

LB council may hike parking-in-lieu fees

Fearing a shortage of funds for future parking projects, the Laguna Beach City Council may adopt an ordinance early next year to raise parking-in-lieu fees substantially.

The change could cost businesses as much as four times the current fee.

The city requires Laguna Beach businesses to provide parking to accommodate customers or pay the city a parking-in-lieu fee of \$4,000 for every space not provided. The present fee has been in place with relatively minor changes for five years, according to City Manager Ken Frank.

Under the present ordinance, if a restaurant wishes to expand its capacity from five to 10 persons, it must either provide five new parking spaces for customers or pay the city roughly \$20,000. New businesses also must provide parking or pay the fee.

The city then is supposed to invest the funds in building, expanding or leasing parking facilities to meet the demand brought on by the businesses.

But this week, council members said the average cost of constructing a parking space falls between \$12,000 to \$15,000, making the \$4,000 fee inadequate, according to Laguna Beach Mayor Robert Gentry.

"We haven't looked at the fee in a long time," Gentry said. "There is some question whether it is adequate now that we're building a new parking structure. Higher fees would be a way of getting more money for the project."

Gentry was referring to the \$1.28 million Glenneyre Street parking garage which will be financed with \$220,000 in parking-in-lieu funds and about \$1.1 million in parking authority funds raised from parking meter receipts.

Gentry said there are also future projects on the drawing board that would benefit. Consultants hired by the city to design the Village Entry project across the street from the Festival of the Arts grounds propose constructing two multi-million dollar parking structures there.

"That's something we have to consider too," Gentry said. "I would think that the parking-in-lieu fee will go up. We know it's not carrying its weight right now."

But local businessmen are concerned a significant fee increase would curtail business expansion and stop new businesses from locating in the city.

"Raising fees to the business community with the economy the way it is could be a dangerous thing," explained Jim Lyon, general manager of the Laguna Beach Chamber of Commerce.

The Laguna Chamber of Commerce board of directors met Thursday to discuss the fee issue. Lyon described the atmosphere at the meeting as "cautious."

El Toro military home burns, 4 in family hurt

Four members of a family living in military housing at the El Toro Marine Corps Air Station were injured — one critically — when fire swept through their home Friday evening.

Gunnery Sgt. Peg Cauley said the fire gutted a three-bedroom, one-story duplex in the Wherry Housing area at about 5:45 p.m.

Three members of the Apulu family were taken by helicopter to the burn unit at UC Irvine Medical Center, she said.

Matthew Apulu, 5, was listed in critical condition Friday night at the hospital. His brother, Moses Apulu, 2, was listed as satisfac-

tory. Both boys suffered second and third degree burns.

Their mother, whose first name was not available, was treated for cuts and was listed in satisfactory condition.

A third brother, James Apulu, 10, was treated at the El Toro base dispensary for head and leg injuries and was released. A base firefighter who suffered smoke inhalation was also treated at the dispensary and released.

Sgt. Cauley said the cause of the fire is under investigation. She said the Apulu children's father is a Marine currently stationed in Japan.

Jetliner's brakes catch fire

Orange County firefighters extinguished a blaze that broke out in the brake system of an American Airlines jet at John Wayne Airport Friday night.

American Airlines spokeswoman Mary Sullivan said the DC-9 from Dallas-Fort Worth had landed safely and all passen-

gers had disembarked when the fire was discovered at 8:13 p.m.

She said no injuries were reported in connection with the blaze.

A fire department spokesman estimated damage to the jet at \$10,000.

Bonin accomplice sentenced

One of convicted Freeway Killer William Bonin's admitted accomplices — who offered to testify against his former friend rather than face the death penalty — was sentenced in Orange County Superior Court to a 25-year to life prison term.

Gregory Matthew Miley, 22, agreed to the same plea-bargain arrangement in Orange County in return for his testimony that he had in the Los Angeles County

case against Bonin, convicted in the sex-torture slayings of 14 Southern California youths.

Miley was arrested at his step-father's home in Houston in 1980 and returned to Orange County where he was charged in the series of Freeway Killings.

Bonin, 36, was convicted of 10 killings in Los Angeles County last year and four more in Orange County Aug. 2.

defense attorneys and nearly everyone in the courtroom when he asked the judge for permission to address the court. His attorneys, Douglas Otto and Fred McBride, quickly asked for a recess and the three retired for about 15 minutes. When they returned Kraft apparently had decided against making any statement.

"He wants to make sure he participates in this thing. He thought this was his chance," Otto said.

Kraft, however, was not the only one to startle courtroom observers during the hearing. Deputy District Attorney Bryan Brown sent a shock wave of his own through the room when he revealed publicly that police investigators had recovered a coded list of Kraft's purported victims from the trunk of his car.

"Mr. Kraft is a true scorecard killer," Brown said. "Every victim is noted in Mr. Kraft's scorecard." The prosecutor also referred to the list, possibly a computer printout, as a "death list."

The list, which was introduced as evidence during one of two closed sessions, was sealed by the judge immediately after he ruled in the case.

Brown said one of the victims initials, Edward Daniel Moore, appear on the list as do the notations, "New Year's Eve," "jail out," "two in one hit," and "Marine Carson," among others.

Brown told the court New Year's Eve pertains to the night

victim Mark Howard Hall, 22, of Santa Ana disappeared. "Jail out" refers to Roland Gerald Young, 23, who was killed hours after his release from the Orange County Jail in 1978; "two in one hit" refers to the double killing in 1982 of Geoffrey Alan Nelson, 18, and Rodger DeVaul Jr., 20, both of Buena Park; and the "Marine Carson" pertains to the killing of Richard Keith, a Camp Pendleton-based Marine last seen alive in Carson.

Besides the so-called scorecard, Brown argued that pictures seized when Kraft was arrested, photos of young men with and without clothes, who appear dead, as well the similarities in the 16 killings warranted Kraft's prosecution on the charges.

He said the killings were similar. Most victims were strangled with the same kind of strap, many were found to have alcohol and valium in their bloodstreams and many had been sexually mutilated, burned or emasculated.

Defense attorneys Otto and McBride argued that Kraft had been linked by the testimony and evidence presented during the hearing to only seven of the 16 slayings. They asked that the remaining nine murder charges be dismissed.

Otto also said the preliminary hearing was the "prosecution's show," that the burden of proof is slight. "This unsophisticated public will be hopelessly prejudiced at subsequent proceedings such as the trial," he said.

Skeletal remains to be studied

An anthropologist will be called in to study the skeletal remains discovered Thursday afternoon at Huntington State Beach.

An Orange County Coroner's spokesman said the remains are part of a skull that had been in the surf for an extended period of

time. The spokesman said an anthropologist is needed to determine whether the skull was from a human or an animal.

The remains were found by a jogger near the surfline at Golden West Street.

ports and sign on to crew with a ship bound for San Francisco — just for love of the sea and the ships that sailed on it.

On his honeymoon, he and his bride, Betty, drove to Canada in the Model A Ford he had restored himself.

It was 14 years ago that Betty and he were married — only a few months before the Pilgrim began to take its shape.

Through it all, Betty has persevered, bearing and raising three daughters, Julie, 9, Heidi, 6, and Amy, 2, on board the drydocked Pilgrim.

The couple met in high school

and virtually grew up together. "We both always had to work for everything we had," he said.

"But Betty's one of a kind. She's incredibly patient. She's like Margaret Thatcher — the Iron Lady."

By 1970 Holland had read about clipper ships and dreamed of building one for 10 years. He had immersed himself in boat history — the lore and the legend of famous ships, from where they were built, to who built them and why.

Holland studied and planned and dreamed about the authentic clipper ship he had his heart set on

building, simply for the love and the challenge of it.

In his studies, he came across a book on Donald McKay, the man who built the best and the fastest clipper ships in the world.

"I was born on the same day he was — Sept. 4," Holland says. "And the first ship he built is the same as the Pilgrim — but it took him only four months to build it back then."

The cost of quality building materials and supporting his growing family just about broke Holland more than once in the 13-year history of the Pilgrim.

Holland said there were many times, when it looked like he'd have to permanently shelve the project.

"But I just didn't want to be a failure. I figured somehow if I failed on this I'd fail the rest of my life, too. I couldn't go on to something else and leave this undone," he said.

The Hollands are full of plans and more plans. After the launch it will take a few weeks for the wood to swell up and the rigging to be put in place. Then there's the Pilgrim's maiden voyage — to take place sometime in January.

Holland hopes to turn the boat into a charter cruiser, taking 30 passengers and crew members on weekend voyages to Catalina Island and to San Pedro.

After he works the boat long enough to support her, he wants to take to the open seas. Betty has mentioned Australia as a good starting point.

And she also wants to build a house.

Then there's Holland's other love, antique cars. Even before the launch, he was already talking this week about restoring another car for next spring's Great American Race, which he hopes to enter.

And there's another boat, a 130-foot, three-masted steel schooner dating to 1880 that he's had his eye on for some time.

Whatever he does, you can be sure Holland won't waste his days living other people's dreams.

"It's incredibly satisfying, to know I'm doing something worthwhile — something my children will always be able to relate to."

of the National Transportation Safety Board, estimated it would still be several months before the agency's Airspur investigation is complete.

Airspur's British-made Westland 30 helicopters have been idle since one of the copters crashed Nov. 7 in Long Beach. No one was killed but six people on board the flight were injured.

NTSB Investigator Al Dickenson flew to Yeovil, England this week to consult with the British Accident Investigation Board and with the manufacturer of a part in the helicopter's tail rotor control which may be linked to the crash.

Though the NTSB has not yet made a determination as to the probable cause of the crash, investigators have determined that the tail rotor control failed just before the ship went down, Buckhorn said.

Dickenson was testing the helicopter's servo — a mechanism within the tail rotor drive system — at the Westland plant outside of London this week. Buckhorn said testing of parts is a normal part of many NTSB investigations.

Airspur is owned by John and Joan Gallagher and their son, Tim, all of Huntington Beach. The helicopter commuter service has been plagued by complaints of

noise from North Costa Mesa and Fountain Valley homeowners since it began running 15 flights a day between Orange County and Los Angeles International Airport in September.

Meanwhile, an Airspur helicopter is scheduled to take part in Airshow '83 at Ontario International Airport today, an airport spokeswoman said.

"They said they were doing some testing on their (helicopters) and unless something came up bad they would be there," the spokeswoman said.

Airshow '83 is an annual exhibition and demonstration of flying machines.

Congress gives approval for record military spending bill

WASHINGTON — Congress approved and sent to President Reagan on Friday a record military spending bill that includes \$24 million for CIA aid to rebels seeking to overthrow the Sandinista government in Nicaragua. The measure, approved 311-99 in the House and 75-6 in the Senate, also denies the president's request for \$124 million for the first production of nerve gas since 1969. White House spokesman Larry Speakes said Reagan would sign the \$249.8 billion fiscal 1984 appropriations measure. The compromise legislation, approved after brief debate, allows Reagan to go full speed ahead with development and production of a wide variety of strategic weapons systems, including the MX missile and B-1 long-range bombers.

Greyhound pact rejection predicted

PHOENIX — Greyhound buses rolled in 27 states Friday with less of the violence that marked the first day's resumption of limited service, and striking union leaders predicted their members would reject a company wage and benefit reduction proposal. Eleven arrests were reported in picket line demonstrations Friday, a sharp drop from more than 100 the day before. In Boston, demonstrators again threw eggs and taunted departing drivers as "scabs" but New York police said their biggest problem was "trying to stay awake."

Nazi camp guard suspect arrested

CLEVELAND — A 63-year-old retired autoworker accused of being a Nazi death camp guard during World War II was arrested Friday on an extradition request from Israel, officials said. This was the first time U.S. authorities had ever arrested an alleged Nazi war criminal for extradition to Israel, said Justice Department spokesman John Russell in Washington. John Demjanjuk, who allegedly was known as "Ivan the Terrible" as a guard at the Treblinka death camp in Poland, was arrested at his home in suburban Seven Hills, said Don Russell, local director of the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service. Demjanjuk has maintained that he was a Soviet soldier captured by the German Army in 1942 and held prisoner until the end of the war.

Girl guilty of killing paraplegic

SAN DIEGO — A jury found a 16-year-old girl guilty Friday of first-degree murder in the death of a paraplegic man who was tortured, beaten and stabbed. Joyce Renee Largo, of Campo, who wept quietly as the verdict was announced, faces a possible 30 years to life in prison in connection with the death of Harry Richard Sherwood, 37, of Yuma, Ariz. Sentencing was set for Dec. 16. She also was convicted of kidnapping, robbery, auto theft and infliction of great bodily harm. Judge David Gill ordered Miss Largo held without bail in Juvenile Hall until sentencing. Her attorney said she is eligible for placement with the California Youth Authority, which could hold her in custody until she is 25 years old.

Women facing rape charges

SANTA CRUZ — Two Santa Cruz women face 38 counts of rape and a host of other charges for allegedly abducting two teen-age girls and forcing them into sex acts with farm laborers to earn rent money. The rape allegations were added Thursday afternoon by Municipal Court Judge Richard Kessell at the conclusion of a four-day preliminary hearing. The two Santa Cruz women, Tina Wilson, 24, and Katherine Charles, 18, cried when Kessell ordered them bound over to Superior Court for a Dec. 5 arraignment on a total of 96 felony charges, including rape, kidnapping, pandering, robbery and dissuading a witness.

Earthquake rattles San Bernardino

SAN BERNARDINO — A small earthquake rippled through this inland city early Friday, rattling dishes and windows, but causing no reported injuries or damage, officials said. The quake, which hit at about 2 a.m. and prompted a flurry of calls to law enforcement agencies and radio stations, registered 3.3 on the Richter scale. It was centered eight miles southeast of San Bernardino, said Dennis Meredith, spokesman for the Seismology Lab at the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena.

U.N. rejects Turkish-Cypriot republic

UNITED NATIONS — The U.N. Security Council on Friday declared the self-proclaimed Turkish-Cypriot republic to be "legally invalid" and said its declaration of independence should be withdrawn. The vote was 13-1 with one abstention. Pakistan, an Islamic member of the council, cast the only negative vote and Jordan abstained. Turkish-Cypriot leader Rauf Denktaş said before the vote that the council resolution had "no moral or legal value and cannot be implemented."

New theory on Grenada coup

ST. GEORGE'S, Grenada — Two former Cabinet ministers claim the overthrow and murder of leftist Prime Minister Maurice Bishop were the result of a betrayal by his hard-line Marxist deputy, Bernard Coard, and no "outside forces" were involved in the coup. The former officials called Coard's contention that he had nothing to do with Bishop's death and the army junta that seized power "an absolute and complete lie." "He (Coard) conceived the whole thing. He orchestrated the whole thing," said Kenrick Radix, former minister of industrial development and fisheries. "He told the actors when to enter and when to exit."

Congress calls it quits for 1983

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress quit for the year Friday after brushing aside last-minute efforts to raise taxes and trim the government's soaring deficits. But leaders of both chambers pronounced the 1983 session one of the most productive in years.

The House ended its session at 7:35 p.m. EST and the Senate headed home at 10:04 p.m. as leaders placed traditional telephone calls to President Reagan to officially notify him of the adjournment.

"We ended this session on a note

of cooperation, just as we began it," House Majority Leader Jim Wright, D-Texas, told the president. House Minority Leader Robert Michel, R-Ill., agreed, but added, "We got a little ranking in between times."

Reagan told the leaders: "I am pleased to hear that and know we've all had some victories and we've all had some defeats. But I think there has been progress made in a bipartisan way and I wish you all now a happy recess. Look forward to seeing you in January."

The wrapup of the first session of the 98th Congress produced the usual late flurry of action on major bills:

— The House voted 214-186 to send to Reagan a bill raising the nation's borrowing power by \$101 billion, to \$1.49 trillion. The Senate had already approved the move.

— By a 226-186 vote, the House sent to the White House a \$302 million catch-all spending bill that includes an amendment providing for an \$8.5 billion hike in U.S.

contributions to the International Monetary Fund sought by Reagan.

— The Senate voted 71-18 to confirm Reagan's nomination of former national security adviser William P. Clark to succeed James G. Watt as interior secretary.

— Congress authorized \$6.7 billion over two years for the State Department and related agencies, while holding United Nations funding authorization at \$602.3 million in both fiscal years 1984 and 1985.

PLO says Arafat leads assault on refugee camp

TRIPOLI, Lebanon (AP) — PLO sources claimed Yasser Arafat led his fighters in an assault Friday that recaptured the Baddawi refugee camp from guerrilla mutineers. But reporters who went into the camp said Arafat's men seemed to hold only the southern sector.

In Beirut, meanwhile, Shiite Moslem leaders warned of reprisal attacks for the Israeli and French bombing of Shiite outposts in eastern Lebanon over the past two days, and U.S. Marines continued replacing the unit that has been in Beirut since last May.

The Palestinian sources, who declined to be identified, said Arafat's men opened their assault on the camp northwest of Tripoli at 3 a.m. and that the 54-year-old chief of the Palestine Liberation Organization led the offensive after saying his prayers in a mosque at the edge of the camp.

"Arafat led the initial drive until 7 a.m., until he made sure everything was under control,"

one source said. "Arafat was conducting the force in the operations room and was in the front line of the offensive. He walked in the streets of the camp and he talked to the people."

One source said the loyalists launched their drive from south of Baddawi after retaking a hill above the Mankoubin neighborhood just north of Tripoli. He said they retained the Mankoubin road as their supply route even after the mutineers captured Baddawi Wednesday.

The mutineers, backed by Syria and Libya, accuse Arafat of abandoning armed struggle against Israel in favor of negotiation.

The PLO source said Arafat's fighters took 68 prisoners in the latest offensive. Ten of the captives, identified as Syrians, were shown to reporters on the third floor of a deserted building in Tripoli. They sat on a bare floor in their uniforms and some wore yellow or white T-shirts.

Jury says Buono will spend life in prison

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Jurors who convicted Angelo Buono Jr. of killing nine young women in the gruesome Hillside Strangler slayings recommended Friday that he spend his life in prison with no hope for parole, rejecting the option to condemn him to death.

The decision, two years after the trial began, brought an end to the longest and one of the most expensive criminal cases in California history and one of the longest trials ever held in the United States.

Jurors, apparently traumatized by their protracted ordeal, refused to discuss the reasoning behind their verdicts.

"I feel strained and depressed," said the foreman, Edward McKay. Another juror rushed from the courtroom in tears.

Prosecutors, who had urged Buono's execution in the gas chamber, said they believed jurors had spared his life because his chief accuser, his adoptive cousin, Kenneth Bianchi, was given life in prison in the same case.

The gaunt, inarticulate defendant has always maintained he is innocent and was implicated by Bianchi because of bad blood between the two men.

Superior Court Judge Ronald George set formal sentencing for Jan. 9. California juries can only recommend a sentence, and judges generally follow those recommendations. By law, George cannot upgrade the sentence to death.

An automobile upholsterer from suburban Glendale, Buono was charged with 10 counts of murder in the grisly sex slayings of 10 girls and young women in late 1977 and early 1978.


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
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

On a roll for 10 years

Legend tells that Sir Frances Drake waited to finish a game of lawn bowls before sailing to defeat the Spanish Armada during the 16th century. The 160 members of the Newport Harbor Lawn Bowling Club don't have wars to fight but they are nearly as serious about their lawn bowls.

The club celebrated the 10th anniversary of their Corona del Mar clubhouse and greens this week with a gala celebration Tuesday.

Lawn Bowls is an ancient game that comes from Scotland, according to Bob Hicks, the club's president.

The idea of the game is to roll your "bowl" — it looks like a small, oblong version of a bowling ball without holes — across 120 feet of neatly manicured lawn so that it rests next to the "jack" — a small white ball similar to a billiard ball.

The person who sets his bowl closest to the jack wins the game.

It may sound simple, but according to Hicks, the slow-paced game involves much strategy.

"If your opponent is real close to the jack the object is try and knock his bowl away," Hicks explained.

"If you have a bowl right near the jack you try to put another bowl about two feet in front so that your opponent cannot knock you away," he added.

The game can take many other twists and turns.

Unlike lawn bowls clubs in other countries, American clubs, including the Newport one, are made up of mostly elderly members and retirees. Most of the players in the Newport club are between the ages of 55 and 70 years old. The same pattern is true among the other eight lawn bowls clubs in the Orange County area, Hicks said.

"Why that is something we are trying to figure out. Here we can't seem to attract young people to it. The champions in other countries are in there 20s and 30s," Hicks said.

One attraction to the younger set is that foreign lawn bowl clubs serve liquor, Hicks said. The Newport clubhouse is owned by the city of Newport Beach and the stiffest drink served there is iced tea.

The cost of joining a lawn bowls club is cheap compared to other sports clubs. The Newport club charges a \$30 initiation fee, \$30 a month dues and 50 cents a game.

The cost of keeping up the club green is \$750 a month, he said.

El Toro man arrested for having postassium

Authorities are investigating whether an El Toro home doubles as an illegal drug laboratory after removing a quantity of potassium powerful enough to level several homes.

Orange County firefighters and sheriff's deputies went to the Larkwood Lane residence following reports of an unstable chemical. Authorities said the concern was heightened because the house is next to a grade school.

Lt. Wyatt Hart said the potassium was removed from the residence by members of a bomb squad. The neighborhood, he said, was not evacuated.

Mark Anthony Siminuk, the resident of the home, was arrested on suspicion of possessing dangerous drugs. Authorities said the drug charges and the potassium seizure have not been linked.

While postassium has many legitimate uses, it is also used in making PCP.

Hart said sheriff's deputies are continuing to probe the residence to determine if it is the site of a drug lab.

Fire does \$6,000 in damages to FV building

A Fountain Valley industrial building received about \$6,000 in damages after a fire broke out shortly after midnight Friday morning, officials said.

The fire in the Newport Corp. building at 18235 Mt. Baldy Circle, triggered a sprinkler system that caused most of the damage, according to Battalion Chief John Volstad.

The fire apparently started when paper products that were piled in front of a furnace ignited, according to Volstad.

3 men injured as lighter ignites battery in auto

Car batteries and open flames don't mix, or so three men learned this week in Fountain Valley.

A car battery exploded and spewed acid into their faces, burning them, according to a Fountain Valley Fire Department official.

Battalion Chief John Volstad said the three men were working over the battery in the dark when one of them lit a cigarette lighter to see what they were doing.

The flame from the lighter ignited hydrogen gas in the battery causing it to explode and splatter sulphuric acid on the three men, Volstad said.

They were treated at the scene by paramedics and taken to Fountain Valley Community Hospital where they were treated and later released.

Volstad said a police car was parked near where the incident took place behind the 7-Eleven store at 10585 Slater Ave. He said an officer shouted to warn the men to extinguish the lighter just before the explosion.

Sparks and open flame should never be used around car batteries, Volstad said.

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


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Alonzo Clemons puts the finishing touches on a wax sculpture of a big horn sheep at a recent outing to the Denver Zoo.

'Idiot Savant' a hot artist

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) — Alonzo Clemons still can't read or count. He still can't speak in complete sentences. Occasionally, he must still be reminded to brush his teeth.

But Clemons is no longer just one of the anonymous residents at a group home for retarded adults here.

Now he is Alonzo, one of the hottest young artists in the country, the "idiot savant," the "retarded genius" whose bronzed sculptures are being snapped up by collectors for hundreds of dollars apiece.

In the four months since his first show, about \$30,000 worth of Alonzo's work has been sold through a Denver art gallery.

He has yet to see a nickel of that money. The people making the financial and artistic decisions for Alonzo — his mother, his lawyer and his art dealer — say they are plowing all his income back into producing more sculpture. And they say they haven't made any money off Alonzo's art, either. At least, not yet.

As long as anyone can remember, Alonzo has been hand-sculpting animals out of whatever was at hand. Counselors in the state institution where he grew up used to give Alonzo modeling clay when he was good and take it away when he was bad.

One morning after the clay had been taken away, counselors found tiny black horses under Alonzo's bed. In the night, he had sneaked onto the roof and scraped up tar with his fingernails.

When Alonzo moved to Carmel Ltd., the group home, three years ago, staff members bought him artists' beeswax. Sometimes when he made an especially good sculpture, they took it away from him; otherwise he would flatten it to re-use the wax.

The staff psychologist at Carmel said Alonzo was a classic "idiot savant," from the French for a retarded person with some inexplicable genius in a certain area.

Jim Graves, the Carmel administrator, began taking Alonzo to small art fairs where Alonzo would sculpt horses and cows and Graves would sell them for \$10 or \$20. That money, along with what Alonzo earned as a stableboy at a local ranch, was used to buy a radio and a color television set for his room. And, of course, he bought wax.

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The unmasking of D.B. Cooper?

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — A dozen years ago this Thanksgiving D.B. Cooper — laden with two parachutes and 10,000 \$20 bills — inched his way down the rear stairway of a 727 jet and plunged into the turbulent Oregon skies, the history books....and oblivion.

Now a Las Vegas writer says Cooper was actually a Missouri con man and government informant named Jack Coffelt who took the secrets of that stormy November night to his grave four years later.

Byron Brown says he and his father, James Brown, a cellmate of Coffelt's at the federal penitentiary in Atlanta in the 1950s, accompanied the self-proclaimed hijacker to Oregon in 1974 in a futile

search for the \$200,000.

Brown says the FBI is ignoring Coffelt as the mystery skyjacker, despite two eyewitness accounts, because Coffelt spent half of his adult life in prison, the other half in grey areas working as a government agent.

FBI agents who have worked the case since that chill night Nov. 24, 1971 discount Brown's story, although they admit Coffelt ranks "in the top 20" among 933 Cooper candidates they have developed over the years.


Cooper has been an enigma to law officers, something of a romantic hero to the public since he tied the sack of money around his waist, strapped parachutes to

his chest and back, and plunged from the rear stairway of Northwest Airlines Flight 305. It remains America's only unsolved hijacking.

The incident began in the twilight hours at Portland International Airport when a man listed on the manifest as Dan Cooper boarded the Boeing 727 with 36 other passengers and a crew of six.

Brown, writing in this month's issue of The Las Vegas magazine, said the craft was only one-third full on the busy holiday eve because Coffelt had made numerous reservations, knowing the no-shows would leave the back of the plane empty for him.

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New Catholic Bishops' Leader Is Social Activist

WASHINGTON — The nation's Roman Catholic bishops are signaling their clear intent to keep pushing into social issues beyond those with obvious religious connections.

The latest sign came this week in the church leaders' choice to head their national organization: a bishop who has made his reputation dealing with working people and — in one case — trying to help them buy a closed-down steel mill.

James W. Malone, a 63-year-old steelworker's son from Youngstown, Ohio, took over Thursday as

president of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. And that didn't come as good news to some conservative Roman Catholics who have felt in recent years that bishops and priests have gone too far afield from traditional chores such as saying Mass, hearing confessions and taking up collections.

Malone, for example, was active in a 1977 effort by local officials and workers to buy and reopen closed steel mills in Ohio's depressed Mahoning Valley around Youngstown.

That effort, which failed, was probably his "most dramatic," he said in a meeting with reporters

after his election. But he indicated his involvement with the community-workers group, called the Ecumenical Coalition, was firmly grounded in the beliefs that guide his everyday thinking.

"I see a continuing relevance between the gospels and social issues," he said.

Other samples of his views on religious and other issues:

—He said the bishops' meeting last weekend with Bible scholars and women's groups on the subject of women's roles in the church was "very appropriate." He shrugged off complaints from some Roman Catholics that such a meeting went against Pope John Paul II's orders not to support groups that promote ordination of women to the priesthood.

—Asked about following up the bishops' spring letter condemning nuclear war, he said a conference with other faiths' religious leaders should be called to help spread the word. That's a position not designed to please Roman Catholics who believe, along with the Reagan administration, that the bishops had no

business taking the nuclear stand.

—When asked what would make a good topic for the next major statement by the pope, he suggested the struggle of Catholics in finding relevance for their faith at a time when the outside world and even that old reliable faith might seem to be changing too rapidly.

The bishops also elected Archbishop John May of St. Louis as vice president of their group, a significant step for him since the No. 2 man often is elevated to No. 1 after his three-year term.

May, 61, also is not considered within the church's conservative wing.

Both men said they agreed with comments by the group's outgoing president, Archbishop John Roach of St. Paul-Minneapolis, that the pope's comments about American bishops have not been rebukes for their stands on some issues, but reasonable concern about the doings of the American Church since it is so influential in the church worldwide.

Cardinal Manning plans retirement

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Cardinal Timothy Manning, 74, head of the nation's largest Roman Catholic archdiocese, says he will follow the customary practice of offering his resignation to the Pope before he turns 75.

In an interview on his 74th birthday Tuesday during the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in Washington, Manning said he would step down after 14 years of heading the Los Angeles archdiocese if the Pope "accepts the offer."

The wiry cardinal, who underwent prostate surgery in January, said he's in excellent health and expects to be active in parish work, just as his predecessor, Cardinal James Francis McIntyre, then well over 80, did after Manning succeeded him in January 1970.

Manning currently heads an archdiocese that covers Los Angeles, Ventura and Santa Barbara counties and numbers 2.3 million members.

He is one of only three active cardinals heading American archdioceses, with Cardinals Joseph Bernardin of Chicago and John Krol of Philadelphia.

Manning joined the U.S. bishops' liberal opposition to the Reagan Administration's nuclear arms and Latin American policies, but he has remained a staunch defender of traditional church teachings.

The church's position on the all-male priesthood and matters of sexual morality "are integral to the church," which nothing can change, not even the Pope, he said in the interview with the Los Angeles Times.

Manning's departure will be part of a sweeping shift of prelates in the U.S. Catholic hierarchy which Manning says will invigorate the Catholic Church.

NCC names acting president

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Bishop Philip R. Cousin, presiding officer over 352 African Methodist Episcopal churches in Alabama, has been named acting president of the National Council of Churches, the country's largest ecumenical group.

Cousin was elevated from vice president to head of the council after its president suddenly resigned, citing exhaustion.

Bishop James Armstrong issued a written statement through officials of the United Methodist Church in Indianapolis that he was resigning because he was "physically and emotionally depleted."

Carol Foke, director of news services for the council in New York, said that although Cousin technically is the acting president, his approval as president would be only a formality.

Although Cousin is not the first

black president of the council, he is the first from a black denomination.

He will complete Armstrong's term, which ends Dec. 31, 1984, and then will be eligible for a full three-year term.

The council is composed of 31 church bodies which have a total membership of about 40 million.

Asked recently why black Methodist churches generally are more political than white ones, the 50-year-old Cousin said:

"The white church has a tendency to separate its ethics from its religion. But we say 'no.' Ethics must be a part of your total religious commitment."

"What I am civically, politically, economically, socially — all is a result of what I am theologically."

He said the African Methodist Episcopal church is structured much like the United Methodist

Church, from which it broke off, but has less high liturgy.

"There is more pulpit-pew interaction," Cousin said. "The members of the congregation are not there as spectators, but as participants."

His father was an AME minister in West Palm Beach, Fla., where Cousin grew up. He attended Central State College in Ohio and received a master's degree in theology from Boston University.

Armstrong, the 12th president of the council, was the first to resign.

James Steele, director of communications of the United Methodist Church's Indiana Area, declined to say what was wrong with Armstrong, who also resigned his post as bishop.

Armstrong left Indianapolis Tuesday for a "general medical facility," Steele said.

'Kennedy' — homage to man and myth

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC revisits Camelot 20 years after the death of President John F. Kennedy, and it seems there really were kings, princesses, gallant men, damsels in distress and one ugly frog named J. Edgar Hoover. "Kennedy," a \$13 million, three-part homage to the man and the myth, begins with a three-hour segment Sunday night against ABC's much ballyhooed nuclear catastrophe film, "The Day After." After that, NBC should have more success in the ratings with two-hour installments Monday and Tuesday night.

"Kennedy" is a British production, cleverly written by Englishman Reg. Gadney and brilliantly acted by all, particularly Martin Sheen as the president and John Shea as the subpresident, John Kennedy's indispensable brother, Bobby.

As history, however, "Kennedy" is part compelling docudrama and too much precari-

ous soap opera. Gadney takes liberties with the script that are sometimes beyond anyone's factual reach, despite claims by NBC of an "extensively researched script."

Can Gadney prove that the president's father, Joe, played by E.G. Marshall, actually said to his son that J. Edgar Hoover, the director of the FBI and a Kennedy family foe for years, was a homosexual?

"I think," Gadney himself says, "it's entirely the sort of line that someone as ebullient and extroverted and energetic and very casual in terminology ... as Joe Kennedy would have said."

Hoover, played with remarkable physical resemblance by Vincent Gardenia, is depicted as an obsessive, vindictive, voyeuristic bully who blackmails the Kennedy administration with tapes that point to Kennedy indiscretions. And you thought Richard Nixon had tape troubles?

The president's often-rumored dalliances are presented through hush-hush phone calls with

female friends, including a phone plea to Kennedy from one ardent admirer — a damsel in distress who purportedly had friends in the Mafia — asking to get FBI bloodhounds off her trail.

Bobby Kennedy tells his brother, at one point, "Those things have to change, Jack, especially now as a Catholic president." As a Christmas present to Bobby, Kennedy says they have.

In scene after scene, Hoover casts a spooky gloom over "Kennedy." Too often, Hoover is seen plotting in his office, glaring at Kennedy on TV and demanding his agents — he calls them all "Boy" — find every speck of sexual dirt under the rug in the Oval Office.

Hoover even confronts Kennedy at the White House and tells him he is compromising the presidency. Although there was, indeed, animosity between the two men, the movie goes overboard in portraying Hoover in the black hat that makes for good conflict on TV.

When Hoover isn't intruding, Sheen can excel as the dynamic Kennedy, giving the young president, whose administration was likened to Camelot.

Sheen, who said he turned down the role five times because of his close friendship with Kennedy, has graduated successfully from the Bobby Kennedy role he played in the earlier TV movie, "Missiles of October." He has perfected the mannerisms of the clipped Boston accent, the jabbing finger and the hands dabbing at his suit buttons or thrust into his suit pockets. In profile and from the back, Sheen is John F. Kennedy.

"Kennedy" ends with the assassination, which was filmed in Richmond, Va. Except that this movie is in color, the reconstruction of Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas is eerily identical to the black-and-white TV footage fused into the nation's memory bank.

This is one movie that can never have a happy ending.

'Bay City' benched by NBC

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Bay City Blues" has been pulled from NBC-TV's batting order, but the network says it will give the struggling series another chance this winter.

Three other low-rated shows pulled several weeks ago by NBC to revamp the storylines will return, but it was not certain how long they will remain. The shows are "For Love and Honor," "Manimal" and "The Roustabouts."

"Bay City Blues," from the same production team as "Hill Street Blues," will make its last appearance Tuesday, Nov. 29, after encountering poor ratings despite critical acclaim.

"Everyone agrees 'Bay City Blues' is an excellent show made under superior production auspices," NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff said. "It hasn't been making it on Tuesdays."

"We continue to have faith in this well-made series and we will bring it back after the first of the year."

For Martin Sheen, Kennedy role was a labor of love

LOS ANGELES — Actor Martin Sheen says he saw John F. Kennedy as a hero, but the British producers of the TV miniseries, "Kennedy," had a more detached perspective of the late president and his family.

"I played him as a hero, no question," said Sheen. "I loved him. I wanted it to be a very positive statement. The British were less into the heroic side of it. They were more into the practical history without the emotions."

"They didn't have as many pre-conceived notions about the Kennedys as we did. They were more practical."

The British, who have thoroughly examined their own

royalty in scores of television productions, look at America's own "Camelot" in this seven-hour, three-part miniseries for NBC. It will be telecast Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, concluding exactly 20 years after the assassination of President Kennedy.

"Kennedy" was produced by England's Central Independent Television in association with Alan Landsburg Productions. The writer, director and producer are all British.

The series, which covers only Kennedy's election and days in the White House, also stars John Shea as the late Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, Blair Brown as Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, E.G. Marshall as Joseph Kennedy Sr.,

Geraldine Fitzgerald as Rose Kennedy and Vincent Gardenia as the late FBI director J. Edgar Hoover.

Sheen had previously played Robert Kennedy in the 1974 ABC special, "The Missiles of October," but he was not prepared to play the president.

"I had no desire to play Jack," he said. "The British company came to me in March with the story. Frankly, they didn't have any money and it was a five-month shooting schedule. When I read the script I was fascinated but I did not see myself in it. I didn't see anybody in it."

Sheen said he met with producer Andrew Brown and turned down the role because he didn't want to be away from home for five months. But the producer

offered to alter the shooting schedule so Sheen could have time off. "They also came up with a larger money offer when Landsburg and NBC came into the picture. Their original budget was \$2.5 million and they finally did it for \$10 million."

Sheen said what finally convinced him was when his wife, Janet, said, "You loved him. That is a good enough reason." Sheen said.

He also kept the family together by having his wife of 22 years play a role as artist Elaine De Kooning, who paints Kennedy's portrait after his election.

He said he and Shea decided that since they didn't physically resemble the Kennedys they would go for the spirit. "Never

look back," he said, "never feel intimidated. Go for the spirit and the energy and never second-guess yourself."

The story begins and ends in Parkland Hospital in Dallas, where Kennedy dies. It dwells longest on election night 1960, selection of the cabinet, the birth of John Kennedy Jr. and the Bay of Pigs.

"The politics and the family are inseparable," said Sheen. "It's an intertwining of world-shattering events with the family life. We deal with Kennedy's sex life through J. Edgar Hoover. He kept tabs on it and tried to control him through it. We don't see him with any women. The original script had a scene with a woman, but I don't think we needed it."

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Doomsday in the living room

Chilling disarmament statement presented in TV's 'The Day After'

NEW YORK (AP) — Imagine sleek missiles rising high over a crowded football stadium, headed, presumably, for targets in the Soviet Union. Or picture Lawrence, Kan., in rubble and white-powder ash, its wretched populace governed by firing squad.

Or consider this horrible and numbing scene, when Stephen Klein (Steve Guttenberg) realizes that no shelter, no store of food and water, can arrest the devastation of nuclear holocaust:

"You can't see it. You can't feel it. And you can't taste it. But it's here, all around us. It's going through us like an X-ray, right into our cells."

Make no mistake. "The Day After" on ABC is an extraordinary and powerful statement in support of nuclear disarmament. Never before has a TV movie offered an audience less hope, or reason, for survival in the aftermath of nuclear attack.

"The Day After" asks whether there is life after nuclear war, and millions of Americans will see Sunday night that there is not.

The film, two hours and 15 minutes long and \$7 million in the making, dramatizes the imagined consequences of nuclear catastrophe in the American Midwest. The message, graphic and brutal, is one of despair: "We're lucky to be alive," Eve Dahlberg, played by

Bibi Besch, tells her husband, Jim (John Cullum). "We'll see how lucky that is," he replies.

Some psychiatrists and educators warn that "The Day After" is not for the young and impressionable. Others suggest that the film be watched only in the company of friends and family.

The movie has polarized competing sides in the nuclear arms debate like no previous television show, though ABC denies that "The Day After" is political in content. The timing, though, is remarkable: the first American-made cruise missiles planned for deployment in Western Europe arrived in Britain less than a week before the air date.

The film is divided roughly into two parts, the first dramatizing life as usual against an ominous backdrop of mounting world tension, the second depicting the aftermath of the attack.

"The Day After" opens with a panoramic sweep of the Kansas countryside. There are rumblings of confrontation in Europe, but no one appears particularly worried. Dr. Russell Oakes (Jason Robards) is more concerned about his daughter's plan to move to Boston. And Denise Dahlberg (Lori Lethin) is busy getting ready for her wedding, three days away.

Then the radio reports Soviet troops are invading West Germany. Moscow is being evacuated. And from

long-silent toms on the U.S. plains, Minutemen missiles are launched.

The people watch the white tails in the blue sky, knowing that Soviet missiles — perhaps earlier, perhaps later, it doesn't really matter — have also been launched. Those missiles, directed at Kansas City and the surrounding area, are in flight and unstoppable, a half-hour away.

"Where does one go from Kansas City?" a hospital colleague asks Oakes. "The Yukon? Tahiti? We're not talking about Hiroshima anymore. It was peanuts..."

The cast, with the exception of Robards and Cullum, is more or less anonymous, and with reason. "What we don't want," Nicholas Meyer, the director, said in an article in TV Guide magazine, "is another Hollywood disaster movie with viewers waiting to see Shelley Winters succumb to radiation poisoning."

The film originally was produced as a four-hour miniseries, to be broadcast over two nights, and that was considered too long to hold a troubled audience. The final version could have been shortened even more without diminishing its effectiveness. After all, once it is clear that survival is impossible, or at least meaningless, what is the point of pounding the theme?

Deal for Zoetrope sale falls through

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Filmmaker Francis Ford Coppola's embattled Zoetrope Studios is up for sale again after the latest deal to buy the studio fell through, a Zoetrope spokesman says.

A tentative offer of \$16.6 million had been made for the Hollywood studio by Jerry Kramer, an independent film producer, and Robert Sonnenblick, of Sonnenblick-Goldman Corp., the nation's largest mortgage brokerage firm.

The deal collapsed when the prospective purchasers failed to secure the financing or pay \$175,000 to extend the option, as specified in the agreement, Zoetrope spokesman Bruce Feldman said.

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Young witnesses raising concern

Renee Nicely got a 30-year prison sentence for killing her 3-year-old son, Shawn. "She always hit him on the head with a broom," a New Jersey Superior Court jury heard from the star prosecution witness — the victim's 5-year-old brother, Davell.

Another 5-year-old, Lisa David, told a jury in suburban New York she had seen "Daddy stick a knife in Mommy." Her father, Glenn David, was convicted last Tuesday of second-degree murder in the June 16 stabbing of his wife, Donna Marie, and will be sentenced next month.

Davell Nicely and Lisa David are among the thousands of children called into court each year, mostly in divorce and child abuse cases, and their testimony has raised concerns among judges and lawyers over when and how

children should take the stand. Their concerns are for the integrity of the judicial system and for possible psychological harm to children who become part of it.

Legal authorities say most young children in court testify in criminal cases involving sexual and physical abuse — usually because they are the only witnesses.

In Nashville, Tenn., for instance, prosecutors relied on the claims of a 10-year-old girl in the rape charge against Eugene Gold, a former district attorney in Brooklyn, N.Y.

In Chino, Calif., 8-year-old Joshua Ryen had his throat slashed but survived a bloodbath that left his parents, sister and playmate dead. Joshua was the only known witness and will almost certainly testify when the murder suspect, Kevin Cooper, an escaped convict, is brought to trial.

"With very young children, one of the things I worry about is what it's going to do to the child," said Carol Remer-Smith, a New York assistant district attorney. She said any victim who testifies in court, no matter how old, ends up "reliving" at least part of what happened.

Once a prosecutor decides a child will testify, the judge will often require that the child show he or she is competent. "Legally, there are a lot of problems in qualifying a child as a witness," said Josephine Bulkley of the National Legal Resource Center for Child Advocacy and Protection.



FV redeems itself, 31-13

Barons advance this year

REDLANDS — Fountain Valley High quarterback Brett Stevens, a smile stretched across his face, stood in the visitors training room here at the University of Redlands and tried to explain the Barons' abrupt about-face from the past couple of weeks.

"Tonight, everything was on the line," he said. "It was put up or shut up because this is the CIF playoffs. We knew we didn't want the season to end here. We lost last year in the first round, so we knew the feeling. We didn't want that to happen again."

Maybe the Barons were sparked partly by fear, but it was mainly due to the passing combination of Stevens and split end Jamie Craft that the Barons exploded from their two-week slump, handing the host Spartans of San Geronimo, the second-place team from the Citrus Belt League, a 31-13 thrashing in the first round of the Big Five Conference playoffs before an estimated turnout of 2,300.

Craft was definitely in a class

by himself. The 5-10, 180-pound senior set a school record with 10 receptions (for 163 yards), including touchdown catches of 7 and 14 yards from Stevens, both coming in the third quarter when Fountain Valley (8-2-1) put the game out of reach.

"Jamie came down with some great catches, but I want to give a lot of credit to my offensive line. They've given me great protection all year," said Stevens, who was 13-of-21 passing (8-of-11 in the second half) for 194 yards (119 in the second half). "I was sacked only once the whole game and that's because I slipped."

Craft, unlike Stevens, didn't

slip off his feet or have a ball slip through his hands all night as he surpassed a trio of Barons (with nine catches each) in setting a Fountain Valley record with 10 receptions for a total of 163 yards.

"I didn't find out about it (the record) until the last part of the game, although I felt I was catching a few more than I normally do," said Craft as he walked off the field.

"This is the way we should play. We had a great week of practice and our intensity was way up."

The Barons played the first two quarters Friday night as if they were still in their two-week

slump (they entered the game having scored a total of 16 points in a loss to Marina and a tie with Huntington Beach).

The Spartans (8-3) scored first in the opening minute of the second quarter when halfback Durrell Jones, on a fourth-and-1 at the Baron 20, sprinted around left tackle and into the end zone for the score. After Tony Shreve kicked the point-after, San Geronimo led, 7-0.

But it was all Barons after that as the Sunset League's No. 3 representatives went on to score the next 31 points.

Unknowns lend hand in victory

If you're looking for heroes in Marina High's 13-9 come-from-behind victory over St. John Bosco Friday night, forget about looking in the usual places.

With star running back Eric Karman hobbling with an ankle injury, the Vikings unveiled a feared offensive trio consisting of a defensive tackle, a 10th-grade kicker called up from the sophomore team and an equally-green sophomore tight end to stun the Braves before 4,000 fans at Westminster High in the first round of the CIF Big 5 Playoffs.

Marina, which finished in a three-way tie for the Sunset League championship and was the league's No. 2 representative in the playoffs, overcame a sluggish first half in which the Vikes never got past their own 41-yard line, and earned a shot at the Mater Dei, which upset No. 2 seed Fontana.

How sluggish were the Vikes in the first half? Well, they garnered a grand total of 43 yards offense, managed just two first downs and were slowed considerably by the gang-tackling Braves from the tough Del Rey League.

"I feel fortunate to come out of this on top," admitted Viking Coach Dave Thompson afterward. "We certainly didn't dominate this game defensively."

The first half was nothing more than a pure treat for the Brave fans who saw quarterback Mike McMaster engineer a 57-yard drive culminating with a 23-yard field goal by Gene Lemmers with 5:35 remaining in the first quarter.

St. John Bosco made in 9-0 with 40 seconds remaining in the half as McMaster, on a fourth-and-two situation, raced untouched 25 yards for a touchdown. The PAT snap was poor and the kick never got off the ground.

In contrast, Marina got off the ground in the second half as defensive tackle Mark Smith scooped up a Brave fumble and raced 43 yards for a TD with 7:29 remaining in the third quarter.

Sophomore kicker Pat Penner — in his first varsity appearance — missed the PAT.

Newport breezes, but Sea Kings ousted

Adjustment by Giddings turns it around for Tars

Earlier this week Newport Harbor High Coach Mike Giddings told the Daily Pilot: "We might have to wait until halftime before we get a game plan."

It was a little earlier than that — midway in the first quarter to be exact — that Giddings called time out, went on the field to talk to his defense, and made the necessary adjustment.

The conversation was taken to heart and the Sailors went on to record their fifth shutout of the season in eliminating visiting Garden Grove, 20-0, in the opening round of the CIF Central Conference playoffs Friday night.

"They were running a belly series, something which they have not shown all year, and it was working," said Giddings. "They were giving the ball to the second man who was going over tackle."

Indeed it was. The Argonauts' first nine run-

ning plays, eight over the left side, netted 47 yards before Giddings called his time out. Garden Grove was credited with only 10 yards on the ground for the rest of the game.

The Sailors didn't waste any time showing their offensive ability. On the second play of the game, Steve Brazas crushed through for 16 yards.

On the following play, Bruce Goodfield unleashed a pass, catching Joe James at full stride on the seven and he went in to score untouched for a 48-yard scoring play to give Newport Harbor a 6-0 lead with 10:49 left in the first quarter.

After that the offense went flat.

"This is nothing against Garden Grove, but we made too many mistakes to go any further," said Giddings.

Rams' Reilly released from prison, awaits decision from NFL

Rams linebacker Mike Reilly is free, but not free to play in the National Football League.

After serving five months of a one-year sentence for felony drunken driving and vehicular manslaughter, Reilly was released when Orange County Superior Court Judge Louis Cardenas reduced his sentence.

Cardenas had imposed a one-year sentence last summer, but with good behavior credits, Reilly would have been eligible for release on Jan. 17.

Reilly has continued practicing with the Rams under a work furlough program, returning to the Theo Lacy facility in Orange after work-outs. But he remains under a one-year suspension by the National Football League, banning him from playing in games.

Jim Perry, Reilly's attorney, said he planned to appeal to the NFL to lift the suspension imposed by Commissioner Pete Rozelle, who also fined Reilly \$5,000.

"They just popped out . . . we haven't fumbled all year."

Gauchos lose debut in OT



It becomes pretty scary when a team loses its most consistent player the week of the Southern California Championship tourney — it becomes a nightmare when the same team loses its top scorer.
