunity, but all hopes were dashed by Osgood and Steve Beuerheim at the line.

The Sunset League champions were still in command at the half (33-31) because of the 10-for-14 shooting (71.4 percent) from the field in the first quarter.

But nothing would go right for Edison in the third quarter, attempt after attempt going in-and-out. The Chargers missed 9 of 10 in the third quarter and during the final three quarters could connect on only 10 of 38 (26.3 percent).

Servite, meanwhile, controlled the game with its delay, never losing the lead.

"We were taking a gamble," said Walker, alluding to his team's delay game. "But we've done that ever since league began."

Walker's players were busy cutting down the nets afterward — a symbolic gesture of winning a championship — it was that kind of a game. "This is simply an amazing team," said Walker of his 18-9 Angelus League champs, who face Inglewood next in the semis at Long Beach Arena.

"They played a tough, nasty defense," said Leigh.

DiBernardo started as if he was going to personally run the Friars all the way back to Anaheim, scoring 12 of his team's first 28 points (20 in all), and Chang was crisp from outside, scoring 17 of his game-high 22 in the first half.

DiBernardo also had 11 of his 18 rebounds in (See EDISON, Page B4)

Estancia loses 62-55 to Hoover

Estancia made a run in the third quarter and had closed the gap to 44-43 at the outset of the final period. From that point on, however, it was just a long series of frustrations for the Eagles.

The biggest source of frustration was Hillman. The Tornadoes' 6-0 sophomore point guard hit all eight of his fourth-quarter free throw attempts to keep the game just out of Estancia's reach.

It was Hillman who was the key to Hoover taking the first-half lead as he hit four-of-five shot attempts — all from long range — in the second quarter, was six-of-eight in the first half, and finished with 26 points to lead all scorers.

WHEN HILLMAN wasn't shooting down the Eagles' championship hopes, 6-3 senior Kevin Brown was.

Brown had six points in the final period and finished the game with 14 as he was on the receiving end of a number of Tornado fast breaks.

Estancia employed a zone press throughout the game but it had little effect as Hoover demonstrated a solid transition (See ESTANCIA, Page B2)

Dailey, who was expected to play in both USF games this weekend as the Dons seek a berth in the NCAA playoffs, was ordered to return to court Monday for an evidence hearing. At that time, McCabe said, she will set a date for a preliminary hearing.

McCabe signed a gag order requested by defense attorney George Walker barring attorneys from discussing the case.

Dailey was arrested earlier this week for attempted rape and four other charges in connection with an alleged assault Dec. 21 on a nursing student in a USF dormitory. He is free on \$5,000 bail.

Dailey, a 6-3 junior from Baltimore, is considered one of the top college guards in the country.

Sea Kings post 45-42 triumph

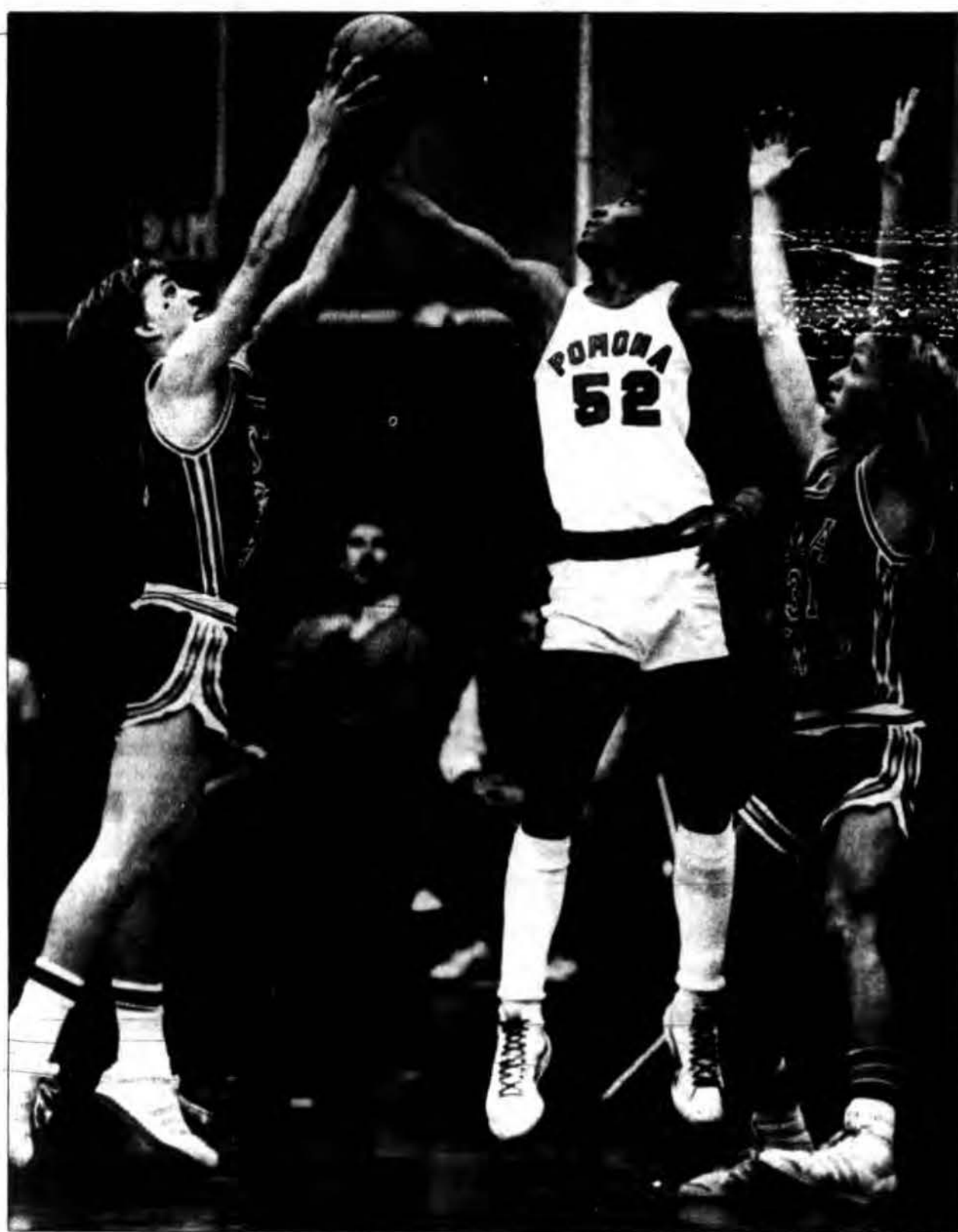
"We knew he was their best player and their leader," admitted Allen of Lynch. "We tried to slow him, but you can never totally shut a kid down if he's a player... and he is."

Angel battery needs a charge

Pitching woes remain, but Boone should step in to catch

The Angels' pitching staff — or lack of same — has been the focus of much of the attention as the club began going through the spring training motions this week.

Can John D'Acquisto become reacquainted with the strike zone? Can Ken Forsch be expected to improve upon the results he produced in 1981? Can Mike Witt dispose of occasional rookie jitters and live up to his potential?

Or, should the ground crew at Anaheim Stadium be reminded to make sure the Angels' bullpen gate is always well-oiled?

Sooner or later, however, the attention may shift to behind the plate. Manager Gene Mauch

has quite a crowd back there, what with acquisition of Bob Boone.

After 10 respectable seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies, Boone was obtained in the off season and figures to be Mauch's choice for the starting catcher spot.

That's bad news for Ed Ott and even worse for Brian Downing, who was forced into playing left field last year when Ott joined the Angels from the Pittsburgh Pirates. Downing has come full circle with the Angels: from the leading right-handed hitter in the American League (.326) in 1979 to an awkward transition to the outfield to his most uncomfortable role of 1982; trade bait. More on this later.

For Boone, the move means handling a new staff of pitchers and facing American League opposition that he's completely unfamiliar with. He says feels like a kid again.

"Well, I'm excited about it because it's just like a completely new lease on life," the 34-year-old Boone said. "Frankly, it's like being a rookie in spring training."

"It's a complete change and it came at a time in my career when it was really needed."

Boone, son of former American League All-Star third baseman Ray Boone, was recognized as one of the top defensive catchers in the National League and was a Gold Glove winner in 1978 and 1979.

He's confident that his experience will help him make a successful transition to the American League.

"I think the handling of the staff will come in the first few days of spring training," Boone said. "Learning the hitters is just something that will take some time going around the league. Hopefully, I'll be able to pick up on it pretty quickly."

Jabbar quiets critics -- and 76ers, 116-114

INGLEWOOD — Kareem Abdul-Jabbar did a pretty good job of silencing his critics Thursday night in Seattle.

The 12-year veteran scored 31 points in the Lakers' important divisional battle with the host Sonics to the tune of a 104-98 come-from-behind victory.

And with Dr. J and the Philadelphia 76ers supplying the opposition Friday night at the Forum, Jabbar and the Lakers knew things weren't going to get easier.

But Jabbar, looking more like the spry young UCLA center of yesteryear, offset a tremendous off-the-bench shooting performance by the 76ers' Andrew Toney in sparking the Lakers to a 116-114 double overtime victory before 17,505 screaming fans.

"Simply awesome," offered teammate Jamaal Wilkes, who added 24 in the Lakers' win, their sixth straight. "That was truly the Kareem of old."

"He has received a lot of criticism lately," Wilkes continued. "And you know he didn't get much rest last night."

Indeed, 33 minutes in the Kingdome Thursday night, a Friday morning return to Los Angeles and the presence of the NBA's best team (record-wise) could have set the stage for fewer heroics from Jabbar.

But thanks to the absence of an injured Bob McAdoo, Jabbar found himself on the playing floor for 49 minutes Friday night. Only Wilkes and Magic Johnson, who played 50 minutes each, saw more action.

"The big guy never let up," added Lakers Coach Pat Riley. "A lot of people say Kareem has

a difficult time mustering the effort. But he knows he is needed out there. The guys are telling him, 'win it for us.'" And that's exactly what Jabbar did.

He scored nine points in each of the third and fourth quarters and for good measure, he pumped in nine more in the two overtime periods. He also hauled down four important OT rebounds for a game-high total of 19.

The victory, meanwhile, snapped Philadelphia's 10-game winning streak. But more importantly, Jabbar helped the Lakers maintain their 2½-game lead over Seattle in the Pacific Division.

"I mentioned last week that I thought we were turning the corner," Riley said afterward. "Now I can say we have."

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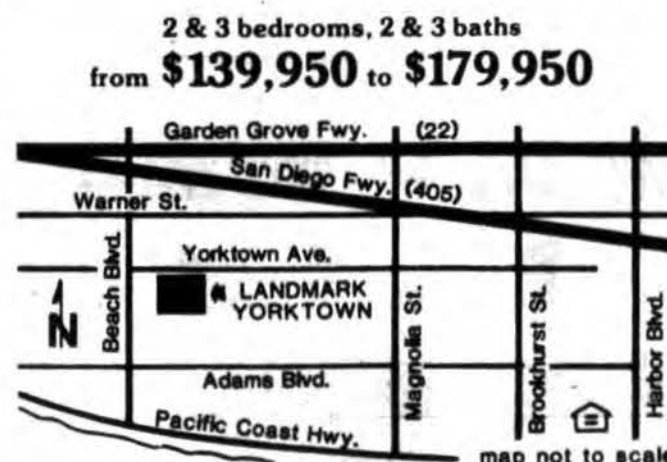

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Ann-Margret prepares to face another crisis

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Ann-Margret can look back on 1981 as the year she finished three new movies, strengthened her hold as Las Vegas' leading lady, edged gracefully past 40 — and learned, once again, to cope with the specter of death.

Her hands dance excitedly, her green eyes gleam as she talks about the three movies. There have been 31 since she headed west as a star-struck teen-ager from the Chicago suburb of Wilmette, met rejection in Las Vegas, then returned to conquer the town — thanks to the good taste of George Burns.

But the sparkle dims, the voice fades to a whisper when asked about her husband, business manager and close confidant for years — actor Roger Smith.

Pianist replaced

Pianist Lillie Krause has canceled her Sunday appearance with the Pacific Orchestra due to illness, a symphony spokesman announced. Miss Krause will be replaced by pianist Charles Rosen who will play a Mozart piano concerto.

Rosen, who holds extensive academic credits in the field of French literature, has performed throughout Europe and America and has recorded numerous works.

The concert is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in the Good Time Theater at Knotts Berry Farm. Ticket information is available at 778-3158.

A decade ago Smith was in Los Angeles when she suffered a near-fatal fall, 22 feet, head-first, onto the stage of a crowded showroom at the Sahara Hotel in Lake Tahoe.

Smith stole a private plane because there were no commercial flights into the mountain resort at night and no charters available. Ignoring the protests of doctors, he spirited his unconscious wife out of a Tahoe hospital for a 400-mile, pre-dawn flight over the Sierra Nevada to experts at the UCLA Medical Center. He insisted that her crushed facial bones be repaired from inside her mouth to avoid scarring one of Hollywood's most beautiful faces.

Told first that she might not live, then that she would never dance again, she returned to the stage 10 weeks later "because I won't allow any fear to overcome me" and to prove to her father — dying of cancer — that she could return.

Now, doctors at the Mayo Clinic have delivered yet another challenge. Smith has been diagnosed as suffering from myasthenia gravis, an incurable muscular wasting disease. Doctors say that with care he could live for 10 years. The

spunky-redhead thinks that might buy enough time to find a cure for the man who reversed her troubled career and changed her life in the mid '60s.

"We just have to deal with it a day at a time," she said recently following one of her shows at Caesars Palace. "He can tell when he gets up how he's going to be the rest of the day, whether it's going to be a good day or a bad day. When he's in bed and cannot move for six days at a time, it bothers me a great deal."

She said the problem seems in remission now, but adds "we never know from day to day what's going to happen."

Ann-Margret's dependence on Smith is well-known. He quit an acting career which included TV's "77 Sunset Strip" to spark a resurgence that has made her one of the hottest properties in Las Vegas and a two-time Academy Awards nominee.

"I realized a year ago in November, when he was diagnosed, that I had to become much more independent, stronger, in order to help him."

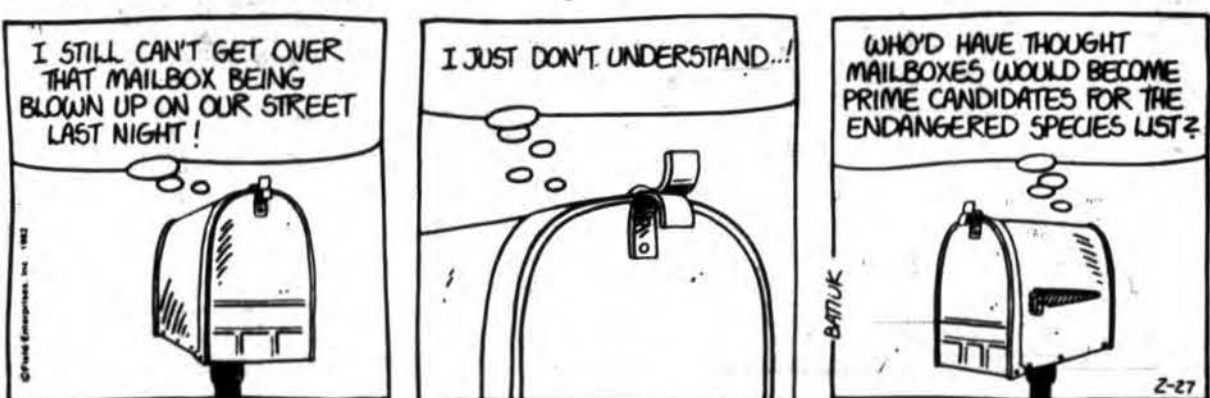

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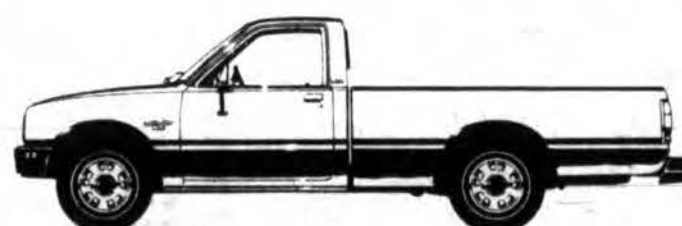
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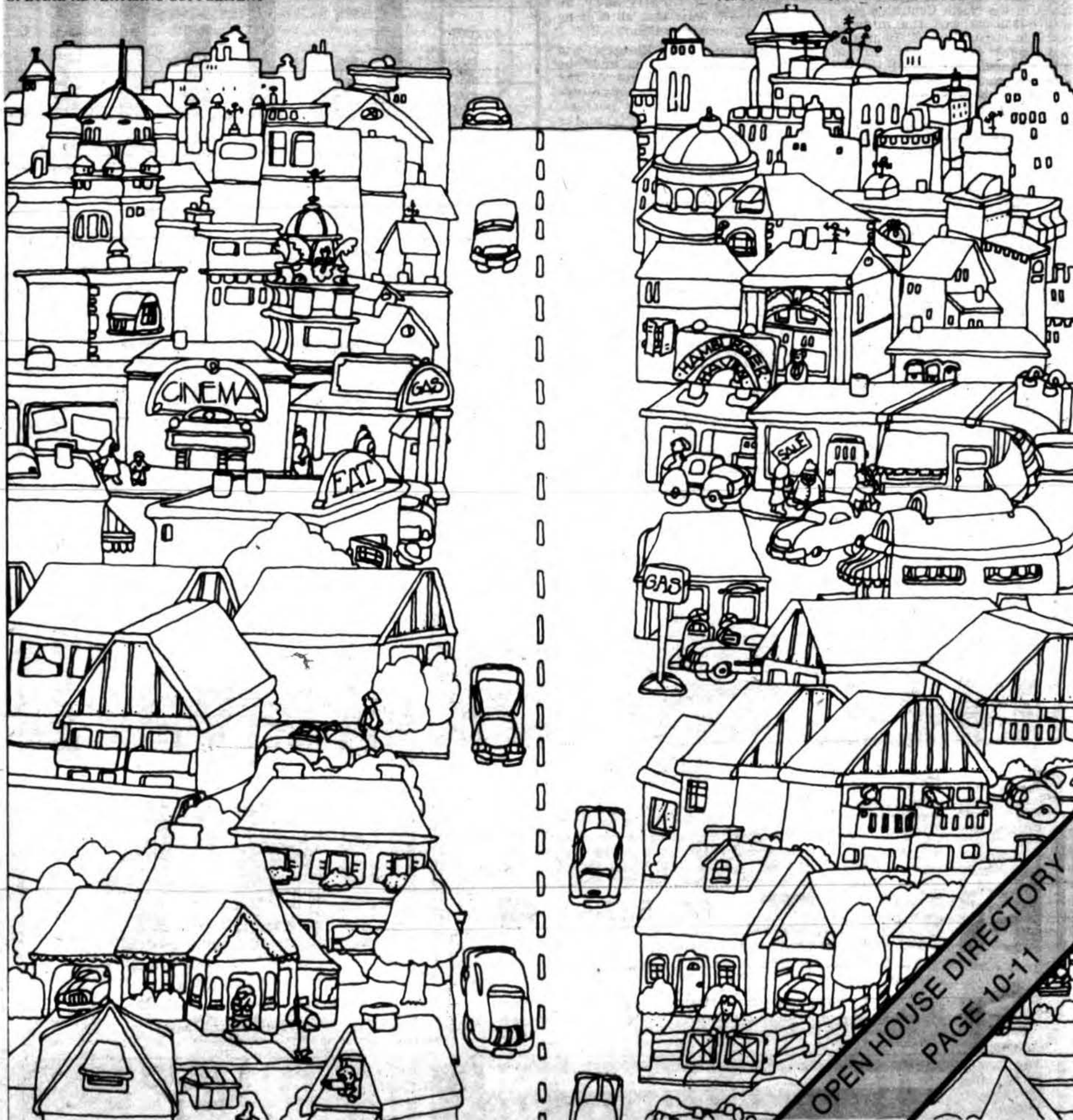

World-wide comparison shows U.S. housing costs less

How does California housing compare to the rest of the United States and the world? According to the National Association of Realtors, the cost of California real estate is probably the highest in the country, though lowest in comparison with its allies.

The median price of an existing California home in June 1981 was \$105,838. The 11 western states reported the second highest median cost of \$93,700.

The least expensive houses were found in the North Central States, where \$55,400 was the midway cutoff in housing prices. Homes in Detroit for example, fell in the \$58,000 range. Sioux Falls, S.D., had a midway range of \$54,000.

Homes in the South may have had a higher median cost than the northeast due to the high housing demand in Miami and Houston. The Southern composite median cost was calculated at \$67,400. Houston and Miami had a midway figure of \$73,000.

The overall midway price of all homes sold in June was reported to be \$67,900. In comparison, a single family home in 1970 was \$23,000. Some experts predict that by 1991 the price of the same home will be \$191,000.

Nevertheless, Americans are lucky, according to Gary Stine, former Irvine Real Estate board president. "Foreigners see our property here as a bargain, including the financing," he said.

Gary Watts, who trains Real Estate agents and travels extensively, illuminated this point with a few personal observations:

In Scotland, there is at least an 8 to 10 year wait to buy or rent a place to live because of the short

building season and scarce materials.

In the Netherlands, where affordable housing is produced by the government, 50,000 people are on the waiting list. Watts said probably another 60,000 people didn't even bother signing up. Prices begin at about \$300,000 for a 900 square foot unit.

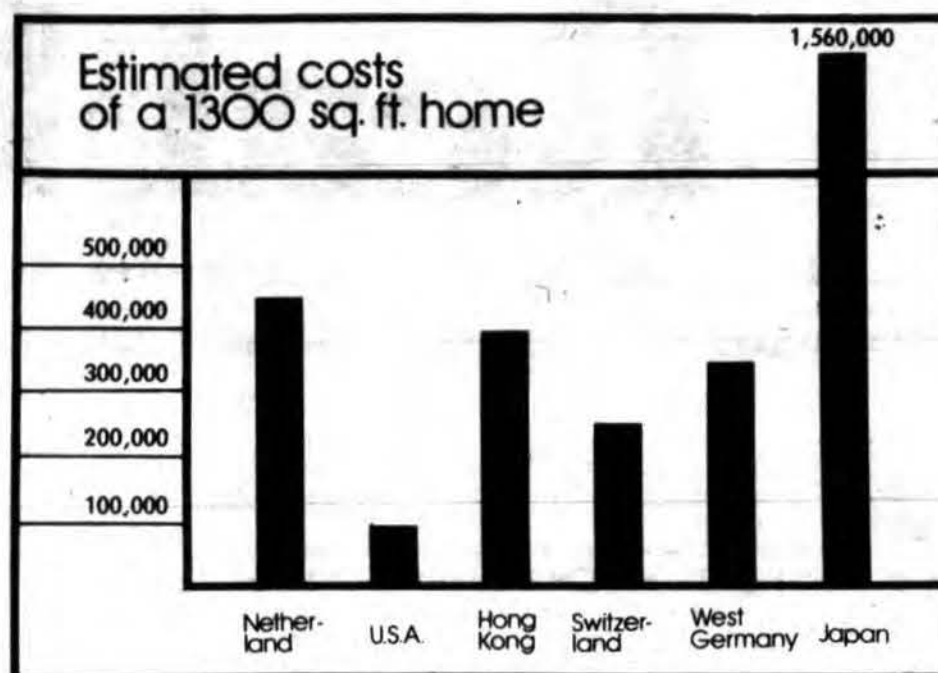
In Hong Kong the real estate values have been going down, even though it is still one of the most expensive places to live. Residents who think they've got problems leasing land locally may be interested to hear that all of Hong Kong is leased from China.

Financing in most European and Far Eastern countries must be provided by the seller of the property, with down payments ranging from 50 to 70 percent. Interest rates range from the Philippines' 22 percent to a real interest rate of 40 percent adjusted for inflation in South America. The country with the highest inflation rate in the world is Argentina, with 130 percent. Brazil has the second highest rate with 95.2.

Great Britain's financing structure for housing is the only one that is anywhere comparable to ours. In England, while financing costs are as low as 12 percent, buyers can write off interest costs on the first \$50,000 of a mortgage loan, with a maximum tax deduction of \$7,500 annually.

This boils down to three main reasons why foreigners are coming to California to buy housing and not vice versa. First, they want "capital preservation" provided by an investment in U.S. properties, which traditionally go up in value.

Secondly, American lending institutions put up more than half of the investment required to buy a house. Third, government instability forces many investors out of their own countries to seek investment protection in this country.
